# DEACON'S CORNER



In today's Gospel, Jesus begins to prepare his disciples for what is to come. He identifies himself with the "just one" in the Book of Wisdom which we heard in today's first reading. He will be put to the test to give proof of his gentleness and patience. He will be condemned to a shameful death—and God will take care of him.

Mark comments that the disciples did not understand the saying and were afraid to question him. Apparently, they distracted themselves by arguing about who was the greatest among them.

Jesus was not distracted and continued to teach them

about himself and how they were to live. "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Jesus is among them as servant – the "suffering servant."

The child Jesus places in their midst and embraces is how they are to receive him: peaceably, gently, without inconstancy or insincerity, open to wisdom from above.

Jesus comes to us as the "suffering servant" – Savior and Lord. He invites us to embrace him as he did the child. May we not allow ourselves to become distracted by petty, personal concerns. Let us accept Jesus as the First and Only in our lives, for he has shown us how to be the last and the servant of all.

this in My name, receives Me; and whoever receives Me, receives not Me but the One who sent Me."



Pastor's Message

I.-- As we move along the JOURNEY OF CONVERSION: we follow the commandments but also CHANGE OUR VALUES TO BE MORE LIKE THE VALUES OF the Kingdom of God. It is often a constant struggle against the values of our culture. For example: forgiveness: American culture would say destroy your enemies. Jesus however says: pray for your enemies and for people you don't like and even get on your nerves. To forgive them always. Another example is wealth. The world would say have the best car, best house, best zip code. However, our Lord would say that our true treasure is God's grace in our hearts. The example of Power: the world says be in control, have authority over peoples lives, achieve things. Our Lord says: to be able to forgive is true power. Forgiveness is power. The world would say that true greatness is defined in: Churchill, Lincoln, Kennedy, etc. HOW DOES OUR LORD DEFINE GREATNESS?

### Story: HOW DO WE DEFINE GREATNESS?

In 1983 at the United Nations....the Secretary General: Javier Perez de Cuellar before a an ELITE GATHERING OF DIGNITARIES, HEADS OF STATE, REPRESENTATIVES OF ALL THE MEMBER COUNTRIES OF THE U.N. stood up and in ONE SENTENCE INDRODUCED THE HONOREE FOR THAT EVENING:

---HE SAID, "I PRESENT TO YOU THE GREATEST AND MOST POWERFUL PERSON IN THE ENTIRE WORLD."

--- AT THAT: a short older woman dressed in a simple white and blue SARI stood up... IT WAS MOTHER THERESA.

\*\*WE ASK: AMONG THE PRESIDENTS AND HEADS OF STATE THAT WERE PRESENT, SOME OF WHOM HAD THE POWER TO WIPE OUT OTHER COUNTRIES,

--HOW IS IT MOTHER THERESA IS THE GREATEST AND MOST POWERFUL?????\*\*\*She was the living proof of Jesus' words in today's gospel

that real greatness lies in serving others. She served all with love and compassion.\*\*\*\*

II—In the Gospel: Jesus is returning to Capernaum; he is avoiding crowds so he can spend more time teaching his Apostles. He makes 3 predictions of his suffering and death in CHAPTERS 8,9,10. APOSTLES WERE PERTURBED because they were hoping to SHARE IN HIS GLORY AND POWER. 7. In chapter 8 he rebukes Peter (you are not thinking as GOD DOES). In chapter 9, the Apostles are Arguing (on the road) who is the Greatest. In chapter 10 James and John ask if they can sit (right

B. In the SECOND PART OF GOSPEL:(AT PETER'S house) JESUS TELLS THEM WHAT TRUE GREATNESS IS: (math formula) /HUMILITY + SERVICE= GREATNESS

--APOSTLES HAD DIFFERENT EXPECTATIONS OF THE MESIAH----THEY /HOPED TO SHARE IN JESUS' POWER AND GLORY... (PROPHET / KING ) Jesus wanted them to look beyond their own: ENVY, JEALOUSY, INTERESTS / WANT THEM TO EMBRACE the values of the Kingdom of God. Jesus used here a PLAY ON WORDS—ARAMAIC WORD THAT CAN MEAN: SERVANT OR CHILD.

