DEACON'S CORNER

Reflection for 2nd Sunday of Advent

The evangelist Luke is the author of the Gospel that bears his name, and he also wrote the Acts of the Apostles as a continuation of the story of Jesus and the Church. In these two works, Luke's sense of time and history emerges. He identifies three epochs of salvation history: the time before Christ, the time of Christ, and the time of the Church and the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel reading, as elsewhere, John the Baptist is presented as the figure who bridges the time before Christ and prepares the way for Christ's own ministry.

In today's Gospel we also note Luke's attention to political and historical detail. Luke shows that salvation is for all people and situated in world events. Therefore, Luke lists the political and religious leaders at the time of John's appearance in the desert. Salvation is understood as God's breaking into this political and social history.

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus, we too are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives the coming of the Lord, as John did.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

Reflexión para el segundo domingo de Adviento

El evangelista Lucas es el autor del Evangelio que lleva su nombre. También escribió el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles como continuación de la historia de Jesús y de la Iglesia. En estas dos obras, surge el sentido del tiempo y de la historia en Lucas. Él identifica tres épocas de la historia de la salvación: el tiempo antes de Cristo, el tiempo de Cristo y el tiempo de la Iglesia y el Espíritu Santo. En la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, como en otros lugares, Juan el Bautista se presenta como la figura que une el tiempo antes de Cristo y prepara el camino para el propio ministerio de Cristo.

En el Evangelio de hoy también observamos la atención de Lucas a los detalles políticos e históricos. Lucas muestra que la salvación es para todas las personas y está situada en eventos globales. Por lo tanto, Luca enumera a los líderes políticos y religiosos en el momento de la aparición de Juan en el desierto. La salvación se entiende como la irrupción de Dios en esta historia política y social.

La predicación de Juan sobre la venida del Señor es un tema clave de la temporada de Adviento. Como el mensaje de Juan preparó el camino para Jesús, nosotros también estamos llamados a prepararnos para la venida de Jesús. Respondemos al mensaje de Juan con el arrepentimiento y la reforma de nuestra vida. También estamos llamados a ser profetas de Cristo, que anunciamos con nuestras vidas la venida del Señor, como lo hizo Juan.

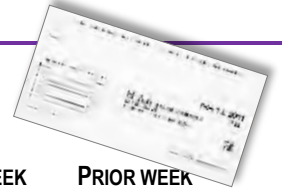

Dear Concerned Parishioner of Our Holy Redeemer Parish:

Many of you are aware that the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been going through a Chapter 11 Bankruptcy process since October 2020. This was the result of the New York State Legislature's passage of the Child Victims Act in 2019, which allowed lawsuits for historical accusations of child sexual abuse, regardless of how many years or decades ago the alleged abuse took place. The number of lawsuits that were brought against the Diocese, our parishes, schools and other ministries made it impossible to equitably compensate victim-survivors of child abuse with meritorious claims through court trials. Trials would have resulted in the first survivors in line with claims receiving compensation and the rest receiving little or nothing.

Bankruptcy offered the possibility of equitable compensation and some measure of healing for survivors, while allowing the Church to continue the saving mission of Jesus Christ by, first and foremost, securing the future of our parishes. The Diocese, as well as every parish and ministry, made a contribution to the settlement in order to accomplish these goals.

To resolve all past claims of abuse of minors and to secure the future of the Church's ministries throughout Long Island, it was necessary that every parish participate in the Chapter 11 Bankruptcy process. This is to ensure that no historical claims could place parishes or schools at risk in the future. Our Parish contributed \$284,000 to the settlement of all cases. These funds come from a very recent bequest made to Our Holy Redeemer Parish. No other parish money was used for this payment. **Please know that pledges made to the Rebuild My Church Capital Campaign will only be used for the stated capital projects and nothing else.**

Please understand that the cost of bringing current or potential future historical cases against our Parish to trials, especially if judgments were eventually rendered, would be devastating to the work and future of Our Holy Redeemer. This is about protecting our Parish now and for the future. We know that the horrific scandal of child abuse was not caused by us, but we inherited the devastating effects. In 2019, as a result of the law passed by the New York State Legislature, our parishes became subject to lawsuits based upon claims of abuse from decades ago, long before any of the current priests or staff members arrived here and, in fact, before most of our current parishioners lived within the parish. The law has affected not only the Church, but many public and private institutions across the state.

By participating in the bankruptcy process, along with the whole Church throughout Long Island, we have helped to resolve all claims and to secure the future of our Parish. As a result, historical lawsuits can no longer be brought against Our Holy Redeemer. Victim survivors of child abuse deserve our respect, our prayers, and our pastoral support. This has been a terribly painful time for them, for their families, and for the whole Church, but we pray that the settlement will give everyone an opportunity for healing and a new beginning.

