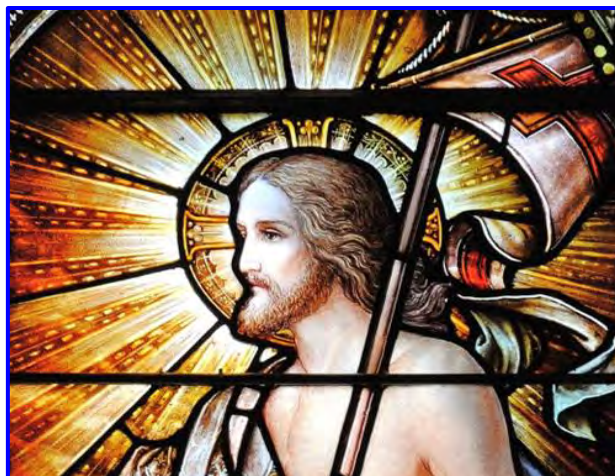

DEACON'S CORNER

"My parents were married for 55 years. One morning, my mom was going downstairs to make dad breakfast, she had a heart attack and fell. My father picked her up as best he could and almost dragged her into the truck. At full speed, without respecting traffic lights, he drove her to the hospital.

When he arrived, unfortunately she was no longer with us.

During the funeral, my father did not speak; his gaze was lost. He hardly cried.

That night, his children joined him. In an atmosphere of pain and nostalgia, we remembered beautiful anecdotes and he asked my brother, a theologian, to tell him where Mom would be at that moment. My brother began to talk about life after death, and guesses as to how and where she would be.

My father listened carefully. Suddenly he asked us to take him to the cemetery.

Dad!" we replied, "it's 11 at night, we can't go to the cemetery right now!"

He raised his voice, and with a glazed look he said:

"Don't argue with me, please don't argue with the man who just lost his wife of 55 years."

There was a moment of respectful silence, we didn't argue anymore. We went to the cemetery, we asked the night watchman for permission. With a flashlight we reached the tomb. My father caressed her, prayed and told his children, who watched the scene moved: "It was 55 years... you know? No one can talk about true love if they have no idea what it's like to share life with a woman."

He paused and wiped his face. "She and I, we were together in that crisis. I changed jobs ..." he continued. "We packed up when we sold the house and moved out of town. We shared the joy of seeing our children finish their careers, we mourned the departure of loved ones side by side, we prayed together in the waiting room of some hospitals, we support each other in pain, we hug each Christmas, and we forgive our mistakes...

Children, now it's gone, and I'm happy, do you know why?

Because she left before me. She didn't have to go through the agony and pain of burying me, of being left alone after my departure. I will be the one to go through that, and I thank God. I love her so much that I wouldn't have liked her to suffer..."

When my father finished speaking, my brothers and I had tears streaming down our faces. We hugged him, and he comforted us, "It's okay, we can go home, it's been a good day." That night I understood what true love is; It is far from romanticism, it does not have much to do with eroticism, or with sex, rather it is linked to work, to complement, to care and, above all, to the true love that two really committed people profess ". Peace in your hearts.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

Every Easter, you and I are reminded of the power of the Paschal Mystery. Commemorating the celebration of the first Eucharist at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, walking with Jesus on the road to Calvary on Good Friday in the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, and celebrating Christ's triumphant conquering of sin and death in the Mass of the Resurrection on Easter is a potent reminder of God's love for us.

During this season of Easter and this time of National Eucharistic Revival, it becomes even clearer to us that the Paschal Mystery is not a mere historical event, but a mystery in which we are privileged to participate every time we celebrate the Mass. In the Easter sequence, we sing: "Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer your thankful praises!" The word, *Eucharist*, which means, *thanksgiving*, implies that every time the Church gathers for the celebration of the Mass, she offers an act of "thankful praise" to the Lord. In this act of offering thanksgiving to God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we as a priestly people offer the sacrifices of our lives with the offering of the Body and Blood of the Lord, by which our sacrifices take on new value and meaning (see, CCC, §1368).

Love is central to the mission of the Church. The sacrifices that we offer to God each day and in the celebration of the Eucharist are an expression of our love for him and for his people. When Christ appeared to Peter and the apostles on the Sea of Galilee after his Resurrection, he asked Peter: "Do you love me?" As he responds, "yes, Lord" to that three-fold questioning, Christ calls him to mission: "feed my lambs...tend my sheep...feed my sheep" (see John 21:15-19) Like Peter, you and I are faced with that same question from the Lord: "do you love me?" In other words, do we take the contemplative time that our hearts yearn for to renew our love for the Lord? In the offering of our time in prayer we are reminded of the very nature of God's love. Through that experience of true love, we realize that as disciples of Christ, you and I are called to mission: to bring the love of Christ to world; to glorify the Lord by our lives; to extend the Divine Mercy to those who suffer; to let the earth shake with the joy of the Resurrection!

Every human heart is created to love. As we grow deeper in our devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus as a Diocese this June, we ask the Lord to strengthen our hearts to love as Jesus loves and for the zeal to proclaim to those we encounter that "God is Love" (1 John 4:8,16).

