Pastor's Message

Homily: Fifth Sunday Lent B 2024

Producing much fruit must include a deeper relationship with our Lord.

I.- During the entire Covid reality we had been praying for a lot of people. We believe in the power of prayers of intercession. No matter what ever the status of some one's soul God can intervene and heal that person or rectify a situation. Ultimately, we believe all things are possible with our God.

People would often say: Father Chris pray for so and so, they are in the hospital. Or for my uncle Frank who has Covid.

- --One of the questions I have reflected on a lot over the years is: healing.
- --Why are some people's prayers answered and others are not?
- --Why are some people healed and others are not?
- -- Is it a simple matter of faith?
- -- Then when some people say they are healed it seems so subjective, one can question if anything took place at all.
- -- Every time I minister Anointing of the Sick or Last Rites, I pray that the faith of the individual and family members gathered around is sufficient.
- --Some of the lines in today's Gospel, I believe, gives us insight into the criteria of having our prayers answered.
- -- The phrase is: "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. ----
- --These brief lines are a summary of the Paschal Mystery: Life→Death→leads to New Life.
- --Our purpose in this life: Is to draw closer to God, that as life moves forward to deepen our relationship with Him, to be as close to God as possible.
- -- This prepares us for our departure from this world and hopefully eternal existence in relationship with our God.
- --So that when people are confronted with a death (metaphoric death not just our demise). For example: the virus, disease, cancer, financial crisis, physical pain, emotional pain, hospitalization, etc.) these all require a dying to self, a profound suffering.

--Such a death can produce much fruit: this fruit has to be:

Actual healing or granting of miracle.

A deeper relationship with our Lord

Granting a person a miracle / healing has to result in a deeper relationship with our Lord.

POINT: we must encourage people who are suffering, who are going through a "death" in their life (virus, cancer, disease, broken marriage, hospital, etc.) hoping for a miracle THAT THEY HAVE TO open their hearts to our Lord in prayer. -- They have to be praying for themselves, in relationship with our Lord.

- -- The New Life is not just being healed; the new life must result in being closer to our Lord.
- -- This is the equivalent of bearing much fruit.

EXAMPLE: My mom had cancer for 10 years. In the end we had over 1,000 people praying for her healing. She died of cancer. In retrospect I don't think she was praying for herself. I think she was angry with God.

- --Her healing would not have produced more fruit in a deeper relationship with our Lord.
- --So, our Lord brought her home to heaven (not as a punishment) the deepest relationship of all.

Another Example: Fr Jim: in Fr Jim's case I believe he was already so close to our Lord in life that the next step had to be heaven.

POINT: we need encourage people who are going through a death, people who are struggling to turn to our Lord in prayer and draw closer to him.

--Part of the New Life/part of the producing much fruit: will be healing them / rectifying their situation but also having a deeper relationship with our Lord.

Conclusion: If you want to make a difference in someone's life encourage them to pray and nurture a friendship with our Lord



Pastor's Message

From Father Cedrick Pisegna Examination of Conscience

A person's conscience is our most secret core and our sanctuary. There we are alone with God whose voice echoes in our depths. (Catechism #1776)


The Spiritual and moral life is about going forward, moving and growing. As you examine your heart, your conscience, are there any areas where you feel stuck or are even going backwards? You must confront and confess these issues in order to move. In addition, you must be honest enough to try to get to the roots. As you surrender your issues and sins to the Lord, you can *trust God* for mercy, gentleness and healing.

Some issues to think about:

- 1) Anger: Are you angry with others, circumstances, self or God? Is there bitterness, resentment and non-forgiveness in your heart? Do you manage your anger by "exploding" or "imploding"? Possible roots of anger are: Perfectionism, grasping for control, unrealistic expectations, family of origin.
- 2) Relationships: Is there someone you need to forgive? Can you ask for the courage to pray for them now? Is there someone you need to confront about their behavior? Ask for the courage to do so and to do it in a non-threatening way. Are you striving to love the irritating and "unlovely" people in your life? Or do you just avoid them?
- 3) <u>Codependency</u>: Do you allow the behaviors and emotions of others to control and manipulate you? Are you a people pleaser and live in fear of what others think all the time? Do you stand up for yourself? Are you true to yourself? Roots: insecurity, fear of rejection.
- 4) Idols: What "catches" your eye in life? Is it out of balance shopping, T.V., excessive Internet, gambling, food, drinking, sex, travel, sports, or work? Are you impulsive, compulsive, obsessive and out of control in any of these areas? What would being in balance mean in these areas? Roots: Low self-image/body image, boredom, lack of control, frustration with life, loneliness, self-sabotage. The need to escape from external and/or internal pain.
- 5) Gossip: Do you build relationships with others based on ungodly talk and slander? Control? Manipulation? Possible roots are the need for acceptance and approval from others. Belittling others to make yourself feel more important. Insecurity.
- 6) <u>Lust</u>: Do you watch programs on T.V., explore the Internet or read books that are inappropriate? Does this lead to unwanted behaviors? Possible roots: Longing for God shifted to lust. Lack of contentment stemming from the need for excitement. Lack of self-control and immaturity. Simple rebelliousness and flippant disregard.
- 7) <u>Laziness</u>: Are you lazy in areas of personal health, relationships, work, and seeking God? Roots: Lack of self-control and discipline, immaturity, low self-esteem, selfishness, lack of integrity.
- 8) Pride: Exaggerated self-importance. Are you stubborn, controlling, insensitive, cynical, contentious, opinionated and slow to say you were wrong? Do you judge others harshly simply by appearance? Pride denies and hides issues. It has a need to always be right. Humility admits, confronts and confesses. Roots: "I" Selfishness, negative self-image, fear and insecurity.
- 9) Anything else? Is there any other area that you need to confront and look at in order to experience healing, forgiveness and go forward? Look at your relationship with God, others and self. Try to think not just about your issues, but possible roots. God Bless you as you confront, face your pain, confess and move forward!!

It is our sinfulness that nailed Christ to the cross!

Please take home a nail as part of your Lenten experience. Carry it in your pocket or purse for the duration of Lent. Let it be a reminder that it is our sinfulness that nailed Jesus to the cross. Bring the nail and your repentant heart to the Penance Service on Monday, March 18, at 7pm. Toss the nail back into the sanctuary as a symbol of your repentant heart.

He wrote: "Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.






