DEACON'S CORNER




The Gospel today, *(See Saint Mark 10:17-30)*, tells the story of a very good young man who wants to follow Jesus and who has been deeply faithful to the teachings of God in his Jewish faith. Yet, when Jesus asks the young man to give up all his wealth and come and follow HIM, then the young man goes away sad. What a strong teaching. God is always asking things of each of us. In so many ways, we are like the rich young man: good and

not yet totally committed. We don't know what the young man did later on. Perhaps he ended up selling everything and giving it to the poor and following Jesus. But his first response was only sadness.

We can ask ourselves what would make us sad to give up for the sake of following the Lord. Ideally, we should be able to give up everything and follow the Lord Jesus. Jesus does not ask everyone to give up everything right away, but in the end we all know that we must be willing to give up everything and cling only to the Lord. Only if we continue to grow in our awareness of and acceptance of HIS love can we finally give up all for Him and enter the Kingdom. Deacon Bruce

Solo si continuamos creciendo en nuestra conciencia y aceptación de SU amor, podremos finalmente entregarlo todo por Él y entrar en el Reino.

Pastor's Message

OCTOBER 13, 2024

I.-- Do we let our "things" rule our lives? In the First Reading: we need to be prudent and seek the virtue of wisdom rather than riches or social influence. Solomon chose wisdom before anything else.

The Second Reading: warns that we will be accountable before God as to how we use our blessings.

In the Gospel: true religion consists of sharing one's blessings with others rather than hoarding them and getting inordinately attached to them.

STORY: Maya Angelou tells the story about her Aunt Tee (Theresa): who worked as a housekeeper for a couple in Bel Air, California. She lived with the couple in their spacious fourteen-room ranch house. They were a **very quiet couple**. As they had gotten older, they had **stopped entertaining their friends** and even spoke less to each other. "Finally," Maya says, "they sat in a dry silence."

Aunt Tee, on the other hand, enjoyed entertaining her friends on Saturday evenings. She would cook a pot of pig's feet, a pot of greens, fry chicken, make potato salad, and make banana pudding for her friends to feast upon. And they would have a marvelous time together. There was always plenty of laughter coming from Aunt Tee's room.

One Saturday as they were playing cards, the old couple called her. "Theresa, we don't mean to disturb you..." the man whispered, "but you all seem to be having such a good time..." The woman added, "We hear you and your friends laughing every Saturday night, and we'd just like to watch you. We don't want to bother you. We'll be quiet and just watch." Aunt Tee agreed and allowed them to join her and her friends.

WHAT a sad situation, Here this couple is wealthy, have a nice home, swimming pool and three cars, but they had no joy in their lives.

--Maya Angelou would write: "IT IS NICE TO HAVE MONEY AND SECURITY BUT IT WILL NEVER BUY JOY

- -- Money will buy a bed, but not sweet dreams.
- -- Money will buy books, but not wisdom.
- -- Money will buy a house, but not a home.
- -- Money will buy pleasure, but not genuine joy.

CONCLUSION: Jesus is saying that as long as you allow money to be your master, there is no way you can say "Yes!" to God.

II.-- Our Lord is very POSSESSIVE—He wants ALL OF US COMPLETELY—TODAYS GOSPEL BIDS US TO ASK:

--WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT I CAN SURRENDER TO MY LORD?

--WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT IS KEEPING ME FROM MOVING FORWARD ON THE JOURNEY OF CONVERSION?

--WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT IS KEEPING JESUS FROM POSSESSING Y_{OU} COMPLETELY?

--Ego, Pride, Inability to Forgive/Grudge, Resentment, Hatred, Judgementalism, Critical, Prejudice, Hatred, Superiority,

Materialism, _____

WHAT IS THE ONE THING THAT IS KEEPING YOU FROM BEING AN ACTIVE: PARTNER (in building up his kingdom) AND NO LONGER A FOLLOWER.

A.-- Just as our Lord says to the Young Man in the Gospel today: YOU ARE LACKING ONE THING: In this man's case it was MATERIALISM—he owned a lot—or we should say that HIS POSSESSIONS OWNED HIM.

--OUR Lord invites him to take that LAST STEP—to liquidize all that he has, give it to the poor, AND COME AND BUILD UP HIS FATHER'S KINGDOM—TO BE A PARTNER—A COHEIR—A CO-WORKER IN THE KINGDOM.

