## DEACON'S CORNER



The Today's Gospel offers evidence of Jesus' power and authority as he calms the storm. In his day, power over nature was believed to be a sign of divinity—only God calms storms. Jesus' rebuke of the storm also echoes the rebuke he uses when he talks to and expels demons. In each situation, Jesus' power and authority is a sign of his divinity. Indeed, the disciples are left wondering about Jesus' identity at the conclusion of today's Gospel. They see before them a human being who acts with

the authority and power of God. The disciples' uncertainty about Jesus' identity is a recurring theme in Mark's Gospel.

This Gospel is a metaphor for our lives. We are in the boat, the storms of life are raging around us, and like the disciples, we may believe that Jesus is unconcerned, or “sleeping.” We hope that we will be as familiar with Jesus as his disciples. If we feel that Jesus is sleeping, are we comfortable enough to wake Jesus and present him with our needs? Jesus does not chide his disciples for waking him. Instead, he chides them for their lack of faith, for their lack of perspective. When we bring our worries to God in prayer, we might just begin to learn to see things from God's perspective.

## EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

El Evangelio de hoy ofrece evidencia de la presencia de Jesús. poder y autoridad mientras calma la tormenta. En su época, se creía que el poder sobre la naturaleza era un signo de divinidad: sólo Dios calma las tormentas. Jesús; La reprimenda de la tormenta también se hace eco de la reprimenda que usa cuando habla con y expulsa demonios. En cada situación, Jesús; el poder y la autoridad es signo de su divinidad. De hecho, los discípulos se quedan preguntándose acerca de la vida de Jesús. identidad al final del evangelio de hoy. Ven ante ellos a un ser humano que actúa con autoridad y el poder de Dios. Los discípulos; incertidumbre sobre Jesús; la identidad es un tema recurrente en el evangelio de Marcos.

Este Evangelio es una metáfora de nuestras vidas. Estamos en la barca, las tormentas de la vida azotan a nuestro alrededor y, como los discípulos, podemos creer que Jesús está despreocupado o “durmiendo”. Esperamos que estemos tan familiarizados con Jesús como sus discípulos. Si sentimos que Jesús está durmiendo, ¿estamos lo suficientemente cómodos para despertar a Jesús y presentarle nuestras ¿necesidades? Jesús no reprende a sus discípulos por despertarlo. En cambio, los reprende por su falta de fe, por su falta de perspectiva. Cuando presentamos nuestras preocupaciones a Dios en oración, es posible que comencemos a aprender a ver las cosas desde la perspectiva de Dios.

## Pastor's Message

**Our faith will help us navigate the storms in life**

### **I.-- WHY DO BAD THINGS HAPPEN TO GOOD PEOPLE?**

How can a loving God allow an earthquake to wipe out so many lives and cause such destruction? How does an airplane drop out of the sky in mid-flight? How does a virus like Covid 19 develop and kill millions of people in today's modern age? How can someone be driving down a road and be involved in an accident or a Road Rage incident?

**Question Is: Does God cause these things to happen? If not, why does he allow them to happen?**

**STORY** -one evening on a Sunday night my brother, my Mom, and I went to 6pm Mass at St. Ignatius Loyola in Hicksville where we grew up. Dad was probably at work (NYC PD). I was in the fourth grade.

It was snowy and icy outside and was getting worse by the minute. Our mom said to my brother and I, "children we are going to scoot out and go home right after Mass, the roads are getting worse (which by the way leaving Mass early is a no no.)

So, we got in the car, and she was driving home and a man's car leaving the Seven Eleven slid on some ice and bumped into the side and back of our car (73 chevy). It didn't cause much damage, and no one was hurt but it startled us profoundly. After my mom and the man exchanged the required info, which was an ordeal in the freezing cold, we made our way home.

While driving our mother raised her fist to heaven and said to God, "Why did you let this happen and with my kids in the car no less?" My brother (in the second grade) yelled from the back seat, "It's because we left Mass early Mommy."

**Conclusion:** To her dying day my mother always wondered why God allowed that to happen. Who knows, maybe God helped us and it could have been a lot worse.

**THE FACT IS: THE UNIVERSE IS RANDOM.**

**--THE ONLY CONSTANT / THE ONLY CERTAINTY IN THIS WORLD IS OUR FAITH IN OUR LORD.**

**II.--** The Book of Job attempts to answer just that question: The belief was that if you were:

**--WEALTHY AND HEALTHY--you were BLESSED by God.**

**--If you were POOR OR HAD AN ILLNESS—you were cursed by God.**



--Job was a Righteous and Holy Man--and Tragedy befalls him, and he loses everything... wife, children, family, wealth, and eventually his own health.

--Job knew in his heart he did nothing wrong.

--But through Job's Faithfulness to God, through all the tragedy and loss, everything and more is restored to Job.

--**POINT**-- Universe is random: It is our Faithfulness to God that will get us through. (Trusting that no matter what happens God will be there).

**III.** -- In our Gospel, we have to keep in mind that the Apostles were all Seasoned Fishermen—they would have navigated many a violent storm or at least know when to have gotten to dry land if a storm was coming. This miracle did take place and there is a lot of symbolism included.

