DEACON'S CORNER



In today's Gospel, we hear the Twelve referred to as "apostles." The word *apostle* is a Greek word meaning "one who is sent." Jesus chose twelve men from among His disciples whom He sent to share in his ministry of preaching and healing. The first report of this is found in the third chapter of Mark's Gospel, where the Twelve are also

called apostles and the names of this select group are listed.

We who are Jesus' disciples today have also been sent to share the Gospel with others. Perhaps our commitment to following Jesus as his disciple leaves us feeling tired and overwhelmed. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm the importance of times of rest and renewal. Jesus wanted his disciples to come away and spend time alone with him. This is what we seek and find in our life of prayer and in our celebration of the Eucharist.

Pastor's Message

JULY 21, 2024

STORY: Will Rogers (may have heard the name: was an entertainer) was known for his laughter and JOY, but he also was a man of great depth of emotion and who also knew how to weep—One day, he was entertaining and putting on a show at a Children's Hospital in Los Angeles. Very soon, Rogers had everybody laughing, even patients who were paralyzed were laughing hysterically; but suddenly he left the stage and went to the restroom. An assistant followed him to make sure he was all right. When he opened the door, he saw Will Rogers leaning against the wall crying profusely. The ASSISTANT asked him what was wrong: ROGERS responded: "IT PAINS ME TO SEE SO MANY SICK CHILDREN—JUST GIVE ME A COUPLE OF MINUTES."

The Assistant closed the door, Rogers quickly composed himself and appeared back on the stage as jovial as ever... AND WITHIN 15 MINUTES HAS EVERYONE LAUGHING AGAIN. WILL ROGERS WAS A VERY SENSITIVE AND EMPATHETIC MAN WHO COULD SENSE AND FEEL THE PAIN AND SUFFERING OF OTHERS.

****IN OUR GOSPEL IT SADDENS OUR LORD, IT PAINS OUR LORD TO SEE SO MANY OF THE ISREALITE PEOPLE IN SUCH GREAT NEED**HE LOOKED OUT AT THEM AND COULD ONLY FEEL COMPASSION AND PITY FOR THEM—THEY ARE LIKE SHEEP WITH OUT A SHEPHERD.**

PART OF THE PROBLEM OUR LORD WAS REACITNG TO WAS THE : RITUAL PURITY LAWS THAT KEPT PEOPLE WALLOWING IN THEIR SINFULNESS AND A GOD THAT HAD NO MERCY*****HERE JESUS IS TEACHING THEN THAT GOD IS A DADDY AND MANY OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE BELIEVED THEMSELVES REJECTED BY GOD.

We as Catholics ARE CALLED TO MINISTRY BY VIRTUE OF OUR BAPTISM. TO SHARE OUR PEARL OF GREAT PRICE OUR CATHOLIC FAITH WITH OUR FAMILY MEMBERS, COWORKERS, ETC...

WE ARE CALLED TO DO MINSTRY to share a word, a verse (last week was perfect: "Don't be afraid, just have faith") with people who need to hear the Good News.

If we are faith full to share our faith with others, it will cause us to weep with those who weep, to hurt with those who hurt, to share the joy of those who are joyous.

SOMETIMES: in sharing the Good News WE ARE TOUCHED BY AND ENTER INTO THE PAIN OF OTHERS.

II.-- THIS IS MINISTRY: Ministry is more than a job (in a job you perform a TASK OR SERVICE AND AT THE END OF THE DAY YOU WALK AWAY) MINISTRY IS RECIPROCAL... IN GIVING WE ALSO RECEIVE BACK... BUT IT INVOLVES BEING TOUCHED BY AND FEELING THE PAIN, JOY, THE ENTIRE RANGE OF EMOTIONS OF OTHERS

EXAMPLES:

E.M.E. those who have been E.M.E. for several years can see it in people's faces: HUNGER, LONGING FOR THE BODY OF CHRIST / DIVINE EMBRACE—People long to be fed by our Lord's Body and Blood, to have that physical contact with our Lord

MINISTRY OF CONSOLATION—those who do this ministry: FEEL / TOUCH / ENTER INTO . . . the pain and suffering to those who have lost a loved one . . . it would be impossible not to feel their pain / loss.

LECTOR...over time Lectors when they proclaim God's word, and they look out at the people they can see how the proclamation of God's word is feeding their soul....

MOM/DAD OF FAMILY (the most important ministry of all) ... are TOUCHED BY / ENTER INTO the JOY / HAPPINESS / SUFFERING OF THEIR CHILDREN.

III.-- IN OUR GOSPEL: Jesus has sent out the twelve as an extension of HIS MINISTRY...they come back all excited and Jesus is eager to listen about their experience...(Says: **Let us go off to a deserted place where you can rest. He knows they are weary...He knows they need time for PRAYER AND REFLECTION**)

--A LARGE CROWD: walked the 10 miles around the LAKE and arrived before the Apostles and our Lord (to the deserted place)...THEY DON'T EVEN HAVE TIME TO EAT...

JESUS WAS MOVED TO PITY FOR THEM BECAUSE THEY WERE LIKE SHEEP WITHOUT A SHEPHERD ... (in part due to the **System of Reconciliation with God**).

--JESUS WAS FEELING / EXPERIENCING THEIR PAIN AND SENSE OF BEING LOST, WEIGHT OF THEIR SINS ON THEIR SHOULDERS, their sense of feeling rejected by God...

--This is the same large crowd (5,000) for whom he will MULTIPLY THE FISH AND THE LOAVES...AND FEED THEM...

CONCLUSION:

WE HAVE TO BALANCE: work / ministry / silence / solitude in PRAYER.

