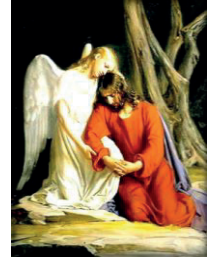

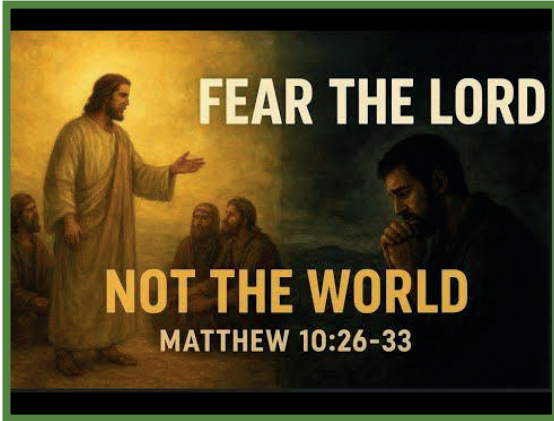

DEACON'S CORNER



This section of Matthew's Gospel should be read in the context of Matthew's intended audience, a Jewish-Christian community. The Gospel alludes to the dangers and persecutions that this community has most likely already faced and will continue to face. To reassure this community, Matthew recalls for them the encouraging words of Jesus that we read today. *See Saint Matthew 10:36-33.*

In this Gospel passage, Jesus might be understood as putting suffering in perspective. The disciples of Jesus are called upon to keep their focus on God.

Those who can harm the body do not have ultimate power; God does. Still persecution and suffering cannot be avoided or prevented. But Jesus reassures his disciples that God knows and cares about what happens to his children.

We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavor to live a Christian life. Sometimes we let the opinions of others prevent us from doing what we know to be right. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us.

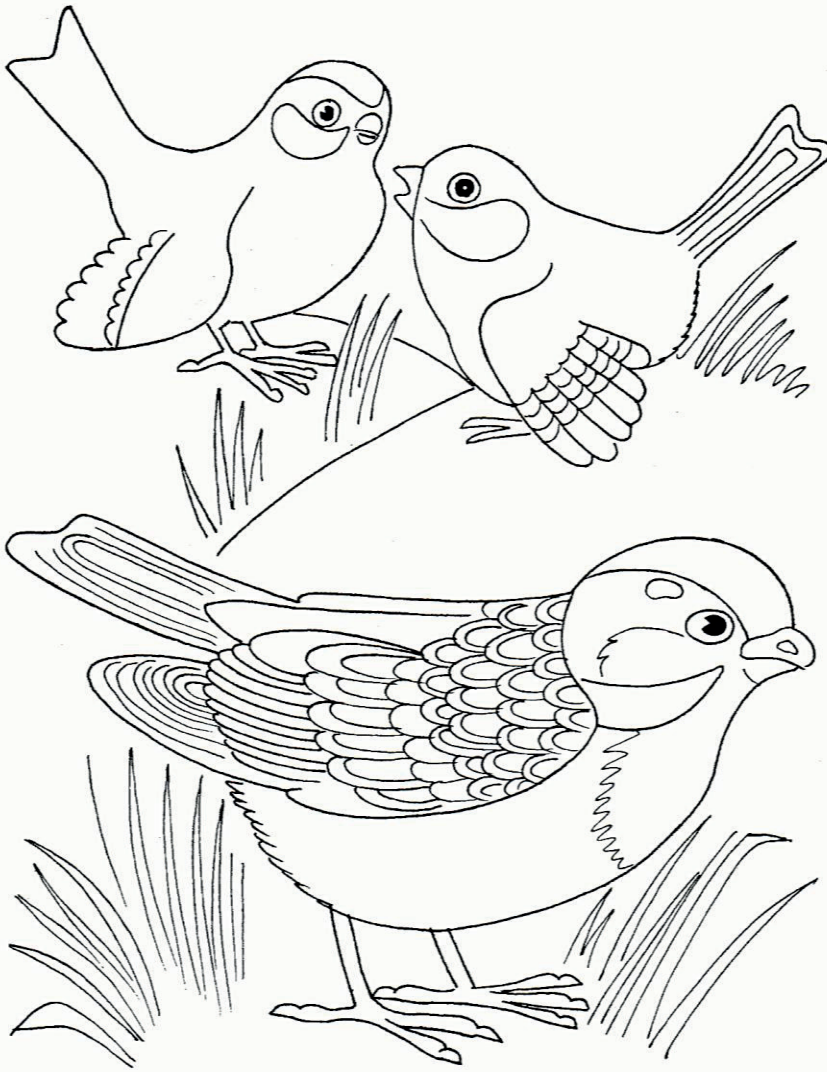
EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

