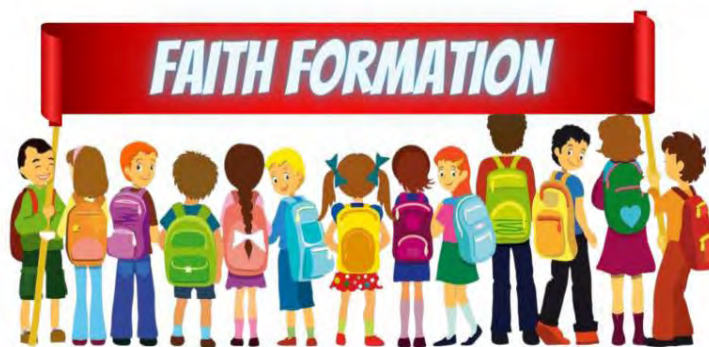

Pastor's Message

JULY 14, 2024

STORY: Fritz Kreisler (1875-1962), the world-famous violinist, earned a fortune with his concerts and compositions, but he generously gave most of it away. So, when he discovered an exquisite violin on one of his trips, he wasn't able to buy it. Later, having raised enough money to meet the asking price, he returned to the seller, hoping to purchase that beautiful instrument. But to his great dismay it had been sold to a collector.

--Kreisler made his way to the new owner's home and offered to buy the violin. The collector said it had become his prized possession and he would not sell it. Keenly disappointed, Kreisler was about to leave when he had an idea. "Could I play the instrument once before it is consigned to silence?" he asked.

--Permission was granted, and the great virtuoso filled the room with **such exquisite heart-moving music** that the **collector's emotions were deeply stirred.**

--"I have no right to keep this violin to myself," he exclaimed. "It's yours, Mr. Kreisler. Take it into the world, and let people hear it."

POINT**-Jesus gives us the same instruction: to take his exquisite beautiful **GOOD NEWS** and ministry into the world, so the world can benefit from it.**

****** Our Beautiful Catholic faith was not meant to be kept for ourselves; it was meant to be shared with others

I.-- SUMMARY OF GOOD NEWS: GOD IS ALL LOVING , ALL MERCIFUL, AND VERY NEAR TO US

ALL LOVING: he loves us infinitely, our value as a human being is **DERIVED** from his love, his is like a **DADDY/ ABBA.**

ALL MERCIFUL: if we are contrite and willing to change, he will always forgive us. **HENCE:** we must also forgive one another.

VERY NEAR TO US: he is closer to us than we are to ourselves **NOT FAR OFF.** -HE is intimately involved in our lives; we can't even conceive

**** IF we love our CATHOLIC FAITH: WE ARE SENT TO:** families, co-workers, neighbors: to share the **GOOD NEWS.**

FAITH : NEVER INTENDED TO BE SOMETHING PRIVATE (e.g. devotion God and me)

--The problem with Catholics is that for 2,000 years we have been too passive: our faith is not just between God and me; it's between God and us.

--**IF WE REALLY SEE THE EXQUISITE BEAUTY OF THE GOOD NEWS; WE WILL ALWAYS TAKE THE OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE IT**

--the 12 APOSTLES ARE THE CHURCH: TODAY YOU THE PEOPLE OF GOD ARE ALSO THE CHURCH
By virtue of our Baptismal Promises, we are CALLED AND SENT IN MISSION to bring the GOOD NEWS to others. (THE WORD MISSION MEANS TO BE SENT)

APOSTLE= ONE WHO IS SENT

MISSION= TO BE SENT

--We are called to touch minds and hearts and souls with the tenderness of God. To comfort people in need (with the Good News).

--To proclaim the GOOD NEWS, we do not have to **leave the lives that we live now.** But only live them better.

--We can be certain that God will put in our path people who need to hear the GOOD NEWS

II. The Gospel : The context: Jesus, prepared his disciples to go ahead of him to various places to announce his coming and to preach the good news.

--Jesus tells Apostles/Us to travel light: DON'T TAKE ANYTHING EXTRA: **JUST TRUST IN GOD**

-- Expect rejection. : He himself encountered rejection in his Hometown.

--**Tell them to travel in pairs?** Because according to Jewish law, two witnesses were needed to pronounce a truth.

--Accept the Hospitality Offered / Required by Torah: Don't go from house to house:

--Be more concerned with "giving" rather than "getting."

--They should be walking examples of God's love and providence.

--"Shake off the dust from your feet:" --Jesus is saying, "If people refuse to listen to you or to show you hospitality, the only thing you can do is to treat them as an orthodox Jew would treat a Gentile or a pagan."

--The Rabbinic law stated that the dust of a Gentile country was defiled, so that when a Jew entered Palestine from another country, he had to shake off every particle of the unclean land's dust from his clothing and sandals.

-- Convey the good news of God's love and mercy: Jesus' disciples were to preach the good news that God is not a punishing judge, but rather a loving Father who wants to save people from Sin.

--The disciples were to preach the **message of metanoia** or repentance----To "repent" means to change one's mind and actions accordingly. **Metanoia literally means change your mind. It can also mean taking a new direction.** Thus, repentance means a change of heart and a change of action--a change from a self-centered life to a God-centered life.

****In Jesus' time, the Jews of Palestine ordinarily wore five articles of clothing:**

- a) **The Tunic:** The innermost garment was called the tunic.
- b) **outer garment** was used as a cloak by day and as a blanket by night.
- c) The **Girdle:** which was worn over the tunic and cloak. The skirts of the tunic could be hitched up under the girdle for work or any strenuous activity.
- d) **Headdress** was also worn in order to protect the neck, the cheekbones, and the eyes from the heat and glare of the sun.
- e) **Sandals** made of leather, wood or matted grass.

