Before the end of the 7th century, Patrick had become a legendary figure. One legend would have it that he drove the snakes of Ireland into the sea to their destruction. He also reportedly prayed for the provision of food for hungry sailors traveling by land through a desolate area, and a herd of swine miraculously appeared.

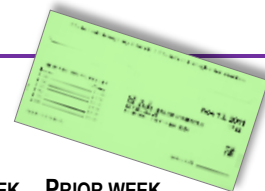

DEACON'S CORNER



“Lord, how good it is for us to be here.” Jesus had invited Peter, James and John to come up to the mountain to pray with Him. As they prayed, they had the dazzling and powerful experience of the Transfiguration. For the first time the disciples were able to see their Lord’s Divinity shining through His humanity. Much later on during hard times they probably thought of that wonderful moment, and the remembrance strengthened and reassured them.

We all need those moments of “Transfiguration” when we truly experience the Power and Presence of God. We need to remember them when things go bad for us. We need these moments of ecstasy to balance out the moments of agony. We need to learn to expect the experience of the Living God in our prayer life and in our daily living. Pastor's Message: Second Sunday of Lent

I.-- IT IS VERY GOOD PRACTICE WHEN MAKING A MONUMENTAL DECISION IN LIFE...TO PRAY OVER IT / TO INVITE GOD INTO THE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS...TO SEEK GOD'S BLESSING AND APPROVAL.

A.-- MOTHER THERESA: was on a retreat and then was on a train ride when she had a MYSTICAL MOMENT that led her to change her ministry from being a teacher to working with the poorest of the poor in Calcutta.

--ARCHBISHOP OSCAR ROMERO: prayed and prayed before he wrote his last homily (given over the radio) exhorting the Salvadorian military to STOP THE OPPRESSION AND THE KILLING: He would be assassinated the next day.

--DR.MARTIN LUTHER KING: had already been receiving death threats. He had some Mystical Experience: that he said in his speech: "I've been to the MOUNTAIN TOP AND HAVE SEEN OVER TO THE PROMISED LAND... I MAY NOT GET THERE WITH YOU... LOGEVITY HAS ITS PLACE..." KING had a glimpse of the Kingdom of God (he calls the Promised Land) where all people get along and there is racial equality and economic justice: this gave him encouragement to continue and move forward.

--DOROTHY DAY: felt the call of conversion in her life to help the poor... was herself penniless, with a child, no husband, nowhere turn...took the train to D.C. and spent the entire day praying (pouring her heart out to our Lord) in the Crypt Church in the Basilica. Took the train back to NYC walked to her apartment: only to find PETER MAURIN A FRENCH MAN SITTING ON HER DOORSTEP... Maurin who would help Dorothy establish the Catholic Worker Movement.

--Religious, Priests and Deacons: before we make our vows / promises we had to go on retreat asking God's blessing and approval to go forward.

--THOSE WHO ARE MARRIED: hopefully you spent time in prayer before the actual ceremony asking God... is this the right person for me? Give me a sign Please! Ex. Friend: Tom

II.-- JESUS GIVES US A WONDERFUL EXAMPLE OF HOW TO INVITE GOD INTO OUR LIVES AND THE DECISIONS WE HAVE TO MAKE:

At our Lord's Baptism when Jesus came up out of the water God the Father said to God the Son: THIS IS MY BELOVED SON WITH WHOM I AM WELL PLEASED (ALL 4 GOSPELS). NOW JESUS CAN BEGIN HIS PUBLIC MINISTRY HE HAS THE FATHER'S BLESSING & APPROVAL...

At the TRANSFIGURATION: Jesus turns to Jerusalem...TO HIS PASSION AND DEATH...WE HEAR THE WORDS: "This is my beloved Son, (with whom I am well pleased) listen to him." Now Jesus can journey to Jerusalem to his Passion and Death knowing that it is the Father's will he has THE FATHER'S APPROVAL (and his 3 closest Apostles know this as well).

The TRANSFIGURATION = QUINTESSENTIAL = MYSTICAL = MOUNTAIN TOP moment ...where God Gives his CLEAR AND DECISIVE APPROVAL... sometimes they happen after the fact... I am sure many of you who are married have had the experience of blessedness that you married the ONE AND ONLY...

STORY: I know for myself sometimes walking from the Pastoral Center to the Rectory or when walking the dog... I feel how blessed my life is... I have one of those quintessential moments.

The PURPOSE OF THE TRANSFIGURATION IS: TO GIVE APPROVAL & ENCOURAGEMENT... It IS A PRECURSOR OF THE RESURRECTION...

This is the clue to the deeper meaning of the Transfiguration: Jesus was seeking the approval of the Father that he was indeed doing the will of the Father by going on to Jerusalem to suffer and die. And the Father gives him a resounding "yes".

