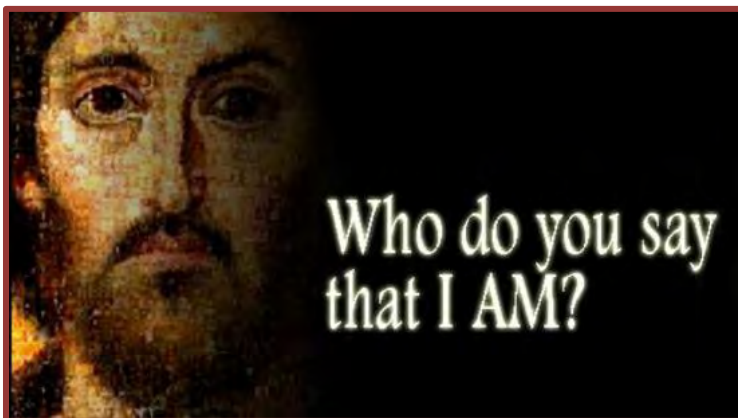

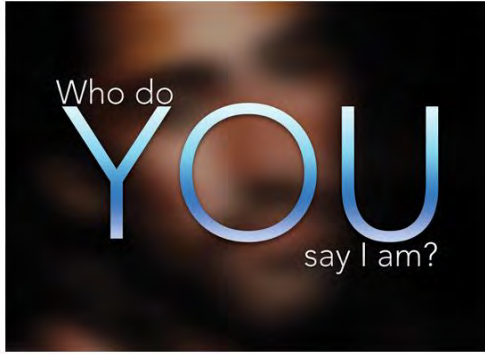

DEACON'S CORNER



“Who do people say that I am?” (See Saint Mark 8:27-35) It is easy to parrot what others say, to imitate their faith. But then, Jesus goes deeper, “But, who do *you* say that I am?” This is an open and ever-present question for all of us, and each one of us has to answer it in his or her personal way. No disciple of Jesus escapes the question. How do we answer? Sometimes we are in the position Peter saw himself and we give an oral answer, clear and definitive. But, in reality we are answering the question every moment of our

lives. Not just when we do what some may refer to as church stuff, but on every moment of our lives. Whenever we do what is loving, whenever we do what is good, whenever we do what is moral and upright, whenever we help the poor, whenever we stand for justice, we are saying like Peter did “You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God.” Whenever we are doing what is wrong, what is evil, what is selfish, we are denying Him. We need to realize that the question is ever present and so is the answer. How do we answer? Who do we say that He is? We can look at the example of that Perfect Disciple, Mary, the Most Holy Mother of God. She knew who Her Son was, and she acted in harmony with it. Her final words in the Gospel are: “Do whatever He tells you.”

“¿Quién dice la gente que soy yo?” No fue muy difícil responder a esa pregunta de Jesús que se encuentra en el Evangelio de hoy (Vea San Marcos 8:27-35) Es fácil repetir lo que otros dicen, imitar la fe de otros. Pero entonces, Jesús penetra más profundamente en el asunto, “Y ustedes, ¿quién dicen que soy yo?” Esta es una pregunta abierta y siempre presente para todos y cada uno de nosotros. Ningún discípulo de Jesús puede escaparse de ella. ¿Cómo la contestamos? A veces nos encontramos en la misma posición en que estuvo Pedro y tenemos que dar una respuesta oral, clara y definitiva. Pero en realidad estamos dando respuesta a la pregunta a cada minuto de nuestra vida. No solo cuando hacemos algo que pueda verse como asunto de la iglesia, sino a cada momento de nuestra vida, estamos dando respuesta a la pregunta de Jesús. Siempre que hacemos lo que es bueno, siempre que hacemos lo que es amoroso, lo que es moral, lo que es justo, siempre que ayudamos al pobre, siempre que nos ponemos de parte de la justicia, estamos respondiendo como hizo Pedro, “Tú eres el Mesías, el hijo de Dios.” Siempre que hacemos lo que es malo, lo que es inicuo, lo que es egoísta, lo estamos negando. Tenemos que darnos cuenta de que esta pregunta siempre está presente y que nuestra respuesta también lo es. ¿Cómo respondemos a la pregunta?

