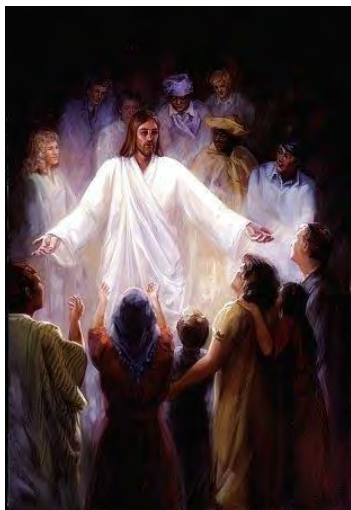

DEACON'S CORNER



“Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.” (See Saint Luke 24:35-48.) To break bread with someone means to eat with that person, to share a meal together. In Bible times you shared break with people you knew and with honored guests and visitors. People ate very close to each other. There was a great deal of intimacy in the breaking of bread. People usually reclined at tables over a cushion and over a mat. Sometimes a particular piece of food, such as bread, was passed on and shared by all of those present. People talked, recounted stories—in general they got to know each other well. As it was the case with the disciples in this Lucan account, it is in the sacred intimacy of the Communion Banquet that Jesus is made known to us. As a lovely song says: “We have come to tell our story, we have come to share our bread, we have come to know our rising from the dead.” As we come to Mass, we hear Jesus’ story, and as we meditate in His story, we realize that in effect it is also our own story. Then, we share the bread—the fruit of our labor that has become bread, is now transformed by the Holy Spirit in the body and blood of Christ and we all eat of it. We witness in the Sacrifice of the Altar His death and His rising. We are assured that we too will rise with Him. We turn around and give our brothers and sisters a greeting of peace; we unite our words and call God our Father as we recite the prayer that Jesus taught us. Yes, in the breaking of bread Jesus is made known to us.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

“Lo habían reconocido (a Jesús) al partir el pan.” (Ver San Lucas 24:35-48) Partir el pan con alguien significa comer con esa persona, compartir una comida con él o con ella. En tiempos bíblicos la gente compartía el pan con las personas que conocían o con huéspedes y visitantes a los que estaban honrando. La gente por lo general se reclinaba a la mesa sobre un cojín y una alfombra. A veces un artículo de alimento en especial era pasado de un comensal a otro para de ese modo compartirlo. La gente hablaba, se hacían historias, y usualmente llegaban a conocerse mejor. Como sucedió con los discípulos del relato del Evangelio de San Lucas, nosotros en la intimidad del banquete de Comunión llegamos a conocer a Jesús. Como un hermoso canto dice: Hemos venido a contar nuestra historia, hemos venido a compartir nuestro pan, hemos venido a conocer que nosotros también vamos a resucitar. Al venir a la Misa oímos la historia de Jesús, pero al meditar en la historia, nos damos cuenta de que en efecto también es nuestra historia. Entonces, compartimos el pan. El fruto de nuestra labor que se ha convertido en pan es entonces transformado por el Espíritu Santo en el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo. Presenciamos en el sacrificio del altar Su muerte y Su resurrección. Nos sentimos seguros de que nosotros también resucitaremos. Nos volvemos y nos damos unos a otros un saludo de paz, unimos nuestras voces y llamamos a Dios Padre Nuestro, a medida que recitamos la oración que Jesús nos dio. Sí, al partir el pan llegamos a conocer a Jesús.

Pastor's Message

Homily: III Sunday of Easter 2024

I You know there are no chance happenings in Life...THERE ARE NO COINCEDENCES IN LIFE (yes: there are tragedies, accidents, acts of nature, hurricanes, earthquakes>>>results of the Physical Order)

--EVERYTHING HAPPENS FOR A REASON (we, in this life, may never know that reason. We have to trust...).....God is so intrinsically involved in our lives, more than we ever know.

---There are no chance encounters in life: the people we meet and know God has put there for a purpose.

STORY: A young boy was walking home through the park after attending a Sunday school class. Somehow, he couldn't stop thinking about the lesson for that day about **Jesus' teaching on the Last Judgment**. What impressed him most was what the teacher said, "**When you give something to another person, you're really giving it to Jesus and you will find the risen Jesus in every one you meet IF YOU REALLY LOOK WITH FAITH.**" As he continued through the park, he noticed an old woman sitting on a bench. She looked lonely and hungry. So he sat down next to her, took a chocolate bar he had saved and offered some to her.

---She accepted it with a beautiful smile and he watched her smile as she chewed the chocolate. They sat there and chatted for a while.

---Finally, the boy got up to leave. As he began to walk away, he turned, ran back to the bench, and gave the woman a big hug. -----When he arrived home, his mother saw a big smile on his face and asked, "**What made you so happy today?**" He said, "I shared my chocolate bar with God." Before his mother could ask more questions, he added, "**You know, God has the most beautiful smile and is a lot older than I thought.**"

----- Meanwhile, the old woman returned to her little apartment where she lived with her sister. Her sister said, "You're all smiles," "What made you so happy today?"