D-- Moses and Elijah. (mentioned in all 3 accounts of the Transfiguration) Moses was considered the greatest of all of the law-givers, and Elijah was considered the greatest of all of the prophets.

Both had experiences of God on a mountain top. MOSES: MOUNT SINAI—to receive the 10 commandments (Exodus: 31:18) ELIJAH: MOUNT HOREB--in the still small voice (1Kgs. 19:9-12)

They appeared to Jesus and conversed with him to offer him support as he was about to face his passion and death. Also to get across to the listener of the Gospel that Jesus was the fulfillment of the Jewish law.

E.-- Peter says, rather impetuously: Lord, how good it is for us to be here, let us erect three tents... Peter here recognizes the depth of the moment and want to prolong it and memorialize it. (with a tent).

CONCLUSION: THE PURPOSE OF THE TRANFIGURATION EVENT IS TO INVITE GOD INTO EVERY DECISION / EVERY WAKING MOMENT OF OUR LIVES, TO DISCERN AND TRUST IN GODS WILL. ULTIMATELY: TO PRAY

III.-- ALSO (PURPOSE): Peter, James, and John got a glimpse of Jesus' resurrection it is supposed to ENCOURAGE US FORWARD WITH OUR LENTEN PRACTICES BECAUSE IT GIVES US A GLIMPSE / FORETASTE OF OUR GOAL THE GLORY OF THE ...RISEN CHRIST.

THAT NO CANCER, NO SUFFERING, NO TRIBULATION, NO DEATH OF A LOVED ONE, IN LIFE WILL BE THE LAST WORD—RESURRECTION / NEW LIFE IN CHRIST IS ALWAYS THE LAST WORD—

--THE MOUNTAIN TOP MOMENTS GET US THROUGH THE BAD TIMES. SO, WHEN WE HAVE TO CARRY OUR CROSS AND ARE TEMPTED TO DESPAIR, WE LOOK BEYOND THE PRESENT MOMENT OF SUFFERING AND REMEMBER THOSE GLIMPSES OF GOD WHEN HE SENT US CONSOLATIONS.

GRATITUDE: Lord, thank you for all that you give me: the air that I breathe, the clothes on my back, my parent(s), the food that I eat, the home that I live in, the school that I go to.

FORGIVENESS: Lord, forgive me for the times I have disobeyed you and disobeyed my parents.

JUDGING OTHERS: Lord, help me to always look at myself first instead of judging and criticizing others.

Lord, help me to always begin with myself instead of looking for fault in other people.

My Lenten Practice : Feeding and Being fed by the Word of God

LENTEN OBSERVANCE: after moving from the Eucharistic Table to the Fellowship Table (either in the Lower Church or in your Kitchen at home) now break open God's Word and share it with your fellow parishioners and family members

LECTIO DIVINA: In a group: Table Fellowship: you just heard the Gospel proclaimed at mass and the homily. Now with the people at your table seated in the Lower Church pray the process of LECTIO DIVINA

STEP ONE: READ: (someone at the table volunteers to read the Gospel again out loud or people can read it to themselves)

LENT FIRST SUNDAY: Gospel [Saint Luke 9:28b-36](#)

Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As they were about to part from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

But he did not know what he was saying. While he was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." After the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. They fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen.

STEP TWO: MEDITATE: People at the table share out loud what they "SEE" the setting (where and what is going on?), the people, the characters involved (who are they), and the unfolding action (What is taking place). It is through this meditation that you encounter the text and discover its meaning for your life.

STEP THREE: PRAYER: (ORATIO) YOUR PERSONAL RESPONSE: what is the text saying to you personally. What is Jesus saying or trying to teach you? Each member at the table share out loud what Jesus is saying to him or herself through this text.

STEP FOUR: CONTEMPLATION: share out loud what you see as the overall message of this Gospel reading and how would you apply to the faithful.

PASO UNO: LEER: (alguien en la mesa se ofrece como voluntario para leer el Evangelio nuevamente en voz alta o el grupo puede leerlo para sí misma)

PRIMER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA: Evangelio Lucas 4, 1-13

En aquel tiempo, Jesús, lleno del Espíritu Santo, regresó del Jordán y conducido por el mismo Espíritu, se internó en el desierto, donde permaneció durante cuarenta días y fue tentado por el demonio.

No comió nada en aquellos días, y cuando se completaron, sintió hambre. Entonces el diablo le dijo: "Si eres el Hijo de Dios, dile a esta piedra que se convierta en pan". Jesús le contestó: "Está escrito: *No sólo de pan vive el hombre*".

PASO CUATRO: CONTEMPLACIÓN: comparte en voz alta lo que ves como el mensaje general de esta lectura del Evangelio y cómo lo aplicarías a los fieles.
