NEWS FROM THE DE LA SALLE SCHOOL (516) 379-8660 The De La Salle School —Catholic Lasallian School for young men Grades 5-8

On February 9, we will celebrate The Feast Day of Saint Miguel Febres Cordero. The De La Salle School is one of four schools known as San Miguel Schools in The Brothers of the Christian Schools District of Eastern North America district. Being a San Miguel Schools means that we are an educational institution committed to providing quality education, grounded in faith, service, and community, particularly for students from marginalized and underprivileged background. We provide access to educational opportunities for those who may not otherwise be able to afford them with the goal of protecting students from negative influences in their environment. We ask our Almighty and everlasting God, that like Saint Miguel Febres Cordero who gave his life to God's Church, that he may grant us the ability to imitate San Miguel's exemplary dedication. That we learn to welcome young people with kindness and thereby guide them more surely to our Lord.

The recruiting season for the 2025-2026 school year continues. We would like to give the parishioners of Our Holy Redeemer the first opportunity to apply. Applications for admission to our fifth grade in September are available by contacting Mrs. Elder, Executive Director or Mrs. Becker, principal at the school by phone 516-379-8660 or by stopping by the office between 7:30 AM and 3:45 PM on any school day (our entrance is by the flagpole in the parking lot). The De La Salle School is a Catholic Lasallian school for young men whose families would like the option of a Catholic school education but cannot afford the choice. Families are only asked to contribute \$80.00 per month. If you know of a young man entering fifth who is interested and would qualify for our school, please have them contact us for an application. There are also few seat in the 6th and 7th grades.

DEACON'S CORNER

"Put out into deep water." Jesus says this to Simon Peter on the Lake of Gennesaret, or the Sea of Galilee, but what might this command mean to us in our lives today? After a futile night spent trying to make a catch, Jesus instructs Simon to go out once more. He is doubtful, tired, and reluctant. It seems irrational to go back to the same place where you *know* there are few fish to catch, right? Yet Simon is willing to heed his command anyway, and out to the deep he goes. This act of faith – and what unfolds consequently – reveals to us one of the many beautiful paradoxes of our Christian faith: in doing what the world might view as irrational or foolish, we actually find what is most wise and rational. In Jesus Christ we find life, love, and direction, and an overwhelming abundance of it. Our nets become full, almost to the point of tearing.

When Jesus gets into Simon's boat, he asks him to go out just a short distance from shore so he can teach the crowd. Only after his words have been spoken does he ask Simon to go out further, where the waters are deep and unpredictable. I think herein lies Jesus' call to us today. We may first hear Jesus speak to us while safely on land or in shallow waters where we can stand, but once we do – once the Word of God takes root in our hearts – we are then called further. We are asked to let the Incarnate Lord's voice grow in our hearts. We are asked to take our feet, hands, eyes, ears, mouths, and hearts further. We are asked to get in our boats and put out into deep water – laboring and trusting in our loving God who will fill our nets beyond our understanding, despite our unworthiness. For this reason, we can stand here on the shores of our St. Joseph and St. Mary's lakes and trust that just as he said to Simon Peter, he says to us, too, "do not be afraid."

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

"Leva la barca mar adentro". Jesús le dice esto a Simón Pedro en el lago de Genesaret, o mar de Galilea, pero ¿qué podría significar este mandato para nosotros en nuestra vida actual? Después de una noche inútil tratando de pescar, Jesús le ordena a Simón que salga una vez más. Está dudoso, cansado y reacio. Parece irracional volver al mismo lugar donde sabes que hay pocos peces para pescar, ¿verdad? Sin embargo, Simón está dispuesto a obedecer su mandato de todos modos, y se lanza mar adentro. Este acto de fe -y lo que se desarrolla en consecuencia- nos revela una de las muchas hermosas paradojas de nuestra fe cristiana: al hacer lo que el mundo podría ver como irracional o tonto, en realidad encontramos lo que es más sabio y racional. En Jesucristo encontramos vida, amor y dirección, y una abrumadora abundancia de ellos. Nuestras redes se llenan, casi al punto de romperse.

Cuando Jesús sube a la barca de Simón, le pide que se aleje un poco de la orilla para poder enseñar a la multitud. Sólo después de haber pronunciado sus palabras, le pide a Simón que vaya más lejos, a donde las aguas son profundas e impredecibles. Creo que en esto reside el llamado de Jesús para nosotros hoy. Es posible que primero escuchemos a Jesús hablarnos mientras estamos seguros en tierra o en aguas poco profundas donde podemos estar de pie, pero una vez que lo hacemos, una vez que la Palabra de Dios se arraiga en nuestros corazones, entonces somos llamados a ir más lejos. Se nos pide que dejemos que la voz del Señor encarnado crezca en nuestros corazones. Se nos pide que llevemos nuestros pies, manos, ojos, oídos, bocas y corazones más lejos. Se nos pide que llenará nuestras redes más allá de nuestro entendimiento, a pesar de nuestra indignidad. Por esta razón, podemos estar aquí en las orillas de nuestros lagos de San José y Santa María y confiar en que, así como le dijo a Simón Pedro, también nos dice a nosotros: "no tengan miedo".

