DEACON'S CORNER



Today's "Stay with us" (See Saint Luke 24:13-35). The disciples on the way to Emaus, although they had not recognized the Lord, pleaded with Him that they would abide with them. Why? A little later on the Gospel tells us: "Were not our hearts burning within us, while He spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" Yes. Jesus opened the Scriptures for them, that is, He explained the Scriptures to them. Here it seems to me that Saint Martin de Porres famous question pertains: "How about you?" Do you take time to read Scripture so that later you can explain it to others, that is, open the Scriptures to them? That's what Jesus did and in so doing He was setting an example for us all. Not only for those who have been ordained and studied at a Seminary, but for all those who claim to be His disciples. Yes, for those who want Jesus to stay with them. Remember: He is risen! He is truly risen! Let us ask him to "stay with us", and at the same time follow His example and be ready to open the Scriptures to others.

Pastor's Message for the Third Sunday of Easter:

On the Road to Emmaus

I.-- You know there are no chance happenings in Life...THERE ARE NO COINCEDENCES IN LIFE (yes: there are tragedies, accidents, acts of nature, hurricanes, earthquakes>>>results of the Physical Order)

--EVERYTHING HAPPENS FOR A REASON (we, in this life, may never know that reason. We have to trust) God is so intrinsically involved in our lives, more than we ever know.

--There are no chance encounters in life:

STORY: A young boy was walking home through the park after attending a Sunday school class. Somehow, he couldn't stop thinking about the lesson for that day about Jesus' teaching on the Last Judgment. What impressed him most was what the teacher said, "When you give something to another person, you're really giving it to Jesus, and you will find the risen Jesus in every one you meet IF YOU REALLY LOOK WITH FAITH." As he continued through the park, he noticed an old woman sitting on a bench. She looked lonely and hungry. So, he sat down next to her, took a chocolate bar he had saved and offered some to her.

--She accepted it with a beautiful smile and he watched her smile as she chewed the chocolate. They sat there and chatted for a while.

--Finally, the boy got up to leave. As he began to walk away, he turned, ran back to the bench, and gave the woman a big hug. --When he arrived home, his mother saw a big smile on his face and asked, "What made you so happy today?" He said, "I shared my chocolate bar with God." Before his mother could ask more questions, he added, "You know, God has the most beautiful smile and is a lot older than I thought."

--Meanwhile, the old woman returned to her little apartment where she lived with her sister. Her sister said, "You're all smiles," "What made you so happy today?"

--She replied, "I was sitting in the park, eating a chocolate bar with Jesus. And, you know, he's a lot younger than I expected."

--POINT: *we will meet and experience the risen Jesus in unexpected places and unexpected ways we just need to be looking.* --Nothing is RANDOM in this life:

II.--The Emmaus story>>>is a story about US; it is the story about of our spiritual pilgrimage>>>and our maturing in faith. Are we attentive to God's closeness in our lives, IF NOT than we MISS OUT.

GOSPEL: 1. It is divided into two parts (as is the mass):

a. Liturgy of the Word b. Liturgy of the Eucharist

A.-- LITURGY OF THE WORD-- the two disciples are walking away from Jerusalem, the center of their faith (Geography and Direction are important in Luke's Gospel)

TO EMMAUS (7 miles away)

--Jesus begins walking with them. Yet they can't recognize him because:

Their faith is not **MATURE** enough to recognize the Risen Christ. (POINT: Do you have the faith to look out at the world and see the signs of new life? Do you see God's presence in the world... do you see how radically close He is to you. Can we look out at the world amidst all the brokenness and evil and see signs of the Risen Christ?)

--IN ADDITION, THEY: are spiritually Impaired (20/20 spiritual sight)

--THEY are **LOST IN THEIR GRIEF** (sadness & preoccupied by empty tomb) at all that has gone on>>>they thought that Jesus was a prophet, messiah, miracle worker, savior.

--As he is speaking to them: their hearts are burning as he explains all of the scripture passages that refer to him as the **Messiah (Lit. of the Word)**

--"Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things."

--Different expectations of the **Messiah**...They were expecting a **Socio-Political Messiah** who is going to restore Israel to its **Glory Days**.

--Jesus wants them to see he is a **Spiritual Messiah**.

--They misunderstand the purpose of Jesus...

POINT FOR US:

--**WHAT EXPECTATIONS DO WE HAVE OF GOD?**

--Do you expect that God is going to save the day and rescue you from: Financial woes, broken marriage, sickness, Darkness, or does he **JOURNEY WITH US COMFORTING US; GIVING STRENGTH WHEN WE NEED IT TO GET US THROUGH?**

CONCLUSION: TO RECOGNIZE THE RISEN CHRIST REQUIRES FAITH.

B,-- LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: "when they arrived at the village where they were going"

--first part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is the OFFERTORY...
THEY OFFER THIS STRANGER HOSPITALITY...

--NB: it is only when we put ourselves out there / extend ourselves / move beyond our comfort zone THAT WE OPEN OURSELVES TO ENCOUNTER CHRIST.

--THEY SAY TO JESUS/STRANGER: STAY WITH US... (Jesus / stranger takes the initiative and walks with them... they RECIPROCATE by saying: STAY WITH US...

--(SAME WITH US: God calls us / we need to reciprocate)

--it is only after they extend hospitality to this stranger and they recline at table with him. This stranger then: TAKES, BLESSES, BREAKS, AND GIVES the bread to them. JESUS IS PRESENT TO THEM IN THE EUCHARIST....

--At that moment they recognize Him and He vanishes.

****CONCLUSION**: What they couldn't recognize with their faith; they were given in the SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST**

****BUT WHAT A MISSED OPPORTUNITY****

--Can you Imagine being in the presence of the RISEN CHRIST (how their hearts were burning) and then NOT REALIZING IT? WHAT A MISSED OPPORTUNITY!

MESSAGE: that our Faith be mature enough that we recognize the RISEN CHRIST IN ALL PEOPLE... when we don't recognize him... WE MISS OUT!

****His coming to them and walking alongside of them illustrates the road to Emmaus is a road of companionship with Jesus who desires to walk with each of us.**

-- "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). Jesus is with us even when we do not recognize him.

--No matter what happens in life, the Risen Jesus is always with us.

-- As Francis Thompson puts it, He is the *Hound of Heaven* who relentlessly follows us when we try to escape from His love.

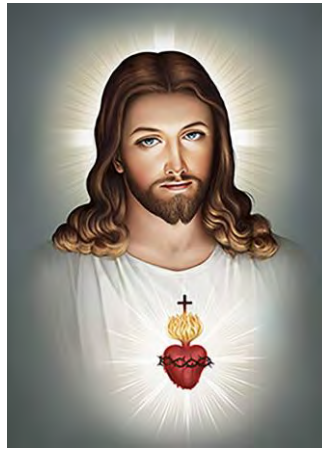

The Road to Emmaus

Jesus appeared to two of His followers on the road to Emmaus, but they did not recognize Him until He broke bread with them.

Luke 24:13-35

"Two of Jesus's disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus and they were conversing . . . "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over. So, He went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while He was with them at Table, He took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized Him, but He vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way and opened the Scripture to us?" So, they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread."

BABY'S LIFE BEFORE BIRTH

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
