## **DEACON'S CORNER**



Today's Gospel brings to the fore two sterling examples of faith: Jairus, the father of a dying little girl, and a woman afflicted with a long-term illness. They believed not only that Jesus had the power to help them, but also that He would help them. So, they took decisive action. Jairus "came forward. Seeing [Jesus], he fell at His feet and pleaded earnestly with Him, saying, 'my daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay Your hands on her that she may get well and live.'" Jairus' faith puts in

action Jesus' power, resulting in his little daughter's resurrection. Likewise, the woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years thought: "If I but touch His clothes, I shall be cured." She did, and she was healed. Do we get the point? Do we understand our need to exercise our faith? We must learn to be like Jairus and this woman. We must really believe not just in Jesus' power but must also belief that Jesus wants to help us, and then take the necessary action. As the Blessed Mother said at the wedding in Cana: "DO whatever He (Jesus) tells you." The act of faith will have its reward. As Jesus told the woman, "your faith has saved you." See Saint Mark 5:21-43. Deacon Cris

### EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

El evangelio de hoy pone de relieve dos excelentes ejemplos de fe: Jairo, el padre de una niña moribunda, y una mujer afligida por una enfermedad de larga duración. Creían no sólo que Jesús tenía el poder para ayudarlos, sino también que Él los ayudaría. Jairo "se adelantó. Al verlo [a Jesús], cayó a sus pies y le suplicó encarecidamente, diciendo: "Mi hija está al borde de la muerte". Por favor, ven a poner tus manos sobre ella para que se recupere y viva'". La fe de Jairo pone en acción el poder de Jesús, lo que resulta en la resurrección de su hijita. Asimismo, la mujer que padecía de hemorragias durante doce años pensó: "Si toco Su ropa, seré curada". Ella lo hizo y fue sanada. ¿Entendemos? ¿Entendemos nuestra necesidad de ejercer nuestra fe? Debemos aprender a ser como Jairo y esta mujer. Realmente debemos creer no sólo en el poder de Jesús, sino también creer que Jesús quiere ayudarnos y luego

tomar las medidas necesarias. Como dijo la Santísima Virgen en las bodas de Caná: "Hagan lo que Él (Jesús) les diga". El acto de fe tendrá su recompensa. Como Jesús le dijo a la mujer, "tu fe te ha salvado". *Vea San Marcos 5:21-43.*

#### Pastor's Message

STORY/LEGEND: about Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector. It tells how in later years, he rose early every morning and left his house. His wife, curious, followed him one morning. At the town well he filled a bucket... and he walked until he came to a sycamore tree. There, setting down the bucket, he began to clean away the stones, the branches, and the rubbish from around the base of the tree. Having done that, he poured water on the roots and stood there in silence, gently caressing the trunk with both of his hands.

--When his amazed wife came out of hiding and asked what he was doing, Zacchaeus replied simply, "This is (the tree I climbed down from) where I found Christ."

\*\*THERE IS AN INNATE YEARNING IN EVERY HUMAN BEING TO SEEK OUT THE SACRED OR RETURN TO A SACRED PLACE WHERE WE'VE HAD A RELIGIOUS EXPERIENCE\*\*

**EXAMPLE:** I used to go down to the board walk at Jones Beach Field 6: at the end a Gazebo where I would go and Pray . . . or at the Grotto at Mt Manresa on Staten Island.

- --WE CAN IMAGINE THE Woman who touched the tassel of Jesus... and the daughter of Jairus, continually went back to those sacred spots and said, "This is where I found Christ! This is where Christ healed me back into life!"
- ----This is the Good News of our FAITH: Love has the power to heal, to reconcile, and to redeem.
- I.-- Today's readings are about **Jesus as the giver of life**. The gospel consists of two related stories, with one inside the other, a typical feature of Mark's gospel known as 'inclusion' OR SANDWHICH. A-B-A.
- A.--Jesus is approached by Jairus, an official of the Synagogue. His daughter is seriously ill, and he wants Jesus to come and lay his hands on her "to make her better and save her life".
- B.--While he is on the way a woman who has suffered a hemorrhage for 12 years is in the crowd. She has spent all she had on Doctors, with no improvement and even getting worst. (Remember Luke the Evangelist was a doctor)
- --Like many people, she has heard about Jesus and is moved by a deep faith in Him. She believed that if she could just touch the hem of his cloak it would be enough for her to be healed. And in fact, she was.
- --The woman was afraid--and in fear and trembling, stepped forward--she was afraid because HER BLEEDING PROBLEM MADE HER UNCLEAN--AND ISOLATED FROM BEING around other people—she would be in deep trouble.
- --Just to reach out and touch Jesus would have made Him ritually unclean also. But she steps forward, falls at Jesus' feet and tells Him everything.