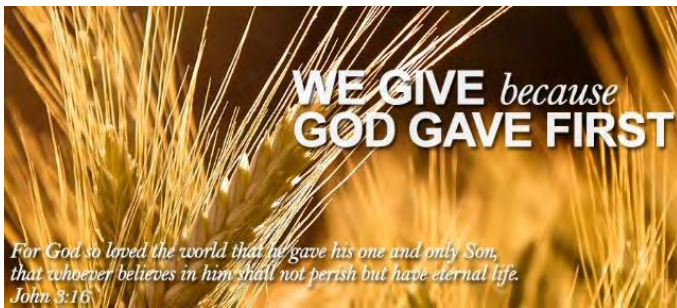

Pastor's Message

I.-- Jesus is in the First Year of Public Ministry; He is in Gentile Territory. He knows of all the DIFFERENT EXPECTATIONS ABOUT THE MESSIAH... So, he decides to test the waters...to get the gossip.... To see if people are REALLY GETTING IT....

--after a year of preaching and healing, and miracles...are people getting it.....SO HE ASKS HIS APOSTLES...WHO DO PEOPLE SAY THAT I AM? **WHAT IS THE BUZZ...THE GOSSIP...**they respond some say you are:

- A) **Elijah**—went up on a chariot of fire to heaven....people thought he would return.
- B) **John the Baptist**---many thought John would come back to life.
- C) **One of the Prophets**---most expected a **Prophet/King** that would, get rid of the Romans and restore Israel to its former glory and prosperity like under time of King David....

--these were the existing expectations of the coming Messiah in our Lord's day. Of course ..**THE CORE OF JESUS' QUESTION: ARE PEOPLE GETTING IT? DO THEY SEE ME AS THE MESIAH?**

II.-- **Then Jesus makes IT PERSONAL:** by turning the question on his apostles: **WHO DO YOU** (my Apostles who have been with me over a year) **SAY THAT I AM?**

--of course Peter (spokesperson for the Apostles) hits the bulls eye...Peter blurts out: **YOU ARE THE CHRIST!**

--Jesus tells them **NOT TO TELL ANYONE.**

III.-- **THIS RAISES THE QUESTION: WHO IS JESUS CHRIST FOR YOU? WHAT EXPECTATIONS DO YOU HAVE?**

--**DO YOU BELIEVE YOU CAN ASK OUR LORD FOR ANYTHING AND HE WILL ANSWER YOU?**

--WE NEED TO HAVE HIGH EXPECTATIONS OF OUR LORD---THAT ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE WITH GOD---- IN THUS DOING WE ALLOW GOD TO BE GOD IN OUR LIVES.....

STORY: A MIDDLE-AGED PARISHIONER who passed away recently: her son gave a beautiful eulogy and tribute to his mom at the funeral home. In trying to understand his Mom's death he said, " We were taught that when you ask God for things in prayer (ASK ANYTHING IN MY NAME AND I WILL GRANT IT TO YOU)." **Where is the answer to our prayer???** We prayed to YOU to end her suffering... not end her life.....

--YOUNG MAN WAS IN EFFECT SAYING: Lord, I believe in you and all things are possible with you.....BUT?????-----EXPECTATIONS---

--When these kinds of things happen to people.....they lower their expectations of God.....**WHICH SHOULD NOT BE THE CASE!**

--IN MANY INSTANCES GOD:

--WILL NOT GIVE US ANSWERS---ARE NO ANSWERS

--WILL NOT GIVE US UNDERSTANDING---nothing to understand

--HOWEVER: **HE WILL GIVE US MEANING:** GOD ALWAYS ANSWERS OUR PRAYERS AND WILL GIVE US WHAT WE NEED NOT ALWAYS WHAT WE WANT...

