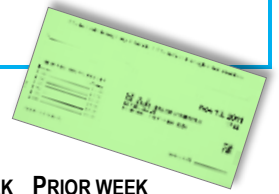

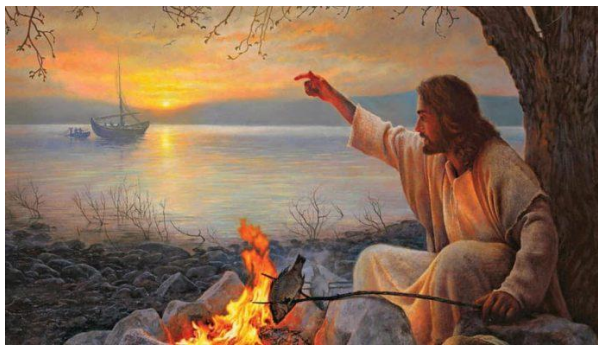

DEACON'S CORNER

“At that time, Jesus revealed Himself again to His disciples.” (See *Saint John 21:1-19*) As this text shows the resurrected Lord revealed Himself more than once to His disciples, and just as it happened with them, Jesus reveals Himself to us again and again, as many times as it is necessary. When Jesus reveals Himself to us our experience is very much like that of Peter in this account. Peter needed to be fed. He also needed to be forgiven. Peter needed to reaffirm his love for Jesus. Jesus gave



him that opportunity. Time after time, Jesus does the same for us. It is at times of severe distress, at times when we feel far away from Him that He comes to us. It may be in the visit of a dear one or in the words of a trusted friend. It may be when we come to Church and are surrounded by our brothers and sisters—sometimes in the words of a Christian song, or when we receive His Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist. Whatever the situation, Jesus feeds us and we find what we need in order to reaffirm and strengthen our relationship with Him. It is interesting that in the above experience Jesus reveals Himself to a group of disciples. We must never forget this. We find Jesus in the midst of our brothers. Every time we come back to church, we have the possibility of receiving a Jesus experience in the midst of our brothers. May He continue to always reveal Himself again and again to His disciples!

Cada vez que regresamos a la Iglesia tenemos la posibilidad de recibir un encuentro con Jesús en medio de nuestros hermanos. ¡Que Él continúe revelándose a sus discípulos vez tras vez!

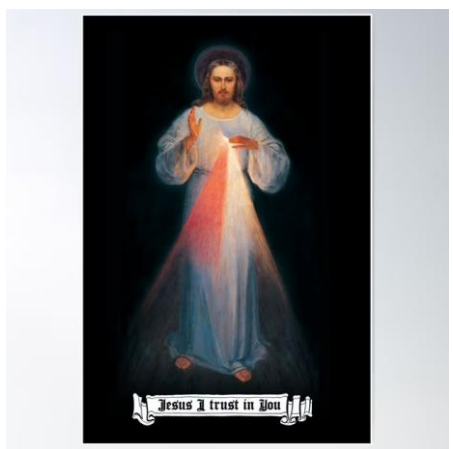

Pastor's Message for the Third Sunday of Easter

All prayer is communication: speaking and listening:

STORY: During the great depression (1929-1939.). Jobs were scarce and when an opening was announced, dozens of applicants appeared. On this particular occasion, they crowded into a waiting room, eager to be interviewed for the position of **telegraph operator**. But the noise of their conversation competed against a steady **background of dots and dashes**. Suddenly, the door opened and yet another applicant entered the room. After standing there quietly for a moment listening attentively to the **dots and dashes**, he walked to a door marked "Private" and knocked. The **personnel director** opened the door and announced to the others, "**You may all go now; this applicant has the job.**" Furious and frustrated, the others demanded an explanation. **At that, the director said, "Listen!"** When the room became quiet, all heard the dots and dashes, **repeating over and over the same message, "If you hear this, come in; the job is yours."**

POINT: This story reminds us that God is constantly speaking to us, but, like the crowd of applicants, are we listening?

--Today's gospel describes how the Risen Lord reveals himself to his listening and observant apostles through a miraculous catch of fish and how he confers the primacy in his Church on Peter.

--THE MESSAGE FOR US IS: are we listening, are we recognizing the Risen Christ in our lives: in various forms, circumstances and events?

A) --presence of the Risen Lord in: **unexpected success, achievements, promotion at work, miraculous healings, and success in relationships.**

-- shouldn't attribute any of this to hard work, or our own efforts. We have to remember (John 15:5) "*Without me you can do nothing.*" And (Psalm 127) "*If the Lord does not build the house in vain do the builders labor.*"

B We should also see the risen Lord in our PAINS AND SUFFERINGS:

-- Risen Christ transformed the life of Saul by pushing him off his horse (Road to Damascus) and making him blind.