Pastor's Message

<u>"What will it take to make you a better Catholic"</u>

I.-- What is the ONE THING (event, miracle, sign, happening,) ... What is the one sign that you need, that will make you move forward on the Journey of Conversion? What will make you live out your baptismal calling and share your faith with others?

II.-- **True Story**: There was a family that I knew in a previous parish who son died very suddenly as a young adult. We can't even fathom the loss of a child.

--Part of the Grieving process you bargain with God ... The Mother shared , "She said to God in prayer... PLEASE LORD GIVE ME A (sign, miracle, event, something...) to show me that my Son is OK in heaven with you... Please let me know. If you let me know that my son is ok in heaven with you and safe, I will do anything for you and become the best and most active Catholic ever.

--Apparently, in life the Son had two DUCKS FOR PETS; their names were FRIC AND FRAC. They were genetically bred with a recessive gene, so that there DOWN FEATHERS WERE A kind of REDDISH / AUBURN color—WHICH WAS VERY RARE AND DISTINCTIVE.

--WELL ONE DAY ... she and her husband were out doors in this park and one of these feathers fell from a clear blue sky right into her hand. To see that color feather and to fall from a clear sky. She showed her Husband, "Look Tom this is the color of FRIC AND FRAC." No Bird or Duck was to be seen ...

With tears in their eyes: they thanked God for this sign that that they understood their Son was in heaven.

-- Out of gratitude to God for that sign and keeping her side of the bargain, she became a very active and zealous parishioner: she lived and breathed her Catholic Faith.

III.-- The central theme of today's readings is God's call and our response. God calls us in so many different ways.

--We hear in the readings of the three great Biblical Figures of—**Isaiah**, **Paul** and **Peter**—they hear GOD'S CALL, GOD'S SIGN TO THEM TO MOVE THEM ALONG THE JOURNEY OF CONVERSION TO SERVE HIM. A.-- In today's Gospel, Jesus preached from Peter's boat to a large crowd. ---Jesus told Peter to pull out into deeper water for a catch of fish. ---

--Peter, perhaps not wanting Jesus to look foolish, explained, "Master, we have worked hard all night long, caught nothing."

--Peter knew fish only come to the surface at night

Yet he said, "Nevertheless, if You wish it, I will lower the nets."

--Peter's declaration of trust made the miracle possible. And the CATCH WAS an UNPECEDENTED AMOUNT OF FISH.

--Simon Peter understood the message very quickly.

--THIS WAS THE ONE SIGN / MIRACLE THAT PETER NEEDED TO DROP EVERYTHING AND FOLLOW OUR LORD.

Confronted by the size of the catch, he recognized the presence of God before him.

--When we stand before the Divine, we immediately recognize our own sinfulness.

A We find the same response in all three readings today.

1.-- **Isaiah**, seeing the glory of God in his vision, says, "What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips... and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts."

2.-- **Paul**, not particularly known for his modesty, says, "I am the least of the apostles... I hardly deserve the name apostle."

3.-- **Peter** begs Jesus to go away. His simple confession -- "Leave me Lord. I am a sinful man." -- marks a turning point in his life.

--Jesus seized the opportunity to proclaim Peter's mission, a call Peter was able to receive because he had seen the tremendous power of God.

--Peter is the first apostle to be called by Jesus.

--Today's Gospel concludes with the Apostle's commitment: "When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him" (Lk 5:11).

--The miraculous catch of fish is an **abundance miracle** and resembles other "abundance" miracles. Later in this same Gospel, we will see Jesus **feeding five thousand** people with five loaves of bread and two fish (9:12-17).

--The Gospel of John reports another abundance miracle, the wine Jesus supplied at the **wedding in Cana** (John 2:1-11). Changing the 5 large cisterns of water into wine.

-- All these "abundance" miracles have two things in common:

(1) they meet human needs and

(2) they demonstrate God's power. The spiritual outcome of this particular miracle was that the disciples, "*left everything and followed [Jesus*]" (v. 11).

IV.-- What is it going to take for you to drop everything and SHARE THE GOOD NEWS WITH OTHERS?

--WHAT SIGN DO YOU NEED: to move forward on the Journey of Conversion...to be Evangelizers...to share your faith with others?

A.-- What is it going to take for you to say the words of Isaiah in the First Reading: "HERE I AM LORD, SEND ME".

--This is why God has a different call for each of us.

--Each of us is unique, so each of us has a mission which no one else can fulfill.

--Let us accomplish this mission by radiating the love, mercy, and forgiveness of Jesus to others

--and by participating in the various ministries of our parish.




Diocese of Rockville Centre Eucharistic Pilgrimage

During those days, Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to the town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. Luke 1: 39-40

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. The Western Route will journey from St. Agnes Cathedral (Rockville Centre) through Nassau County, while the Eastern Route will journey from the Parish of Saint Therese of Lisieux (Montauk) through Suffolk County.

The Holy Eucharist will be carried in procession across the Diocese through many of our towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. During this pilgrimage, there will be opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, public processions, and other Eucharistic celebrations. The People of God will be invited to walk with Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, pray in the pilgrim churches, and proclaim the Gospel to bystanders as Jesus passes through their towns.
