



VIRTUS INSTRUCTIONS

Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: www.Virtus.org

When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.

- a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
- b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
- c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
- d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
- e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
- f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
- 2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION!
 - 1. If you stop, you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'



Pastor's Message for the Third Sunday of Lent

I.-- If we had to summarize today's readings it would be: USE IT OR LOSE IT. All that we are and all that we have has been given to us by God. Our very life, our faith, our time (ability to forgive and show mercy and to say the needed words like "I love you" to family)

If we don't use our time well, it can be taken away. God will always forgive us when we are contrite and want to do better; but we have to forgive others... use it or lose it.

STORY: There is a tragic story that illustrates how we have to use the present moment: now is all we have, tomorrow may never come:

As a newly ordained priest, a woman came up to me after mass and asked how she obtain forgiveness from the grave? She told me this story: When she was 15 years old, she lived with her mom and older sister in an apartment building on Kingsbridge Ave. in the Bronx. She was a smart student and attended Bronx High School of Science. Her mom was an immigrant, and she was very protective of her daughters. The mom was an LPN nurse at Bronx Montefiore Hosp. The rule of the house was no boyfriends until they were 18 and in college. They have to apply themselves to school first.

One day the mom was doing the laundry and emptying the pockets and she found a note from a boyfriend. She confronted her daughter, and an argument ensued. The mom growing bored said, "you want to live under my roof than you live by my rules. Or get out!" The 15-year-old daughter was aghast. Frustrated she yelled several nasty words to her mom, ran to her room and slammed the door crying profusely.

Several hours past and the mom knocked on the door.... but no response. Finally, the mom knocked again and asked her daughter to open the door, she didn't want to leave for work mad like this. But you know that I am right and only want the best for you. As she tells it her face was pressed against the door, and she could feel the knock of her mother's fist. But her heart was cold... she could see her tears dropping on the floor, but nothing—she remained silent

Finally, the mother said, OK then. I have to leave and go to work, when my shift at the hospital is over tomorrow, we will go to breakfast. You know I love you and only want the best for you. The daughter remained silent.

The mother took the elevator down and took one step off the curb at Kingsbridge she was hit by a bus and killed instantly. Now that 15-year-old girl now a mom of her own has had to live with the fact that her last words to her mother were nasty words her mother never deserved.

She would have nightmares of throwing her door open and telling her mom that she was sorry. All those times her mom knocked on her door and she remained silent on the other side. USE IT OR LOSE IT. OUR TIME AND ABILITY TO FORGIVE...THE PRESENT MOMENT...TODAY IS ALL WE HAVE.

God will always give us a chance to repent, but as we hear in the parable of the Fig Tree our opportunity to use our gift of time (e.g to forgive, show mercy, etc.) can run out.

Remember the degree that I forgive, show mercy to others: is the degree that I can receive God's forgiveness and mercy.

II.-- The Gospel also raises the question: Does God punish? Or does God allow events to occur to teach us something? Every time there is a tragedy: we are left asking: How could God let this happen? Of course the secular mindset also says: "you get what you deserve" o fate will catch up with you." Or "What goes around comes around"

Yet this was the religious belief in our Lord's time: that if you suffered a tragedy or were sick or ill or poor: you were paying for your sinfulness or the sinfulness of your ancestors. So, the belief was: if you were victim or even a family member of someone who suffered a tragedy, you deserved it you were being punished by God.

In the Gospel, People (with this mindset) came to Jesus with a story of some Galileans who had been killed by Pilate while they were offering their sacrifices in the Temple (probably at Passover). Jesus aware of this mentality asks, "Where these Galileans greater sinners that anyone else? Did they deserve this? Of course not. It's difficult to accept that God does not punish.

Jesus offers a second example: A water tower part of an aqueduct system collapsed and killed 18 people—an accident and tragedy. Jesus uses this opportunity to teach a very important lesson: That we need to repent and be reconciled ASAP... as long as we have the time and the ability. We don't know the moment of the hour...so as long as we are alive and have the ability, we should be reconciled. A tragedy could befall anyone at any time, so we make every day count.

Clearly then, God does not allow accidents to punish people, but still, according to Jesus' parable, nor does He infinitely wait. As the parable suggests: we have to bear fruit in life with what God has given us.

A fig tree should produce fruit every year, just as human lives should bear the fruits of good deeds. This fig tree had been barren "for three years" and not only did it not bear figs, it seemed to be draining nourishment from other plants in the vineyard.

