

The Gospel of Saint Mark today is a delight because it shows the family of Jesus believing that Jesus has truly lost His mind. And it shows us Jesus completely frustrated with what had happened in the temple. Jesus wants the House of God to be a house of prayer, not a business enterprise. (See Saint Mark 3:20-35)

We can understand that the family of Jesus does not understand Him. Jesus is so different! Jesus is completely caught up in doing the work of His Father and

pays no attention to anything else. This looks like insanity to any normal person. Jesus is not getting enough to eat. He probably is not getting enough sleep. He seems obsessed with healing people. All in all, his family decides that Jesus has lost His mind.

So, Jesus irritates and bothers his family. With the Scribes and Pharisees, it is worse. Jesus seems to have an understanding of the Law that is completely different from theirs. They want to challenge Jesus but recognize how popular Jesus is among the ordinary people. They think that Jesus is possessed by the devil but again fear saying anything like that.

For us, all of this is a call to follow the Lord, no matter what our families or other religious people think about us. We are challenged to do the works of God, to recognize that the fight between good and evil is still going on in our own time. We must also recognize that it is God who is at work and so we can trust that we are being remade in the image of God.

Pastor's Message

"Who are my brothers and Sisters and mother?"

- I. Family Life and Community are so important: it is in the context of family that the values of the K of G are nurtured and instilled in family members.
- --- Then they are lived out and practiced in COMMUNITY / SPIRITUAL FAMILY.
- **HOWEVER: SOMETIMES WHEN PEOPLE REALLY live the Gospel values and stand up for their faith; people (even members of one's own family) may question your judgement (and think you are crazy):

Example: U.N. Ambassador, Andrew Young, tells the story about SAYING GOOD BY AND letting his daughter go off to **Uganda to work for Habitat for Humanity**. When she brought up the idea he argued against it. He knew the danger lurking on that continent and the insanity **of Idi Amin** and others. Young was so worried about what could happen to her. **He begged for her to reconsider and NOT Go.**

- ---SHE SAID: BUT DADDY, "But haven't you been telling us all these years, to be authentic believers to practice the faith, that when God calls, we have to respond and follow. God is calling me and I have to go to serve the poor.
- ---He said to her, "I TOLD YOU ALL OF THAT BECAUSE All I wanted was for you was just to be a decent Christian, NOT A REAL ONE.

Example: Augustinian Seculars: George and Irene, they both said as parents they were failures; Their two children studied and the University of Pennsylvania and became Architects: after graduation: their son joined the Catholic Worker /their daughter became a Nun. George and Irene were expressing to me how they failed as parents because their children don't make any money.

BOTH CHILDREN CHOSE THE PROPHETIC PATH IN LIFE AND REALLY FOLLOWED OUR LORD.

Example: My Dad who sewed the seed of me being a priest back in the 4th grade when he asked my brother and I if we could see ourselves becoming priests. After graduating from SJU (which he paid for) when I told him I was going to enter religious life and become a priest he said: WHAT? He was hoping I would make a lot of money and be monetarily successful

- II.—The first part of today's Gospel tells us how Jesus' relatives and neighbors mis-judged him as being out of his mind. That is why (Matthew 10:36) Jesus says, "A man's enemies will be the members of his own household.". --Jesus' own family tried to dissuade him from his ministry:
- First, Jesus had <u>abandoned his safe and secure job as a village carpenter</u> HE COULD HAVE HAD A steady income. Second, Jesus had chosen a group of uneducated fishermen with <u>no political or social influence</u>, to be his disciples.
- **Third**, Jesus had begun to criticize the scribes and Pharisees, labeling them hypocrites. **Fourth**, Jesus <u>claimed to be the long-awaited Messiah</u> and had worked miracles to support his claim.
- III. Our Lord in his public ministry encountered much adversity. It was difficult to get people to believe in him as the Mesiah and follow in his ministry.

Compounding this Problem: All families were either: Greek / Roman Pagan OR Jewish. Hence: all converts were adult family members. Family life being very tight nit made it very difficult for people to put their faith in our Lord and follow him.

- --- TODAY: Generally, all family members are of the same faith
- --We are aware of the TENSIONS that can result when a family is: MIXED OR INTERFAITH.
- So, our Lord EXPANDS NOTION OF FAMILY: WE ARE ALWAYS GOING TO HAVE OUR BIOLOGICAL FAMILY.
- --We are all familiar with the: PHRASE: Blood is thicker than water; Well for our Lord: Faith runs deeper than Blood. Our Faith binds us together in a deeper way even more than our blood relations... --Blood is thicker than water: Biological/blood family ties run much deeper than any other relationship. However: even in a biological family of say 6 people: 3 accept the faith and 3 remain pagan or Jewish: this caused friction and division. Ultimately the 3 Christians could be handed over to the authorities because being Christian up to the year 313 was ILLEGGAL.
- ***HENCE: it was difficulty to get people to believe in him as the Mesiah.****
- ***OUR LORD EXPANDS UNDERSTANDING OF FAMILY ***
- ---For our Lord: our FAITH BINDS PEOPLE TOGETHER MUCH DEEPER THAN ANY OTHE RELATIONSHIP OR FAMILY CONNECTION.
- --When he says: "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking around at those seated around the table he said, "Here is my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."
- --Our Lord is saying that our Faith binds us much closer than any a BLOOD / BIO family bond.....
- ---WHO ARE MY FAMILY MEMBERS: THOSE WHO DO THE WILL OF GOD= COMMUNITY
- --SPIRITUAL FAMILY: think about it: even if you come to church an hour a week: you may spend more time and have more in common / share more of the same values than some of your biological family members.--DO THE WILL OF GOD = SPIRITUAL FAMILY = COMMUNITY = BODY OF CHRIST
- IV. Did Jesus have any blood / biological brothers and sisters?

ANSWER: NO/ CHURCH TEACHES THE PERPETUAL VIRIGINITY OF MARY--We read, "Isn't this the carpenter, the son of Mary, a brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? Aren't his sisters our neighbors here?" (Mk 6:3). -- Greek word adelphos, was used to describe brothers not born of the same parents, like a half-brother or stepbrother. The word also described other relationships like cousins, nephews, etc.---In Hebrew and Aramaic languages, no special word existed for cousin, nephew, half-brother, or stepbrother. So, they used the word brother in all these cases. --- By this time, St. Joseph has died. Since Jesus, the first-born, had no "blood brother," when He was hanging on the cross, He entrusted Mary to the care of St. John, the Beloved Disciple.

V.- FAMILY/COMMUNITY: IS SO IMPORTANT:-- BIOLOGICAL FAMILY = Nurtures and instills the values of our Lord: Learn / Model: forgiveness, mercy, charity, agape love.--children need to SEE /EXPERIENCE FORGIVENESS to be able to forgive--SPIRITUAL FAMILY = COMMUNITY: in the "rubbing of shoulders" moves us along the Journey of Conversion. ---all of the above is put into practice: Example: practice forgiveness.




