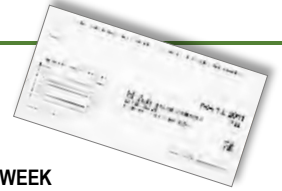

DEACON'S CORNER



Saint Mark 12: 38-44. Jesus then observes how Jewish pilgrims are making their contributions to the temple treasury. The Temple in Jerusalem was the center of Jewish worship in the time of Jesus. It was expected that observant Jews would make pilgrimages to the Temple to offer prayer and sacrifices. Pilgrims were also expected to make a financial contribution to the temple treasury.

As we would expect to be the case, Jesus observes that those who were rich contributed large sums to the treasury. Those with less means made smaller contributions. A similar situation exists in most of our parishes as well. Jesus calls attention, however, to a poor widow who makes the smallest of contributions—two coins of little value. Jesus upholds the poor widow's offering for his disciples' consideration, commending her because her small offering was an act of profound generosity, giving from her livelihood rather than her surplus.

To give from our livelihood is not only an act of generosity, it is also an act of trust in God. We can only give from our need if we trust that God will provide for us. Jesus himself demonstrates the ultimate act of generosity and trust in God as he gives his life for us on the cross.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

San Marcos 12: 38-44. Jesús observa entonces cómo los peregrinos judíos hacen sus contribuciones al tesoro del templo. El Templo de Jerusalén era el centro del culto judío en la época de Jesús. Se esperaba que los judíos observantes hicieran peregrinaciones al Templo para ofrecer oraciones y sacrificios. También se esperaba que los peregrinos hicieran una contribución financiera al tesoro del templo.

Como esperaríamos que fuera el caso, Jesús observa que los que eran ricos contribuyeron grandes sumas al tesoro. Los que tenían menos medios hicieron contribuciones más pequeñas. Una situación similar existe también en la mayoría de nuestras parroquias. Sin embargo, Jesús llama la atención sobre una viuda pobre que hace la contribución más pequeña: dos monedas de poco valor. Jesús apoya la ofrenda de la viuda pobre para que sus discípulos la consideren, elogiándola porque su pequeña ofrenda fue un acto de profunda generosidad, dando de su sustento en lugar de su excedente.

Dar de nuestro sustento no es solo un acto de generosidad, es también un acto de confianza en Dios. Solo podemos dar de lo que necesitamos si confiamos en que Dios nos proveerá. Jesús mismo demuestra el máximo acto de generosidad y confianza en Dios al dar su vida por nosotros en la cruz.

Pastor's Message

I.-- Mother Teresa of Calcutta has said, **"If you give what you don't need, it isn't giving."**

--She told a story of how one day she was walking down the street when a beggar came up to her and said, "Mother Teresa everybody is giving to you, I also want to give to you. Today for the whole day I got only fifteen rupees (thirty cents). I want to give it to you."

--Mother Teresa thought for a moment: "If I take the thirty cents, he will have nothing to eat tonight, and if I don't take it I will hurt his feelings. **So, I put out my hands and took the money. I have never seen such joy on anybody's face as I saw on the face of that beggar at the thought that he too could give to Mother Teresa."**

-- She said that gift meant more to her than winning the Nobel Prize. Mother Teresa went on: "It was a big sacrifice for that poor man, who had sat in the sun the whole day long and received only thirty cents.

--**Thirty cents is such a small amount and I can get nothing with it, but as he gave it up and I took it, it became like thousands because it was given with so much love.**

CONCLUSION: God looks not at the greatness of the work, but at the love with which it is performed."

II.--Jesus is sitting in the Temple courtyard watching people throw their donations into the large "tuba shaped" receptacles (13 of them) in the LARGE Temple courtyard.

--the larger the sum of many the greater the "clang" into the receptacle. When people would hear the loud clang, they would look over to see who made such a large donation.

-- people who threw in such large sums of money oftentimes did so in a haughty, arrogant manner.