III.-- It is the third week of Lent, if we haven't already it is time to consider those aspects of our lives in need of conversion...that which is keeping us from growing closer to God.

In using the example of the Fig Tree, Jesus heightens awareness wasting what he has given us. Life, Faith, Time: USE IT OR LOSE IT!

All that God has given us: we either use it well or it could be taken away. As long as we have the gift of time we must repent and be reconciled.

A.-- Other examples of parables of: USE IT OR LOSE IT!

- --Do you remember the Parable of the Talents? The master gave ten talent, five talents, and one talent of money to a third servant. The first two servant put their master's money to work but the third one, the useless one, the unproductive one, did nothing with it The master rightly condemned that servant for doing nothing.
- --Then there was the parable of the merchant who found a really valuable treasure buried in a field. He went out, sold all that he had and bought the field containing the treasure.

Finally there was the parable of the unjust steward who "cooked the books" of his master so that after he was fired they would take care of him.

These parables and others similar to them, all point to the idea: that we have to use well all that God has given us to produce fruit but especially us our time well and repent and be reconciled: NOW USE IT OR LOSE IT!

The parable of the fig tree isn't about God's vindictive anger. Clearly Jesus is not being vindictive or harsh. He never was and never will be. No, he is simply stating a fact of life: USE IT OR LOSE IT!

JOKE:

- --a priest parked his car in a no-parking zone because he couldn't find a space. He put a note under the windshield wiper that read: "I have circled the block 100 times. If I don't park here, I'll miss my appointment. "Forgive us our trespasses."
- ---When he returned, he found a TICKET from a police officer along with this note: "I've circled this block for 10 years. If I don't give you a ticket, I'll lose my job. "Lead us not into temptation."

Children's Prayer

GRATITUDE: Lord, thank you for all that you give me: the air that I

breath, the clothes on my back, my parent(s), the food that I eat, the home that I live in, the school that I go to.

FORGIVENESS: Lord, forgive me for the times I have disobeyed you and disobeyed my parents.

JUDGING OTHERS: Lord, help me to always look at myself first instead of judging and criticizing others.

Lord, help me to always begin with myself instead of looking for fault in other people.

My Lenten Practice: Feeding and Being fed by the Word of God

LENTEN OBSERVANCE: after moving from the Eucharistic Table to the Fellowship Table (either in the Lower Church or in your Kitchen at home) now break open God's Word and share it with your fellow parishioners and family members

LECTIO DIVINA: In a group: Table Fellowship: you just heard the Gospel proclaimed at mass and the homily. Now with the people at your table seated in the Lower Church pray the process of LECTIO DIVINA

STEP ONE: READ: (someone at the table volunteers to read the Goepel again out loud or people can read it to themselves)

LENT FIRST SUNDAY: Gospel Saint Luke 13:1-9

Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!"

And he told them this parable:

"There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.""

STEP TWO: MEDITATE: People at the table share out loud what they "SEE" the setting (where and what is going on?), the people, the characters involved (who are they), and the unfolding action (What is taking place). It is through this meditation that you encounter the text and discover its meaning for your life.

STEP THREE: PRAYER: (ORATIO) YOUR PERSONAL RESPONSE: what is the text saying to you personally. What is Jesus saying or trying to teach you? Each member at the table share out loud what Jesus is saying to him or herself through this text.

STEP FOUR: CONTEMPLATION: share out loud what you see as the overall message of this Gospel reading and how would you apply to the faithful.

(Spanish)

PASO DOS: MEDITAR: Las personas sentadas a la mesa comparten en voz alta lo que "VEN": el contexto (¿dónde y qué está sucediendo?), las personas, los personajes involucrados (¿quiénes son?) y la acción que se está desarrollando (¿qué está sucediendo?). Es a través de esta meditación que te encuentras con el texto y descubres su significado para tu vida.

PASO TRES:

ORACIÓN: (ORATIO) TU RESPUESTA PERSONAL: ¿Qué te dice el texto personalmente? ¿Qué te está diciendo o tratando de enseñar Jesús? Cada miembro de la mesa comparte en voz alta lo que Jesús le está diciendo a él o ella en este texto.

PASO CUATRO:

CONTEMPLACIÓN: comparte en voz alta lo que ves como el mensaje general de esta lectura del Evangelio y cómo lo aplicarías a los fieles.


