





## DEACON'S CORNER



"My Father gives you the true bread from heaven." (See John 6:24-35) People today are interested in many things. They want many things. They work very hard to get these things. Yet, the one important thing, "the food that endures for eternal life" is often neglected, especially during the summer months. They would rather stay home or go to the beach, than come to Mass on Sunday as it is our obligation and great blessing. Why is this? Today's readings show

very clearly that God is the Grand Provider. He provided for the Israelites of old and He provides for us today. What is more, in addition to our daily food, He provides heavenly bread, the bread that endures for eternal life. Do you really believe this? Do you have friends that stay home instead of coming to Mass every Sunday? Please, tell them what they are missing. God feeds us at Mass with "the true bread from heaven." Invite them to come. Remind them that as St. Paul says in Ephesians it is only when we are fed with the Eucharist, "the true bread from heaven" that we can lay aside our way of life to be created anew in His image, "in righteousness and holiness of truth."—See also Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15 and Ephesians 4:17, 20-24.

## Pastor's Message

My Grandmother: Anna Griffith, my mom's mother, was from Country Caven in Ireland and migrated to the USA as a young woman seeking a better life. My grandmother Anna was a deeply religious woman, very Catholic, went to daily mass. Even though she did not have much education she was very smart and spent her life raising her family. Anna Griffith was also a great cook who had the NEED TO FEED PEOPLE—it was in her genetic composition. She always had something on the stove either heating or simmering. She was in her glory when she was feeding people.

Our Lord at his Last Supper knew he had to give his Apostles something, something of himself so they stay together. So, he gives them his body and blood. He feeds them. Table fellowship was very important in our Lord's ministry. So, it was very natural that he fed them his body and blood. Jesus, in his humanity and divinity had this same quality: the need to feed his children. In the Eucharist Jesus feeds us, the Eucharist is the glue that keeps us together, it she table fellow ship and keeps our Spiritual Family together and feeds us. -Jesus wants to satisfy our hunger for: justice, peace, an end to poverty,...

## I.-- We continue with the Bread of Life Discourse which runs the entire chapter 6 in John's gospel.

LAST WEEK: we had the multiplication of the Bread and Fish and the feeding of the 5,000 men. (this miracle appears SIX TIMES in the 4 Gospels--- so it was very significant for the early Christian community)

-- John's Gospel has no INSTITUTION NARRATIVE, the words of consecration at mass, so this is the Eucharist for his gospel. Jesus invites the people to sit down on the grass>>>an allusion to Psalm 23 (Verdant Pastures). They are up on a Mountain, which symbolizes Jesus as the New Moses.

The boy who has 2 fish and 5 Barley loaves and he gives all that he has. The boys giving of the loaves and fish is a paradigm for ministry and reciprocal ministry. Ministry works like this:

--All that we have and all that we are come from God. When we offer even the little we have to God to help others, God gives us back so much more. God multiplies what we have given him. Mother Theresa is a perfect example.

--OUR LORD invites us to become instruments in HIS hands by sharing our blessings with others. Miracles can happen through our hands, when we collect and distribute to the needy the food destined for all by our generous God.

However, after the feeding of the 5,000 the people are CAUGHT UP IN WHAT JESUS CAN DO FOR THEM (the Signs and Miracles) RATHER THAN WHO HE IS--- THEY DON'T SEE HIM AS THE MESSIAH.

-Jesus tries to teach the people: that he himself is the bread that has come from heaven; not the magic provider of everything they want, but the genuine source of all that they need.

II.-- A. In the First reading today from the **Book of Exodus**: the people are complaining God has led them out into the dessert and there is no food. So, he provides them with: **Manna**, **Quail**, and **Water** (The food basics: carbs, protein, and H2O). The Israelites will complain even about this food.

Moses proclaims, "This is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat." Centuries later the Hebrews will fondly look back at those years in the desert when the Lord loved them and taught them to rely on God for their daily bread.

Manna (literally meant What is It?): was a secretion of INSECTS that ran down a leaf and solidified and crystalized (in the cool dessert morning) and formed a PATTY when it hit the ground. However, in the mid-day heat it would LIQUIFY again and then disappear. This is why they could only collect what they needed for the DAY (give us this day our DAILY BREAD) and UTTER RELIANCE ON GOD. The manna was given to them by God.

Quail: Large Flocks of Quail migrated across the Mediterranean Sea. When they reached the other side, they were so exhausted they just dropped from the sky—so they were easy to catch for food.

Even though this food can be explained as naturally occurring phenomena—the FAITHFUL STILL SAW GOD'S HAND IN IT AND ATTRIBUTED THEIR NOURISMENT TO GOD ALONE.

B. In the Gospel today: Jesus is challenging all those who had their fill (and want to make him a Prophet/King so he can continue to feed them) TO BELIEVE IN HIM AS THE BREAD OF LIFE. He wants them to look beyond the signs/miracles and to accept him as one sent from God to give life to the world.

- --He says: "I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE"; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."
- --the "I AM" statements in John are reminiscent of God's answer to Moses on Mt. Sinai. (Exodus 3:14) I AM WHO AM.
- -- Jesus is offering as food, the gift of himself, his teaching, his preaching, his miracles, his very body and blood given up in sacrifice.

III.-- How does the Eucharist FEED US? What are the effects?

- a) Eucharist forgives venial sin
- b) Spiritually strengthens us to build up our Lord's Kingdom
- c) Binds us in INTIMATE COMMUNION with our Lord; --WE BECOME MORE LIKE HIM
- d) Binds us in INTIMATE COMMUNION with His Body the Church.
- --By saying AMEN we are saying I BELIEVE, we are saying 2 things:
  - 1) I am consuming MY LORD'S BODY AND BLOOD
  - 2) I will allow the BODY AND BLOOD OF MY LORD TO Transform ME-so that over TIME I WILL BECOME MORE LIKE HIM
- -- Many came seeking Jesus, but they didn't want to follow him.
- -- They called him "Rabbi," but they refused to be taught.
- --They clamored after bread, but they did not want to be nourished as Jesus intended.
- -- They were willing to work for food that would perish, but Jesus challenged them and their hungers to strive for food that gives eternal life.





## THE BREAD OF LIFE


Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from Heaven, My Father gives you the true Bread from Heaven. For the Bread of God is that which comes down from Heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to Him, "Sir, give us this Bread always." 