--THE PERSON WHO IS FIRST (#1) IS SERVANT(CHILD) TO ALL. A CHILD HAS NO POWER OR WEALTH, CAN'T GIVE BACK, HELPLESS, WEAK... --TRUE GREATNESS CONSISTS IN LOVING SERVICE OF ONE'S NEIGHBOR: EVEN THE WEAKEST AND POOREST.

III.-- Havard Business School studied qualities of the great leaders, and there is one surprising finding: the best/most effective people are the ones who promote others people's success. 90% of the top leaders made it a priority to help their subordinates succeed at their jobs... in succeeding at their jobs the fulfilled the mission of the company. Only 4% of top leaders were selfcentered in their career goals

A.-- DAVE THOMAS....FOUNDER / CEO OF WENDY'S (book: Well Done: the common guy's guide to success) all workers for Wendy's need to get their MBA (not Masters of Bus. Admin) but rather... MOP, BUCKET, ATITUDE...THAT IS A COMMITMENT TO SERVICE.

--THIS IS WHAT CHRIST WANTS FROM US: <u>TO SERVE NOT TO BE</u> <u>SERVED.</u>--This is the key to success / to happiness. "If anyone wants to be first, he must be the very last, and the servant of all."

### IV.-- TO CONCRETIZE HIS POINT: JESUS PUTS CHILD IN MIDST:

--child represents the most powerless member of any society, a person who has no power, no influence, a person who can be controlled, neglected or spoiled and rendered selfish by others.

-- HE shows us that, when serving others, we must serve the least important, no social status, the outcast, the sinner, the sick and the feeble.

\*\*WE CAN SAY THAT: LOVE MAY BE THE CROWN OF ALL VIRTUES, BUT HUMILITY IS THE FOUNDATION...

Winston Churchill was once asked, "Doesn't it thrill you to know that every time you make a speech, the hall is packed to overflowing?" "It's quite flattering," replied Sir Winston. "But whenever I feel that way, I always remember that if instead of making a political speech I were being hanged, the crowd would be twice as big."

V.-- <u>The Second Reading from James</u>--reinforces this message: James warns us that selfish ambition destroy peace and cause conflicts. James too advises us to choose the path of humble service which leads to lasting peace. James expresses that conflicts come from our inordinate desires, jealousy, worldly cravings and selfish ambitions. The DISCIPLES WERE HUMAN BEINGS--THEY WANTED TO STAND OUT...THEY WERE AMBITIOUS. there is nothing wrong with Ambition as long as it does not cause you to step on people.

STORY: group of European college professors once visited Mother Teresa in Calcutta. She said to them, <u>"You try to do what I am doing, then you will be able to enjoy what I am doing.</u>" She took them to one of her childcare centers and picked up a child who was playing in the mud and gave the child a kiss. She waited for her guests to do the same. None of them did. Jesus selected a child as a way of saying to the disciples how they were to serve those who were helpless, those who could not help themselves, regardless of their age. This is how we best serve God--by serving the least and the lowest.

# **Proposal 1: A Wolf in Sheep's Clothing**

A statement of the Catholic Bishops of New York State

On November 5, faithful citizens throughout the nation will have the opportunity once again to exercise their sacred right to vote. Pope Francis has reminded us that as thoughtful Catholics, we must participate in the public square for the sake of the common good. Every Catholic is called to do the work of properly informing his or her conscience and voting for candidates and policies that will best advance the natural law, the protection of human rights, the dignity of the human person, the sacredness of all life, and the teachings of Christ and His Church. It is a presidential election year, and there are important votes to be cast for Congress and the state Legislature as well. Importantly, in New York, like several other states, there is also a critical referendum on the ballot.

Educating oneself will be especially important in the case of Proposal 1, sometimes referred to as the "Equal Rights Amendment." The title suggests a noble cause, as all children of God should be treated equally under the law. However, this proposed amendment to the state Constitution is broadly written and could have dangerous consequences if enacted, which is why we oppose it and urge you to vote no. The measure would, effectively, permanently legalize abortion without restriction and up until the moment of birth in New York. Aside from being redundant in a state that already has stripped away all abortion limitations, the amendment would render impossible any change to the law if the hearts and minds of New Yorkers were ever to shift toward protecting the child in the womb.