--Jesus often visits us in the form of: accidents, illness, the loss of dear ones, pain and sufferings, problems.

-- When Cardinal Bernadine was hospitalized for surgery for cancer he said, "**Cancer increased my faith in the presence of the Risen Jesus as actively involved in my life even in illness.**"

-- Bishop Desmond Tutu who was losing the battle against prostate cancer, spoke of how the disease had given him **new ears, and new eyes, to see things and hear things he had so taken for granted** - the love of a spouse, a Beethoven symphony, the dew on the rose, the laughter of a grandchild.

C. Recognizing the Risen Lord in our friends and family: those who give encouragement and lift us up; those who are always there.

--recognizing the Risen Christ in the poor and homeless. **Dorothy Day** and her prayer in the Crypt Church in the Basilica in Washington, DC-- Lord, you are so hard to love—you are unbathed and you smell, you are crude, you are mentally ill, etc.

D. Recognizing the RISEN LORD on our altar and in our worship, in the Liturgy of the WORD, IN THE SACRAMENTS, IN THE GATHERED COMMUNITY--- Matt 18:20 wherever two or three are gathered in my name...there am I...)

E. Recognizing the Risen Lord in all OUR ACTIVITIES AND ENDEAVORS---- to invite him into the process—every waking moment of our lives.

II. It is difficult to fathom which was worse: suffering a slow and painful death suffocating and bleeding to death on a cross...

OR being stabbed in the back and **BETRAYED BY YOUR CLOSEST FRIENDS**-- Peter was with our Lord for three years. The Apostles traveled with our Lord, they ate together, prayed together, spent every waking moment with our Lord.

--Peter, who was part of our Lord's Inner Circle: Peter, James, and John-- **DENIED THAT HE EVER KNEW OUR LORD THREE TIMES...**

-- **JUST IMAGINE THE LAST WORDS YOU EVER SPOKE TO SOMEONE YOU LOVE---** WERE NOT THE WORDS: **"I LOVE YOU"** BUT RATHER WORDS OF BETRAYAL.

-- **WE CAN SEE WHY PETER JUMPED OFF THE BOAT WHEN HE RECOGNIZED IT WAS THE LORD....** As he was swimming ashore, he was probably thinking: I betrayed him, now I **CAN MAKE IT RIGHT!**

--**IN TODAY'S GOSPEL:** PETER IS GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY 3 TIMES TO REDEEM HIMSELF.

A --- Chapter 21 of John's Gospel may have been added to clear up some ambiguities about the roles that Peter and John were exercising in the first-century community.

--THE PRIMARY PURPOSE- of this appearance of the Risen Christ was to REDEEM PETER and to confer PRIMACY on him (which will be known as the Papacy)

-- Chapter 21 shows **Peter going back home and to his old job and WAY OF LIFE**-- six other apostles join him.

--John mentions it was the third time that JESUS appeared to the apostles (it was actually the FOURTH)

-- 1st to Mary Magdalene

-- 2nd Disciples without Thomas

-- 3rd time Disciples WITH THOMAS

-- 4th time Peter and Disciples in the Boat

-- Jesus asks the disciples to cast their nets into the sea a second time. They catch a large number of fish-- Jesus invites Peter to follow him. BOAT= Church, Sea = the world, Peter = supreme authority in Church. LARGE (153) Number of fish = signifies the number of the elect / ABUNDANCE

-- The Apostles return to their old occupation and way of life: which **sets the stage for their conversion**. They realize the stranger on the shore is directing them to a TREMEMDOUS CATCH-- THAT IT IS THE LORD.

-- they recognize him while they were doing what they always do. Afterwards----they eat a meal with Jesus.

-- THIS GIVE A GREAT GLIMPSE INTO THE EUCHARIST: in the early decades of the Church, it was a regular meal in which the consecration of the Bread and Wine were separated it out.

-- Jesus validates them by adding some of the fish they caught to the meal of FISH AND BREAD.

-- John's Gospel: begins with a **MIRACLE OF ABUNDANCE** (wedding feast at Cana: Water into Wine) **AND CLOSSES WITH A MIRACLE OF ABUNDANCE** on the Sea of Tiberius "*Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish*"

-- Overtones of the Eucharist.

