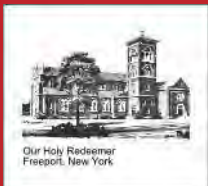

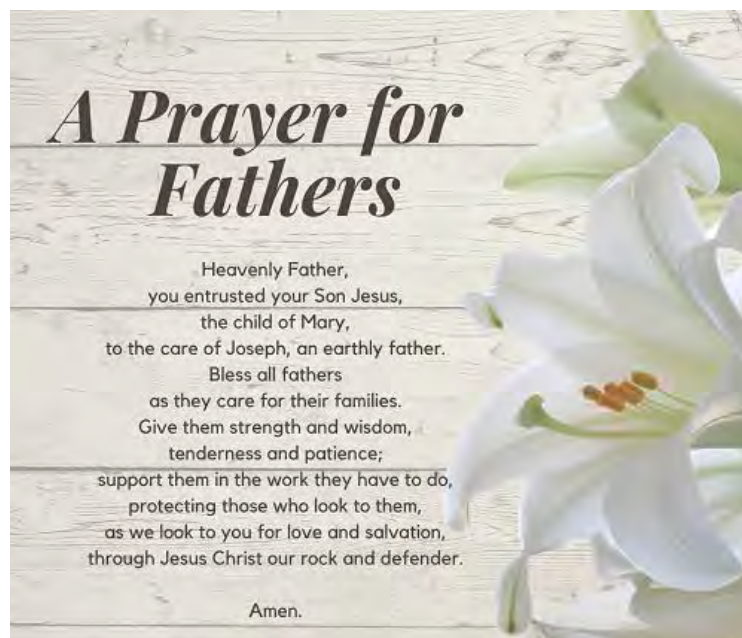

DEACON'S CORNER



What do you pray for? For success or for fidelity? In this Parable Jesus says that with the Kingdom of God “it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow.” without the man knowing how. (See Saint Mark 4:26-34) You see, we are called to be faithful, not successful. Yes, some are more successful than others, but this should not deter us. The growth comes from God. All of us in ministry need to take this to heart, and in particular parents need to understand this. Sometimes we think we have failed because

our children do not go the way we think they should. But we must remember it is God who makes the seed grow even when we go to sleep, even when we do not even know how it grows. Be faithful in sowing the seed, yes do as much as you can, “scatter seed on the land”, and then, let God do the rest. At His own good time, He will make it grow. That little mustard seed will become a large plant and will put forth large branches. Pray for fidelity. Be faithful. God will see to it that the seeds you plant will grow.

Pastor's Message

JUNE 16, 2024

Only God can produce growth, we wait with patience.

I.-- We can all use a little more patience, don't you think? Patience with others, patience with the world, and maybe even with ourselves.

--Sometimes we have to just take a step back, take a deep breath and let people and situations, and the world unfold.

STORY: A young family is at a diner. The 10-year-old daughter asks her father, "Can we say grace?" The father rather impatiently responds, "We don't do that religious stuff in public." The girl made the sign of the cross and in a hushed voice said several words of thanks so as to not offend her father. An older couple was walking past the table and saw the little girl. The woman said, "It's wonderful to see a family saying grace before a meal." The father replies, "It was strange at first, but we always express thanks at home before we eat." The woman looked at the girl and said, "Don't ever stop sweetie. It means a lot to those of us around you.

CONSLUSION: It seems like such a small thing but gives great witness to the Kingdom of God.

POINT: sometimes you have to let people, situations just evolve and take place and see how they positively influence others.

--Here are individuals who have made major contributions to the world but some people didn't have patience with them:

Moses: the stuttering herdsman who, in a personal interview with God, was directed to liberate his nation from slavery.

Thomas Edison's teacher said he could never amount to anything and advised his mother to take him out of school.

Winston Churchill when he started High School, he was kept at the lowest track possible... thinking he would never achieve.

Albert Einstein when he was a child, his parents were told by a teacher that he was slow and dull

Rita Rizzo: born April 9, 1923, had a rough childhood spent mostly in poverty. As a young woman she decided to become a nun. At 21 she entered the Poor Clares. She felt she was being called to the Television Ministry. **MOTHER ANGELICA:** With \$200 she became the only woman in religious broadcasting and then owned her own network eventually the **ETERNAL WORD TELEVISION NETWORK** headquartered in Alabama. **ITS AMAZING WHAT GOD AND A LITTLE PATIENCE HAS ACCOMPLISHED THROUGH THIS LITTLE NUN.**

THUS, IT IS with God's Kingdom. We scatter the seed, but we are not ultimately responsible for its growth. We can't make things happen / we cannot force things to happen... sometimes we need to take a step back and let things unfold.

--The process of the K of G is slow and dull at times: we don't judge; WE NEED TO HAVE PATIENCE

II.-- How is it that you can have two people:

--**One person** looks out at the world and only sees: war, hatred, prejudice, pain, brokenness, poverty, AND QUESTIONS WHERE IS THE PRESENCE OF GOD AND HIS KINGDOM.....

--**The second person** looks out at world and only sees: grace, peace, care, harmony, joy, happiness, . . . A WORLD FILLED WITH GOD'S PRESENCE . . . AND CAN PALPBLY SEE GOD BUILDING HIS KINGDOM.

--**Part of the ANSWER IS IN TODAY'S READINGS:** As we hear in the second reading:

--WE WALK BY FAITH AND NOT BY SIGHT-- what does this mean? That as believers, things do not appear as they seem in the world.

