

# DEACON'S CORNER



The alleluia (*Jn 13:34*) beautifully introduces the gospel reading (*Lk 6:27-38*). I give you a new commandment, says the Lord: "love one another as I have loved you." "Hear what I say" Jesus says to the disciples. Every Christian has heard. Every Christian knows that Jesus concisely tells us to love one another and to react to hate or injustice with love. Jesus knows that this is difficult. He sets an extremely high standard to be a disciple, a Christian. We are instructed not merely to do or love what is natural for us, but rather, to fight against our often-reflexive human tendencies, e.g., to fight back (even vengefully); to be selfish and proud; to hate those

who hate us; to hate even those who do not hate us. Jesus reminds us that "even sinners love those who love them." This gospel is not a puzzle. It is an instruction on Christian living. If we follow it, Jesus tells us, "Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, for he Himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful just as your Father is merciful."

Give your love and mercy to others; you will be repaid "measure for measure." Be sure that your measure is "packed together, shaken down, overflowing," and we humans may survive in peace, harmony, and love for one another as God intends. It will certainly take effort. Pray for the strength to follow Jesus' way.

# EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

"El aleluya (Juan 13, 34) introduce bellamente la lectura del evangelio (Lucas 6,27-38). Les doy este mandamiento nuevo, dice el Señor: «Que se amen unos a los otros como yo los he amado». «Escuchen lo que les digo», dice Jesús a sus discípulos. Todo cristiano ha oído. Todo cristiano sabe que Jesús nos dice concisamente que nos amemos los unos a los otros y que reaccionemos con amor ante el odio o la injusticia. Jesús sabe que esto es difícil. Establece un estándar extremadamente alto para ser un discípulo, un cristiano. Se nos instruye no sólo a hacer o amar lo que es natural para nosotros, sino más bien a luchar contra nuestras tendencias humanas a menudo reflexivas, por ejemplo, a contraatacar (incluso vengativamente); a ser egoístas y orgullosos; a odiar a quienes nos odian; a odiar incluso a quienes no nos odian. Jesús nos recuerda que «también los pecadores aman a quienes los aman». Este evangelio no es un rompecabezas. Es una instrucción sobre la vida cristiana. Si lo hacemos, Jesús nos dice: "Así tendrán un gran premio y serán hijos del Altísimo, porque él es bueno hasta con los malos y los ingratos. Sean misericordiosos como su Padre es misericordioso". Den su amor y su misericordia a los demás; seréis recompensados "medida por medida". Asegúrense de que su medida sea "una buena medida, bien sacudida, apretada y rebosante", y los seres humanos podremos sobrevivir en paz, armonía y amor mutuo como Dios quiere. Sin duda, será necesario un esfuerzo. Oremos por la fuerza para seguir el camino de Jesús.



# Pastor's Message

**LENTEN PRACTICE**: During the Lenten Season we encourage parishioner who go to coffee fellowship after mass in the lower church to share the Word of God with one another. You are invited to use the following 4 step process below.

**LECTIO DIVINA**: In a group: Table Fellowship: you just heard the Gospel proclaimed at mass and the homily. Now with the people at your table seated in the Lower Church pray the process of LECIO DIVINA

STEP ONE: READ: (someone at the table volunteers to read the Goepel again out loud or people can read it to themselves)

# FIRST SUNDAY:

STEP TWO: MEDITATE: People at the table share out loud what they "SEE" the setting(where and what is going on?), the people, the characters involved(who are they), and the unfolding action(What is taking place). It is through this meditation that you encounter the text and discover its meaning for your life.

**STEP THREE: PRAYER: (ORATIO)** YOUR PERSONAL RESPONSE: what is the text saying to you personally. What is Jesus saying or trying to teach you? Each member at the table share out loud what Jesus is saying to you through this text.

STEP FOUR: CONTEMPLATION: share out loud what you see as the overall message of this Gospel reading and how would you apply to the faithful.

I.--If we truly love our Lord and want to truly follow him our lives have to be distinctive from the people around us. Our Lord calls us as believers to a higher standard of living. We are called to be counter-cultural and live a higher standard.