A.-- Scribes were the LAWYERS OF THE TIME: only ones who could read or write;

--wore a **Talith** a long cloak when they prayed in the Temple—however, they started to wear it in the Marketplace to display their supposed holiness.

--Often portrayed in the Gospels as **POMPOUS HOLIER THAN THOU OPORTUNISTS.**

--Didn't **earn a salary** but probably charged a **FEE FOR THEIR SERVICES AND PROBABLY EXTORTED MONEY** (few wealthy widows)

--the most important seats in the synagogue were in front of the Torah the Scrolls (**THIS IS WHERE ALL EYES WERE FOCUSED**)--that is where the scribes sat.

B.--Widow in Aramaic means "silent one" Widows were considered the most needy and vulnerable of society (widow, orphan, foreigner).

-- Jesus observes that **"she has given all she had to live on"**

--**JESUS IS PRAISING THE WOMAN FOR HER GENEROSITY BUT IS ALSO LAMENTING HER NOW WORSE ECONOMIC SITUATION.**

--TWO COINS WERE CALLED *leptons*. Those two, almost worthless coins represented her last shred of security, her fragile thread of hope for the future.

--With her deep desire to be an obedient servant of God, the widow gave all she had as an offering -- even her future -- for the sake of God.

--In other words, she gave herself totally into God's hands, with the sure conviction that He would give her the support she needed.

JESUS IS PRAISING THE WOMAN FOR HER TRUST IN GOD:

--she gave without considering the cost. In doing so, she demonstrated an incredible trust in God to care for her.

--WHEN WE GIVE all of what we have we have to trust in God...

This same trust is echoed in today's first reading in which the widow of Zarephath trusted the words of Elijah in using up the last of her flour and oil and was rewarded for her faith.

--**Message:** we are stewards of all that we have been given, We are called to give freely not just of our financial resources but also of our talents, and time

--we are called to give without COUNTING THE COST.

--which flies in the face of stability and having a safety net.

C.-- STORY: At Parish Mission one day, a very wealthy man rose to give his testimony. "I'm a millionaire," he said, "and I attribute it all to the rich blessings of God in my life.

--I can still remember the DAY like it was yesterday: I was a very young man and I had just earned my first dollar and I went to a church meeting that night. The speaker was a missionary who told about his work and was asking for donations to support his mission.

-- I knew that I only had a dollar bill and HAD TO GIVE THE WHOLE DOLLAR OR GIVE NOTHING AT ALL.

I DECIDED TO GIVE MY FIRST EARNED DOLLAR TO GOD.

-- I firmly believe that God blessed that decision, and that is why I am a wealthy man today."

--WHEN HE FINISHED: it was clear that everyone had been moved by this man's story.

--But, as he took his seat, a little old lady sitting in the same pew leaned over and said: "Wonderful story! I dare you to do it again!"

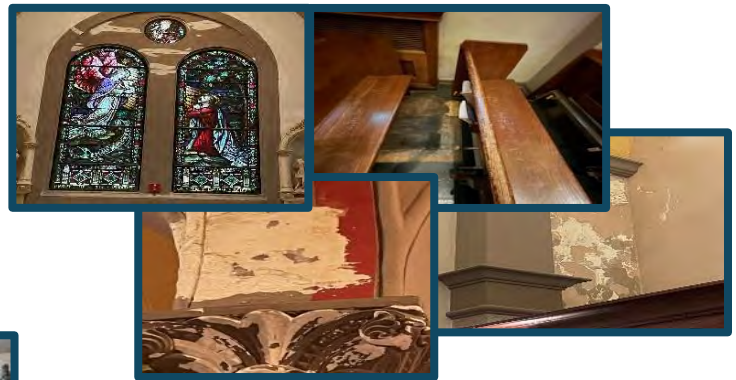
PRELIMINARY CASE STATEMENT

Our beloved church has adapted and expanded to the needs of parishioners in order to remain a thriving oasis of faith and community.