---She replied, "I was sitting in the park, eating a chocolate bar with Jesus. And, you know, he's a lot younger than I expected."

---- POINT: we will meet and experience the risen Jesus in unexpected places and unexpected ways we just need to be looking.--Nothing is RANDOM in this life:

II The Easter Journey is part of our spiritual pilgrimage>>>and our maturing in faith. Are we attentive to God's closeness in our lives, IF NOT than we MISS OUT.....

Today's Gospel begins with the end of the Emmaus Journey when the two disciples recognized Jesus in the Eucharist.

(Geography and Direction are important in Luke's Gospel)

TO EMMAUS (7 miles away)

---Jesus begins walking with them. Yet they can't recognize him because:

Their faith is not MATURE enough to recognize the Risen Christ. (POINT: Do you have the faith to look out at the world and see the signs of new life? Do you see God's presence in the world...do you see how radically close he is to you. Can we look out at the world amidst all the brokenness and evil see signs of the Risen Christ?)

--THEY are LOST IN THEIR GRIEF (sadness & preoccupied empty tomb) at all that has gone on>>>they thought that Jesus was a prophet, messiah, miracle worker, savior.

---As he is speaking to them: their hearts are burning as he explains all of the scripture passages that refer to him as the

---Different expectations of the Messiah....They were expecting a Socio-Political Messiah who is going to restore Israel to its Glory Days....

---Jesus wants them to see he is a Spiritual Messiah.

---They misunderstand the purpose of Jesus....

POINT FOR US:

-WHAT EXPECTATIONS DO WE HAVE OF GOD?

--Do you expect that God is going to save the day and rescue you from: Financial woes, broken marriage, sickness, Darkness.....or does he JOURNEY WITH US COMFORTING US; GIVING STRENGTH WHEN WE NEED IT TO GET US THROUGH?

CONCLUSION: TO RECOGNIZE THE RISEN CHRIST REQUIRES FAITH.....

B LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: "when they arrived to the village to where they were going"

----first part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is the OFFERTORY...THEY OFFER THIS STRANGER HOSPITALITY...

----NB: it is only when we put ourselves out there / extend ourselves / move beyond our comfort zone THAT WE OPEN OURSELVES TO ENCOUNTER CHRIST.....

---THEY SAY TO JESUS/STRANGER: STAY WITH US...(Jesus / stranger takes the initiative and walks with them....they RECIPROCATE by saying: STAY WITH US.....

---(SAME WITH US: God calls us / we need to reciprocate)

---it is only after they extend hospitality to this stranger and they recline at table with him. This stranger than: TAKES, BLESSES, BREAKS, AND GIVES the bread to them. JESUS IS PRESENT TO THEM IN THE EUCHARIST....

----At that moment they recognize him and he vanishes.

CONCLUSION: What they couldn't recognize with their faith; they were given in the SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

BUT WHAT A MISSED OPPORTUNITY

---Can you Imagine being in the presence of the RISEN CHRIST (how their hearts were burning) and then NOT REALIZING IT? WHAT A MISSED OPPORTUNITY!

MESSAGE: that our Faith be mature enough that we recognize the RISEN CHRIST IN ALL PEOPLE....when we don't recognize him.....WE MISS OUT!.

**His coming to them and walking alongside of them illustrates the road to Emmaus is a road of companionship with Jesus who desires to walk with each of us.

-- "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). Jesus is with us even when we do not recognize him.

--No matter what happens in life, the Risen Jesus is always with us.

----. As Francis Thompson puts it, He is the Hound of Heaven who relentlessly follows us when we try to escape from His love.

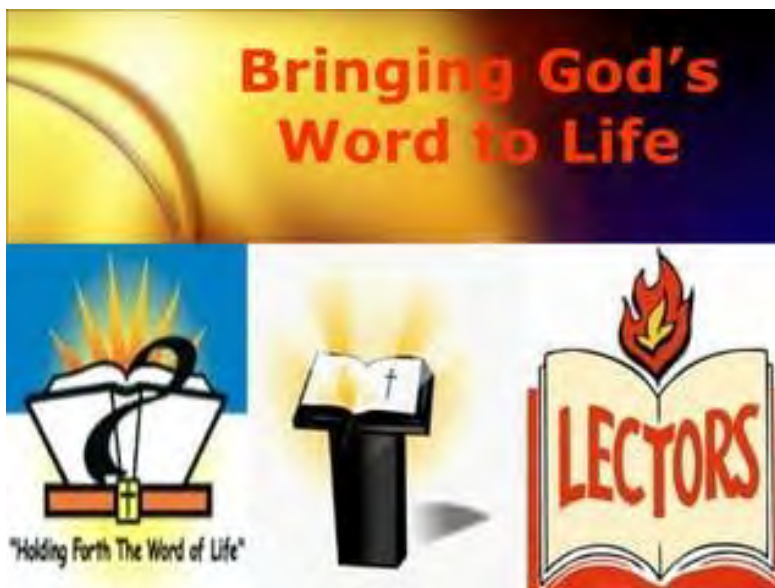