This Gospel is a continuation of Luke's Sermon on the Plain. Our Lord explains how the Beatitudes are lived out concretely in our lives.

GOSPEL TODAY REQUIRES A COMPLETE CHANGE OF ATTITUDE ON REVENGE, FORGIVENESS AND MERCY.

--I think it is safe say that our American Culture considers showing mercy and forgiveness as a sign of weakness.---Remember: we forgive others NOT to allow them off the hook, we forgive to allow healing in our heart . . . we forgive to also follow our Lord's example.

The first reading David made the right choice by not killing SAUL: God's anointed king

<u>Second reading</u>, St. Paul tells us how the "First Adam" was DISOBEDIENT: his disobedience brought death--Jesus, the "New Adam," WAS OBEDIENT, which brought life.

<u>Gospel</u>: is very challenging: if we love our Lord(and we all do) he calls us to a higher standard in life. Calls us to rise above our **mere human instincts** (retaliation / revenge).--as believers he calls us to be the better person...TO A HIGHER STADARD. He calls us to imitate him.

- \* Love your enemies: This is contrary to human nature. -Agape love is to wish other's well even if they have hurt and offended you—why because God loves them just as much as he loves you.
- St Thomas Aquinas: Agape Love: (1) desire good, charity, and the well-being of the other person.—this is the love Paul was writing about in Corinthians…love is the greatest of the Spiritual gifts. (2) you have to keep the communication channels open.
- \*To love your enemy doesn't mean you allow them to hurt you or anyone else again.
- --Jesus gave us an example of this as he forgave his persecutors from the cross.
- <u>\* Turn the other cheek....</u>:Our Lord does not want anyone to become a human punching bag: --We are NOT PACIFISTS: "Self-defense is *legitimate*, .
- --Our Lord is saying here: DON'T RETURN VIOLENCE WITH VIOLENCE.

(Matt: you have heard is said . . . but I say to you) --BUT JESUS CALLS US TO A HIGHER STANDARD\* it requires far greater strength **not to hit back**. if you do hit back, you lower yourself to the same level as your "opponent". You are no better than he/she is.

- \* <u>"Forgive and you will be forgiven.</u>-- PROPORTION: The degree I forgive others: is the degree I receive (leave myself open to) God's forgiveness.
- --OUR FATHER: "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us," \*Be Merciful as your heavenly Father is merciful: PROPORTION:
- \*Stop condemning and you will not be condemned.
- \*The measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

--PROPORTION—the degree we show forgiveness, mercy, kindness, goodness, charity, IS THE DEGREE, we leave ourselves open to God's: forgiveness, mercy, kindness.— As believers, Jesus expects us to be the better person, he calls us to a Higher Standard, and rise above our human instincts and follow his goodness and generosity.\*\*Jesus' teaching requires a tremendous inner strength and self-discipline.—It also requires a great respect of the dignity and rights of other people, irrespective of the way they behave.

**STORY**: Martin Luther King Jr.'s home was burned down one night by a group of men who did not like his message about the equality of the races.

One of the things that Martin Luther King Jr told the crowd that night to calm them down was this: "When you live by the rule "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, you end up with a nation of blind and toothless people"...

**POPE FRANCIS**: --Catholics we have to forgive. We all need forgiveness . . . we must forgive because WE HAVE BEEN FORGIVEN...


**CONCLUSION**: showing forgiveness and mercy is not a sign of weakness rather it is the way of our Lord


# Diocese of Rockville Centre Eucharistic Pilgrimage

During those days, Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to the town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.

Luke 1: 39-40

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. The Western Route will journey from St. Agnes Cathedral (Rockville Centre) through Nassau County, while the Eastern Route will journey from the Parish of Saint Therese of Lisieux (Montauk) through Suffolk County.

The Holy Eucharist will be carried in procession across the Diocese through many of our towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. During this pilgrimage, there will be opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, public processions, and other Eucharistic celebrations. The People of God will be invited to walk with Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, pray in the pilgrim churches, and proclaim the Gospel to bystanders as Jesus passes through their towns.
