## DEACON'S CORNER



In today's Gospel Jesus and the religious leaders in Jerusalem continue their tense exchange of questions and challenges. At this point the disciples of the Pharisees, together with the Herodians, try to entrap Jesus by their question about the payment of taxes.

Jesus' response to this attempt to trap him exposes the guile of his questioners. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Avoiding the question of lawfulness altogether, Jesus answers their question

with simple logic. Then, going further still, Jesus tells them that their obligation is to pay to God that which belongs to God.

Jesus' response to the Herodians and Pharisees suggests the ethic that Christians ought to adopt. It reminds us of the importance of keeping things in their proper perspective. Do we attach ourselves to worldly things at the expense of the love and honor that we owe to God?

## EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús y los líderes religiosos de Jerusalén continúan su tenso intercambio de preguntas y desafíos. En este momento los discípulos de los fariseos, junto con los herodianos, intentan atrapar a Jesús con su pregunta sobre el pago de los impuestos.

La respuesta de Jesús a este intento de atraparlo expone la astucia de quienes lo interrogan. Pide a sus interlocutores que examinen la moneda. Jesús acepta que es la imagen de César en la moneda y les dice que debe pertenecer a César. Evitando por completo la cuestión de la legalidad, Jesús responde a su pregunta con una lógica sencilla. Luego, yendo aún más lejos, Jesús les dice que su obligación es pagar a Dios lo que es de Dios.

La respuesta de Jesús a los herodianos y fariseos sugiere la ética que los cristianos deberían adoptar. Nos recuerda la importancia de mantener las cosas en su perspectiva adecuada. ¿Nos apegamos a las cosas mundanas a expensas del amor y el honor que le debemos a Dios?

#### Pastor's Message

- I. We are all familiar with President Kennedy's words in his Inaugural address in 1961 "My fellow Americans, ask not what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country "----If we were to apply today's Gospel to these words, they would say, "Don't ask, 'What can God do for you?' Instead ask, 'What you can do for God?" This raises the question: Do we owe God anything?
- ---Two weeks ago: Parable of the Wicked Stewards: Owner planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, put in a grape press, built a tower, and went off to a foreign land (expecting the RENT at the appropriate times) RAISES THE QUESTION: Do we owe God Rent? Anything?
- ---We owe God our faithfulness, our gratitude, giving something back.
- --(if you are a Mom or Dad and your child comes to you: I don't trust in you anymore...I don't believe in you...)--People do this to God all the time through their lack of faithfulness... GOD WANTS OUR FAITFULNESS—God wants us to open our hearts to him: HE WANTS OUR HONESTY:
- B (ANECDOTE: HONESTY) local **Catholic High School teacher** used to say to his class before every exam: "Today I am giving two exams—one in trigonometry and the other in honesty. I hope you will pass them both. ---If you fail, fail for trigonometry. There are many good people in the world who CAN'T PASS TRIGONOMETRY, but they CAN PASS THE EXAM OF HONESTY.
- II. Gospel: we just finished with 3 parables of judgement. Now the Pharisees, Herodians, Sadducees are on the offensive (even the 3 are enemies) and they ask our Lord 4 questions to try to trap him and undermine him.
- --Israel was occupied by the pagan Romans at the time, and as all OCCUPYERS do they made the Jews pay a tax which had to be paid in money used by the Romans>>>DENARIUS (equivalent 2 days wages).
- -- The Jews were forced to pay three types of tax to the Roman emperor: the **ground** tax, the income tax, and the census tax. Here, the question concerned the census tax. --Romans believed that CAESER/EMPEROR was of divine origin (they in fact believed in many gods (small g).

- --So, for a devout Jew to carry around or to touch the GRAVEN IMAGE of another DEITY would have rendered that person RITUALLY IMPURE
- --interestingly enough our Lord does not have such a coin, yet the religious leaders can readily produce one.
- A. When our Lord says, "REPAY TO CAESER WHAT IS CEASERS." he recognizes that the image of Caeser is on this coin than return it to Caeser.\
  --We can also infer from our Lord's statement that we have certain civic responsibilities: pay taxes, serve our country, vote, etc.....
- B. However, the question is: WHAT DO WE PAY TO GOD? (two weeks ago) WHAT DO WE OWE GOD?

(two weeks ago: FAITHFULNESS, GRATITUDE, BUILD HIS KINGDOM (OUR TIME AND ABILITIES)

- --(NOW) When a human being is conceived: the GRAVEN IMAGE of God is imprinted on our hearts/on our souls. We can say that our purpose, AS WE JOURNEY THROUGH THIS LIFE is to respect and love that IMAGO DEI: that image of GOD in ourselves and in one another.
- --what we give back to God is a pure heart with his image blazoned on it.
  -----WHAT WE OWE GOD IS THAT WE NOT TARNISH HIS IMAGE
  ENGRAVED ON OUR HEARTS.
- C. This is why the Israelites were prohibited from having any graven images of YAHWEH, ever; that when Jesus Christ came into the world>>those who placed faith in him would look at his face and see the DIVINE IMAGE of GOD.
- D. Our problem is that we DEFACE THAT IMAGE of GOD on our HEARTS when we allow our hearts to be filled with: HATRED, PREJUDICE, JEALOUSEY, IMMORALIY, when we are UNFORGIVING, when we are SELFISH AND UNCARING ABOUT THE POOR.
- III. <u>We have what is called a Dual Citizenship</u>: we are citizens of the country we've been born in---so we have a legal obligation to pay taxes, fulfill our civic duty, be productive and functioning citizens.
- ----However, when we <u>were baptized</u>: we also became citizens of Heaven and of the Kingdom of God---to whom we have a greater responsibility and a greater debt-OUR VERY LIVES.






