DEACON'S CORNER



In identifying Himself as “the good shepherd,” Jesus alluded to the Old Testament understanding of God as the shepherd of His people, Israel. God at times appointed leaders to shepherd His people on His behalf like Joshua or David. However, the intention was always that God would Himself shepherd His people. Here Jesus, as God in the flesh, reveals how this will come about. Jesus is the “one shepherd” to look after the “one flock,” which is the Church. He knows His sheep intimately and they

know Him. As a good shepherd, He will not abandon His flock. Rather, Jesus is willing to die to protect His sheep. In fact, Jesus did die on the cross for His flock. He laid down His life so that we, His sheep, might be able to live. But even in death Jesus did not abandon us. He is still with us (His sheep) as our good shepherd, leading us to where we need to be. Therefore, let us follow our good shepherd wherever He leads us.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

Al identificarse como “el Buen Pastor”, Jesús aludió a la comprensión de Dios en el Antiguo Testamento como el Pastor de su pueblo, Israel. En ocasiones, Dios nombró líderes para pastorear a su pueblo en su nombre, como Josué o David. Sin embargo, la intención siempre fue que Dios mismo pastoreara a su pueblo. Pastor's Message

I Our purpose in this life is to draw closer to God by: prayer, sacraments, care for the poor.

--THE Eucharist is our greatest and deepest point of contact with our God. The Pinnacle of our faith.

--It's always a tragedy when people stay away from the mass due to: laziness, shopping, etc.

A--READINGS WE MOVE FROM: **RECOGNIZING THE RISEN CHRIST TO METAPHORS THAT CONVEY THE CLOSENESS OF JESUS TO US: GOOD SHEPHERD, VINE AND BRANCHES, FRIENDSHIP.**

--many people take comfort in our Lord as THE GOOD SHEPHERD.

Story: True story about two sisters who were staying together for a couple of weeks. On a Saturday, the one sister (who was a regular church goer) invited the other if she wanted to go to mass the next day Sunday (the sister had stayed away from the faith for years). She was very non-comittal because she had plans on going skiing instead. On one of the runs down the mountain she fell and broke her leg. So, the next Sunday when the Sister asked her to go to mass SHE NOW HAD NO EXCUSE NOT TO AS SHE WAS WEARING A CAST. SHE ACCEPTED THE INVITATION.

--Call it Divine Providence or Coincidence: That Sunday was GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY. The priest in his homily told how there was a practice among Shepherds in the time of Jesus: If a young lamb would always stray from the heard. The shepherd would intentionally break the leg of the lamb so that he had to carry it on his shoulders until the leg healed. In that time, the lamb became so attached to the Shepherd that it never strayed again.

--The sister with the broken leg (tried to hide her cast): felt those words were directly meant for her. Here she is at mass for the first time in years. **HOW GOD CAN WORK IN OUR LIVES.** Our Lord the Good Shepherd was carrying her on his strong shoulders. That very week she would go to confession and again receive the Eucharist. Our Lord became the center of her life AND SHE WOULD NEVER STRAY AGAIN.

B--JOHN OF THE CROSS writes: "The language of God is the experience God writes inside our lives."

-- Divine Providence can be interpreted as: A CONSPIRACY OF ACCIDENTS.

****God can never cause us harm or do bad to us: But God use events in our lives: Good, bad events accidents, mishaps, bad choices: to bring about his will and bring us back to him.****

**** We are all familiar with the phrase: "God writes straight with Crooked Lines"**

POINT: Metaphor: Our Lord the Good Shepherd is always there for us at every turn in our Lives.

II So that we have a better understanding of what our Lord intended, lets briefly look at the **Sheep>>>Shepherd metaphor.**

--**SHEEP** have a herding instinct; they tend to stay in groups; a lone sheep will not live long.

>>**HUMAN BEINGS** we have the need for family and community and have sense of belonging.

--**SHEEP** can be trained to obey and follow the voice of their shepherd>>

>>**HUMAN BEINGS**: try to follow our Lords call and have his law written upon our hearts.

