



# DEACON'S CORNER



Mary and Joseph's presentation of Jesus at the Temple demonstrates their adherence to Jewish law and tradition. This act exemplifies the importance of religious customs and rites in nurturing family faith and identity. The recognition of Jesus as the Messiah by Simeon and Anna symbolizes the discernment of God's presence in our lives. Their prophetic insights highlight the role of wisdom and spiritual maturity in recognizing God's work in the world.

Simeon's prophecy about Jesus being a sign that will be contradicted, and Mary's heart being pierced by a sword, foreshadows the suffering and opposition that Jesus and His followers will encounter. This

theme speaks to the reality of suffering in the Christian journey and the cost of redemption.

Anna's response of praise and speaking about the child to all highlights the joy and evangelistic zeal that comes from encountering Christ. This theme encourages sharing the good news with others, driven by joyous experience.

The entire episode reflects the virtues of the Holy Family: obedience, faith, patience, and humility. It offers a model for Christian families in living a life centered on God and His purposes. The final verse, mentioning Jesus growing and becoming strong, filled with wisdom, and the grace of God being upon Him, emphasizes the importance of growth in virtue and grace. It is a reminder that spiritual and moral development is a lifelong process nurtured within the family.

# EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

La presentación de Jesús por parte de María y José en el templo demuestra su adhesión a la ley y la tradición judías. Esta ley ejemplifica la importancia de las costumbres y ritos religiosos para fomentar la fe y la identidad familiar. El reconocimiento de Jesús como el Mesías por parte de Simeón y Ana simboliza el discernimiento de la presencia de Dios en nuestras vidas. Sus ideas proféticas resaltan el papel de la sabiduría y la madurez espiritual en el reconocimiento de la obra de Dios en el mundo. La profecía de Simeón acerca de que Jesús será una señal que será contradicha y el corazón de María traspasado por una espada, presagia el sufrimiento y la oposición que Jesús y sus seguidores encontrarán. Este tema habla de la realidad del sufrimiento en el camino cristiano y el costo de la redención. La respuesta de Anna de alabanza y hablar sobre el niño a todos resalta el gozo y el celo evangelístico que surge del encuentro con Cristo. Este tema anima a compartir las buenas nuevas con los demás, impulsado por una espaca.

Todo el episodio refleja las virtudes de la Sagrada Familia: obediencia, fe, paciencia y humildad. Ofrece un modelo para que las familias cristianas vivan una vida centrada en Dios y sus propósitos. El último versículo, que menciona a Jesús creciendo y haciéndose fuerte, lleno de sabiduría y con la gracia de Dios sobre Él, enfatiza la importancia del crecimiento en virtud y gracia. Es un recordatorio de que el desarrollo espiritual y moral es un proceso que dura toda la vida y se cultiva dentro de la familia.

## Holy Family Sunday

**I STORY**; Pope Francis said that as a child, he heard a story of a family with a mother, father, many children, and a grandfather. The grandfather, suffering from Parkinson's illness, would drop food on the dining table, and smear it all over his face when he ate. His son considered it disgusting. Hence, one day he bought a <u>small table</u> and set it off to the side of the dining hall so the grandfather would eat, make a mess, and not disturb the rest of the family. One day, the grandfather's son came home and found one of his sons playing with a <u>piece of wood</u>. "What are you making?" he asked his son. "A table," the son replies. "Why?" the father asks. "It's for you, Dad, when you get old like grandpa, I am going to give you this table." Ever since that day, the grandpa was given a prominent seat at the dining table and all the help he needed in eating by his son and daughter-in-law. "

---"Grandparents are a <u>treasure</u>," " A society or community that does not value, respect, and care for its elderly members "doesn't have a future because it has no memory, it's lost its memory,".

**METAPHOR/IMAGE:** OCANEE DINER, OLDER COUPLE HAVING LUNCH, NOT SPEAKING BUT COMMUNICATING, TIME TOGETHER IS SACRED/HOLY

--Now let's speculate they have two/three children/ each of whom have two/three children ...We just have to fathom the LIFE AND LOVE THIS ELDERLY COUPLE HAS POURED OUT INTO EACH OTHER (OVER A LIFETIME) AND INTO THEIR FAMILY.....

--THAT AS THEY SIT THERE IN THEIR QUIET, THEY HAVE AND ARE COMMUNICATING VOLUMES.

---FAMILY LIFE IS HOLY/ FAMILY LIFE IS SACRED.....It is no surprise that on the Sunday after Christmas we always celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family.

---Our Lord was born into a human family.

## MESSAGE: FAMILY LIFE IS SACRED AND HOLY!

II Subtitle to today's feast: Back to the basics of family life.

--This Feast is new in a Church 2000 years old.

A. Its Origin is in the 17th Century, Industrial Revolution Europe

B. People moved from an Agrarian based society, working in the fields, to an industrial based society, working in factories. People moved in from the countryside to the cities.