--We read the Newspapers, watch the news, experience firsthand some of these mentioned realities--but at the depth of it all: GOD IS INTRICITLY AND INVOLVED IN THE WORLD BRINING HIS KINGDDOM TO FRUITION.

--We don't see it, we can't always recognize it---BUT ITS THERE----WE HAVE TO BELIEVE IN FAITH--THAT THE KINGDOM IS GROWING.

The process by which the kingdom of this world becomes the Kingdom of God IS very slow AND AT TIMES exasperates us.

--**The second part of the answer** is found in the Parables in today's Gospel.

IF WE HAVE DONE OUR JOB: if we have faithfully scattered the seed, THE WORD OF GOD--THAN WE HAVE TO BE PATIENT AND WAIT FOR THE K OF G TO appear in its fullness.

--EXAMPLE: Look at the seed you have sewn in your own children. You raised them in the faith; they received their sacraments, learned how to pray, went to Sunday Mass, had/have a relationship with Jesus . . . YET . . . in their young adult life they stopped going to mass and have abandoned their Catholic Faith.

SO, you patiently wait for the day when the seed you planted a long long time ago is rejuvenated and takes root again in their lives and the practice of the faith takes the FOREFRONT OF THEIR LIVES.

KEY HERE is being patient and always being that gentle invitation . . . ITS GOD'S TIME AND EFFORT NOT YOURS.

III.-- The Parable: the parable was a very powerful teaching tool that our Lord used frequently in his preaching. The Parable employed examples and metaphors that people of the time could identify with.

--The parable would lead the listener (if they listened with their hearts and not their minds) to a new way of viewing reality a new way of looking at things. Ex: Good Samaritan

A **KINGDOM/REIGN OF GOD:** is the most frequent topic /theme in our Lord's preaching. **The fulfillment of the Reign of God represented the world as God intended it.** The world obviously got side tracked when sin entered the world.

----**The Reign/Kingdom of God**---- represents the world God intended, **a world in which there is no prejudice, hatred, war, violence, destruction, poverty ---- a world filled with faith, justice, peace, and love.**

B In Mark's Gospel we have the: **KINGDOM PARABLES ALSO KNOW AS THE SEED PARABLES**-- they point to the Kingdom as a Divine Act and NOT a Human Accomplishment..... and call humanity to be patient with its delay in coming.

Parable of the sower, Parable of the Harvest, Parable of the Mustard Seed. A consistent theme is all this is the seed as the Word of God. God alone can give growth. We are called to plant and nurture. God will do only what God can so: **PRODUCE GROWTH.**

IV PARABLE OF THE MUSTARD SEED: (found in: Mark, Matt, Luke)--- emphasized the contrast between tiny beginnings and tremendous size (at the end of its growth). In the First Century: Mustard Seed: well known as a large, fast growing shrub, that would **OVERGROW ANY OTHER GROWTH AROUND IT** if left unchecked.

PARABLE OF THE SEEDS GROWTH: (only found in Mark): Jesus used wheat and mustard seed parables to explain the growth of the kingdom: initially slow, mysterious, and unnoticeable. But within months a mature plant with many branches and leaves, flowers and fruits will be produced. Growth is silent but steady—it isn't because of our efforts--it is God's effort that growth takes place. **WE NEED TO BE PATIENT AND NOT GIVE UP**

GOD WORKS IN WAYS WE DON'T UNDERSTAND.

A This is the way the Kingdom of God grows in the human soul. The Kingdom of God grows when the individual does the will of God and surrenders his life to God. The seed of faith lies dormant....only when we permit God to nurture it---it grows miraculously in gigantic proportions.

---**MESSAGE OF PARABLE:** The Kingdom of God will grow to its fullness, despite all obstacles. Those who accept Jesus and his values in all areas of their lives w/ the Power of the Holy Spirit.

CONCLUSION: We have to do our part and sow the seed / the Word of God and then step back, with patience, and let the Kingdom Grow and UNFOLD. God produces the growth.

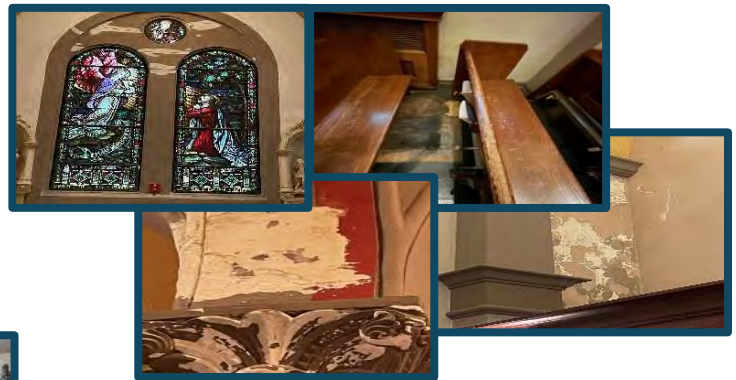
PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT

For many years, Our Holy Redeemer Parish has welcomed all who walk through its doors, educating the Catholic community with the knowledge and love of God and of the Gospel. Our beloved church has adapted and expanded to the needs of parishioners in order to remain a thriving oasis of faith and community.

Today we find ourselves in an exciting moment in our parish's history. As we look forward to the future, we recognize the need to renovate our church and school. The proposed necessary projects for the church and school have been carefully identified.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731
