DEACON'S CORNER



The man we hear about in today's Gospel could be me, could be you, in fact it should be. We have to let Christ stick his fingers in our ears. To allow Him to open us to His word, His gift of life. That's our first lesson from today's Gospel.

Christ calls us to continue his work, to work as His Church for Him, to help build heaven here on earth. Our second lesson today, is as followers of Christ, it's about how we go about doing His work. Jesus gives us a wonderful demonstration of this today. Think about the way he approached the man in today's gospel. Most of the time when Jesus cured people, He

spoke to them, gave them an instruction or told them their sins had been forgiven. This time he used actions, why? Maybe because the man was deaf, Christ used a sign language to speak to him. He found a way to communicate with the man, before healing him.

That's our second lesson, find a way to communicate with people. That's also the continuation of the prophecy, our tongues are being healed so we can proclaim Christ to a deaf world. But how can we tell the world, or even just one friend, the wonders we know about Christ, if we can't communicate with them. Our ears have been unsealed, we know from our own experience Christ can and will unseal their ears, the challenge we are given as Christians is how do we start the conversation for Christ, He will finish it if we can just start it.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

El hombre del que oímos hablar en el Evangelio de hoy podría ser yo, podría ser usted, de hecho debería serlo. Tenemos que dejar que Cristo meta sus dedos en nuestros oídos, para permitirle abrirnos a su palabra, a su don de vida. Esa es nuestra primera lección del Evangelio de hoy.

Cristo nos llama a continuar su obra, a trabajar como su Iglesia para él, a ayudar a construir el cielo aquí en la tierra. Nuestra segunda lección de hoy es cómo, como seguidores de Cristo, hacemos su obra. Jesús nos da una maravillosa demostración de esto hoy. Piense en la forma en que se acercó al hombre del Evangelio de hoy. La mayoría de las veces, cuando Jesús curaba a las personas, les hablaba, les daba una instrucción o les decía que sus pecados habían sido perdonados. Esta vez utilizó acciones, ¿por qué? Tal vez porque el hombre era sordo, Cristo utilizó un lenguaje de señas para hablarle. Encontró una manera de comunicarse con el hombre antes de sanarlo.

Esa es nuestra segunda lección: encontrar una manera de comunicarnos con las personas. Esa es también la continuación de la profecía, nuestras lenguas están siendo sanadas para que podamos proclamar a Cristo a un mundo sordo. Pero ¿cómo podemos decirle al mundo, o incluso a un solo amigo, las maravillas que conocemos acerca de Cristo, si no podemos comunicarnos con ellos? Nuestros oídos han sido destapados, sabemos por nuestra propia experiencia que Cristo puede y destapará sus oídos, el desafío que se nos da como cristianos es cómo iniciamos la conversación con Cristo, Él la terminará si podemos iniciarla.

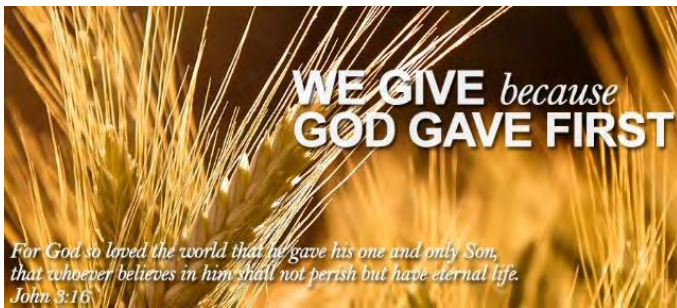

Pastor's Message

I. -- Story: Every Year: at Our Lady of Providence Catholic Grade School (and just about every catholic grade school) they have a **Pin Ceremony** in 8th grade to help the students transition on to High School. In the ceremony each student expresses their: **DREAMS, HOPES, express what they want to be in life:** Veterinarian, M.D. Police, Teacher. They are **ENCOURAGED TO DREAM BIG TO CHANGE THE WORLD**

POINT: I thought to myself: they have their whole life ahead of them: they need to focus on the future. However, **OVER TIME THE FOCUS ON THE FUTURE WILL Lessen TO FOCUS ON THE PRESENT MOMENT.**

****BECAUSE IT IS IN THE PRESENT MOMENT WE ENCOUNTER THE DIVINE****

**** Why** does it take **SOME MONUMENTAL EVENT**, to live in the present moment, **TO APPRECIATE WHAT WE HAVE, TO RECOGNIZE GOD'S PRESENCE?**—Some people don't see / appreciate the goodness in their life **UNTIL IT IS ALL ALMOST GONE.**

STORY/METAPHOR: Ocanee Diner: I was once having lunch at the Ocanee Diner in East Islip. I was by myself; I had some reading to do. An elderly couple was sitting across from me. They just sat there didn't say a word to each other. As they looked at each other they seemed to be **FULLY PRESENT TO AND AWARE OF THE BEAUTY AND RICHNESS AND THE PRESENCE OF THE MOMENT.** No need to fill the air with words—just silence and the sacredness of the present moment.