I wish you and your families a blessed Easter Season!

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Cristo Resucitó! Aleluya!

Cada Pascua, usted y yo recordamos el poder del Misterio Pascual. Conmemorando la celebración de la primera Eucaristía en la Misa de la Cena del Señor, caminando con Jesús por el camino del Calvario el Viernes Santo en la Liturgia de la Pasión del Señor, y celebrando la victoria de Cristo sobre el pecado y la muerte en la Misa de la Resurrección en la Pascua es una poderosa forma de recordar el amor de Dios por nosotros.


Durante este tiempo de Pascua y este tiempo de Reavivamiento Eucarístico Nacional, se nos hace aún más claro que el Misterio Pascual no es un simple acontecimiento histórico, sino un misterio en el cual tenemos el privilegio de participar cada vez que celebramos la Misa. En la secuencia Pascual, cantamos: " Ofrezcan los cristianos ofrendas de alabanza a gloria de la Víctima propicia de la Pascua". La palabra Eucaristía, que significa acción de gracias, implica que cada vez que la Iglesia se reúne para la celebración de la Misa, ofrece un acto de "alabanza agradecida" al Señor. En este acto de acción de gracias a Dios en el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, nosotros, como pueblo sacerdotal, ofrecemos los sacrificios de nuestra vida con la ofrenda del Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor, por lo que nuestros sacrificios adquieren un nuevo valor y significado (ver, CCC, §1368).

El amor es la misión central de la Iglesia. Los sacrificios que ofrecemos a Dios cada día y en la celebración de la Eucaristía son expresión de nuestro amor a Él y a su pueblo. Cuando Cristo se apareció a Pedro y a los apóstoles en el mar de Galilea después de su resurrección, le preguntó a Pedro: "Me amas?" El respondió, "sí, Señor" a esas tres preguntas, Cristo le llama a la misión: "apacienta mis corderos... cuida mis ovejas... apacienta mis ovejas" (cfr. Jn 21, 15-19) Como Pedro, tú y yo nos enfrentamos a esa misma pregunta del Señor: "¿me amas?". En otras palabras, ¿nos tomamos el tiempo contemplativo que anhela nuestro corazón para renovar nuestro amor al Señor? En el ofrecimiento de nuestro tiempo en oración se nos recuerda la naturaleza misma del amor de Dios. A través de esa experiencia de amor verdadero, nos damos cuenta de que, como discípulos de Cristo, tú y yo estamos llamados a la misión: llevar el amor de Cristo al mundo; glorificar al Señor con nuestras vidas; extender la Misericordia Divina a los que sufren; ¡hacer que la tierra tiemble con la alegría de la Resurrección!

Cada corazón humano ha sido creado para amar. Mientras profundizamos en nuestra devoción como Diócesis al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús en este mes de junio, pedimos al Señor que fortalezca nuestros corazones para amar como Jesús ama y para el celo de proclamar a los que encontramos que "Dios es amor" (1 Juan 4:8,16).

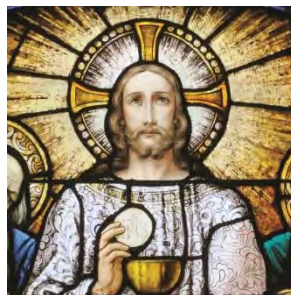

✠ IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE STAFF ✠

Catechesis on Mass Etiquette.

1. No food 1 hour before Mass.
2. Come early allow 10-15 minutes for reflection and meditation. People often ask me, "When am I late for Mass?" My answer is 5 minutes before it starts.
3. No eating allowed during Mass.
4. Dress properly, we are coming to a banquet.
5. Turn off your phones before entering church.
6. Genuflect in direction of tabernacle before entering pew.
7. Participate in the Mass by singing, responding, listening and praying.
8. Examine your conscience before receiving.
You know when your heart is right before the Lord.
9. When receiving, bow first. If receiving in the hand, extend weak hand forward cupping it with your strong hand. Take host with strong hand and place it in your mouth. Consume host before leaving the Sanctuary. If receiving on the tongue, please open your mouth and stick out your tongue. Return to your pew and remain kneeling until celebrant is seated....
10. Think of others. Remember, this is not a time for idle conversation. Be still. Don't be in a hurry. We don't leave until the recessional hymn is finished.



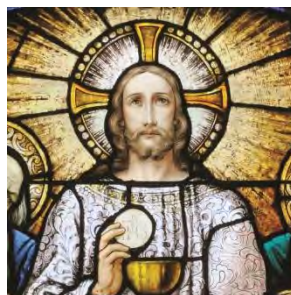

✠ MENSAJE IMPORTANTE DEL PASTOR ✠

Catequesis sobre Etiqueta de Misa.

