DEACON'S CORNER



Today's Gospel begins with a report that the Jews complained about Jesus' claims regarding his identity. They knew his family, and they knew he was the son of Joseph. They could not comprehend what Jesus meant when he said that he came down from heaven. Jesus responds to the complaints by saying that only those who are chosen by God will recognize him as the one that God sent. This is a recurring theme in John's Gospel, that God has chosen those who will have faith in Jesus.

In the verses that follow, Jesus talks more about his unity with the Father. He is the one who has seen the Father and, therefore, knows the Father. Those who listen to God will recognize that Jesus is the one sent from God. Those who believe will have eternal life. Jesus concludes with the central element of our

eucharistic theology. He promises that the bread of life will bring eternal life to those who partake of it, and he tells us that the bread of life will be his own flesh, given for the life of the world.

In today's reading, we hear Jesus say again, as he did in last week's Gospel, that he is the bread of life. We also hear Jesus adds that he is the living bread. Both of these statements help us understand better the gift that Jesus gives us in the Eucharist. We celebrate this gift of Jesus each time we gather for Mass. We believe that receiving Jesus in the Eucharist will lead us to eternal life.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

El Evangelio de hoy comienza con un relato de que los judíos se quejaron de las afirmaciones de Jesús sobre su identidad. Conocían a su familia y sabían que era el hijo de José. No podían comprender lo que Jesús quería decir cuando dijo que había bajado del cielo. Jesús responde a las quejas diciendo que sólo aquellos que son elegidos por Dios lo reconocerán como el enviado de Dios. Este es un tema recurrente en el Evangelio de Juan, que Dios ha elegido a aquellos que tendrán fe en Jesús.

En los versículos que siguen, Jesús habla más sobre su unidad con el Padre. Él es el que ha visto al Padre y, por lo tanto, conoce al Padre. Aquellos que escuchan a Dios reconocerán que Jesús es el enviado de Dios. Aquellos que creen tendrán vida eterna. Jesús concluye con el elemento central de nuestra teología eucarística. Promete que el pan de vida traerá vida eterna a quienes participen de él, y nos dice que el pan de vida será su propia carne, entregada por la vida del mundo.

En la lectura de hoy, escuchamos a Jesús decir de nuevo, como lo hizo en el Evangelio de la semana pasada, que él es el pan de vida. También escuchamos a Jesús añadir que él es el pan vivo. Ambas declaraciones nos ayudan a entender mejor el don que Jesús nos da en la Eucaristía. Celebramos este don de Jesús cada vez que nos reunimos para la Misa. Creemos que recibir a Jesús en la Eucaristía nos llevará a la vida eterna.

Pastor's Message

"THE BREAD OF LIFE DISCOURSE"

- I .-- What have been the THEMES THUS FAR:
- A.-- The Need to Feed: Jesus looked out at the people and had pity / compassion for them, so he feeds them with his word—the Good News. Then He multiplies the loaves and the fish and feeds the 5,000 (plus their wives and children). Jesus has that NEED to feed. He feeds us in the Eucharist His body and blood. The Eucharist and table fellowship is the glue that keeps the Apostles and us as a community together.
- **B.-- Reciprocal Ministry:** Whatever we have (a little or a lot) when we offer it to our Lord with a generous heart..... he receives it, multiplies it, and feeds a multitude of people. Our Lord wants us to be INSTRUMENTS IN HIS HANDS.

We have the four Eucharistic verbs: TAKES, BLESS, BREAK, AND GIVES

EXAMPLE---OFFERTORY AT MASS... all of the communities' work, sweat, tears, joys, sorrows, etc... are offered up on the altar, and they are turned into the BODY AND BLOOD OF OUR LORD.

- C.-- Bread from Heaven: (Manna and Quail) John the Gospel writer is constantly contrasting Jesus as the BREAD FROM HEAVEN with the MANNA that God provided to the Israelites in the desert.
- --the Manna and Quail taught the Hebrews to rely on God for everything (give us this day our Daily Bread) AND IT KEPT THEM ALIVE FOR 40 YEARS in their journey through the dessert.
- --WHEREAS THE BREAD FROM HEVEN—will give eternal life—Jesus was constantly challenging them to LOOK BEYOND the feeding of the 5,000 and the multiplication of the Bread and the Fish—to LOOK BEYOND THE MIRACLE AND SIGN—TO SEE WHO DID THIS>>>>THE MESSIAH.
- D.-- I am the Bread of Life...I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever:
- 1) Accepting Jesus' Origins: that He said I am the bread come down from heaven: the Jews began to MURMUR AMONG THEMSELVES because as they said: they knew his family: Mary and Joseph. WE KNOW WHERE YOU ARE FROM. You are an uneducated carpenter. It has to do with EXPECTATIONS of the coming Messiah. Many Hebrews were waiting for a PROPHET / KING who would throw off Roman Rule and bring about PROSPERITY and keep their bellies filled (like Jesus did with the bread and fish).
 - --- No One expected the Messiah/King to come into the world in a manger in human form.
- II.-- John's Gospel uses the "I AM" STATEMENTS:
- --I AM the bread of life. I AM the resurrection and the life. I am the sheep gate. John uses the "I AM" statements as a harkening to God's response to Moses on Mt. Sanai when he asks God his name:-- I AM WHO I AM-----I will be for you who I will be for you. I am the living bread come down from Heaven—SPIRITUAL FOOD:

This is why one of THE EFFECTS OF THE EUCHARIST IT to GIVE US THE STRENGTH TO BUILD UP GOD'S KINGDOM—to meet the needs of humanity: PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL.... so that people can be SPIRITUALLY FED.-- forgives venial sin, binds us closer to Christ, binds us closer to the Church.

E.-- The bread that I give is my flesh for the life of the world. This is the last line in today's Gospel: the word FLESH is going to become a great stumbling block for the Jewish people... they are thinking cannibalism

STORY: There's a story told of a young Jewish boy named Mortakai who refused to go to school. When he was six years old, his mother took him to school, but he cried and protested all the way and, immediately after she left, ran back home.

She brought him back to school and this scenario played itself out for several days. He refused to stay in school. His parents tried to reason with him, arguing that he, like all children, must go to school. To no avail. His parents then tried to apply an appropriate combination of bribes and threats. This too had no effect.

Finally, in desperation they went to their rabbi and explained the situation to him. For his part, the rabbi simply said, "If the boy won't listen to words, bring him to me." They brought him into the rabbi's study.

The rabbi said not a word. He simply picked up the boy and held him to his heart for a long time. Then, still without a word, he sat down. What words couldn't accomplish, a silent embrace did. Mortakai not only began willingly to go to school, but he also went on to become a great scholar and a rabbi.

**What that parable wonderfully expresses is how the Eucharist works. IN THE EUCHARIST God physically embraces us.

Words, as we know, have a relative power. In critical situations they often fail us. When this happens, we have still another language, the language of ritual. The most ancient and primal ritual of all is the ritual of physical embrace. It can

say and do what words cannot.

God's CONCLUSION: The Eucharist is embrace. The Eucharist is the glue that keeps us together as a community and is food that sustains our soul until one day it hopefully rests in God's embrace.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731

- Replace the roof to prevent damage to the 100 years old front and main body of the school building.

 Reemplazar y actualizar las puertas y ventanas originales de 40 años de antigüedad, desgastadas y oxidadas.






EL AIRE ACONDICIONADO DE LA ESCUELA (EL SÓTANO) - \$68,000


