


The De La Salle School—Catholic Lasallian School for young men Grades 5-8

Touch with pity the hearts of those women pregnant in our world today who are not thinking of motherhood.


Help them to see that the child they carry is made in Your image - as well as theirs - made for eternal life.

Dispel their fear and selfishness and give them true womanly hearts to love their babies and give them birth and all the needed care that a mother can give.



DEACON'S CORNER



"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." (See Saint Mark 1:14-20) These words of Jesus to His disciples in today's Gospel resound in our ears with radiant power because we know Jesus is also telling us to follow Him and become fishers of men. You may say, but I am not a preacher. But, you see, a fisher of men does not need to preach—at least not always. In fact, St. Francis of Assisi said: "Preach the Gospel at all times and when necessary, use words." What did he

mean? Simply this: Your way of life, the way you treat others, should be such that no words are necessary. People will see and hear Jesus when you act and speak. For some people, we may be the only glimmer of Jesus that they will ever see. Take the example of the Blessed Mother. In all the Gospel narratives Mary spoke very seldom. Yet, each one of her expressions was backed up by a life of simple faith. Take for instance: "Do whatever He tells you." (Saint John 2:5) It is safe to say that even though Mary was not a preacher, she certainly became a fisher of men, and her catch will continue to grow throughout the centuries, all for the glory of Her Divine Son. May we follow Him and, on the way, become fishers of men!

Pastor's Message Third Sunday Ordinary Time / 2024

I.-- Pope Francis instituted the Fourth Sunday of January as the Word of God Sunday to highlight the importance of Sacred Scripture in our lives. He encourages believers to read the Bible and be nurtured by its divinely inspired words. Most important, we are fed in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we believe in the real presence in the consecrated bread and wine. We are fed in the Liturgy of the Word through the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures. The lectionary is just a book but in the proclamation of the words God is present. We have to imagine that as a scriptural reading is proclaimed the words are being swept off the page in a kind of sacred steam/vapor that envelopes the community of listeners. That holy steam penetrates their ears, minds, and hearts. This is why the Liturgy of the Word feeds us. There was a time when people would say their Rosary or other prayers during the Liturgy of the Word and then paid attention during the Eucharist because it was more important. The Eucharist is the pinnacle of our faith, but both the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist are equally important. We are fed and nurtured by both.

II.-- What is Gods' Word saying to us?

The first reading from the Book of Jonah is about the reluctant prophet. Jonah was called by Yahweh to call the Ninevites to repentance. But Jonah did not accept Yahweh's call and ran the other way. However, no one is going to avoid Gods will for them. Jonah was on a boat that was being tossed about in the waves. He knew that it was because Yahweh wanted him to go back to Nineveh. So, Jonah is thrown into the water. He is swallowed up by a whale and spewed back up on the shores of Nineveh to complete what God was asking of him. As Jonah begins preaching repentance in Nineveh the entire city repents.

POINT: when God calls you to a vocation or to do something, there is almost no way to avoid doing it. I know couples who can say it was destiny they be together. It was Gods strong arm that brought them together.

Myself as a priest or any other priest, God called us to be a priest and I can't see myself doing anything else.

Responsorial Psalm: The 150 Psalms were written by King David and are a great source of wisdom and spirituality. The Psalm for this week could be used as a mantra for prayer and repeated over and over: Teach me your ways, O Lord.

In the Second Reading, The first verse reminds me of the comedian Henny Youngman: take my wife please (those of you having wives act as if you don't have a wife). Paul, in his earlier letters believed and taught that Jesus was going to come back soon, the Parousia, the second coming. He urges the Christian community in Corinth to lose no time in accepting the message of the Gospel (married couples stay chaste) because the *second coming* may occur at any moment.

MESSAGE FOR US: the second coming for us is the end of our lives, to be ready. To live in the right relationship with others and reconcile immediately with others sooner than later because later may never come. Remember we forgive others not to let them "off the hook", we forgive others to allow healing in our heart. To say those important words to spouse and family members often because we don't know the moment or the hour,

Gospel: We have the call of the first disciples :The scene of the Gospel reading is immediately after Jesus' baptism; he now calls his first disciples. Notice their response to the Lord's calling was immediate and complete they drop everything and follow our Lord. In our Lord's time usually, students sought out their teachers and kind of "attached" themselves to a teacher. Here Jesus takes the initiative and calls his disciples/students. They were simple fishermen with no great backgrounds. Jesus needs ordinary men who will give all of themselves. Christ was interested more in their availability than their ability. Jesus does not give his disciples a course to study but a way of life to follow. Discipleship in Marks Gospel: being with Jesus and sharing in his mission.

POINT: Last week the message was that God is constantly communicating with us (speak Lord your servant is listening) Are we listening?

He calls all people to holiness or wholeness meaning to be more Christ-like. Secondly, people are called via a path (discipleship) in life eg, Holy Orders, marriage, religious life, mom / dad of of family.

In this Gospel He calls his disciples and gives them(and all believers) the task of spreading the Good News. Succinctly stated: God is all loving, all merciful, and very near to us. All believers are called to discipleship to be fishers of men and share the Good News with people who need to hear it. Our faith was never meant to be a private "thing". It is meant to be shared. I am sure there is someone in your life right now that needs to hear that Christ is close to them and loves them infinitely. He doesn't want them to suffer. III On this the Word of God Sunday, the saints would maintain that one of the best ways we can be nurtured by scripture is by using it in prayer. I am an advocate of repeating scripture in a mantra under one's breath as you go through the day. While you are driving, at work, walking, rather than adding more noise just in a low voice under your breath repeat a verse of scripture. This helps us stay connected to our Lord and not be distracted by (eg. worries, events, etc.). Remember prayer is about relationship about connection with our Lord. If you can go through the day with your consciousness (soul) even partially focused/connected to our Lord, you will have peace in our heart. This could be a very good form of prayer for obsessive / compulsive people. As with all things it is a discipline you have to keep at it every day.

The following are some brief summary passages that can be repeated over and over again as you go through the day. In the entire Bible the list is endless:

--Jesus Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ have mercy on me a sinner

(paraphrase of the verses)

--Be my strength Lord : Isaiah 40:31

--My heart is glad Lord when you are at my side: Psalm 16:8-10

--Give me peace and hope Lord in my heart : Jeremiah 29:11

-- God you are always with me : Zephaniah 3:17

- -- Fill me with your hope, joy, peace o Lord : Romans 15:13
- --Lord you are my hope and my salvation : Romans 8:24-26

-- I will fear not, because you are with me Lord : Deuteronomy 31:6

--Lord wipe away all my tears : Revelation 21:4