--Parents and children began to work 16-hour days

--family life began to breakdown

--social problems eg. crime, substance abuse, etc... began

C. The Church responded prophetically...

--Pope Leo XIII instituted Feast to Holy Family in 1893 to give families a model of Family Life.

-It was -made universal Feast in Church in 1921 by Benedict XV to fight against SECULARISM

III. LIFE OF THE HOLY FAMILY WAS VERY REAL: It was not a "picture postcard":

--- as IMMEGRANTS HAD TO FLEE for their lives into Egypt ...

--Joseph was a hard-working father who possibly died very young as we don't hear of him later in Jesus' life... and Mary a hard working mother. Life was not easy....

---Mary endured great hardship as the Mother of God (Simeon's prophesy: sword piercing her heart), watching her son suffer and die...

IV. Family Unit: How should we define family life today: Back to the Basics:

--Yes, today we have the reality of **same sex couples adopting children**...**THESE ARE REALITIES**....

-- the Church however continues to hold up the Holy Family as a model of family life/unit.

--family consists of: Mother, Father, children, or Single Parent with children (divorce).

A. **Family Relationships:** Paul's letter to the Colossians using Household Code. Also found in Corinthians. It is a style of literature found in the Ancient Greek world adapted by Paul to get across to his listeners, how to live in Right Relationship with one another.

offers us some insight: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, bearing with one another, forgiveness, and gratitude.

--In the verses before this he says:

--Husbands and wives love one another

--children obey your parents

--parents don't provoke (be overbearing) on your children

--RESPECT, LOVE, COMPASSION, FORGIVENESS IS VERY IMPORTANT

**FICTIONAL HUMEROUS STORY: IMPORTANCE OF FORGIVENESS:** In Ernest Hemingway's short story, a Spanish newspaper carried a poignant story about a father and his son. It went like this. A teen-aged boy, FRANCISCO (Paco), and his father had a falling out and the young man ran away from home. The father was crushed. After a few days, he realized that the boy was serious, so the father set out to find him. He searched high and low for five months to no avail. Finally, in a last, desperate attempt to find his son, the father put an ad in a Madrid newspaper. The ad read, "Dear Paco, Meet me at the Hotel Montana at noon Tuesday. All is forgiven. I love you. Signed, Your Father. On Tuesday, in the office of Hotel Montana, over 800 Pacos showed up, looking for love and forgiveness from their fathers!! What a magnet that ad was. Over 800 Pacos!! The feast of the Holy Family reminds

us that we need more loving, forgiving fathers and mothers.

B. Family priorities:

--Family Life centered on God: FAITH (eg. pray together, attend mass together, etc...)--religious formation of children.

--AS I SAY AT BAPTISMS: CHIDREN KNOW INSTINCTIVELY WHAT IS IMPORTANT TO THEIR PARENTS: IF **FAITH** and FAMILY LIFE ARE PRIORITIES TO THE PARENTS THEY WILL BE IMPORTANT TO THE CHILDREN.

---WE REFER TO THE FAMILY AS THE : **DOMESTIC CHURCH**...it is where the FAITH and VALUES are lived and modeled for the children.

--spend time together--how many families have dinner together?

--how many have the TV on while eating??

STORY: AGAIN, THE IMPORTANCE OF CARING FOR THE ELDERLY: In an audience <u>Pope Paul</u> <u>VI</u> told how one day, when he was Archbishop of Milan, he went out <u>on parish visitation</u>. During the course of the visitation, he found an old woman living alone. 'How are you?' he asked her. 'Not bad,' she answered. 'I have enough food, and I'm not suffering from the cold.' 'You must be reasonably happy then?' he said. 'No, I'm not', she said as she started to cry. 'You see, my son and daughter-in-law never come to see me. I'm dying of loneliness.' Afterwards he was haunted by the phrase 'I'm dying of loneliness'. And the Pope concluded: People need something more. They need our presence, our time, our love. They need to be touched, to be reassured that they are not forgotten.'

C. Lord widens concept of family: "Blood is thicker than water" well according to our Lord, "FAITH RUNS DEEPER THAN BLOOD RELATIONS" eg. our ties of faith in Jesus bind us together and in a deeper way than our own family ties.

--our Lord says, "who is my mother and who are my brothers and sisters? Those who do the will of my father."

--Sometimes THE REALITY IS we have more in common and spend more time with members of our Spiritual family than we do with members of our biological family members.

**Conclusion:** WE ARE REMINDED TODAY THAT FAMILY LIFE IS SACRED AND HOLY. Today's Feast reminds us of the basics and fundamentals of family life.

---Family life Again its back to the basics: The reason why family life is so important to the Church is that the Church is responsible to continue the building up of the Reign of God (Christ's mission). Jesus is building his Kingdom in our world, brick by brick or family by family. This is why the health of family life is so important.