- --Jesus is not angry. He says, "My daughter your faith has healed you, go in peace and be free from your complaint." Jesus has restored her to fullness of life.
- --She is not only Physically restored, but socially and spiritually as well--and fully integrated into society.
- --But it was her deep faith in Jesus, symbolized by her mere touching the hem of his garment, which was a major factor in her healing.
- II.-- A We now move back to our first story. Just as Jesus heals the woman with the hemorrhage, Jairus is told that his daughter has died and that there is no need to bother Jesus any further. Jesus may be a healer but He is not expected to resuscitate the dead. --Jesus, however, insists on going and he says beautiful words which we need to hear from time to time: "Do not be afraid; only have faith." (This phrase appears in the Bible 365 times.) --He only allows three of his disciples, the inner circle of Peter, James and John, to accompany Him. He wants them to see what is going to happen, but He does not want to satisfy the mere curiosity for the sensational of the excitable crowd.
- --Jesus goes into the house with just the parents and his three INNER CIRCLE. He takes the girl by the hands and tells her: "Little girl, I tell you to get up." And the 12-year-old girl immediately got up and walked around quite normally, as if nothing had been wrong with her.
- --Those words "get up" have overtones of resurrection, the "getting up" of Jesus from his own tomb. This is <u>Mark's way of presenting what Jesus says more explicitly in John's gospel: "I am the resurrection and the life."</u> She was restored to fullness of life and Jesus is revealed as the Lord of life.

#### We are created for wholeness

- --Both of these stories reveal Jesus as the source of life and healing.
- --As the First Reading says today, "God takes no pleasure in the death of the living." We have been made, the book of Wisdom tells us, to be in the image of God's own nature. "God made us imperishable; he made us in the image of his own nature."
- --This is the goal of our lives: to know, to love and to share his life forever. Yet all of us, in some way or another, are constantly in need of God's healing. Healing, health, wholeness, and holiness are, in English, all linked words.
- A.--These TWO stories have several common features.
- --One woman is 12 years old, and the other has suffered for 12 years.
- --Both are called "daughter," and both are in need of physical healing.
- ---The girl's father is encouraged to have faith, and the older woman is praised for her faith. --The two stories illustrate Jesus' power over both chronic illness and death.

- III.-- The reading from the Book of Wisdom assures us that "God did not make death" but rather death entered human existence through "the envy of the devil" (see Genesis 3).
- --In both stories a lack of understanding of Jesus' power leads to a dramatic manifestation of his generosity. In both cases Jesus far exceeds the expectations of his supplicants and exhibits marvelous generosity by giving them life and salvation in addition to physical healing.
- --Jairus approaches Jesus in the hope that Jesus might heal his daughter. No one ever imagined that Jesus could do anything for the girl once she was dead. The miracle here is not merely physical healing. It is restoration to life after death.
- -- The woman with the flow of blood approaches Jesus in the hope that he might heal her even after many physicians had failed. Her understanding of Jesus' healing power is almost magical.
- --She says to herself, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Here Jesus is able not only to give her physical healing but also assurance that "your faith has saved you." The woman comes to appreciate that Jesus' power to heal had more to do with his person and her faith than with magic.
- IV.-- The generosity of Jesus is also a theme in today's selection from 2 Corinthians 8. Here Paul describes Jesus' life, death and resurrection as "the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ." This statement is part of the first Christian fundraising letter, preserved in 2 Corinthians 8 and 9.
- --This collection was intended for the poor in the Christian community in Jerusalem, the mother church of all Christian communities. Paul conceived this collection as a visible sign of the spiritual unity existing between the Gentile churches that he founded and the Jewish Christian community at Jerusalem.

Paul here appeals to justice, Scripture, personal and corporate honor, church unity, and so on. But his most striking appeal is to the "gracious act" of Jesus in becoming human and undergoing the shame of the cross. By his personal generosity Christ became poor so that we might become rich and find peace with and access to God.

#### **CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731**

- Repair interior walls and floors that were damaged before the roof replacement, by rainfall and faulty HVAC system.
- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



#### **SCHOOL ROOF - \$166,100**
