DEACON'S CORNER



"Grant that in Your glory we may sit one at Your right and the other at Your left." (See Saint Mark 10:35-45) We can sympathize with this request from John and James. It is very natural. It is very human. Yet, Jesus' response helps us to understand that things are diametrically different in the Kingdom of God. "Can you drink the cup that I drink or be Baptized with the Baptism with which I am Baptized?" The one who wants to be first must be last and serve others. Christianity is a call to sacrifice. Jesus' cup is a sacrificial cup. The more we penetrate in the mystery of Christ the more we realize that to be a

Christian is to be willing to make sacrifices. We cannot do this on our own. We need help from above. Glory comes, but first comes sacrifice. But Jesus is not the kind of teacher that tells you what to do and does something else. He goes on to say: "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." Where the Master trod, we we *must* follow, because we are His disciples and to be a disciple means to be a follower. The good news is that Jesus accompanies us all the way. We also have His Mother, Holy Mary. She is the example of the perfect disciple, the "handmaid" of the Lord.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

"Concédenos que en tu gloria nos sentemos uno a tu derecha y el otro a tu izquierda" (Cf. San Marcos 10,35-45). Podemos simpatizar con esta petición de Juan y Santiago. Es muy natural. Es muy humano. Sin embargo, la respuesta de Jesús nos ayuda a entender que las cosas son diametralmente diferentes en el Reino de Dios. "¿Podéis beber el cáliz que yo bebo o ser bautizados con el bautismo con el que yo soy bautizado?" El que quiere ser el primero debe ser el último y servir a los demás. El cristianismo es una llamada al sacrificio. El cáliz de Jesús es un cáliz de sacrificio. Cuanto más penetramos en el misterio de Cristo, más nos damos cuenta de que ser cristiano es estar dispuesto a hacer sacrificios. No podemos hacer esto por nosotros mismos. Necesitamos la ayuda de lo alto. La gloria viene, pero primero viene el sacrificio. Pero Jesús no es el tipo de maestro que te dice lo que tienes que hacer y hace otra cosa. Continúa diciendo: "El Hijo del hombre no vino para ser servido, sino para servir y dar su vida en rescate por muchos". Allí donde el Maestro caminó, nosotros debemos seguirlo, porque somos sus discípulos y ser discípulo significa ser seguidor. La buena noticia es que Jesús nos acompaña en todo el camino. También tenemos a su Madre, Santa María. Ella es el ejemplo del discípulo perfecto, la "sierva" del Señor.

Pastor's Message

I.-- Today's Scripture readings describe leadership as: sacrificial service done for others and offer Jesus as the best example.

Today's Gospel explains how Jesus has accomplished the mission of saving mankind from the slavery of sin by becoming the "Suffering Servant." In this context James and John ask for key positions in the Messianic political kingdom Jesus would establish after overthrowing the Roman rule. Jesus challenged his followers to become great by serving others with sacrificial agape love: "Whoever wishes to be great must be a servant."

II.-- last week the rich young man was asked to give up all his possessions and give them to the poor. We have to keep in mind our Lord is very POSSESSIVE-- he wants ALL OF US COMPLETELY. HE BIDS US TO ASK: WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT I CAN SURRENDER TO MY LORD? WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT IS KEEPING ME FROM MOVING FORWARD ON THE JOURNEY OF CONVERSION WHAT IS THE ONE THING MORE THAT IS KEEPING JESUS FROM POSSESSING You COMPLETELY?---Ego, Pride, Inability to Forgive/Grudge, Resentment, Hatred, Judgementalism, Critical, Prejudice, Hatred, Superiority, Materialism?

WHAT IS THE ONE THING THAT IS KEEPING YOU FROM BEING AN ACTIVE: PARTNER (in building up his kingdom) AND NO LONGER A FOLLOWER.

III--This Sunday: teaches us about LEADERSHIP: SERVANT LEADERSHIP... Servant leaders are those who lead by putting the needs of other people before their own.

We recall when JESUS ASKS: Who do people say that I am? John the Baptist, Elijah, one of the Prophets...THE EXPECTATION WAS A PROPHET / KING who was powerful and would throw out the Romans and restore Israel to its GLORY. PETER SAYS: you are the Christ. They weren't' waiting for Messiah who was going to suffer and die.

THEY WERE WAITING FOR A STRONG, POWERFUL, SUCCESSFUL LEADER...

--LAST WEEKS GOSPEL: Peter asks: What is in it for us? We've given up everything for you: job, home, mother-in-law... What are we going to get out of our SACRIFICE TO FOLLOW YOU.

