

### DEACON'S CORNER



The Gospel focuses on GOD's desire that humans have blessings and positive experiences from their human relationship in the way that GOD originally intended them to have. Human weakness has weakened the interpretation of what GOD desires for human relationships. Moses allowed divorce because of the hardness of the heart of humans – their sinful nature. Yet, before sin entered the world, GOD had created man and woman to be images of GOD and to share together in GOD's personal relationship and the divine process of

creation. Jesus draws His listeners (especially His disciples) back to GOD's ideal plan of a woman and a man sharing a loving and physical relationship as a reflection of the relationship they have with GOD and that GOD has within the GODhead.

The second part of today's Gospel (which can optionally be read) deals with relationship that GOD desires to have with humans. It should be similar to the relationship that a child has with her/his parents. It is a relationship of unquestioning trust by the child and complete obedience to the will of the parents.

Jesús lleva a sus oyentes (especialmente a sus discípulos) de vuelta al plan ideal de Dios de que una mujer y un hombre compartan una relación amorosa y física como reflejo de la relación que tienen con Dios y que Dios tiene dentro de la Deidad.

La segunda parte del Evangelio de hoy (que se puede leer opcionalmente) trata de la relación que Dios desea tener con los seres humanos. Debe ser similar a la relación que un niño tiene con sus padres. Es una relación de confianza incondicional por parte del niño y de obediencia completa a la voluntad de los padres.

# OHR Its Inspect, Not Text 1851

### Pastor's Message

First off, it has to be said that if anyone is divorced, that the purpose of these readings and why they are included in the Sunday Cycle of Readings is NOT TO SHAME ANYONE. Also, we know people, and we all do, that are divorced—good people who entered their marriage with the best of intentions of making it work—but they tried everything... and even though they tried everything, their marriage failed.

I.-- Today's Gospel passage is another POIGNANT EXAMPLE of a Biblical Passage that has to be looked at and understood in its Context. RATHER THAN JUST agree or dismiss a passage based on our experience. Today's Gospel passage upholds a very positive and important dimension of marriage: the indissolubility / permanence of marriage. This is the Beauty of Marriage: THE TWO BECOME ONE FLESH...THIS IS ANOTHER WAY OF SAYING: "SOULMATES".... spouses become so close: (spiritually, psychologically, emotionally, physically...they literally are: ONE BEING, one flesh.

THE LOVE BETWEEN HUSBAND AND WIFE IN A SACRAMENTAL MARRIAGE BECOMES A REFLECTION A SPARK OF GOD'S INFINITE DIVINE LOVE FOR HUMANITY.

This is so important because the FAMILY: HUSBAND+WIFE+ CHILDREN= BUILDING BLOCK OF THE K OF G-Jesus is building his Kingdom in this world: Brick by Brick-or family by family, by family....

This historical and social context in which our Lord spoke the words: "Whoever divorces their spouse and marries another commits adultery" was that there was widespread abuse of divorce and remarriage. Our Lord here in DEFENDING THE WEAK AND VULNERABLE—IN THIS CASE THE WIFE. At the time of our Lord marriage was an arranged legal contract. Under Jewish law the husband had all the power and wife was considered a possession and only the husband could divorce. If he got tired of his wife or bored all he has to do was give her a WRIT OF DIVORCE and dismiss her.

She needed this WRIT to marry another otherwise she would be destitute and have no economic means.

What contributed to this frequent divorce and re-marriage was a raging debate between two RABINICAL SCHOOLS over Deuteronomy 24: 1—4

If a man takes a wife, and after they are married, she is unpleasing to him because of something objectionable in her, let him give her a statement in

writing and send her away from his house. 2 And when she has gone away from him, she may become another man's wife. (Deuteronomy 24:1-2)

One school defined "something objectionable" as nothing less than INFIDELITY; the other school said that divorce could occur for LESSER REASONS. So that at the time of our Lord, divorce and remarriage was a widespread practice and marriage commitment was not taken seriously. It wasn't that the Law of Moses allowed divorce/but out of the "hardness of their hearts" of the Israelite people, Moses permitted divorce.

II.-- It is in this context that our Lord REAFFIRMED THE PERMANENCE OF MARRIAGE: and prohibited divorce referring to Genesis that a man and woman are now "ONE FLESH" In doing so our Lord raised up the dignity of marriage, recognizing that the Marital/familial relationship is the essential fabric of society and even more importantly is essential to the completion of God's Kingdom on earth. We can say that if Jesus Chris. is building up his kingdom on earth: family by family or brick by brick. This is why family life and especially the marital relationship is so important to the Kingdom of God / Church.

Marriage as we understand it today: as a COVENANT between a man and a woman would not be defined until after VAT II (1983 Canon Law) our Lord was laying the foundation for marriage to be raised to the dignity of a sacrament.

--The definition of marriage: Marriage is a covenant between a man and a woman, a partnership of the whole life, ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation of children... Raised to the dignity of a SACRAMENT.

--In this definition we hear the required elements: --COVENANT: BOND that is entered into FREELY, --PARTNERSHIP: implies equality between the two, that they will both work at it together / a team.

UNITY (fidelity): that there will be no one else,

FOR THE WHOLE LIFE: indissolubility (until death do us part),

OPENESS TOWARDS CHILDREN: procreation.

TOWARDS THE GOOD OF THE SPOUSES:

Up until the 1917 revision of Canon Law marriage was seen as a contract and the primary end of marriage was having children. The secondary end of marriage: the good and mutual wellbeing of the spouses became a co-equal end of marriage after Vatican II and the revision of Canon Law in 1983.

We tend to think that the sacraments as we know them have always been the same. Jesus Christ instituted the 7 sacraments and gave them to his Church on Pentecost, however, they developed over time... Historically, the Church didn't even get involved with marriage until after the fall of the Roman Empire and civil authority over marriage began to break down. In the 6/7 Century.

Interestingly enough: no sooner does our Lord declare the ABSOLUTE INDOSOLUBITLY OF MARRIAGE; that the Gospel writers and even Paul begin to SOFTEN this IDEAL and MODIFY it in various ways. Paul introduces what is known as the: PAULINE PRIVILEGE: which makes a Christian convert free to marry if the non-Christian partner divorces him/her.

Mark's Gospel extends the prohibition of divorce on the part of the husband, to divorce on the part of the WIFE, thus adapting Jesus' ideal for marriage: to Roman law, which unlike Hebrew Law allowed a wife to divorce her husband

Matthew modifies the commandment by permitting divorce in the case of the wife's infidelity.

The early church accepted as law the ideal that Christ set forth and demanded RADICAL OBEDIENCE to this law AS THE CHURCH STILL DOES TODAY; but immediately the Early Church applied this ideal in pastoral practice and allowed concessions>>> recognizing all are called to strive to live the ideal but many times the IDEAL remains ELUSIVE to many people OFTENTIMES through no fault of their own.

III.-- Why is the INDISSOLUBILITY DIMENSION of marriage so important? We believe that marriage as a sacrament manifests God's infinite love to each spouse. That the Love that Christ has for his CHURCH is manifest in the love between husband and wife—that over time (arguments, disagreements, failures, forgiveness, reconciliations, healing, commitment, fidelity, permanence, etc.) each spouse will come to know the REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST in and through one another. Gods INFINITE AND EVERLASTING LOVE is reflected in the MARITAL BOND.

Conclusion: Our Gospel today upholds permanence of marriage. The ideal should always be strived for and never be taken lightly or dismissed too easily. We pray that God's grace will enable all married couples to strive for the ideal.