IN DOING MINISTRY AS HUMAN BEINGS: we are going to be affected / touched by the: JOY, HAPPINESS, SORROW, PAIN of others...

--AS MINISTERS: WE WILL DO WHATEVER IT TAKES TO GET THINGS DONE ... (Next week Jesus will feed the 5,000)

--WE RECOGNIZE THAT ALL MINISTRY (priest, parent, lay person) IS A BLESSING AND A PRIVILEGE...

--The message of today's Gospel reminds us of the SONG: You Are Mine: speaks so beautifully to these necessities of life:

I will come to you in the silence, I will lift you from all your fear.
You will hear my voice, I claim you as my choice, be still and know I am here.

Do not be afraid, I am with you. I have called you each by name.
Come and follow me, I will bring you home; I love you and you are mine. (4)

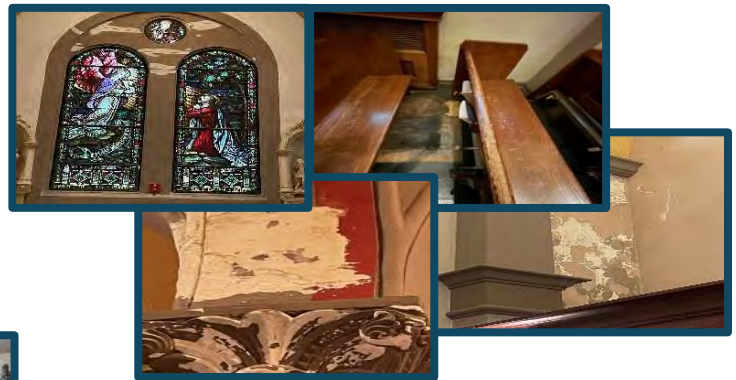
PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT

Our beloved church has adapted and expanded to the needs of parishioners in order to remain a thriving oasis of faith and community.

Today we find ourselves in an exciting moment in our parish's history. As we look forward to the future, we recognize the need to renovate our church and school. The proposed necessary projects for the church and school have been carefully identified.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731

- Repair interior walls and floors that were damaged before the roof replacement, by rainfall and faulty HVAC system.
- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



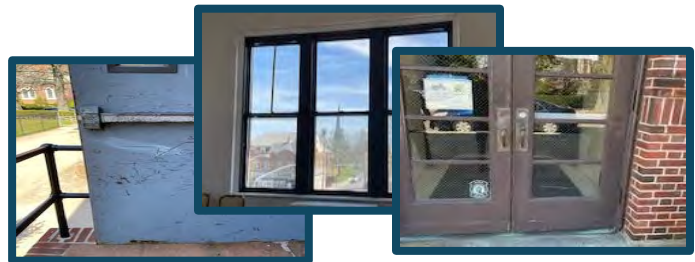
SCHOOL ROOF - \$166,100

- Replace the roof to prevent damage to the 100 years old front and main body of the school building.

SCHOOL

WINDOWS AND DOORS - \$453,525

- Replace and upgrade the 40-year-old, worn out and rusted, original doors and windows.



SCHOOL AIR CONDITIONING (BASEMENT) - \$68,000

- Replace the current air conditioning unit that has reached its life expectancy at over 25 years old, to ensure proper cooling of the meeting rooms in the school basement.

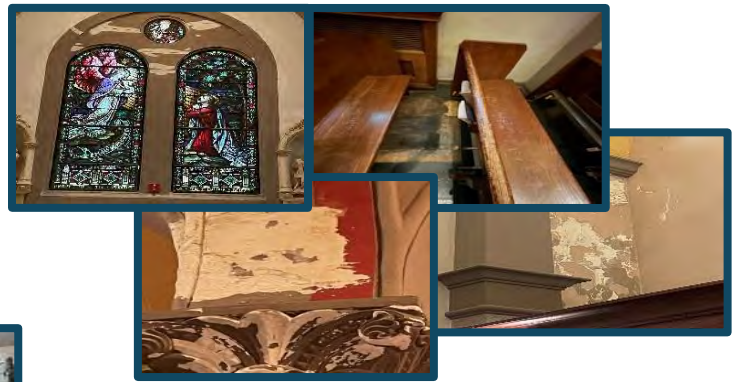
DECLARACIÓN PRELIMINAR DEL CASO

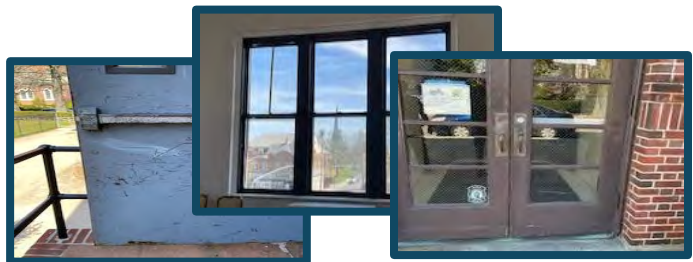

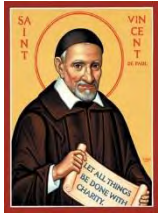

BABY'S LIFE BEFORE BIRTH

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
- ♥ My brain waves can be detected as early as 43 days.
- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.
- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
- ♥ By the 11th and 12th weeks I am moving my arms and legs, sucking my thumb and breathing amniotic fluid. All my systems are working.
- ♥ My movements by 16 weeks are quite active and I can be seen performing somersaults on ultrasound but am not yet felt by my mother.
- ♥ From the 3rd month on nothing new develops. I continue to grow in size and by 20 weeks I have hair on my head, weigh 1 pound and am 12 inches tall.
