DEACON'S CORNER



I think sometimes we're too hard on ourselves. We allow our own harsh judgements to replace the only one that truly matters: God's. Our own personal attitude can prevent us from accepting and sharing in the love and grace of God if we constantly feel that we are unworthy or failing. In the Gospel, when the adulterous woman is brought before Jesus, it does not say that she cried or tried to run. In the Gospel account, she lays at the feet of Jesus, lets Him clear her name and, ultimately, lets Him forgive her sins. Here's a secret I've

learned that the Gospel has been trying to tell us for a few thousand years now: Man is never worthy on his own, but has been made so by Christ, who offers redemption to all. If man were worthy, Christ would not have needed to redeem us after the Fall. So, we need to stop allowing our own negative perception of our efforts to prevent us from bearing or receiving the fruits of God's grace and forgiveness.

Why was Jesus' reaction effective with the woman? Christ did not condone her sin, but met the woman in her sinful situation with love and mercy. Surely, such a transformation is not possible without a profound encounter with God's mercy, an openness to change, and conversion of heart. The adulterous woman of this week's Gospel is told by Jesus to "Go, and from now on do not sin any more" (John 8:11). As a result of her encounter with Jesus, her heart was changed, and she spent the rest of her life trying to grow closer to Him. We are called to do the same – during the Lenten season or any other time. If we are open to the love of God, it will fill us and strengthen us in our actions.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

Creo que a veces somos demasiado duros con nosotros mismos. Permitimos que nuestros juicios severos reemplacen al único que realmente importa: el de Dios. Nuestra actitud personal puede impedirnos aceptar y compartir el amor y la gracia de Dios si constantemente sentimos que somos indignos o que estamos fallando. En el Evangelio, cuando la mujer adúltera es llevada ante Jesús, no dice que llorara ni intentara huir. En el relato evangélico, ella se postra a los pies de Jesús, deja que Él limpie su nombre y, finalmente, permite que Él perdone sus pecados. He aquí un secreto que he aprendido y que el Evangelio nos ha estado diciendo desde hace miles de años: el hombre nunca es digno por sí mismo, sino que lo es por Cristo, quien ofrece redención a todos. Si el hombre fuera digno, Cristo no habría necesitado redimirnos después de la Caída. Por lo tanto, debemos dejar de permitir que nuestra propia percepción negativa de nuestros esfuerzos nos impida dar o recibir los frutos de la gracia y el perdón de Dios.

¿Por qué fue efectiva la reacción de Jesús con la mujer? Cristo no condonó su pecado, sino que la acompañó en su situación pecaminosa con amor y misericordia. Sin duda, tal transformación no es posible sin un encuentro profundo con la misericordia de Dios, una apertura al cambio y una conversión de corazón. A la mujer adúltera del Evangelio de esta semana, Jesús le dice: «Vete, y de ahora en adelante no peques más» (Juan 8:11). Como resultado de su encuentro con Jesús, su corazón cambió y dedicó el resto de su vida a acercarse a Él. Estamos llamados a hacer lo mismo, durante la Cuaresma o en cualquier otro momento. Si estamos abiertos al amor de Dios, este nos llenará y nos fortalecerá en nuestras acciones.

Pastor's Message for the Fifth Sunday of Lent

I.-- Story: Abraham Lincoln (before he was President) was in Charleston, South Carolina walking through the center of town where they were holding an AUCTION...SLAVE AUCTION.

--As he looked, his soul was **aghast as human beings were selling other human beings.**

-- next on the auction block was a woman...as the bidding started he moved to the edge of the crowd and uncharacteristically started bidding on her.

--the bidding became very heated and more and more involved... But Lincoln **OUTBID ALL THE PLANTATION OWNERS.**

--The AUCTIONEER said: Sold to the tall lanky man with the beard....

--After paying the BID, the woman was brought to him.

--Lincoln asked: Miss, do you have kin folk (family) in the North where you can go to? She responded YES...

--He said to her: go to them. **YOU ARE FREE AGAIN!**

CONCLUSION: (I use this story because SLAVERY = SIN). **But also, because SIN = form of SLAVERY** (how many people find themselves slaves to: negativity, judging others, addictions, etc...)

II ****Jesus Christ has purchased our freedom from slavery to sin with his very life, death, and resurrection...he has set us free.**

...he tells us on this last Sunday before Palm Sunday...I have purchased your freedom (and, as he told the woman caught in adultery): **NOR DO I CONDEMN YOU...I GIVE YOU A SECOND CHANCE...GO BE FREE OF YOUR SINFULNESS and sin no more...**

A. We don't know what happened to the woman (if her husband took her back) .Adultery (was / is a particularly grievous sin because it divides families and tears down community.

--punishable by death by the MOSAIC LAW

--Woman here is a: **SINNER BUT ALSO A VICTIM:** she (and not her accomplice is being dragged out in public) to TRAP JESUS...TO SEE IF HE WILL UPHOLD THE MOSAIC LAW OR FAVOR THE SINNER...