Esta sección del Evangelio de Mateo debe leerse teniendo en cuenta a los destinatarios originales de la obra: una comunidad judeocristiana. El Evangelio alude a los peligros y persecuciones que, muy probablemente, esta comunidad ya había afrontado y seguiría afrontando. Para reconfortarla, Mateo les recuerda las palabras alentadoras de Jesús que leemos hoy. *Véase San Mateo 10:26-33.*

En este pasaje evangélico, se puede entender que Jesús sitúa el sufrimiento en su justa perspectiva. Se llama a los discípulos de Jesús a mantener la mirada puesta en Dios. Quienes pueden dañar el cuerpo no poseen el poder definitivo; ese poder pertenece a Dios. Aun así, la persecución y el sufrimiento son inevitables. Sin embargo, Jesús asegura a sus discípulos que Dios conoce lo que les sucede a sus hijos y se preocupa por ellos.

Quizás no afrontemos el mismo tipo de persecución, pero sí experimentamos dificultades al tratar de vivir una vida cristiana. A veces permitimos que las opiniones de los demás nos impidan hacer lo que sabemos que es correcto. Necesitamos recordar que lo que Dios piensa de nosotros es más importante. Nos reconforta la promesa de que Dios cuida de nosotros y nos protege..

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) narrative 2023

"The only thing we have to fear, is fear itself"

I. -- THE ROOT OF ALL FEAR: is the fear of losing something or someone. You can lose your job, a child, family, house, money, health and even life itself. Loss is the basis of our fear. However, we forget one thing: whatever trouble or crisis affects us, we know that God understands it better than we ourselves. Our heavenly Father knows ALL THAT IS GOING ON. What a comfort to know that God is on our side; that our life is in the hands of a loving God.

The next time fear grips our life we need to remember that being faithful to Christ is much more important than our fear of loss. We hear the words: "Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." The last verse of Psalm 27 sums it up nicely, "Trust in the Lord. Have faith, do not despair. Trust in the Lord."

A. -- The year was 1933, the U.S. was deep in the midst of the Depression, there was double digit unemployment, there was rampant poverty throughout the country-- many Americans were starving and were in a state of pervasive hopelessness and despair. FEAR was the rule of the day.

FDR, a relatively unknown candidate, is elected president and would put into place a 5-year plan; the New Deal that would lift the country out of the Depression and restore HOPE. In his Presidential inaugural address he would utter, some of the most memorable words ever spoken in a public address: words that also capture the message in today's first reading and the Gospel: THE ONLY THING WE HAVE TO FEAR: IS FEAR IT SELF.

Let's face it THERE COULD BE A LOT TO BE AFRAID OF: another act of terrorism, a missile reaching from North Korea to the United States, Global Warming, someone losing their job, a random act of violence, getting sick and losing our health, getting into an accident. --there is so much we could be afraid of. Today's readings BID US TO NOT BE AFRAID AND ENCOURAGE us to remain hopeful: Our Lord uses the example of Sparrows, small birds that congregate in groups and make nests, they were common in the Holy Land in our Lord's time. People trapped them and sold them. They were very cheap, but they yielded very little meat for eating. However, poor people bought sparrows to eat and also to offer as a sacrifice in the Temple.