--**IMPORTANT:** HAD the young man in the story discerned MORE: He would have gotten THIS from God:

-- In bringing your Mom home to heaven, I ended her suffering and she fulfilled her DESTINY TO BE WITH ME IN PARADISE. HER DEATH WAS BIRTH INTO NEW LIFE WITH ME.

IV.-- THERE IS A (1932) film called "**The Man Who Played God**". It featured the great character actor, **George Arliss (Scarecrow in Wizard of OZ)** , playing the part of a prominent, rich musician (**Montgomery Royale**). Lost his hearing due to a bomb explosion, the musician became embittered and cynical.

--Not only did he turn his back on his friends (and his Fiancée **Grace Blair** played by **Betty Davis**), he turned his back on God.

--He lived in a penthouse overlooking Central Park and **began to learn the art of lip-reading**. From his penthouse window, he would look through a set of high-powered binoculars and try to read people's lips.

--One day he concentrated on a young man whose lips were moving in prayer. He determined what it was the **young man was praying** for and then dispatched his butler to deliver it to him.

--On another occasion he read the lips of a woman who was telling another about something she needed and wanted desperately. Again, the wealthy musician saw to it that the need was met.

--**And each time he performed one of these services, the cynical musician would look heavenward and laugh in God's face.**

--He found it laughable that he was playing God but didn't even believe in God.

--But as time went by, and his eccentric method of meeting people's needs continued, something strangely wonderful began to happen.

--**The man who played God, found God.** Through the game he was playing
-- **the game of serving people's needs**

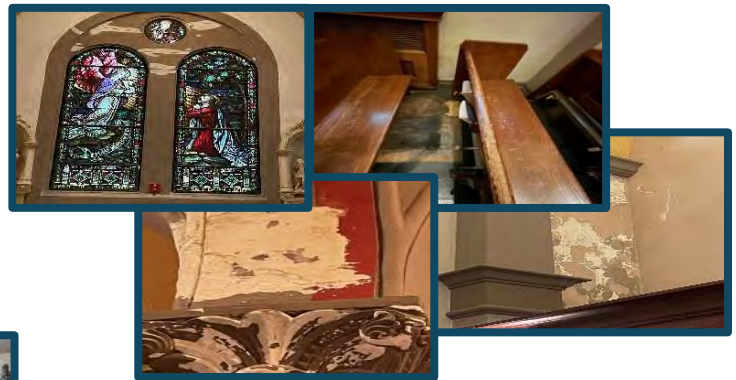
PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT

For many years, Our Holy Redeemer Parish has welcomed all who walk through its doors, educating the Catholic community with the knowledge and love of God and of the Gospel. Our beloved church has adapted and expanded to the needs of parishioners in order to remain a thriving oasis of faith and community.

Today we find ourselves in an exciting moment in our parish's history. As we look forward to the future, we recognize the need to renovate our church and school. The proposed necessary projects for the church and school have been carefully identified.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731

- Repair interior walls and floors that were damaged before the roof replacement, by rainfall and faulty HVAC system.
- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



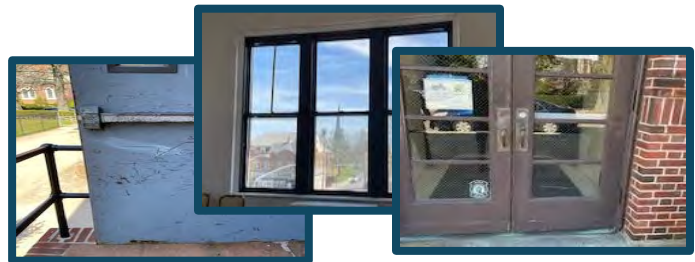
SCHOOL ROOF - \$166,100

- Replace the roof to prevent damage to the 100 years old front and main body of the school building.

SCHOOL

WINDOWS AND DOORS - \$453,525

- Replace and upgrade the 40-year-old, worn out and rusted, original doors and windows.



SCHOOL AIR CONDITIONING (BASEMENT) - \$68,000