1. No comer 1 hora antes de la Misa.
2. Venga temprano, permita 10-15 minutos para la reflexión y la meditación. La gente a menudo me pregunta, "¿Cuándo llego tarde a misa?" Mi respuesta es 5 minutos antes de que comience.
3. No se permite comer durante la Misa.
4. Vístase apropiadamente, vamos a un banquete.
5. Apaguen sus teléfonos antes de entrar a la iglesia.
6. Hacer una genuflexión en dirección al tabernáculo antes de entrar a la banca.
7. Participar en la Misa cantando, respondiendo, escuchando y orando.
8. Examine su conciencia antes de recibir. Usted sabe cuando su corazón está recto delante del Señor.
9. Al recibir, inclínese primero. Si recibes en la mano, extiende la mano débil hacia delante ahuecándola con la mano fuerte. Tome la hostia con la mano fuerte y colóquela en su boca. Consuma la hostia antes de salir del Santuario. Si recibes en la lengua, abra la boca y saque la lengua. Regrese a su banca y permanezca arrodillado hasta que el celebrante se siente.
10. Piensa en los demás. Recuerde, éste no es un momento para conversaciones ociosas. Estese quieto. No tenga prisa. No nos vamos hasta que el himno de recesión haya terminado.

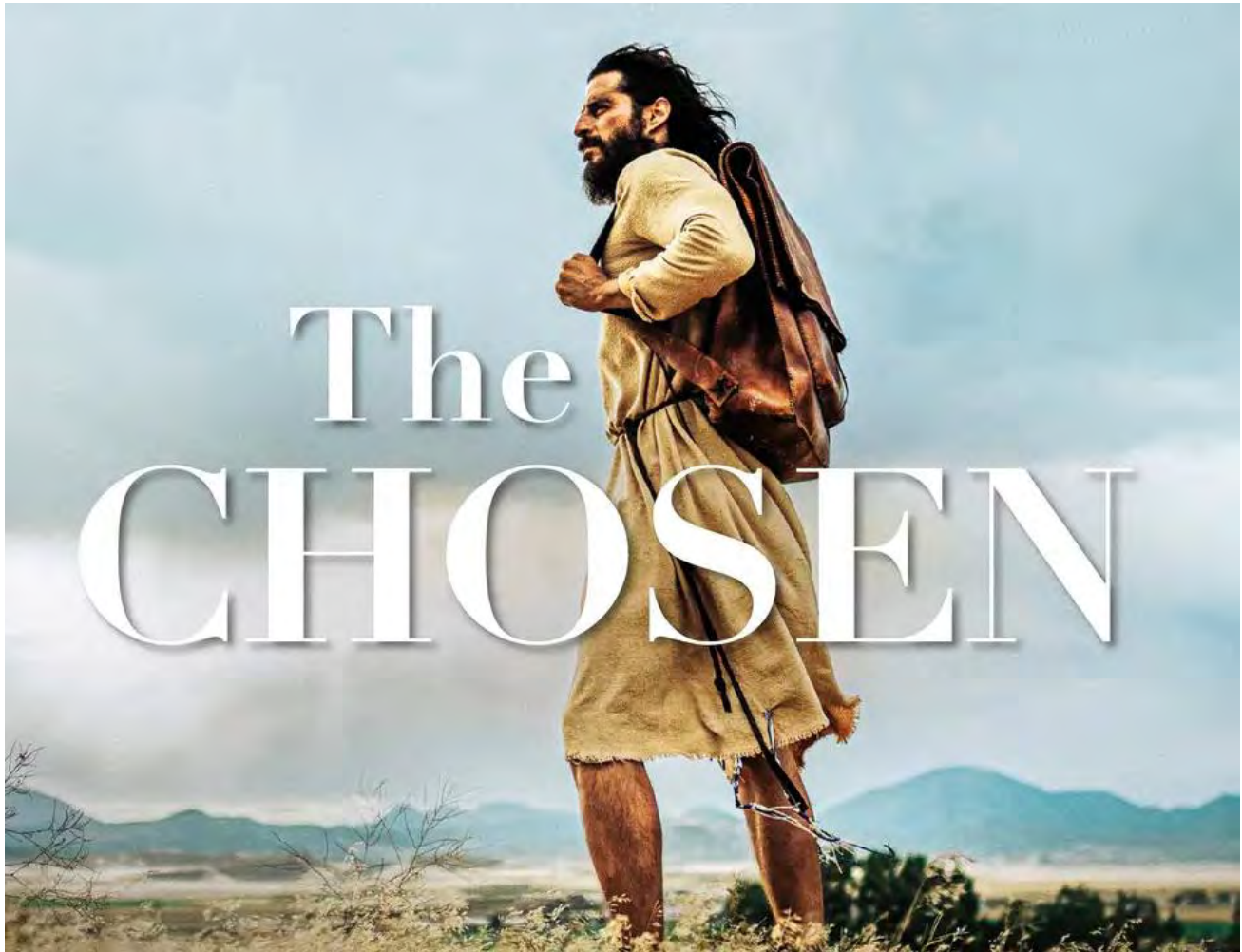

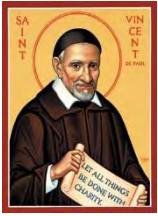
