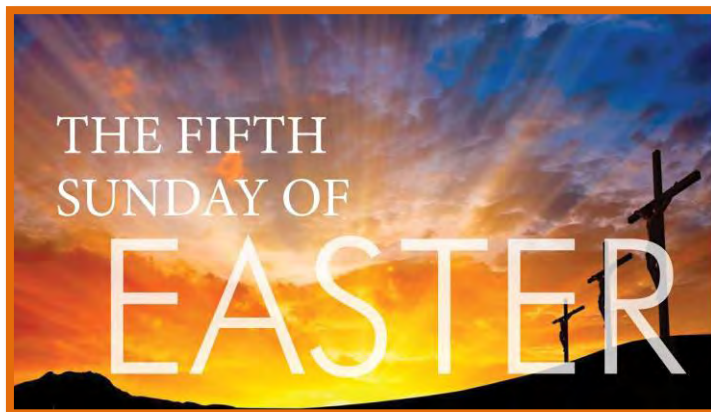

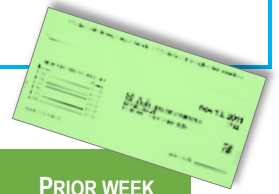

DEACON'S CORNER



Today's Gospel speaks of the cross as Glory! "Now (with His death on the cross and His resurrection) is the Son of Man glorified." (See Saint John 13:31-33a, 34-35. No cross. No resurrection! It is as simple as that. Jesus, however, tells us that the cross must be carried with love. After speaking of His death on the cross as His being glorified He gives the new commandment: "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." This new commandment would mark His disciples. You see, many people can carry crosses.

Some may even do so out of spite, or to prove how pious they are. But Jesus is telling us that we must do so for love, and out of love. This is how we know that we are His disciples, not just by what we are willing to do for others, but rather by how much we love others. In so doing, we will be helping them to carry their crosses. In Jesus case this led Him to glory. It will also lead to glory in our case, and all will know that we are His disciples.

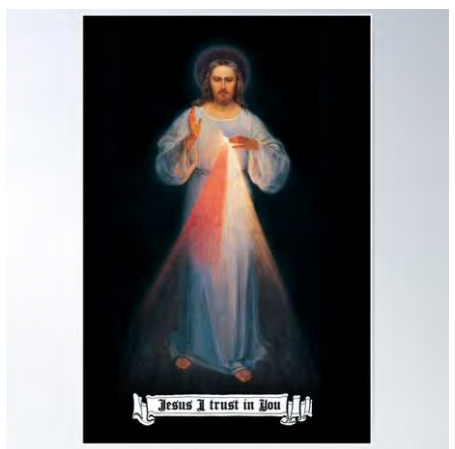

Pastor's Message for the Fifth Sunday of Easter: "Love one another as I have loved you."

I.-- Last week: Jesus used the Metaphor of the Good Shepherd to capture his radical closeness to us. This Sunday he uses the New Commandment: Love one another as I have loved you.

--**CONTEXT:** these verses are from John 13: beginning of the **Farewell Discourse at the Last Supper** (5 long chapters). Begins with washing of the feet; then hands bread to Judas who will betray him...Judas leaves. Then, Jesus gives them the New Commandment:

****THE KEY WORD IS: AS I HAVE LOVED YOU.**** His love for us is an example of the love that we should have for one another.**

--**HOW DOES JESUS LOVE?**

1.-- **SELFLESS:** even in the noblest of human love there is some element of SELF. What am I going to get out of this? What will this do for me? **Jesus never thought of himself. His one desire was to give himself and all he had for those he loved.**

2.-- **SACRIFICIAL:** there was NO LIMIT to what his love would give or to where it would go. No demand would be too much, even if it means the **CROSS—Jesus was prepared to go there.**

3.-- **UNDERSTANDING:** He knew his disciples completely; he **knew them well: their positive qualities and the faults.** Real love—you love the person for who they are not who you want them to be.

4.-- **FORGIVING:** Peter would deny Jesus three times...they all would forsake him in his hour of need...they never really understood him...they were blind, insensitive and slow to learn and they were **COWARDS... But JESUS HELD NOTHING AGAINST THEM...**

****QUESTION IS: Can we BE TRUE DISCIPLES AND SHOW THIS SAME KIND OF LOVE TO EACH OTHER?**

II.-- STORY: Woman, **Marie**, she wanted her son Billy to have a **NORMAL LIFE; SHE** announces her plans to go to Lourdes to bath her young, handicapped **son Billy** in the waters. She saved and planned for the trip for two years.