B. ONE OF THE **MAIN PURPOSES OF THE RESURRECTION APPEARANCES**: Jesus appears for a PURPOSE—he usually COMMISSIONS SOMEONE.

--Here Jesus is OFFERING PETER 3 CHANCES TO REDEEM HIMSELF (afterwards he commissions him)

-- **Jesus asks**: Peter son of John: DO YOU LOVE ME? Jesus uses the word that is translated from ARAMAIC into the Greek Word: AGAPE and NOT PHILIOS. AGAPE is a deep sacrificial love and PHILIOS is a kind of brotherly (wish you well kind of love).

-- as Peter responds Yes... our Lord ADDS: FEED MY LAMBS/ TEND MY SHEEP/ FEED MY SHEEP—

-- Our Lord here is commissioning Peter to SHEPHERD HIS CHURCH--THIS IS THE BEGINNING OF THE EVOLUTION OF WHAT WOULD BE THE PAPACY.

CONCLUSION: We need to open our eyes, ears and hearts wide to see, hear and experience the Risen Lord coming into our lives and our WORLD in various forms, circumstances and events.

MAYBE IN PRAYER TONIGHT, YOU CAN SAY THOSE BEAUTIFUL WORDS TO OUR LORD: **I LOVE YOU!**

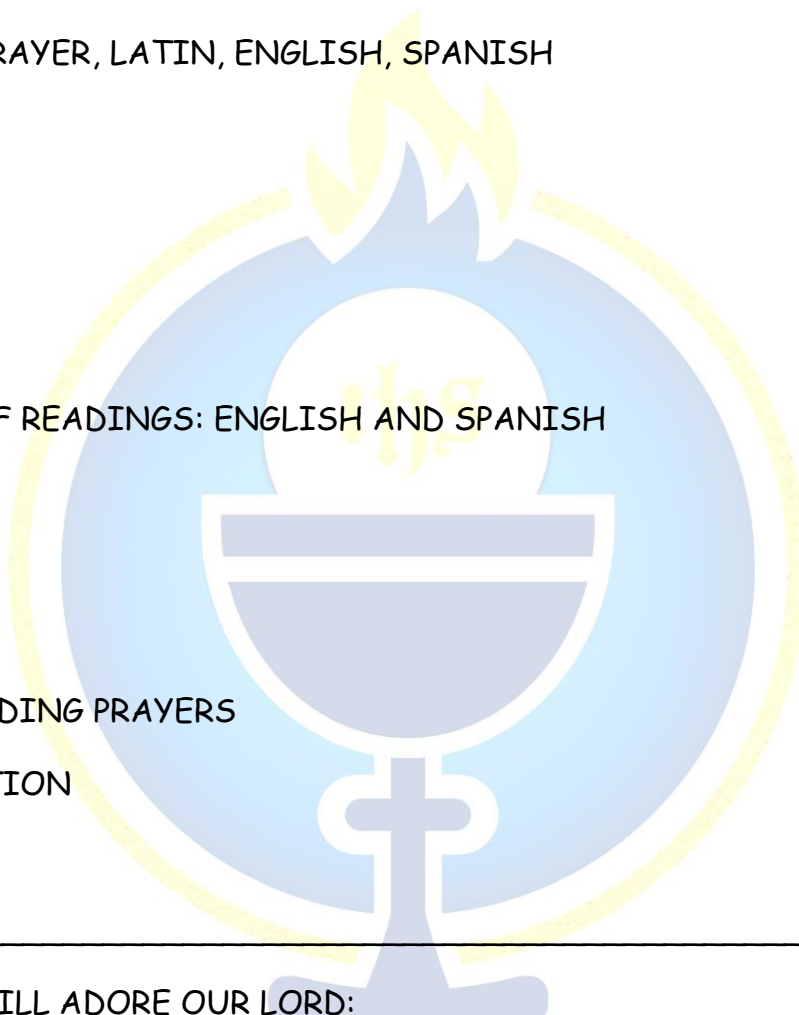

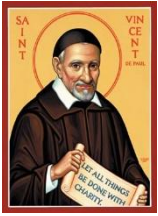

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.

- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.

- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
- ♥ By the 11th and 12th weeks I am moving my arms and legs, sucking my thumb and breathing amniotic fluid. All my systems are working.
- ♥ My movements by 16 weeks are quite active and I can be seen performing somersaults on ultrasound but am not yet felt by my mother.
- ♥ From the 3rd month on nothing new develops. I continue to grow in size and by 20 weeks I have hair on my head, weigh 1 pound and am 12 inches tall.
