

DEACON'S CORNER

The feeling of someone being isolated can be traumatic for we are social beings meant to be in a family/community and not in some isolated corner. It is painful to be treated like an enemy by your own family, friends, and the community due to a sickness that you never invited into your body; that's why we see a very desperate leper coming to Jesus for help; he was tired of living a lonely life, dining alone and watching people run away from him whenever he approaches them. When he got to Jesus, he knelt at His feet and begged Him to heal him from this deadly sickness that separated him from the rest of the members of the community. In his request he said to Jesus, "If you will, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, Jesus stretches His hand and touches the sick man and says, "I will; be clean." And immediately the leprosy left him. See Saint Mark 1:40-45.

No matter how bad the situation was, the leper didn't demand healing from Jesus but in humility he allowed the will of God to take lead in his life for he knew that Jesus had the best interest at heart for him. Probably life would be much better if we could always humble ourselves at the feet of Jesus whenever we need to pray, whether a thanksgiving prayer or a prayer of request and allow the will of God to be done in our lives, trusting in His mercy and love. When you feel lonely, abandoned, when others are busy gossiping about you, laughing at you and doing all sorts of things to degrade your human dignity, remember Jesus is always there to embrace you, to heal both your physical and spiritual sicknesses, give you words of hope and courage and finally re-integrate you back to the family of believers for His unfailing love endures forever.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

La sensación de que alguien está aislado puede ser traumática porque somos seres sociales destinados a estar en una familia/comunidad y no en un rincón aislado. Es doloroso ser tratado como un enemigo por tu propia familia, amigos y la comunidad debido a una enfermedad que nunca invitaste a entrar en tu cuerpo; por eso vemos a un leproso muy desesperado acudiendo a Jesús en busca de ayuda; Estaba cansado de vivir una vida solitaria, cenar solo y ver a la gente huir de él cada vez que se acercaba a ellos. Cuando llegó junto a Jesús, se arrodilló a Sus pies y le suplicó que lo sanara de esta enfermedad mortal que lo separaba del resto de los miembros de la comunidad. En su petición le dijo a Jesús: "Si quieres, puedes limpiarme". Movido por compasión, Jesús extiende la mano y toca al enfermo y le dice: "Quiero; sé limpio". Y al momento la lepra lo abandonó. Ver San *Marcos 1, 40-45*. No importa cuán mala fuera la situación, el leproso no exigió la curación de Jesús, pero con humildad permitió que la voluntad de Dios tomara la iniciativa en su vida porque sabía que Jesús tenía el mejor interés para él. Probablemente la vida sería mucho mejor si siempre pudiéramos humillarnos a los pies de Jesús cada vez que necesitemos orar, ya sea una oración de acción de gracias o de petición y permitir que se haga la voluntad de Dios en nuestras vidas, confiando en su misericordia y amar. Cuando te sientas solo, abandonado, cuando otros están ocupados chismeando sobre ti, riéndose de ti y haciendo todo tipo de cosas para degradar tu dignidad humana, recuerda que Jesús siempre está ahí para abrazarte, para sanar tus enfermedades físicas y espirituales, darte palabras de esperanza y valentía y finalmente reintegrarte nuevamente a la familia de creyentes Díácono Bruce porque su amor inagotable perdura para siempre.



Pastor's Message Sixth Sunday Ordinary Time / 2024

- I. We continue with the theme of SUFFERING: Why is there so much suffering and pain in the world, and where is God when we face suffering?
- ---LAST WEEK: FIRST READING: JOB: Why do bad things happen to good people? CHALLENGE THE BELIEF THAT IF YOU WERE POOR, SICK, DEFORMED, ETC. YOU WERE PAYING FOR YOUR SINS OR YOUR ANCESTOR'S.
- ---POINT OF JOB: IT IS JOB'S FAITHFULNESS TO GOD THAT GETS HIM THROUGH SO THAT ALL THAT JOB LOST (wife, family, home, farm, health) IS RESTORED.
- ---IT IS OUR FAITHFULNESS IN TIMES OF SUFFERING AND PAIN, THAT GOD IS NEAR US: WILL GET US THROUGH.