We pray for our parishes and all ministries that serve God and the common good of all people on Long Island, that Mary, Mother of the Church will intercede for us. Out of this dark chapter in the Church's history, we look to a time of resurrection, to a Church purified and eager to bring the saving message of Jesus Christ to all people. STATEMENT

DATE: December 4, 2024
RE: Bankruptcy Confirmation
FROM: Spokesperson for the Diocese of Rockville Centre

We are grateful to God that on December 4th, the court confirmed the Plan that resolves and ends the Bankruptcy Case for the Diocese of Rockville Centre, all our parishes, and related ministries. For the sake of abuse survivors and the Church's mission on Long Island, we pray that the Plan brings some measure of healing to survivors and allows the Church to carry on the saving mission of Jesus Christ. Victim survivors of child abuse deserve our respect, our prayers, and our pastoral support. The Church is grateful for their courage and perseverance.

The total settlement amount was just over \$323 million, which included insurance contributions, Diocesan assets and sale proceeds from Diocesan property, and contributions from parishes and other related entities. The Diocese, parishes and other related entities contributed a total of \$234.8 million. Insurance companies contributed a total of just over \$85 million. Counsel for the Creditor's Committee contributed \$3 million. All participated in order to offer equitable compensation to survivors and move this difficult ordeal towards its conclusion.

Parishes also completed an abbreviated Chapter 11 to secure a release from any past liabilities for the parishes. No parishes are closing as a result of this process. No Catholic Ministries Appeal donations were used for this settlement. Parishes will now continue their ministry, free from historical lawsuits and free from bankruptcy. We are grateful for the expert counsel of Jones Day, Alvarez & Marsal, and Reed Smith, as well as for the Westerman Ball Firm of Long Island that shepherded our parishes through Chapter 11.

The Diocese's goal has always been the equitable compensation of survivors of abuse while allowing the Church to continue her essential mission. We believe this plan has achieved those goals.

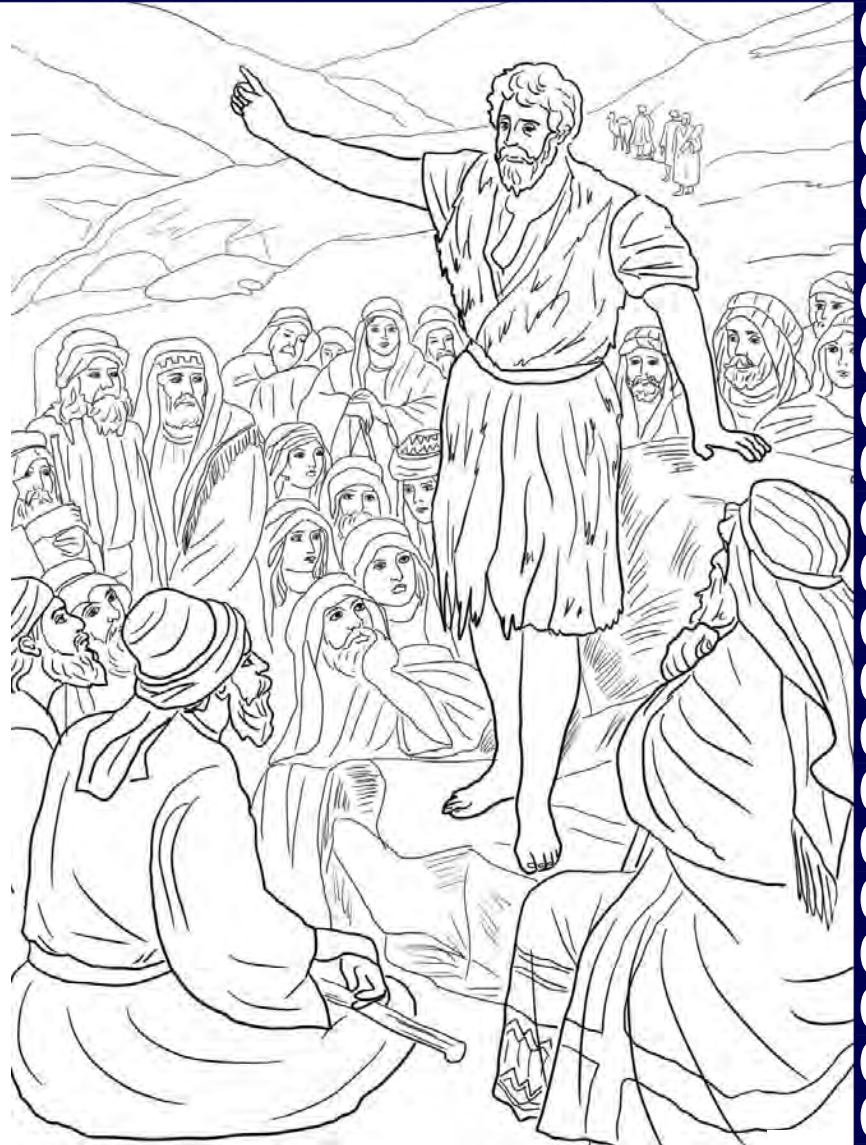

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