--BUT LIKE SO MANY PEOPLE... HE COULDN'T TAKE THAT LAST BIG STEP IN HIS JOURNEY OF CONVERSION AND BECOME A PARTHER, A COHEIR, A WORKER IN THE VINEYARD.

B.-- Jesus is Challenging the Belief System of the time. If you were rich, you were blessed by God... it was a goal in life to be blessed by God, outward sign was your wealth. If you were poor or sick you were cursed by God.

Jesus uses a **Powerful Metaphor**: Easier for **Camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for Rich Person to enter the Kingdom of God**....

--AGAIN, OUR LORD IS NOT CRITIZING WEALTH: Remember Book of Genesis: On the Last Day God declared all of his creation GOOD.

--When God created the universe, He made sure there were enough resources for all people to have enough. It is BECAUSE OF HUMAN SELFISHNESS THERE IS POVERTY.

The problem with too much wealth is:

1) It takes a lot of time to manage wealth—NO TIME TO ATTEND TO THE SPIRITUAL LIFE—NO time to be a **Partner with our Lord to Build up his Kingdom**.

2) HAVING SO MUCH WEALTH WHEN THERE IS SO MUCH POVERTY IS AN INJUSTICE: WEALTH COMPROMISES YOUR RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS.

--We remember the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, day after day he stepped over Lazarus the Poor man and did nothing for him, so at death he went down to the hell he himself created.

II.-- Now we notice how Peter says to our Lord: "Lord we have given up everything to follow you."

--PETER IS ASKING: WHAT IS IN IT FOR US!

--Apostles believed that Jesus was Prophet/King Messiah who was going to restore Israel to its former GLORY... and they were going to share in this Glory... IN THIS LIFE. That they WERE GOING TO BECOME WEALTHY.

A.-- OUR Lord is in effect saying to him (as He says elsewhere) YOU CANT' SERVE TWO MASTERS— IN this case money and me—BESIDES I WANT YOU TO BE A PARTNER NOT A FOLLOWER.

III .-- OUR LORD IS CALLING ALL OF YOU TO BE A PARTNER, A COHEIR,

--ASK YOURSELVES: WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT IS KEEPING YOU FROM GOING INTO THE VINEYARD-TO BE A PARTNER?



PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT

For many years, Our Holy Redeemer Parish has welcomed all who walk through its doors, educating the Catholic community with the knowledge and love of God and of the Gospel. Our beloved church has adapted and expanded to the needs of parishioners in order to remain a thriving oasis of faith and community.

Today we find ourselves in an exciting moment in our parish's history. As we look forward to the future, we recognize the need to renovate our church and school. The proposed necessary projects for the church and school have been carefully identified.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731

- Repair interior walls and floors that were damaged before the roof replacement, by rainfall and faulty HVAC system.
- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.





SCHOOL ROOF - \$166,100

- Replace the roof to prevent damage to the 100 years old front and main body of the school building.

SCHOOL

WINDOWS AND DOORS - \$453,525

 Replace and upgrade the 40-year-old, worn out and rusted, original doors and windows.





SCHOOL AIR CONDITIONING (BASEMENT) - \$68,000

- Replace the current air conditioning unit that has reached its life expectancy at over 25 years old, to ensure proper cooling of the meeting rooms in the school basement.

How to give a blessing

The word blessing takes its root in the latin verb: *Benedicere*, to speak well of (*Bene*—well; *dicere*—to speak). Therefore, to bless someone is, in the end, to speak well of him or her. To say good things about them directing the words to God.

A standard blessing has 3 parts: praise God, praise his creation, and praise (say good things about the person: spouse, child, etc.... receiving the blessing). You can use your own words, but these are the words we have being using at mass: (place you hand over the person receiving the blessing)

GOD YOU ARE ALL GOOD ALL YOUR CREATION IS WONDERFUL YOU ARE SO GOOD TO US

PLEASE BLESS MY SPOUSE (NAME): YOUR OWN WORDS HERE: how good they are, how much they mean to you, what a blessing they are to you and the family, really enumerate their good qualities e.g. smart, funny, intelligent, beautiful. Really go into details.

MAKE THE OUTWARD SIGN OF THE CROSS OVER THEM TO CONCLUDE THE BLESSING.

POINT: with all the negativities being expressed its important that family members especially spouses say good and uplifting, loving words to each other every day.