(we do have to keep in mind that when we are PRAYING / FAITHFUL, and someone dies, it doesn't mean our prayer has failed, it just means that HEAVEN IS OUR DESTINY.)

- ---Book: AFTER AUSCHWITZ: asks how is it even possible for a Jew to believe in God after the Holocaust.—How does God allow such EVIL?
- A Harold Kushner (JEWISH TRADITION): argues that God loves us infinitely, but he MAINTAINS THAT GOD ISN'T ALL POWERFUL THAT THERE IS SOME SUFFERING HE CAN'T STOP.
- B IN the Catholic Tradition (C.S. Lewis, Teilhard de Chardin, others) GOD IS NOT A RESCUING GOD BUT A REDEEMING GOD. HE DOESN'T PROTECT US FROM PAIN AND SUFFERING BUT RATHER ENTERS INTO IT AND ULTIMATELY REDEEMS IT.

GOOD EXAMPLE: FROM LAZARUS:

- --We recall in John's Gospel that when Jesus was told that Lazarus was gravely ill, our Lord, upon hearing the news stayed another 2 Days-where He was. When He finally went to Lazarus—whom he loved dearly, Lazarus had already died. Was dead for 4 days.
- --Martha and Mary both say to our Lord: If you had been here, we know that our Brother would not have died" Basically they were saying: Where were you when Lazarus was suffering?
- --But <u>Jesus enters into their suffering and pain when is says:</u> **Jesus Wept!**
- --IMPORTANT MESSAGE—that GOD doesn't miraculously rescue or save us from our suffering and pain--RATHER HE REDEEMS US WITH IT.

- --GOOD EXAMPLE: JESUS DYING on the CROSS—God the Father doesn't rescue GOD THE SON—rather he raised him from the dead.
- A. In today's Gospel it says, "Jesus takes pity on him and heals him immediately and completely. He then directs him to go to the priests for verification of his healing.
- --More than the other Evangelists, Mark gives attention to Jesus' emotions. He tells us that at the leper's request, Jesus was "moved with pity." His compassion was undoubtedly a factor in his positive response to the leper's request for healing.
- --"Leprosy" most likely refers **not to what we call Hansen's** disease but rather to various skin diseases that were then regarded as infectious.
- --Such conditions not only brought physical sufferings to the victim but also caused separation or quarantine from family and friends, and from Jewish society in general.
- --In restoring the man to physical health, Jesus was also returning him to full participation in human society and in the people of God.
- -- The FIRST READING from Leviticus 13": "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp." One can imagine the sadness and isolation that such persons had to endure.


Conclusion: Jesus here is not only as a powerful healer but also A GREAT UNIFYIER: HE BRINGS ISOLATED PEOPLE BACK TO THE COMMUNITY

- II. Paul is trying to RESOLVE A DISPUTE BETWEEN FACTIONS OF THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY: Eating meat and other foods that had been associated with rites in PAGAN TEMPLES:
 - A. the STRONG side felt there was no problem because the pagan gods did not exist anyway.
 - B. The WEAK side felt that eating such foods could involve PAGAN WORSHIP

Paul wanted to side with the Strong: but he also wanted to UNITE THE TWO SIDES as he was more concerned with UNITY and MUTUAL RESPECT.

- --Paul urges BOTH SIDES TO DO EVEYTING FOR THE GLORY OF GOD—RATHER THAN QUARREL
- --Paul here is CHALLENGING THE CORINTIANS TO STRIVE FOR AND AIM FOR HIGHER VALUES---that it is too easy to focus on the faults and mistakes of others and to become PRISONERS OF PETTY FAULTS AND MISTAKES OF OTHERS.