--They also **carried a wicker basket** to collect contributions. No wonder, people labeled them "pious robbers" with their booty growing from village to village.

STORY: During the Korean War, a small Korean village came under heavy artillery fire. When the smoke of the battle cleared away, the pastor of the parish sought the help of some American soldiers in restoring to its pedestal a fallen statue of Christ. Since the statue's hands were gone, the soldiers planned to mold two new hands.

--The pastor, however, came up with a very meaningful suggestion: "Let us leave the statue as it is **WITHOUT THE HANDS** and write on the front of the pedestal the words, **FRIEND, LEND ME YOUR HANDS.**"

POINT: Sending his apostles **AND US** as his ambassadors to preach the "good news" reminds us that he has

- No hands** but ours to raise the fallen.
- No feet** but ours to seek out the lost.
- No ears** but ours to listen to the lonely; and
- No tongue** but ours to speak words of **HOPE** and Encouragement.

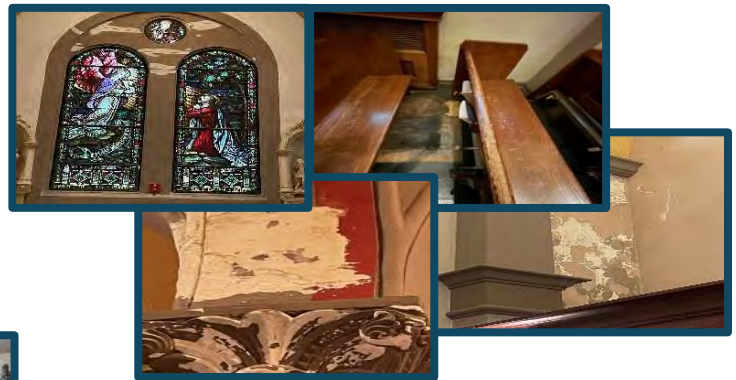
PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT

Today we find ourselves in an exciting moment in our parish's history. As we look forward to the future, we recognize the need to renovate our church and school. The proposed necessary projects for the church and school have been carefully identified.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731

- Repair interior walls and floors that were damaged before the roof replacement, by rainfall and faulty HVAC system.
- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



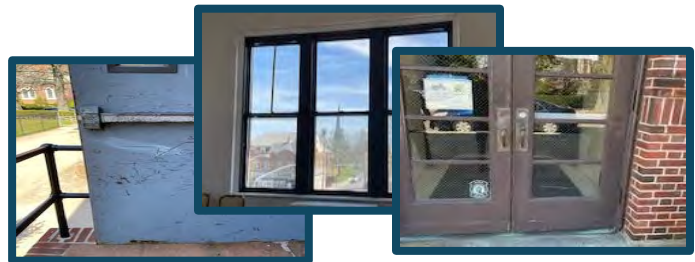
SCHOOL ROOF - \$166,100

- Replace the roof to prevent damage to the 100 years old front and main body of the school building.

WINDOWS AND DOORS - \$453,525

- Replace and upgrade the 40-year-old, worn out and rusted, original doors and windows.



SCHOOL AIR CONDITIONING (BASEMENT) - \$68,000

- Replace the current air conditioning unit that has reached its life expectancy at over 25 years old, to ensure proper cooling of the meeting rooms in the school basement.

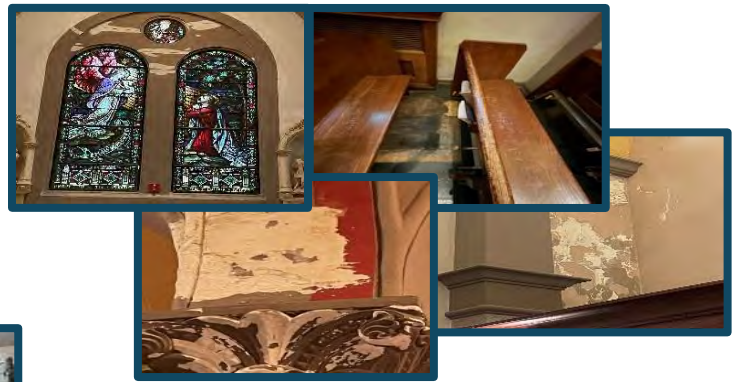
DECLARACIÓN PRELIMINAR DEL CASO

- Restaurar las almohadillas para arrodillarse y los bancos.

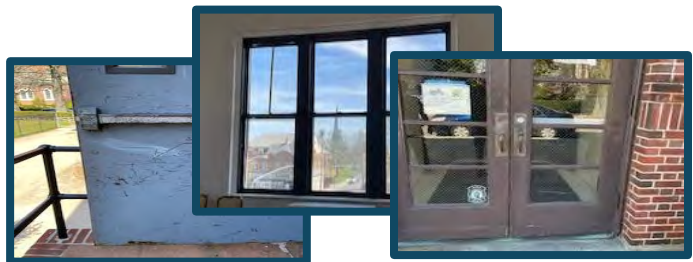


AZOTEA DE LA ESCUELA- \$166,100

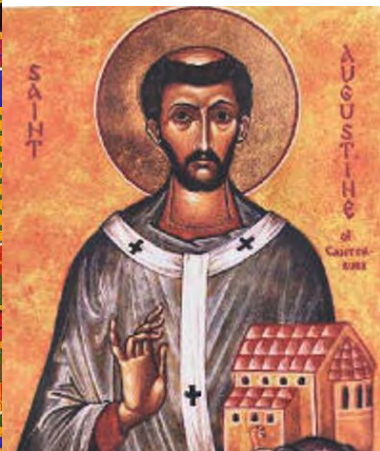
