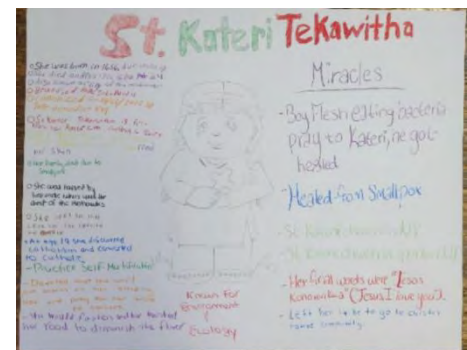
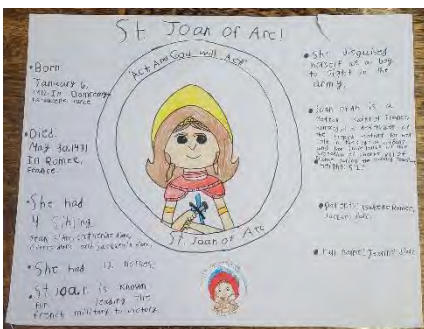

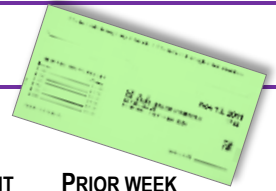

DEACON'S CORNER



“This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.” (See Luke 15:1-32) In today’s readings we see two different paradigms of how God is. The writer of Exodus sees God as an angry God who casts away sinners. This God tells Moses “let me alone, then, that my wrath may blaze up against them to consume them.” (See Exodus 32:7-14) In contrast, the writers of the New Testament after having experienced Jesus Christ in their lives see a God who welcomes sinners and eats with them. They see a God interested not so much in casting out sinners, but in gaining them back. We have the parable of the lost sheep. The shepherd (a picture of God)

goes to look for it and upon finding it he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and calls his friends to rejoice with him over the sheep. The woman—again another picture of God—searches all over the house for her lost coin and rejoices over finding it. Finally, we see the Father—Jesus’ preferred picture of God—welcoming the lost son and encouraging the faithful one to enter into the feast. We must remember that the true picture of God is the one given by our Lord Jesus Christ. This is the God who says to his faithful children “we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.” How do you see God?

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

“Este recibe a los pecadores y come con ellos.” (Vea San Lucas 15:1-32) En las lecturas de hoy vemos dos imágenes diferentes de cómo Dios es. El escritor del Éxodo ve a un Dios airado que rechaza a los pecadores. Este Dios le dice a Moisés: “Deja que mi ira se encienda contra ellos hasta consumirlos.” (Éxodo 32:7-14) En contraste, los escritores del Nuevo Testamento, después de haber experimentado a Jesucristo en sus vidas ven un Dios que recibe a los pecadores y come con ellos. Ven a un Dios que no se interesa en rechazar a los pecadores, sino en volverlos a ganar. Tenemos la parábola de la oveja perdida. El pastor (una imagen de Dios) sale a buscarla y al encontrarla se la pone sobre los hombros y llama a sus amigos para que se regocijen con él. La mujer—de nuevo otra imagen de Dios—busca la moneda perdida hasta encontrarla y se regocia por ella. Finalmente vemos al Padre—la imagen preferida de Jesús para explicar a Dios—que recibe con los brazos abiertos a su hijo perdido y anima al hijo fiel a entrar en el banquete. Debemos tener presente que la imagen verdadera de Dios es la que nos brinda el Señor Jesucristo. Este es el Dios que dice a sus fieles: “Era necesario hacer fiesta y regocijarnos, porque este hermano tuyo estaba muerto y ha vuelto a la vida, estaba perdido y lo hemos encontrado.”

VIRTUS INSTRUCTIONS

Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: www.Virtus.org

When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.