The amendment's sweeping language and inclusion of "age" as a protected class could also lead to parents' rights being stripped away. Courts could decide that parents have no authority over their minor children on important matters and permit children to make destructive and permanent decisions on their own which they could well live to regret, including but not limited to so-called "gender affirming" treatments and surgeries. The relationship between parents and their children is sacred. Parents must be able to support and guide their children in accord with the natural law, without interference from the government or courts, which would be reaching beyond their competency.

Proposal 1 is a wolf in sheep's clothing that could lead to darkness for many New York families. This amendment disregards the lives of unborn and struggling children in the name of political agendas. It could have dangerous consequences for these children and their parents. As they look to make their voices heard in the public square, faithful Catholics should consider these consequences and vote no. Likewise, they should thoughtfully vote their informed conscience up and down the ballot so that we might usher in change for good.

# Propuesta 1: Un lobo con piel de oveja

### Declaración de los Obispos Católicos del Estado de Nueva York


El 5 de noviembre, los fieles ciudadanos de toda la nación tendrán una vez más la oportunidad de ejercer su sagrado derecho al voto. El Papa Francisco nos ha recordado que, como católicos de buen juicio, tenemos la obligación de participar en el ámbito de la opinión pública en beneficio del bien común. Cada católico está llamado a tomarse el trabajo de informar adecuadamente a su conciencia y votar por los candidatos y las políticas que mejor promuevan la ley natural, la protección de los derechos humanos, la dignidad de la persona humana, el carácter sagrado de toda vida y las enseñanzas de Cristo y su Iglesia. Es un año de elecciones presidenciales y además hay votaciones importantes para el Congreso y la Legislatura estatal. Cabe mencionar que en Nueva York, al igual que en otros estados, también hay un referéndum decisivo en las urnas.

Instruirse será especialmente importante en el caso de la Propuesta 1, en ocasiones denominada "Enmienda de Igualdad de Derechos". El título sugiere una causa noble, ya que todos los hijos de Dios deben recibir el mismo trato ante la ley. Sin embargo, esta propuesta de enmienda a la Constitución estatal está redactada en términos generales y podría tener consecuencias peligrosas si se promulga, por lo que nos oponemos a ella y les instamos a votar en contra. La medida, en efecto, legalizaría permanentemente el aborto sin restricciones y hasta el momento del nacimiento en Nueva York. Además de ser redundante en un estado que ya ha eliminado todas las restricciones al aborto, la enmienda haría imposible cualquier cambio en la ley si los corazones y las mentes de los neoyorquinos cambiaran alguna vez hacia la protección del niño en el vientre materno.

El lenguaje amplio de la enmienda y la inclusión de la "edad" como clase protegida también podrían llevar a que se despojara a los padres de sus derechos. Los tribunales podrían decidir que los padres no tienen autoridad sobre sus hijos menores en asuntos importantes y permitir que los niños tomen por su cuenta decisiones destructivas y permanentes de las que podrían llegar a arrepentirse, incluidos, entre otros, los llamados tratamientos y cirugías de "afirmación de género". La relación entre padres e hijos es sagrada. Los padres deben ser capaces de apoyar y guiar a sus hijos de acuerdo con la ley natural, sin interferencias del gobierno o de los tribunales, que irían más allá de sus competencias.

La Propuesta 1 es un lobo con piel de oveja que podría llevar a la oscuridad a muchas familias neoyorquinas. Esta enmienda ignora la vida de los niños no nacidos y en dificultades en nombre de agendas políticas. Podría tener consecuencias peligrosas para estos niños y sus padres. A la hora de hacer oír sus voces en el ámbito de la opinión pública, los fieles católicos deberían considerar estas consecuencias y manifestar su voto en contra. Del mismo modo, deberían votar con buen juicio y su conciencia bien informada en las urnas para que podamos introducir un cambio positivo.