St. Augustine after his conversion wrote these words (about our Lord): "Late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient, ever new, late have I loved you! You were within me, but I was outside, and it was there that I searched for you. In my unworthiness I plunged into the lovely things you created. You were with me, but I was not with you.

--Augustine: restless search for God **OUTSIDE OF HIMSELF (IN THE THINGS OF THIS WORLD)** He found God in the most **unexpected of places: -in the present moment inside of himself.** --IMPLIED IN THIS: **WHEN WE PRAY:** we don't pray to make God present to us. **He is already there. CLOSER**

TO US THAN WE ARE TO OURSELVES: We pray to make our minds and hearts aware of God—to draw closer to him.

-- Some people can't live in the PRESENT MOMENT BECAUSE OF: restlessness, tiredness, distraction, anger, obsession, wounded, always in a hurry.

--people don't appreciate the beauty of the moment. BUT THEN THEY SAY THEIR LIVES ARE: dull, lacking something—PEOPLE DON'T RELIZE THEIR LIVES ARE LADEN WITH RICHNESS: THEY JUST DON'T SEE IT.

--What makes for a rich life is being: AWARE AND PRESENT TO EACH MOMENT AND THE DIVINE IN US.--Why does it take sickness or death, or a life radically threatened to realize this?

A.-- Victor Frankl, a concentration camp survivor, author of: *Man's Search For Meaning*. He was declared clinically dead for several minutes and then revived by doctors.---When he returned to his ordinary life: every thing changed: just the very act of living, of walking and breathing, and eating, and talking now took on a deeper/richer meaning.

B.-- the PURPOSE OF PRAYER IS: -- TO DISCOVER AND DRAW CLOSER TO THE DIVINE INSIDE OF US IN THE HERE AND NOW-- Purpose: IN THIS LIFE IS DRAW CLOSER TO GOD, to have faith and prepare us for Heaven...

II.-- PURPOSE OF MIRACLES:

1.-- MIRACLES: INCREASE FAITH: But to experience a miracle you need to have a least some Faith (the Gospels tell us this)--A miracle is granted to **increase our faith**--Why are some people NOT GRANTED MIRACLES? 1.-- God will always give us what we need, not always what we want: we have to be asking for the correct thing. 2.-- BECAUSE THEY ALREADY HAVE GREAT FAITH...People with great faith don't need a miracle (for them Heaven is the next step)

2.-- MIRACLES: MAKE US AWARE THAT GOD IS ALL AROUND US

Karl Rahner: was once asked whether he believed in miracles. He answered: "I don't just believe in them; I rely on them to get me through each day!"

--Miracles occur all the time, are we aware?

3.-- MIRACLES: restored the individual to the way God intended them to be: whole / complete as human beings: Remember Jews believed that if you were deformed or sick or crippled in any way it was due to your sinfulness or

the sinfulness of your ancestors. So, Jesus makes them whole and complete as human beings.

4.-- MIRACLES: PEOPLE WHO RECEIVE A MIRACLE AND WITNESS A MIRACLE BECAME PROCLAIMERS OF THE GOOD NEWS.

III.-- We hear in the Gospel: And **people brought** to Him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and (**People**) **begged** Him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself **away from the crowd**. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"— that is, "Be opened!" And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly.

A.-- When it says: **People brought to Jesus and Begged Jesus to heal . . .** : Expresses the Need to be a member of a community. Your spiritual family can lift you up in prayer: best example: Lowering the paralytic through the roof: this is what we do in prayer: we lift a person up and place them at the feet of Jesus.

B.-- When it says: **Jesus took the Deaf / Mute aside**: so that HIS WOULD BE THE FIRST VOICE HE HEARS --also the community spoke for the man the words he could not.

C.-- DON'T TELL ANYONE: **Markan (Mark's Gospel) Secret** and is found throughout the Gospel: Jesus didn't want news to spread about Him so fast so that his passion would occur sooner. ALSO: as soon as you tell someone NOT TO DO SOMETHING: WHAT DO THEY DO: **THEY PROCLAIM IT ALL THE MORE**:

IV.-- MESSAGE FOR US: Are aware of the:

-- MIRACLES HAPPEN ALL THE TIME: GOD IS ALL AROUND YOU

--THE RICHNESS AND BEAUTY OF EVERY MOMENT,

--HOW SACRED YOUR LIFE IS

--THIS IS NOT SOMETHING YOU KEEP TO YOURSELF—YOU HAVE TO SHARE IT / PROCLAIM IT TO OTHERS:--THIS IS ALL PART OF THE GOOD NEWS--