- a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. **DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION!**
 1. If you stop, you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

Pastor's Message for the Fourth Sunday of Lent

This Lenten Season our Lord Says to Us: **COME BACK TO ME, ALL IS FORGIVEN.....**

I.-- **STORY:** In 1973, Tony Orlando recorded the song, "**Tie a Yellow Ribbon Round The Old Oak Tree.**" It became an American anthem of homecoming, reunion and renewal.

--The song was probably inspired by the following story:

--A young man is on a train. He seems deeply troubled and is fighting back the tears. An older man seated beside him senses that something is wrong, and he asks the younger man if he is all right.

--The young man, needing to talk, blurts out his story: Three years before, after an **argument with his father** one evening, the young man had run away from home!

--He traveled across the country looking for freedom and happiness and with every passing day had become **miserable AS HE MISSED HIS FAMILY SO MUCH.**

HE KNEW THEY WOULD NEVER TAKE HIM BACK AS HE LEFT IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT. HE LEFT A note on the kitchen table... that sarcastically said: **HAVE A NICE LIFE.** He wouldn't blame them if they never wanted to see him again.

--He mailed a letter to them saying that he would be passing through their hometown on the train on such and such afternoon.

--If they wanted to see him again, they would tie a Yellow Ribbon around the large tree off the side of the tracks right before the station.

--If the ribbon was there, he would get off the train and return home. IF NOT he would continue on his journey AND STAY OUT OF THEIR LIVES FOR EVER.

--Just as the train was approaching the station, the young man couldn't look—he was so tense—he had been so mean to his parents... would they ever have him back?

--The older man said: "I'll watch for you. You put your head down and relax close your eyes. I'll watch for you."

--As they came closer to the station the **older man looked and then touched the young man excitedly on the shoulder and said: "Look, son, look! You can go home! You can go home!"**

--There's a Yellow Ribbon on every limb of that Old Oak Tree and every other tree around it... on top of that: his parents were waiting for him at the station...

****Why is it so difficult to Forgive or to ask for Forgiveness. Why is it so difficult to believe we can be forgiven??? How could the young man ever believe that his parents wouldn't take him back?**

**** We are all in need of God's mercy and love—we need to trust in His mercy and love!**

II.-- GOD'S UNCONDITIONAL LOVE:

--**God of the OT:** Petty tyrant, easily offended, we have to earn his love by being good. A GOD THAT PUNISHES.

--**NT teaches us** that God is like a DADDY / ABBA always caring and near to us, gentle, UNCONDITIONALLY LOVING!

--**Julian of Norwich:** Image of God sitting in heaven, smiling, face looking like a marvelous symphony.

--**But if God loves us UNCONDITIONALLY no matter what we do, they why be good,** why keep the commandments. If we are not going to be punished or rewarded for our efforts, why make the sacrifice?

--We don't try to be good and keep the commandments to get our reward...heaven is NOT a reward for a good life. God's love is unconditional and unmerited—nothing we can do will ever make God love us—nothing we can do to ever make God stop loving us.

--God loves us just like he loves everything else—perfectly. **It is God's love that keeps everything in existence.**

--****We are good and keep the commandments out of our gratitude for being loved by God... ****

--The intent is never to earn God's love or Heavenly reward, **but to respond properly to them... to radiate them to others.**

A.-- We are called to love as God loves AND forgive as God forgives: if God couldn't always forgive than he couldn't unconditionally love...(We are called to forgive because we are called to love as God loves....)

II.-- GOSPEL: LUKE 15: CHAPTER OF MERCY; 3 Parables of the LOST: coin, sheep, and son--about completeness: 10 coins, 100 sheep (risky to leave the 99 to look for 1 sheep), 2 sons (family complete) home under the roof. --remember with the lost son: the father sees his son far off and runs out to meet him. --then the Older Son won't go into the house: the father goes out to speak to him.

GOAL: the Father wants the family complete, and all under one roof.