THIS WEEKS GOSPEL: JAMES AND JOHN (Son's of Zebedee) the HOT HEADS (remember when they want to Rain down Fire and Brimstone to destroy a village). THEY ASK OUR LORD (OR THEIR MOM) CAN WE SIT AT YOUR RIGHT AND LEFT WHEN YOU COME INTO YOUR GLORY. they don't understand what true leadership is... they were looking for positions of power and prestige. They thought that leadership came from the position you held rather than how you served.

The "glory" they are referring to is in the here and now: NOT THE AFTERLIFE: Remember the Jews had a very limited understanding of the afterlife (Hades / Sheol) or didn't believe in it at all...THE OTHER 10 APOSTLES BECOME INDIGNANT. OUR LORD GIVES A FORMULA FOR GREATNESS. GREATNESS = HUMILITY + SELFLESS SERVICE.

STORY: During the American Revolution, a man in civilian clothes rode past a group of soldiers who were busy pulling out a horse carriage stuck in deep mud. Their officer was shouting instructions to them while making no attempt to help. A stranger who witnessed the scene asked the officer why he wasn't helping. With great pride, the officer replied, "Sir, I am an OFFICER!" The stranger dismounted from his horse and proceeded to help the exhausted soldiers himself. When the job was completed, he turned to the OFFICER and said, "next time you have a job like this, and don't have enough men to do it, inform your commander-in-chief, and I will come and help you again.

The overly proud OFFICER recognized it was: General Washington. And he learned a very valuable lesson: you want to be a great leader; you want to aspire to greatness than you must get down in the trenches and the mud with your troops.

As we see in the Gospels...REAL GREATNESS, REAL POWER, REAL GLORY isn't about out-muscling or overpowering evil / or anyone else.

JESUS SHOWS US WHAT REAL POWER Is: When he was being crucified, he had the opportunity to SHOW that he was POWERFUL by doing something spectacular: "If you are the Son of God, prove it, come down off the cross! Save yourself!" On the cross, Jesus proves that he is powerful beyond measure, not by doing something spectacular (calling down a legion of angels). But in a spectacular act of the heart: he forgives those who are mocking and killing him.

True power is manifest NOT IN AUTHORITY OR GLORY OR STRENGTH...BUT IN FORGIVENESS. Jesus did not cling to his divine power but emptied himself and forgave... became as we are...


That is real greatness / strength / glory / power: Is to show compassion and forgiveness in the face of jealousy, hatred, and murder.

IV-- We see this in the Gospels: where James and John ask Jesus for seats at his right and left when in His Glory...They want to be VIP Seats. Jesus takes their request seriously. He doesn't caution them against pride but rather asks them: Can you drink from the cup (is a metaphor for what God has in store) (of suffering) that I shall drink?

They naively respond "YES". (They don't realize that on the right and left of our Lord will be two crucified men). Jesus responds, "The cup that I shall drink, you shall drink but as for the seats (of Glory)...they are not mine to give."

- --Of course, authority HAS ITS PERKS AND BENEFITS:
- --BUT JESUS SAYS: IT SHALL NOT BE THAT WAY WITH YOU: his disciples are to show a radical COUNTER-CULTERAL attitude toward leadership: WITH NO: SELF-PROMOTION, RIVALRY, OR DOMINEERING.

- --THE ONLY WAY TO GREATNESS IS BY IMITATING HIM AND HIS SELF EMPTYING LOVE.
 - --LEADERSHIP= SERVICE=CARING FOR OTHERS...
- --You will taste suffering, and that suffering will make you deep in compassion and forgiveness.
- ***Only compassion and forgiveness bring glory and greatness***
- --Jesus defines GREATNESS / GLORY / NOT by winning a medal or being a champion, or because of achievements.
- --For Jesus glory is: BEING deep in compassion, forgiveness, and graciousness.
- --EXAMPLE: IT IS SAFE TO SAY THAT: Most people (when they are young / children / nurse a secret dream of greatness / glory (e.g. professional athlete, actor, singer, etc.)
- --However: over time that DREAM tapers and matures so they envision themselves as standing out: not by talent, power, intelligence, good looks, muscle, speed, or achievements in life
- --But by being a good person, great mom or dad or grandparent...
- --Then via one's religious imagination DREAM develops / matures further we realize that it's OUR DEPTH OF COMPASSION AND FORGIVENESS...THAT MAKE US GREAT...