*****Christian tradition holds** that the woman was at the Foot of the Cross next to Mary the mother of Jesus.

--**THIS Woman teaches us something important...** No matter how grave your sin... no matter how much your guilt...OUR LORD is willing to forgive, if you are sorrowful, do penance, and go and sin no more...

B--We tend to think of LENT as a solemn time: FASTING, ABSTINENCE, EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE, CONFESSION OF SIN, STATIONS OF THE CROSS . . . **AND THAT IT IS!**

--ALL OF THIS IS NOT TO MAKE US SOMBER ---IT IS TO GIVE US JOY...THE JOY OF REPENTANCE AND RECONCILIATION.

--Last week was LENTEN SUNDAY AND THE LITURGICAL COLOR ROSE to denote JOY because our Lord's RESURRECTION / NEW LIFE ARE NEAR.-- **and because our Gospel** told us that God is like a Father standing on the porch waiting for his prodigal son (us) to come home to him or like the older son to stop judging his brother and celebrate that he has returned home.

C.-- On this week's Gospel: St Augustine said that in the end only two people remained: "misericordia" and "Misericordia"==**Misery (suffering) and Mercy.**

--the woman = human misery (suffering) slavery to sin

--Jesus = embodiment of God's MERCY.

--When you add: HEART (COR) to (MISERIA)=MISERI+CORDIA

****Mercy = when someone's heart is moved to enter the MISERY/SUFFERING OF ANOTHER****

--Jesus' asks: "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No, Sir"

--Jesus responded with those beautiful words: "Neither do I condemn you. Go and sin no more."

Jesus transformed her Misery into JOY.

--HE WANTS TO DO THAT FOR YOU...

GOD IS LOVE (essential attribute: AQUINAS) God's love brought creation into existence and holds it in existence...if God stopped loving creation...all of creation would implode...

--God loves us unconditionally...nothing we can do to earn God's love; nothing we can do to make God to STOP loving us.

--We are good / follow the commandments: out of GRATITUDE to God for experiencing God's love in our lives.

--If God loves us unconditionally he will forgive us unconditionally...

--since God's essential attribute is LOVE. ****MERCY** is what God's love looks like when he turns his love / EXPRESSES HIS LOVE towards humanity / sinner.

**** MERCY = GOD'S LOVE EXPRESSED TO HUMANITY****

D The Gospel of today bids us to look at ourselves and **to avoid passing judgement on others.**

-- there is a tendency within us to find fault in others and condemn them.

STORY: BISHOP (Father) NELSON PEREZ: was very fond of telling this story: After mass a woman came running up to him as he was saying goodbye to the people. Very excitedly she said, "Father Perez, that woman (pointing across the church) is a sinner, and she never should have received communion." Father Perez looked squarely at her and said, "Nor should you have received communion for JUDGING HER."

----During MASS we repeatedly ask forgiveness from the Lord and yet we hold back so many grudges in our hearts

--we hold onto many memories of being HURT AND OFFENDED and forgiveness does not come easily.

**** JESUS CLEARLY TELLS US: NOT TO JUDGE ONE ANOTHER****

E.-- At this point in the Lenten season we NEED TO RECOGNIZE both God's justice and God's mercy.

--By *confessing our sinfulness and avoiding sin*, we bear witness to the **JUSTICE OF GOD.**

--By *ACCEPTING GOD'S FORGIVENESS AND FORGIVING OTHERS*, we bear witness to the **MERCY OF GOD.**

****--The woman in this story represents all of us. She represents every person who has sinned.**

--IS OUR SIN the sin of COMMISSION AND of self righteousness. DO WE SET ourselves up as superior / HOLIER THAN THOU...

CONCLUSION---In the Gospel today, GOD TELLS US that HE makes all things new...**GO AND SIN NO MORE...**



Children's Prayer

GRATITUDE: Lord, thank you for all that you give me: the air that I breathe, the clothes on my back, my parent(s), the food that I eat, the home that I live in, the school that I go to.

FORGIVENESS: Lord, forgive me for the times I have disobeyed you and disobeyed my parents.

JUDGING OTHERS: Lord, help me to always look at myself first instead of judging and criticizing others. Lord, help me to always begin with myself instead of looking for fault in other people.

My Lenten Practice : Feeding and Being fed by the Word of God

LENTEN OBSERVANCE: after moving from the Eucharistic Table to the Fellowship Table (either in the Lower Church or in your Kitchen at home) now break open *God's Word* and share it with your fellow parishioners and family members

LECTIO DIVINA: In a group: Table Fellowship: you just heard the *Gospel* proclaimed at mass and the homily. Now with the people at your table seated in the Lower Church pray the process of **LECTIO DIVINA**

STEP ONE: READ: (someone at the table volunteers to read the *Goepel* again out loud or people can read it to themselves)

LENT FIRST SUNDAY: Gospel [*Saint John 8:1-11*](#)

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, “Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?” They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” Again, he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, “Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?” She replied, “No one, sir.” Then Jesus said, “Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more.”

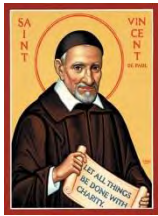

- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