Marie, and her friend Susan, helped each other. They had struggled a lot together. Billy and Susan's son David were born brain damaged. **BOTH HANDICAPPED SONS WERE unique sources of JOY AND GRIEF.**

It would be a difficult trip for Marie **BUT even if there was only a slim chance that Billy could be miraculously transformed...she felt she owed it to him to try.**

When MARIE AND BILLY returned from Lourdes it was obvious **Marie had a new vitality...she was more patient and there was a peace about her...BILLY WAS THE SAME.**

As the weeks passed after the trip...Susan kept expecting Marie to tell her about the trip...but she didn't dare ask... Healing can be a personal private spiritual experience.

One Day **Susan said, " I love my David,** but wouldn't it be wonderful if David could live a normal life? Other parents wish their sons were better students or more athletic or less moody or more ambitious...**I want a miracle for my son.**

Marie, went up to her room and brought back a small plastic bottle and said **HERE...I brought you back some water from LOURDES..."**

Susan asked: "Do you think it would work for my son DAVID?" Implying it **OBVIOUSLY DIDN'T WORK FOR BILLY...**

Marie **LOOKED AWAY...(SHE FELT TERRIBLE...)...SHE SAID: "I DIDN'T LET BILLY GO INTO THE WATERS AT LOURDES"**

SUSAN ASKED: WHY NOT ? MARIE SAID: "... I just couldn't"

SUSAN THOUGHT ABOUT: (all the money, all the preparation) **SUSAN WISPERED: WHY?**

MARIE SAID:" BECAUSE I REALIZED THAT I LOVE HIM THE WAY HE IS" WHAT IS NORMAL ANYWAY?

Susan now understood: the new source of peace in Marie...**SHE accepted and loved her son the way he is...handicap and all.**

MARIE SAID: "Even though he will always be **CHALLENGED ... I will still love my Son."**

CONCLUSION: A MIRACLE DID TAKE place at Lourdes...THE MIRACLE OF SERVICE, SACRIFICIAL, UNDERSTANDING: LOVE**

III.-- Hence...we too should be recognized as Disciples of our Lord by our **LOVE FOR ONE ANOTHER...A LOVE WITHOUT LIMITS, CONDITIONS, OR PREREQUISITES.**

--THIS IS THE TRADEMARK OF BEING A FOLLWER OF JESUS.....

--AGÁPE LOVE: requires a total commitment and trust. It should be more than just a warm feeling towards others. It should be a compassionate gift of ourselves to the **SPIRITUAL AND CORPORAL NEEDS** of our brothers and sisters.

---Agape: implies a reaching out to others in a caring attitude for their wellbeing without expecting anything in return.

IV.-- STORY: The last year my Mother was alive, 2006. I was home visiting from the D.R. She asked me to go shopping with her because she needed a new dress. I don't normally like to go shopping with other people, and I'm not a patient person, but **TO SPEND QUALITY TIME WITH HER**...we set off for the mall together, nonetheless. We visited nearly every store that carried ladies' dresses, and my mother tried on dress after dress, rejecting them all. **As the day wore on, I grew weary, and my mother grew frustrated.**

--Finally, at our last stop, my mother tried on a lovely blue three-piece dress. The **blouse had a bow as a neck-** line, I watched as she tried, with much difficulty, to tie the bow. Her hands were so badly crippled from arthritis that she couldn't do it. Immediately, my impatience gave way to compassion for her. I turned away to try and hide the tears that welled up.

--Regaining my composure, I turned back to tie the bow. ****That evening while saying good night and giving her a hug and kiss...AS I DROVE HOME:**

--I was so grateful that God let me see with new eyes what a precious, priceless gift she was of self-sacrificing love.

****To this very day I remember her struggling to tie that bow with her arthritic hands...Those loving hands that had fed me, bathed me, dressed me, comforted me, and, most of all,**

IV.-- SEVERAL WEEKS AGO: we heard the story of DOUBTING THOMAS who wanted to see the NAIL MARKS IN JESUS' HANDS --Those hands, pierced out of love for all `HUMANITY,

--FROM THE CROSS: CHRIST TAUGHT US: FORGIVENESS...: **"FATHER, FORGIVE THEM FOR THEY KNOW NOT WHAT THEY DO."**

--he wasn't just speaking about the men who crucified him...but to all of us whose sins put him up there...

CONCLUSION: Selfless, Sacrificial, Forgiving Love we are called to show one another... it is **ONLY** then we are True Disciples...

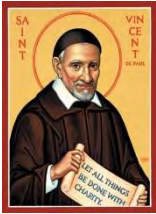
