



DEACON'S CORNER



In the Gospel today the Transfiguration of Jesus offers a profound lesson for us in navigating the ups and downs of life. Imagine ascending a mountain with Jesus and His closest disciples, Peter, James, and John, on a serene day, away from the bustling crowds. This quiet hike suddenly unveils a miraculous moment: Jesus shines with an unearthly light, and Moses and Elijah, the revered heroes of faith, appear. Peter's wish to remain in this celestial moment underscores a universal longing for the divine. Yet, the voice of the Father declaring Jesus as His "Beloved" Son invites us to embrace both

the mountain top experiences and the inevitable return to daily life, carrying with us the light of Christ's presence and the Father's love.

Pastor's Message Second Sunday of Lent / 2024

STORY: I knew of an Older couple who lost their son Matthew, in his early 30s. He lived in Manhattan and had two ducks as pets, they had a very rare color, the feathers were (orange and pink color). One Sunday after the last Mass we went into Manhattan to see an art exhibit called **The Gates in Central Park**. We stood at the balcony of the Museum of Natural History, sipping a cappuccino—it was clear blue sky. All of a sudden, these two orange and pink feathers (what are the odds) fall out of the sky right in front of them.

What are the odds... they began shedding tears of Joy. For you and me they would mean nothing, but for this couple they took it as a sign that their son is in heaven and is OK.

--We can call this a **God Moment**, a **Mountain Top experience moment**, in the midst of their morning the loss of their son, they believed that those two feasters falling from the sky as a sign from God at all was going to be okay. On the way home the mom was texting pictures of the feathers to all family members so they too could share in the experience.

In life we have: GOD MOMENTS, QUINTESSENTIAL MOMENTS, A MOUNTAIN TOP EXPERIECE MOMENT... (only a couple of seconds): BUT THEY MAKE ALL THE DIFFERENCE IN THE WORLD... these moments give us courage, strength, assurance to continue

EXAMPLE: One of the most famous mountaintop experiences of our time is that of the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. We don't know when he had the experience but immediately after speaking about it, he was assassinated (April 4, 1968). These were the last words of his speech:

Well, I don't know what will happen now. We've got some difficult days ahead. But it doesn't matter with me now. Because I've been to the mountaintop. And I don't mind. Like anybody, I would like to live a long life. Longevity has its place. But I'm not concerned about that now. I just want to do God's will. And He's allowed me to go up to the mountain. And I've looked it over. And I've seen the promised land...

This speech prepared the followers of Martin Luther King and the Civil Rights Movement for his death. It prepared them for the TRAUMA they would suffer. These words of his impending death made all the difference in the world. It assured them that his death was part of God's plan in the long struggle for liberation.

King **compares** himself to Moses who led the Israelites from slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land. After a lifetime of faithful service Moses would not reach the Promised Land. However God allowed him to look upon the Promised Land.

NOW it is time to turn to Jerusalem (to his suffering and death) Jesus goes up a Mountain with his inner circle of disciples: God the father gives him ASSURANCE (with Moses and Elijah) COURAGE to turn to Jerusalem to his suffering and death..."THIS IS MY BELOVED SON. LISTEN TO HIM." Peter wants to memorialize the moment when he wants to BUILD THREE TENTS. MOSES: represents THE LAW. Elijah: represents the message of the Prophets and Justice...

POINT: HAVING THIS MOUNTIAN TOP EXPERIENCE:

God the Father gave Jesus (humanity) ASSURANCE: courage and strength to journey on to his passion and death.

- ---PETER, JAMES, JOHN: having had this experience (post-resurrection experience) would share it with the rest of the Apostles and give them: STRENGTH, COURAGE, ASSURANCE in difficult times after our Lord's death.
- -- these experiences GOD MOMENTS: MAKE ALL THE DIFFERNCE IN THE WORLD FOR US...

CONCLUSION/POINT: During this Lenten Season (microcosm of our lives) we WELCOM THESE GOD MOMENTS to ASSURE US, COURAGE, STENGTH TO CONTINUE ON.

THE FIRST READING HAS A POWERFUL MESSAGE FOR US: TO WALK BY FAITH. Story: A young faith filled couple that lives in Long Beach for years tried to have their own child. After numerous medical tests it turned out that she was unable to conceive. They prayed over it and finally decided to ADOPT a child. The highly recommended adoption agency obtained their newborn babies from Russia at the time.

- ---After several agonizing years and almost two hundred thousand dollars and several trips back and forth to Russia and the husband losing his job due to missed days of work: finally, they received into their home a 1-year-old child. THEY PUT THEIR FAITH IN GOD AND THEIR PRAYERS HAD BEEN ANSWERED. we can only imagine their dismay when SIX MONTHS later the child was in the hospital at death's door with an illness and the Doctors had NO HOPE.
- ---The husband said, "THERE IS NO POSSIBLE WAY THAT GOD HAS BROUTH US THIS FAR, PRAYING FOR A CHILD, FINALLY DECIDING TO ADOPT, FINALLY RECEIVING THE CHILD---AFTER THE PRAYER AND TEARS---TO HAVE THE CHILD DIE ON US. Their faith got them through....the child now an adult is studying to be a M.D. at Hofstra Medical School
- **B—IN THE FIRST READING**....we can only imagine their dismay---God promised Abraham many descendants (as many as the stars). So, when God asked Abraham and Sara to sacrifice their ONLY SON---for whom they prayed for dearly---day in and day out.
- ---This was the Son they prayed for and waited for up until their advanced years---even after Abraham fathered a child Ismael with Tamar... Sara's servant.
- ---So it was UNTHINKABLE that God would ask Abraham to sacrifice this only child that would bear Abraham and Sara's descendants.
- ---GOD WAS ASKING THEM TO WALK BY FAITH. THEY also concluded, if God has brought us this far... Then he is going to see us through this.

CONCLUSION: Thus, DURING THE LENTEN SEASON, we are called to WALK BY FAITH---to leave everything in God's hands---to surrender---THY WILL BE DONE.

POINT FOR US---one mountaintop experience / God moment: is all we need to wipe away our fears and doubt and give us: strength, courage, assurance to continue forward...TO WALK BY FAITH.

- ---Every day we are asked to walk in faith and trust. To face situations that we don't understand, to do things and go places that we would rather not do or go. We have all had our faith tested: The death of a loved one, an illness that causes us great pain, the loss of a job, the inability to prevent a war or conflict, hunger, and disease. The list can go on and on.
 ---We are invited to use this season of Lent as a time of reflection to remember that God is with us as we face the many challenges of our daily lives.
- **Our God asks us: Go, not knowing where. Take, not knowing what. The way is unknown. BUT TO KNOW THAT HE IS ALWAYS WITH US.**






DO YOU LISTEN TO HIM?