--**SHEEP** are fragile, naturally defenseless, susceptible to illness, must be watched continually, they are nearsighted>>they can't see beyond about 9 feet; they need constant protection.

>>**HUMAN BEINGS**: can be helpless, get sick or ill, sometimes need direction, **CAN BECOME LOST AND WANDER AIMLESSLY IN LIFE SEARCHING FOR MEANING.**

B. Being a SHEPHERD: was a very difficult and risky job.

--It involved long hours often with sleepless nights. **If you were the owner of the herd you took great risks to PROTECT your sheep.**

--So, when our Lord says the **Good Shepherd lays down his life for his sheep**>>the Shepherd would actually sleep across the gate to the sheepfold and defend his sheep to the death.

C. I am the Good Shepherd; I know mine and mine know me: implies a personal **CONNECTION/RELATIONSHIP** developed between the Sheep and Shepherd. They were **given names** and they responded to his call.

Of course this is the purpose of our spiritual life>

-- that we grow in relationship with our Lord.

--that we recognize his **VOICE** when he calls.

--that we trust that he hears us **WHEN WE CALL OUT HIS NAME IN PRAYER.**

STORY: at family gathering / **WAKE SERVICE** for his Grandmother: young boy stood up and recited Psalm 23 from memory. It was a beautiful rendition and his words flowed like music. Everyone applauded when he finished.

--Then the Grandfather, the oldest member of the family, stood up. In a cracked and staggered voice (tears in his eyes) he struggled to recite Psalm 23: "The Lord is my Shepherd. There is nothing I shall want..." His family was mesmerized by his recital...at the end there was solemn silence....

---Many people commented, "The boy knows the Words of the Psalm....the Grandfather knows the words and he knows the Shepherd personally."

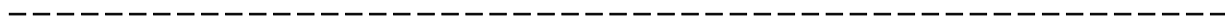

- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



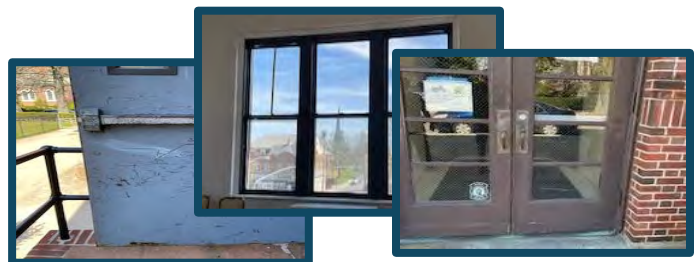

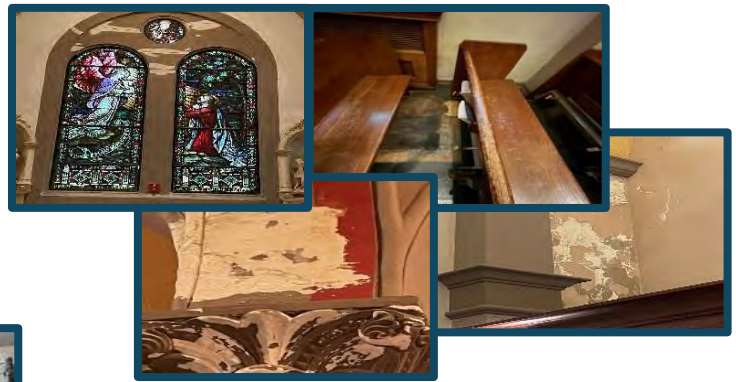

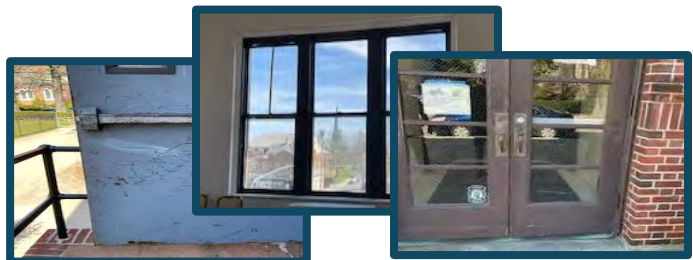
