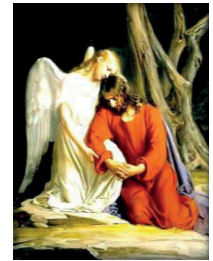

DEACON'S CORNER



Throughout our lives, if we were raised Catholic, we were taught reverence for the Eucharist. But “reverence” is not enough. Most Catholics reverence the Eucharist, meaning, we genuflect, kneel, and treat the Sacred Host with respect. But it’s important to ponder a question in your heart. Do you believe the Eucharist is God Almighty, the Savior of the world, the second Person of the Most Holy Trinity? Do you believe deeply enough to have your heart moved with love and profound devotion every time you are before

our divine Lord present before us under the veil of the Eucharist? When you kneel do you fall down prostrate in your heart, loving God with your whole being? *(See Saint John 6:51-58)*

Perhaps this sounds like it’s a bit excessive. Perhaps simple reverence and respect is enough for you. But it’s not. Since the Eucharist is God Almighty, we must see Him there with the eyes of faith in our soul. We must profoundly adore Him as the angels do in Heaven. We must cry out, “Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord God Almighty.” We must be moved to the deepest of worship as we enter into His divine presence.

Ponder the depth of your faith in the Eucharist today and strive to renew it, worshipping God as one who believes with your whole being.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

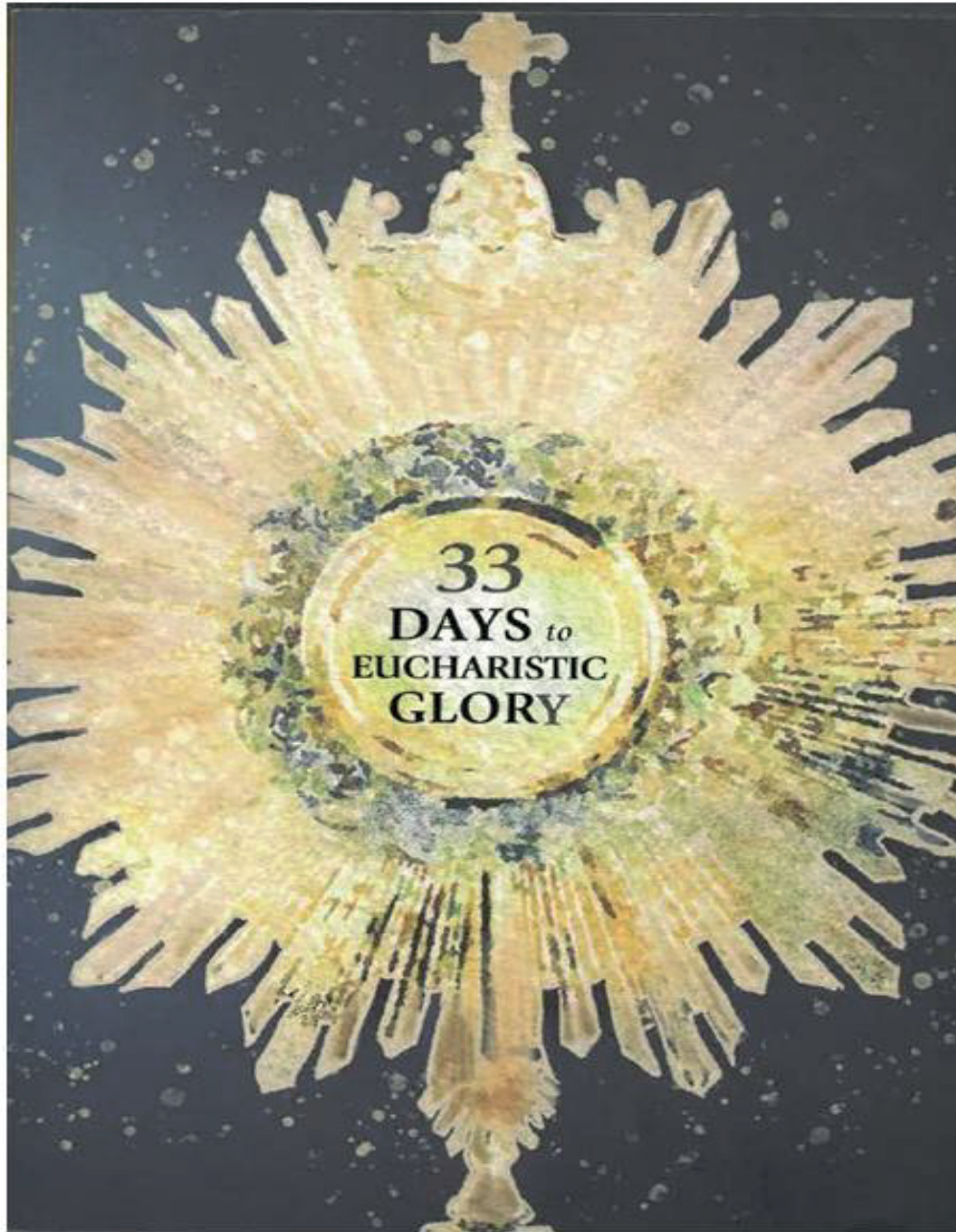
A lo largo de nuestra vida, si fuimos criados en la fe católica, se nos enseñó a tener reverencia por la Eucaristía. Pero la «reverencia» no es suficiente. La mayoría de los católicos reverencian la Eucaristía; es decir, hacemos la genuflexión, nos arrodillamos y tratamos la Sagrada Hostia con respeto. Sin embargo, es importante reflexionar sobre una pregunta en lo más hondo de nuestro corazón: ¿Crees que la Eucaristía es Dios Todopoderoso, el Salvador del mundo, la segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad? ¿Crees con la suficiente profundidad como para que tu corazón se conmueva de amor y profunda devoción cada vez que te encuentras ante nuestro divino Señor, presente ante nosotros bajo el velo de la Eucaristía? Cuando te arrodillas, ¿te postras también en tu corazón, amando a Dios con todo tu ser? *(Véase San Juan 6, 51-58)*