- --SO, PAUL PLACES BEFORE THEM THE NOBLEST VISION OF HUMAN EXISTENCE: <u>bo</u> **EVERYTHING FOR THE GLORY OF GOD**.
- --Paul points to his own example of trying to: PLEASE EVERYONG IN EVERY WAY...THAT THEY MAY BE SAVED."
- --Paul saw it as his mission to bring all kinds of people together (Jew and Gentile, slave and free, male, and female) to accept the GOOD NEWS.
- --His goal in pleasing others (IN BEING ALL THINGS TO ALL PEOPLE) WAS TO BRING THEM INTO RIGHT RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD AND THE KINGDOM.
- --PAUL CHALLENGES US TO IMITATE HIM--As He Imitates Christ--TO DO EVERYTHING FOR THE GLORY OF GOD.
- --HE CHALLEGES US TO BE A UNIFIER, NOT A DIVIDER AND TO DO EVERYTHING FOR THE GLORY OF GOD.





Finance Presentation

Talk given on January 20/21, 2024by Mr. Charles Shields, Chairperson of the Our Holy Redeemer Parish

I'm so grateful for all the Lord has given me, so grateful. Therefore, I support Our Holy Redeemer Parish both spiritually and financially. Ten months ago, during the Lenten season, at the behest of the parish finance council and Father Chris, I came before you and asked you for a \$5 increase in your weekly donation. That is just 72 cents more a day or only \$260 more spread over an entire year. I want to thank those of you who have participated in the \$5 more a week campaign. That effort has helped reduce our annual deficit.

So here's the good news and the bad news. The good news is financially, we did better in fiscal year 2023 than we did in fiscal 2022 thanks to the parishioners who recognized the need and increased their weekly donations. However, we're not out of the woods yet. The bad news is we are still operating at a deficit position. Please take home a bulletin today, which contains two parish financial pie charts – one pie chart of the parish's revenue and the other of the parish's expenses. You'll note that during fiscal year 2023 we still did not collect sufficient revenue to cover all the expenses for the year. Our annual expenses exceeded our annual revenue by over \$170,000. This deficit is a result of increased insurance costs of the diocese and the inflationary increase in costs in general coupled with collections, our main source of income, having not kept pace with the tripling of our expenses over the last 30 years. So, please pray over your donation decision as well as ask yourself if you are budgeting 10% of your income to charity as is expected from a good steward.

So, again, I am asking everyone to participate in the \$5 increase campaign and become a true steward and real participant in the solvency of our wonderful parish.

Estoy muy agradecido por todo lo que el Señor me ha dado, muy agradecido. Es por eso por lo que apoyo a la Parroquia Nuestro Santo Redentor tanto espiritual como económicamente. Hace diez meses, durante la temporada de Cuaresma, a instancias del Consejo Financiero Parroquial y del Padre Chris, me presenté ante ustedes y les pedí un aumento de \$5 en su donación semanal. Eso es sólo 72 centavos más por día o sólo 260 dólares más repartidos en todo un año. Quiero agradecer a aquellos de ustedes que han participado en la campaña de \$5 más a la semana. Ese esfuerzo ha ayudado a reducir nuestro déficit anual.

Así que aquí están las buenas y las malas noticias. La buena noticia es que, financieramente, nos fue mejor en el año fiscal 2023 que en el año fiscal 2022 gracias a los feligreses que reconocieron la necesidad y aumentaron sus donaciones semanales. Sin embargo, todavía no estamos fuera de peligro. La mala noticia es que todavía estamos operando en una posición deficitaria. Llévese a casa hoy un boletín que contiene dos gráficos circulares financieros de la parroquia: un gráfico circular de los ingresos de la parroquia y el otro de los gastos de la parroquia. Notará que durante el año fiscal 2023 todavía no recaudamos ingresos suficientes para cubrir todos los gastos del año. Nuestros gastos anuales excedieron nuestros ingresos anuales en más de \$170,000. Este déficit es el resultado del aumento de los costos de seguro de la diócesis y el aumento inflacionario de los costos en general, junto con las recaudaciones, nuestra principal fuente de ingresos, que no ha seguido el ritmo de triplicar nuestros gastos en los últimos 30 años. Por lo tanto, ore por su decisión de donar y pregúntese si está destinando el 10% de sus ingresos a organizaciones benéficas, como se espera de un buen administrador.

Entonces, nuevamente, les pido a todos que participen en la campaña de aumento de \$5 y se conviertan en verdaderos administradores y participantes reales en la solvencia de nuestra maravillosa parroquia.


