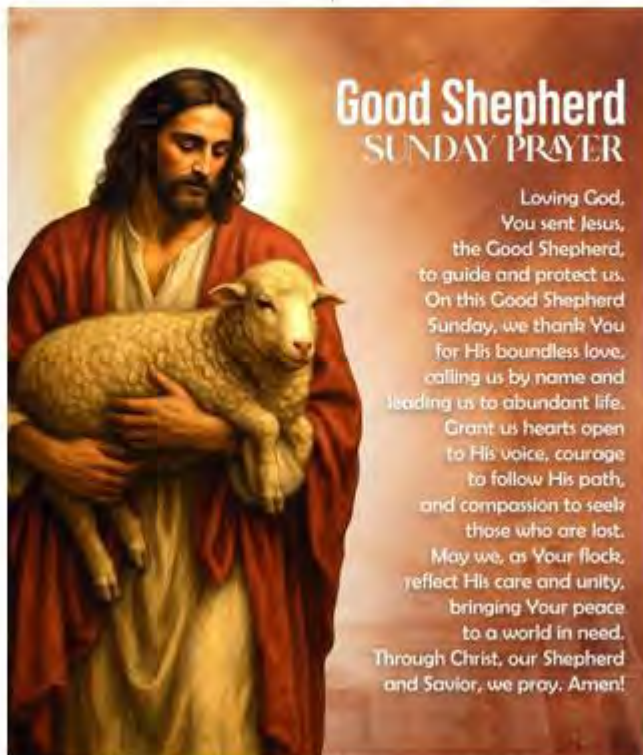

DEACON'S CORNER



The relationship between the sheep and their shepherd is based on familiarity. Sheep recognize their shepherd and will not follow a stranger. At the end of the day, shepherds lead their sheep from pastures to a common gated area called a sheepfold. There, one shepherd protects all of the sheep until the next day when each shepherd returns to lead his own sheep to pasture. As

shepherds move among the sheep, the sheep follow only their shepherd.

Today's Gospel also gives us the opportunity to reflect on Christian leadership. Jesus' words suggest to us that those who will lead the Christian community will be known by their faithfulness to Jesus. The leaders will recognize that Jesus is the gate for all of the sheep and that having a good relationship with Jesus is the primary characteristic of a Christian leader. Jesus' allegory also suggests that faithful Christian leadership requires a good relationship with the community: the shepherd knows his sheep, and they know him. Christian leaders follow the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, by being faithful to him and by being a good shepherd.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

La relación entre las ovejas y su pastor se basa en la familiaridad. Las ovejas reconocen a su pastor y no seguirán a un extraño. Al final del día, los pastores conducen a sus ovejas desde los pastizales hacia un recinto común y cerrado, llamado redil. Allí, un solo pastor protege a todas las ovejas hasta el día siguiente, cuando cada pastor regresa para guiar a sus propias ovejas hacia el pastizal. A medida que los pastores se mueven entre las ovejas, estas siguen únicamente a su propio pastor.

El Evangelio de hoy nos brinda también la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre el liderazgo cristiano. Las palabras de Jesús nos sugieren que aquellos que guíen a la comunidad cristiana serán reconocidos por su fidelidad a Él. Los líderes reconocerán que Jesús es la puerta para todas las ovejas y que mantener una buena relación con Jesús constituye la característica primordial de un líder cristiano. La alegoría de Jesús sugiere, asimismo, que un liderazgo cristiano fiel exige una buena relación con la comunidad: el pastor conoce a sus ovejas, y ellas lo conocen a él. Los líderes cristianos siguen el ejemplo de Jesús, el Buen Pastor, mostrándose fieles a Él y ejerciendo ellos mismos como buenos pastores.

Pastor's Message Fourth Sunday of Easter 2026

Good Shepherd

I.-- A person that comes to mind a lot these days is my Mom. She passed away in the year 2006 after a 10-year struggle with cancer. Of the many things that I remember about her is her voice, growing up in the 70's she would sing along to Helen Reddy, Barbara Streisand, Bet Midler. She had a nice voice but especially what her voice represented: safety, security, home.