Quizás esto suene un tanto excesivo. Quizás la simple reverencia y el respeto te parezcan suficientes. Pero no lo son. Dado que la Eucaristía es Dios Todopoderoso, debemos contemplarlo allí con los ojos de la fe en nuestra alma. Debemos adorarlo profundamente, tal como lo hacen los ángeles en el Cielo. Debemos exclamar: «Santo, Santo, Santo es el Señor, Dios Todopoderoso». Debemos sentirnos impulsados a la más profunda adoración al entrar en su divina presencia.

Reflexiona hoy sobre la profundidad de tu fe en la Eucaristía y esfuérate por renovarla, adorando a Dios como quien cree con todo su ser.

Pastor's Message: The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

(Corpus Christi)

We just celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. God is a community of three persons one God. We as human beings need to be part of a community to challenge us and make us move along the journey of conversion. The community that forms around our Lord's altar is that very community.

We are all familiar with the phrase: "We are what we eat." With so much attention given to nutrition over the past several decades, there is a great truth. We are made up of the nutrients we consume. Well, we as Catholics do truly believe this. In saying amen and receiving the Eucharist, the body and blood of Christ we are saying in effect we will become what we consume over time: the real presence of the body of Christ.

We are especially reminded of this on this Feast of Corpus Christie. However frequent reception of the Eucharist was not always prevalent in the Church. In the middle ages (1200) the laity communed with their eyes by gazing upon the consecrated host in the monstrance. The monstrance would be processed around through the church and the streets so people could gaze upon the body of Christ. Reception from the chalice and in the hands are post Vat II developments. It was Pius X who advocated for frequent communion.

Today's Solemnity reminds us that the Eucharist is first and foremost a sacrifice. Our Lord celebrated the Jewish Passover Feast with his Apostles commemorating the Exodus event. This meal recalled the sacrifice of a one-year-old lamb, the blood painted on the door posts, the blessing and passing of the unleavened bread, the passing of the 4 cups of wine and blessing over the 3rd cup. This meal recalled the Israelites years in slavery and how Yahweh led them to freedom.

Our Lord took the Jewish Passover Feast and changed it into his Last Supper, the Eucharist, in which HE IS NOW THE SACRIFICE, IT IS HIS BLOOD Poured OUT FOR THE SINS FOR THE MANY. This is why Holy Thursday and Good Friday are really one continuous event.

(based on a Sermon from St. Augustine) At mass, to have a Sacrifice, you have to have an: Offering—this is why in the offertory we offer the BREAD AND WINE—which is not just bread and wine.

Those gifts represent the: JOYS, SORROWS, SUFFERING, TEARS, EFFORTS and

WORK of the gathered community.

When we gather together as God's family here at mass; we bring our complete selves here to mass. Many of us have suffered or are enduring great anguish and suffering. Many of us have also experienced great joy and wonder in this life. All of who we are, we bring to mass.

Each of us represents an individual stalk of wheat standing straight and tall. That stalk of wheat is cut down, the chaff is separated, it is grinded to a powder; mixed with water and salt; from this mixture a dough forms; that dough is then put into an oven; and after enduring such extreme temperatures of heat>>>that dough is transformed into bread>>>bread that is freely offered>>>blessed>>>and consecrated into the body of our Lord.

--How many of you have been cut down in the prime of your life by a heart attack or cancer or some other tragedy or illness. How many of you have endured great suffering and tragedy in your lives: death from the virus, chemotherapy, loss of a loved one, failure of a marriage or death of a loved one>>>this is the cross/the heat of the oven that transforms us into the Bread>>>the Bread that is offered up and consecrated into the Body of Christ.

--Notice where the wine and the bread//the gifts come from, they come from the Body of Christ the gathered community. When we gather around our Lord's table; we offer our very lives (our sufferings, joys, pains) that are represented by the gifts of the bread and wine.