Today we find ourselves in an exciting moment in our parish's history. As we look forward to the future, we recognize the need to renovate our church and school. The proposed necessary projects for the church and school have been carefully identified.

CHURCH INTERIOR - \$623,731

- Repair interior walls and floors that were damaged before the roof replacement, by rainfall and faulty HVAC system.
- Refinish kneeling pads and pews.



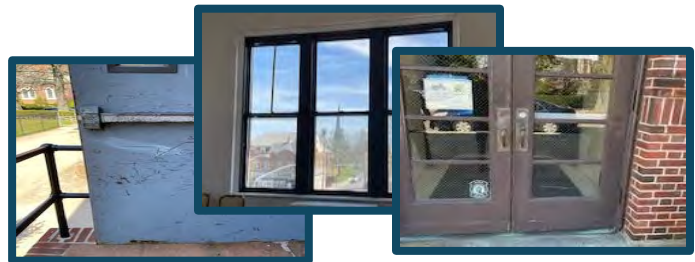
SCHOOL ROOF - \$166,100

- Replace the roof to prevent damage to the 100 years old front and main body of the school building.

SCHOOL

WINDOWS AND DOORS - \$453,525

- Replace and upgrade the 40-year-old, worn out and rusted, original doors and windows.



SCHOOL AIR CONDITIONING (BASEMENT) - \$68,000

- Replace the current air conditioning unit that has reached its life expectancy at over 25 years old, to ensure proper cooling of the meeting rooms in the school basement.

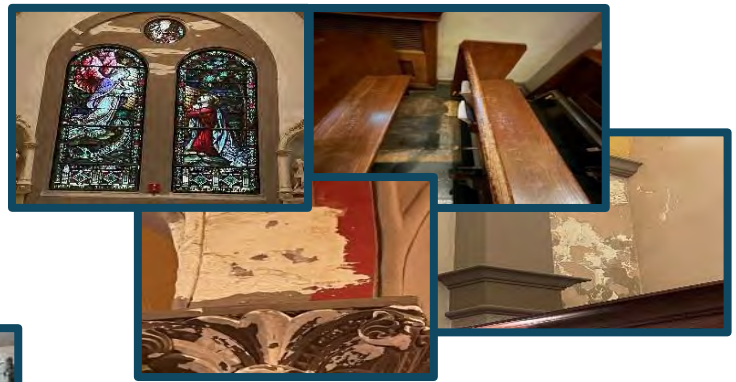
DECLARACIÓN PRELIMINAR DEL CASO

- Restaurar las almohadillas para arrodillarse y los bancos.

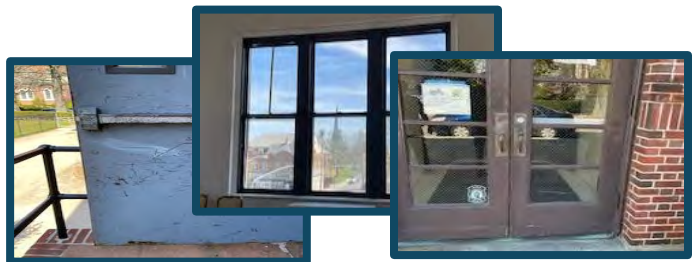


AZOTEA DE LA ESCUELA- \$166,100

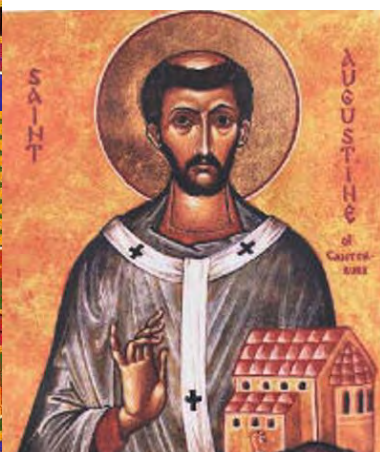

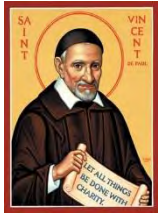