-- THE BOAT—represents the Church

--STORM—represents CHAOS and TRAGEDIES—RANDOMNESS of the world.

--STORM—also represents the persecutions and attacks on the EARLY CHURCH.

--STORM—also SYMBOLIZES—THE STORMS and TRAGEDIES that people face in life:

A.-- What does Jesus say to the Apostles in the Boat?

--Why are you afraid?

B.-- Mark is writing his Gospel to a community that is being persecuted. Listening to this Gospel how Jesus calmed the storm and saved a sinking boat would have brought them much comfort. They understood it to mean that Jesus would get them through the storm of persecution.

POINT: these words should bring you much comfort when you are in the midst of a storm in life (e.g. Covid, Cancer, broken marriage, wayward child, financial crisis). Our Lord says to you: Why are you afraid? OR Don't Be Afraid . . . I will get you through this.

God speaks to Job from a whirlwind and in the Gospel, Jesus calms the whirlwind storm, Both are portraits of the Manifestation of God, even when the whole world seems to be falling apart.

POINT: When your world seems to be falling apart (tragedy, illness, disease, financial problems) God is there with you saying: Don't be afraid, I will get you through this.

**ANECDOTE:** Rembrandt painted "The Storm on the Sea of Galilee" which is his interpretation of this Gospel. It shows the panic on the disciples' faces as their small vessel is being tossed about on the sea. Two of the disciples are attempting to wake Jesus up, who is asleep in the stern of the boat. However, when you count the number of people in the boat there are 14 (not 12 and Jesus). Rembrandt painted himself into the painting in the boat.

This is how we are to interpret the passage. We too are in the boat, faithful but frightened. We are caught up in the storm. Yet it is our faith that will get us through.

**ANECDOTE:** In Ernest Hemingway's *Islands in the Stream*, an anguished father mourns the loss of his oldest son. The boy has been killed in war. The father is grief-stricken. He will not eat or sleep. He walks alone on the beach for hours. A friend tries to persuade him to leave the beach and begin to come out of his depression. **The father says to his friend, "I have been out here all day thinking about him and wanting to have him with me always. I know I have got to let him go. I have got to, but I cannot do it today."**

How many of us can identify with that father's deep hurt. The loss of a loved one is a dreadful storm. --

The Gospel tells us that when the storms of life are raging, Jesus does care. When it seems you cannot hold on to a moment longer, God does care. When the waters threaten to engulf, He does care.

--THE ONE CONSTANT IN LIFE, THE ONE THING THAT IS GOING TO HELP US NAVIGATE THROUGH THE STORMS ---IS FAITH IN GOD--

**CONCLUSION:** In the Book of Job God Speaks from a storm. In the Gospel Jesus calms a storm. God's power is stronger than any storm but is conveyed in gentleness.

In the book of Job and in the example of Jesus, we see a reflection of **what St. Francis de Sales** meant when he said that there is nothing as strong as gentleness and there is nothing as gentle as real strength.



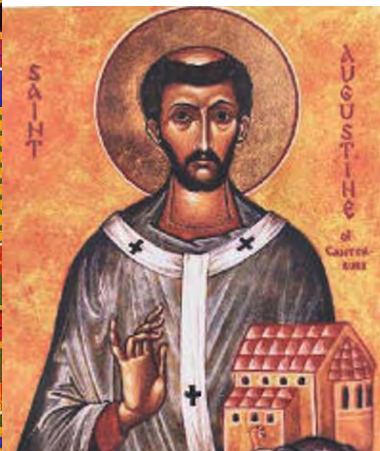

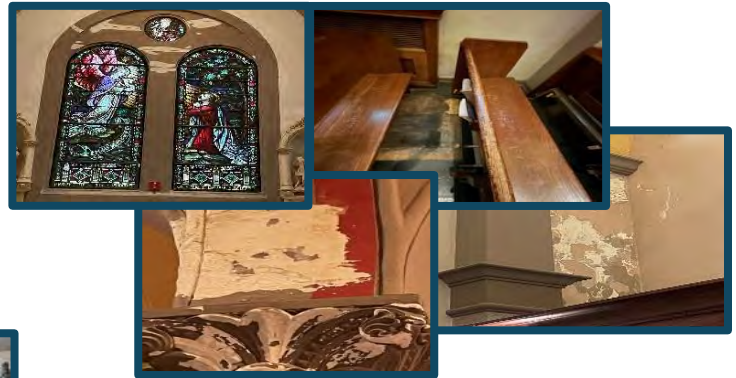
**PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT**

- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



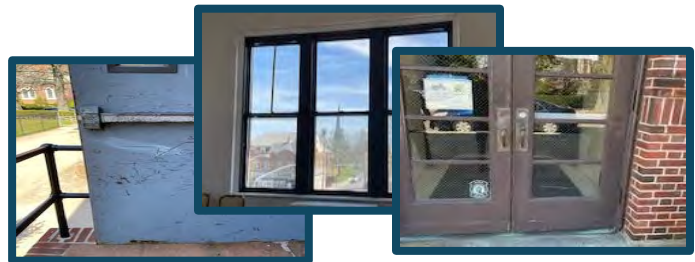
