DEACON'S CORNER



This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions twelve disciples. Many scholars believe that the twelve disciples symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and

the Church.

Matthew lists the names of the twelve disciples, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word *apostle* when referring to the Twelve. The word *apostle* means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission.

Este es un momento de transición en el Evangelio de Mateo. El foco ha pasado del ministerio de Jesús al trabajo de la comunidad que Él ha inaugurado. Más que cualquier otro Evangelio, el Evangelio de Mateo elabora sobre el trabajo de la Iglesia, que debe continuar después de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús.

El Evangelio informa que Jesús comisiona a doce discípulos. Muchos eruditos creen que los doce discípulos simbolizan las doce tribus de Israel. Designa, por tanto, la continuidad entre Israel y la Iglesia.

Mateo enumera los nombres de los doce discípulos, al igual que Marcos y Lucas. Mateo también usa la palabra apóstol cuando se refiere a los Doce. La palabra apóstol significa "uno que es enviado". En este contexto, Mateo está llamando la atención sobre la misión que se les está dando a los doce discípulos. Son enviados por Jesús para proclamar el reino de los cielos en palabra y obra.

Así como Jesús envió a sus discípulos a continuar su obra y misión, así también la Iglesia es enviada por Jesús. La Iglesia es su presencia continua en la tierra. Cada miembro de la Iglesia es enviado por Jesús para contribuir a esta misión.

♣ A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR **♣**

JUNE 18, 2023

- I I think you would agree with me with the concept that: certain people have been put in your life for a reason.
- --to make you grow, make you journey along the path of conversion, to challenge you, to support you and bring out the goodness in you.
 - --not everybody, but most people have been put there for a reason.
- --and you too have been put into someone's life for a a reason....to move them forward on the journey of conversion. To bring out the best in them.

STORY: growing up in the 70s, our Dad / Father was a policeman in the Bronx not too far from Yankee Stadium. In fact we used to go to many games as we were all avid Yankee Fans.

Well one evening coming home late from a night game that went into extra innings on a school night. Our father said he had to stop by the Station house his Preceint #48 to pick something up.

We were taking the narrow side streets as a short cut. Well low and behold he made a turn and in the middle of the street was what looked like a human being just lying there.

Dad put the car in Park and jumped out and ran over to the person. He was bleeding. Dad picked him up and carried him over to the car, he yelled, "kids get in the front seat." He put the man in the back seat. He had a long black over coat on and curls on the side of his head.

We drove straight to Bronx Lebanon Hospital on the Grand Concourse into the Emergency area parking lot. My Dod picked up the man and carried him into the Hospital.

We got back home to Hicksville and Mom was waiting up for us. My brother and I told her how Dad saved some man's life, he was shot and put him in the back seat of the Dodge and brought him to the Hospital. All Mom could hear was that Dad put a bleeding man in the car with her children.

The next day when dad went into work he stopped by the hospital to inquire about the man. He was a Hasidic Jew and a local store owner who was held up and shot and left for dead in the street. DAD SAVED HIS LIFE.

This is one of many stories of HOW GIVING MY FATHER IS. Anyone who knows him, he is the most giving person you will ever meet. Don't ever go to lunch or dinner with him and try to pick up the check. He will fight you for it. I have seen him and my Uncle Phil wrestle on the floor over the bill. It's embarrassing.

ANOTHER EXAMPLE: If you tell him you are coming into NYC on an airline flight. He will immediately offer to pick you up at the airport, no matter what the hour. No questions asked. Anyone who knows my Dad would say he is the most generous person they know.

A With all this said: Part of the reason I became a priest is because my Dad is so giving. It was instilled in me by my Father's example. Now if you tell me you are arriving at JFK on such and such a date. I WILL SUGGEST YOU TAKE UBER.

As many of you know, the foundation of any ministry is giving of oneself: time, abilities, gifts.

- --We recall those very cryptic words at the end of the Gospel: Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."
- --This is the foundation of all ministries: Lector, Eucharistic Minister, Consolation, Priest, Deacon, Mom and Dad of a family. I know being a priest is important, I am responsible for souls.....but a mother and father of children...you are responsible for a human life....


- II In our Gospel... our Lord looks out at the people and has compassion for them, there are so many he can't minister to all of them....even 24/7. They are like sheep without a Shepherd.
- --this is why our Lord CALLS AND DISPUTES his 12 Apostles to carry on his ministry, to become the church.
- --scholars say Jesus had about 500 DISCIPLES (disciple means One Who Follows) and of course only 12 APOSTLES (APOSTLE MEANS ONE WHO IS SENT)
- --By deputing the Apostles and sending them out: OUR LORD IS EXPONENTIALLY EXPANDING HIS MINISTRY...
- --The apostle are the foundation of the Church with the Pope. The Bishops are the descendants of the Apostles.
- -- The apostles are sent to: HEAL, PREACH AND TEACH.
 - ---basically to bring HOPE to people

We share in the ministry of the Bishops: you by virtue of your baptism and me by virtue of Baptism and Priesthood.

- --we may not be able to heal but we can share the GOOD NEWS with people who need to hear it.
- -- The Good News of Jesus Christ can alleviate someone's emotional pain and lessen their suffering and torment.
- --WE TOO ARE SENT/ WE TOO ARE PUT INTO PEOPLES LIVES FOR A REASON... to move them along the journey of conversion.
 - --by our example
 - --by challenging them: prejudices,
- --We too are called to share the GOOD NEWS with people in our lives because God has sent us to them. We do this by our words and by example of living, like my Dad.
- --SUMMARY OF THE GOOD NEWS: GOD IS ALL LOVING, GOD IS ALL MERCIFUL, GOD IS VERY NEAR TO US.
- --Now if more people would recognize that they too are sent, like the Apostles, That they too have been given a ministry to do....they would be more open to and exercise more initiative to share the GOOD NEWS.
- --This has been one of the biggest problems with Catholicism for 2000 years: PASSIVITY its between God and me. I am only responsible for myself.
- --this is not the case: WE ARE RESPONSILBLE FOR ONE ANOTHER....if fact we have been sent to individuals to share the Good News with them to lessen their suffering, heal their pain., help them be well.
- --YOU SEE THE POINT: we have been put into people's lives.....WE HAVE BEEN SENT / SOME PEOPLE NEED TO HEAR FROM OTHERS ABOUT GOD'S MERCY AND FORGIVENESS....:to people proclaim the Good News that God is with them and want's them to be well.

CONCLUSION: We have all been sent in some way to bring the Good News to someone in our life

--those of you who are DADS out there....please recognize that YOU ESPECIALLY HAVE BEEN SENT to be a blessing in your family's life.