Our Lord receives these gifts we offer: he receives our suffering and agony in the form of the gifts of bread and wine; and he transforms them into his body and blood. So that the Body of Christ who is gathered around the altar is now ON The Altar in the consecrated bread and wine//THE REAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST>>>his body and blood.>>>Each of us receives a piece of our Lord's body and drinks his blood (well maybe in the future) and we return to our seats.

--NOW WHERE IS THE Eucharist? It is no longer on the altar. We have consumed the body and blood of Christ. What is left of the consecrated body is placed in REPOSE to bring to the sick who cannot be here at mass.

AND SO, The body of Christ is now IN US sitting around the altar.>>>THE GATHERED COMMUNITY IS NOW THE BODY OF CHRIST. We are the living bread/body of Christ when we leave this mass

The Eucharist is also the Sacrament of Unity: We start with ONE BREAD and ONE CUP—it is divided and consumed by all present—The body of Christ which was now on the Altar is now seated in the PEWS—the community is the Body of Christ

This is why if you have a GRIEVANCE OR PROBLEM WITH YOUR "BROTHER"—as Jesus tells us—to leave your gift at the altar—be reconciled with your brother/sister and then come and make your offering—receive the Eucharist. It is a SIN AGAINST THE UNITY OF THE SACRAMENT

When we say AMEN! when consuming the Eucharist We are Saying 3 things:

First, I BELIEVE WHAT LOOKS LIKE BREAD, SMELLS LIKE BREAD, TASTES LIKE BREAD, IS THE BODY AND BLOOD OF MY LORD. His real presence: SUBSTANCE/ACCIDENTS

Secondly, I am going to allow that real presence of Christ to change and transform me. THAT I WILL ACTUALLY BECOME WHAT I AM CONSUMING: THE BODY OF CHRIST—this is why we believe as Catholics: that we are what we eat.

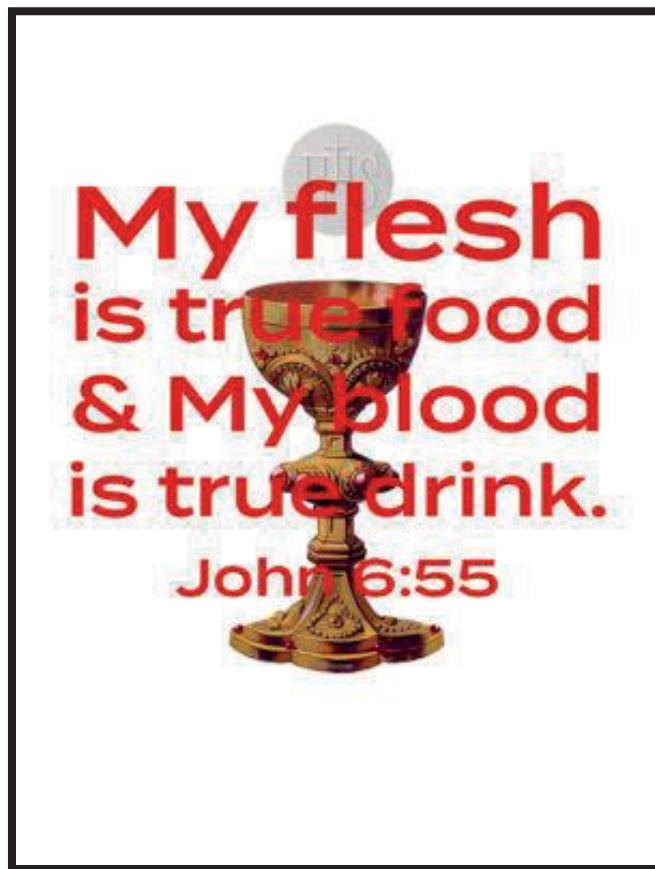
The THIRD AND LAST PART OF THAT AMEN: in being transformed we: BECOME THE HANDS AND FEET OF OUR LORD & WASH THE FEET OF ONE ANOTHER IN SELFLESS SERVICE... Jesus' example at the Last Supper.

CONCLUSION: Original Sin entered the world through an act of eating (biting the Apple). It is interesting then that our Salvation is brought about or effected by an ACT OF EATING: CONSUMING THE EUCHARIST. JESUS SAYS: Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood you will not have life within you. We as Catholics believe that we are/become what we eat, the body of Christ.

“MY FLESH IS TRUE FOOD, AND MY BLOOD IS TRUE DRINK.”

Jesus said to the crowd: “I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, “how can this man give us his flesh to eat?” Jesus said to them, “Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink.

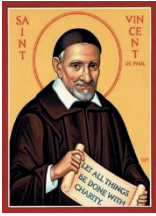



BABY'S LIFE BEFORE BIRTH

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
- ♥ My brain waves can be detected as early as 43 days.
- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.

- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
- ♥ By the 11th and 12th weeks I am moving my arms and legs, sucking my thumb and breathing amniotic fluid. All my systems are working.
- ♥ My movements by 16 weeks are quite active and I can be seen performing somersaults on ultrasound but am not yet felt by my mother.
- ♥ From the 3rd month on nothing new develops. I continue to grow in size and by 20 weeks I have hair on my head, weigh 1 pound and am 12 inches tall.