THE DEAF HEAR AND THE MUTE SPEAK



Again Jesus left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. And people brought to Him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged Him to lay His hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put His finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then He looked up to Heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!" — that is, "Be opened!" — And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more He ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

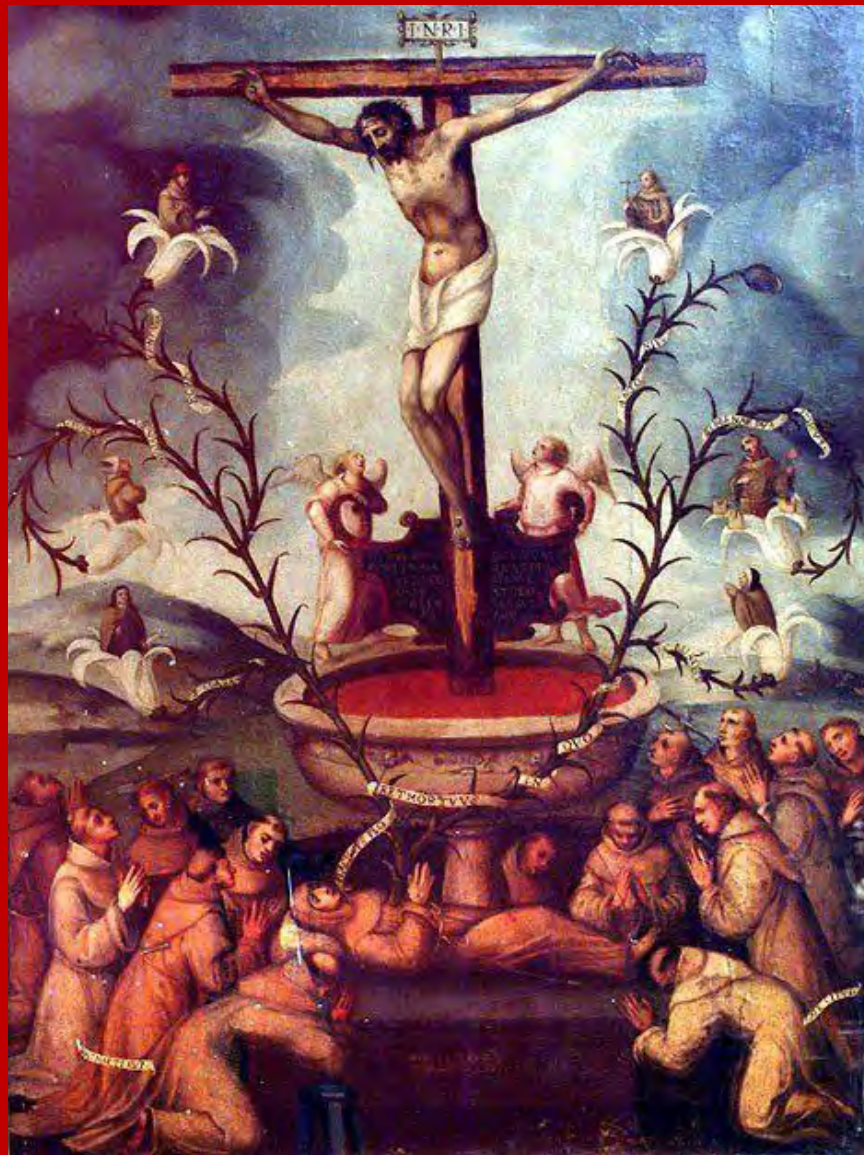

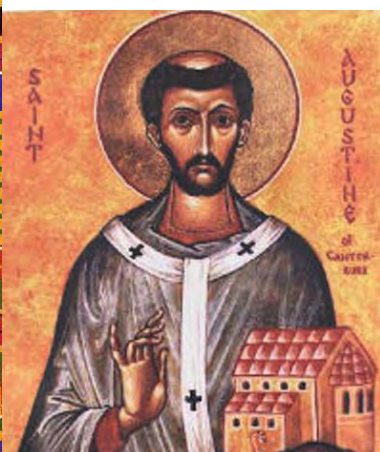

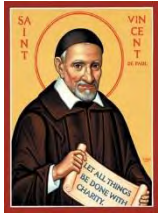

BABY'S LIFE BEFORE BIRTH

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
- ♥ My brain waves can be detected as early as 43 days.
- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.

- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
- ♥ By the 11th and 12th weeks I am moving my arms and legs, sucking my thumb and breathing amniotic fluid. All my systems are working.
- ♥ My movements by 16 weeks are quite active and I can be seen performing somersaults on ultrasound but am not yet felt by my mother.
- ♥ From the 3rd month on nothing new develops. I continue to grow in size and by 20 weeks I have hair on my head, weigh 1 pound and am 12 inches tall.