--One time we, my brother Herb and I, went shopping with her at TSS (Time Square Stores). I somehow became separated from her and my brother. I was about 6 or 7 years old. I was lost long enough for panic to set in. An employee saw my panic. Soon enough over the loudspeaker of the store came: Attention: Anne Nowak you can find your lost son Christopher at the courtesy desk. I I heard her voice calling out: Chris, Chris, Chris! As soon as I heard her beautiful voice, I knew all was going to be ok, no more panic, no more worry. Her voice represented security, safety, and of being home.

II.-- I somehow think that Mary Magdalene, who was at the foot of the cross and watched her Lord, Savior, her friend, die on the cross. On the morning of the resurrection, she goes to the tomb. With tears in her eyes, she thinks that it is the Gardener who is standing behind her. Jesus calls her name: MARY! The sound of his voice takes away all her fears and all of her tears and gives her a sense: security , a sense of safety, a sense of being home.

III.-- When sheep hear their Shepherd's voice, they get sense of: security, of safety. This is why Jesus used this Metaphor to capture our connectedness to him. He is our shepherd: he feeds us in the Eucharist, cares for us, loves us, protects us, guides us.

--it's a metaphor that captures an intimate connection with him.

--Sheep are defenseless animals, very near sighted, cannot live alone they have to be in a herd, constantly need guidance and protection.

--Sheep used for their wool and not consumption live many years. A shepherd would have a name for each sheep and know their different qualities.

--A bond would develop between the sheep and Shepherd. If several Shepherds combined their herds at a water source, all the shepherd had to do was speak. His herd would recognize his voice and follow him.

IV.-- In this the fourth Sunday of Easter, in the Gospel readings, we move from the resurrection appearance and the theme of **RECOGNIZING** the risen Christ **TO USING METAPHORES TO CAPTURE CHRIST'S RADICAL CLOSENESS TO US.**

****In using the Shepherd metaphor people in our Lord's time could identify with the degree of closeness and connectedness between the two.**

--Shepherds who owned their herd and were not for hire would risk their lives protecting their herd.

--Shepherd would lay down at the entrance of the sheep pen at night. There was no gate **THE SHEPHERD WAS THE GATE.** This is what it means when it says: The Shepherd lays down his life for his sheep...

V.-- Pope Francis wanted his priests to smell like their sheep. This entails journeying with people who are struggling, sick, dying, in great need.

--Offering them courage and strength, hope, and the sacraments. We are not problem solvers, we journey with our people (examples: Martha and Mary, Emmaus Story).

--We help them turn to and listen with their hearts and souls to the voice of the Good Shepherd. A voice of security, safety, of being home and Salvation.

--The best thing we can do is encourage people to be attentive to the voice of the Good Shepherd who wipes away all our tears and takes away all our fears.

VI.-- Story: Psalm 23 At a family gathering at the beginning of a/ WAKE SERVICE. A great-grandchild stands up to recite Psalm 23 from memory. He does an excellent job. Everyone applauded when he finished.

--At the end of the wake service, the great-grandfather, the oldest member of the family, the PATRIARCH, stands and goes near the casket of his wife, with tears in his eyes, stammering voice recites Psalm 23. At the end there is utter silence.

--People commented to each other: the boy knew the words to the Psalm. The old man intimately knows the Good Shepherd.

CONCLUSION: During this Easter Season as an Easter people, we need to be looking for signs of new life all around us. But especially we need to open our hearts and souls and listen to the voice of our Good Shepherd, a voice of safety, a voice of security, a voice of being home with our Lord.

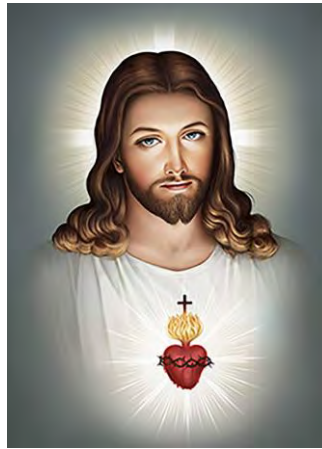