--It's really about the PRODIGAL FATHER (prodigal meaning: excessive). The PRODIGAL FATHER REPRESENTS LOVING GOD WHO IS EXCESSIVE WITH HIS MERCY AND FORGIVENESS SEEKING OUT HIS CHILDREN AND BRINGING THEM HOME.

****OUR LOVING DADDY/GOD IN HEAVEN WANTS TO BRING ALL OF HIS CHILDREN HOME UNDER ONE ROOF IN HEAVEN.****

We forgive others because God has already forgiven us—we forgive always—not to let the other person off the hook or to not feel guilty. We forgive to bring about healing in our own hearts: THAT WE BE A REFLECTION OF HIS INFINITE LOVE. Forgiveness (like faith) has to be modeled in the home—it can't be taught in a book—ALL people are looking for some kind of forgiveness in their lives:

CONCLUSION: Our Lord tells each of us here (and people you know who need to hear this)—COME HOME TO ME—ALL IS FORGIVEN!

Children's Prayer

GRATITUDE: Lord, thank you for all that you give me: the air that I breathe, the clothes on my back, my parent(s), the food that I eat, the home that I live in, the school that I go to.

FORGIVENESS: Lord, forgive me for the times I have disobeyed you and disobeyed my parents.

JUDGING OTHERS: Lord, help me to always look at myself first instead of judging and criticizing others. Lord, help me to always begin with myself instead of looking for fault in other people.

My Lenten Practice : Feeding and Being fed by the Word of God

LENTEN OBSERVANCE: after moving from the Eucharistic Table to the Fellowship Table (either in the Lower Church or in your Kitchen at home) now break open God's Word and share it with your fellow parishioners and family members

LECTIO DIVINA: In a group: **Table Fellowship:** you just heard the Gospel proclaimed at mass and the homily. Now with the people at your table seated in the Lower Church pray the process of LECTIO DIVINA

STEP ONE: READ: (someone at the table volunteers to read the Gospel again out loud or people can read it to themselves)

LENT FIRST SUNDAY: Gospel [Saint Luke 15:11-32](#)

So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. . . . I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.'" So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.' Then the celebration began.

Now the older son had been out in the field . . . He became angry and refused to enter the house. er the house . . . his father came out and pleaded with him. 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have

is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found."

STEP TWO: MEDITATE: People at the table share out loud what they "SEE" the setting (where and what is going on?), the people, the characters involved (who are they), and the unfolding action (What is taking place). It is through this meditation that you encounter the text and discover its meaning for your life.

STEP THREE: PRAYER: (ORATIO) YOUR PERSONAL RESPONSE: what is the text saying to you personally. What is Jesus saying or trying to teach you? Each member at the table share out loud what Jesus is saying to him or herself through this text.

STEP FOUR: CONTEMPLATION: share out loud what you see as the overall message of this Gospel reading and how would you apply to the faithful.

Diocese of Rockville Centre Eucharistic Pilgrimage

During those days, Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to the town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.

Luke 1: 39-40

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. The Western Route will journey from St. Agnes Cathedral (Rockville Centre) through Nassau County, while the Eastern Route will journey from the Parish of Saint Therese of Lisieux (Montauk) through Suffolk County.

The Holy Eucharist will be carried in procession across the Diocese through many of our towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. During this pilgrimage, there will be opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, public processions, and other Eucharistic celebrations. The People of God will be invited to walk with Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, pray in the pilgrim churches, and proclaim the Gospel to bystanders as Jesus passes through their towns.

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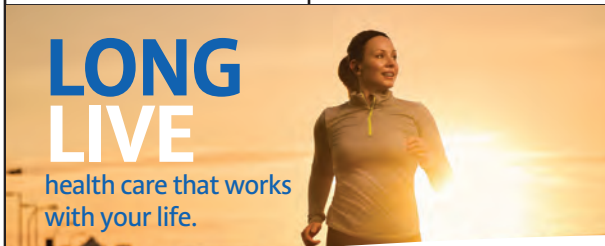