The point of our Lord's saying about sparrows is that these birds were among the most insignificant creatures you could imagine.

Today's Gospel from Matthew 10 comes from the near end of Jesus' instruction to his disciples as he sends them forth to carry on his mission of preaching and healing. He asks them to live simply and to expect opposition. Our Lord holds up the SPARROW to reinforce the disciples' TRUST AND HOPE IN GOD.

Our Lord tells them to FEAR NO ONE. (the only thing you have to fear is fear itself). He warns them of the dangers they will face. But he tells them that if God cares about one of these insignificant sparrows and knows when they hit the ground--how much more will he care for us. We are worth more than a sparrow, and so we can trust God to love us and care for us. In this way the tiny sparrow becomes an image of hope.

When we become fearful, confused, frustrated--we may find clarity and hope in this image: if God cares for such a tiny insignificant bird--how much more will he care for us and want what is good for us.

II.-- One of the ways we can overcome fear: **HAVING A META-NARRATIVE...** having a **BIG STORY, SEEING THE BIG PICTURE** that gives one perspective beyond the **FEARS, UPS AND DOWNS IN LIFE.**

People, who when everything (health, family, relationships) goes well...they are Happy, when things go wrong, fall apart... they become afraid, and upset. When we have a Meta-Narrative: it keeps things in perspective by seeing the Big Picture.

People who have a meta narrative can say: I've faced many of these same problems / difficulties / situations before and I got through them... I don't have to be afraid. **NOTHING IS GOING TO SEPARATE ME FROM GOD'S LOVE.** This is what our Lord meant when he said: "the peace that the world can give us." It is a peace that is fragile, inadequate, and **CONTINGENT ON THINGS.** It is fragile because it is predicated on feeling: healthy, loved, secure... **WHICH CAN ALL CHANGE IN AN INSTANT. WE CAN LOSE ANY OF THESE IN AN INSTANT** for an example a visit to M.D. loss of job, chest pain, etc.

****What Jesus offers is a peace that is not fragile, that does not depend upon feeling healthy, secure, and loved in this world. What is this peace? At the last supper, Jesus offered us his gift of peace. And what is this? It is the absolute assurance THAT We are unconditionally loved BY GOD... and nothing can change that. The ending of the story has already been written: AND IT'S A HAPPY ENDING...to be human means to suffer difficulties and tragedies in life... BUT OUR ENDING HAS ALREADY BEEN WRITTEN BY GOD.**

This is the Peace of Jesus Christ that is **NOT** contingent on anything but is **PEACE** that comes from the Knowledge (and Experience) that God is always there

for us and loves us unconditionally. The Peace of the world is fleeting; The Peace of Christ is pervasive and everlasting.

Julian of Norwich says, all will be well, and all will be well, and every manner of being will be well.

III.-- The same is true for JEREMIAH in the First Reading. Jeremiah was the reluctant prophet, He was kind of known as the whiny prophet, yet he was faithful to Yahweh's call to be a prophet and suffered for it. We hear the words: But the Lord is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph. In their failure they will be put to shame... Praise the Lord, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked.

--IN OTHER WORDS: the only thing you have to fear, is fear itself-- God is on your side so remain hopeful.

IV. The Second Reading from Paul's letter to the Romans, chapter 5, is one of the foundational texts for the Doctrine of Original Sin. The Sin of Adam is passed on from Generation to generation, it is because of O.S. Death entered the world. Baptism is the remedy to O.S. after Baptism; Death becomes REBIRTH INTO NEW LIFE. Before O.S. people just existed in the Garden of Eden = Heaven. After O.S. and baptism which washes away O.S... Death becomes Rebirth into new life.

The remedy to sin and death is Jesus Christ AND BAPTISM: the First Adam sinned but Jesus Christ—the NEW ADAM remained sinless.

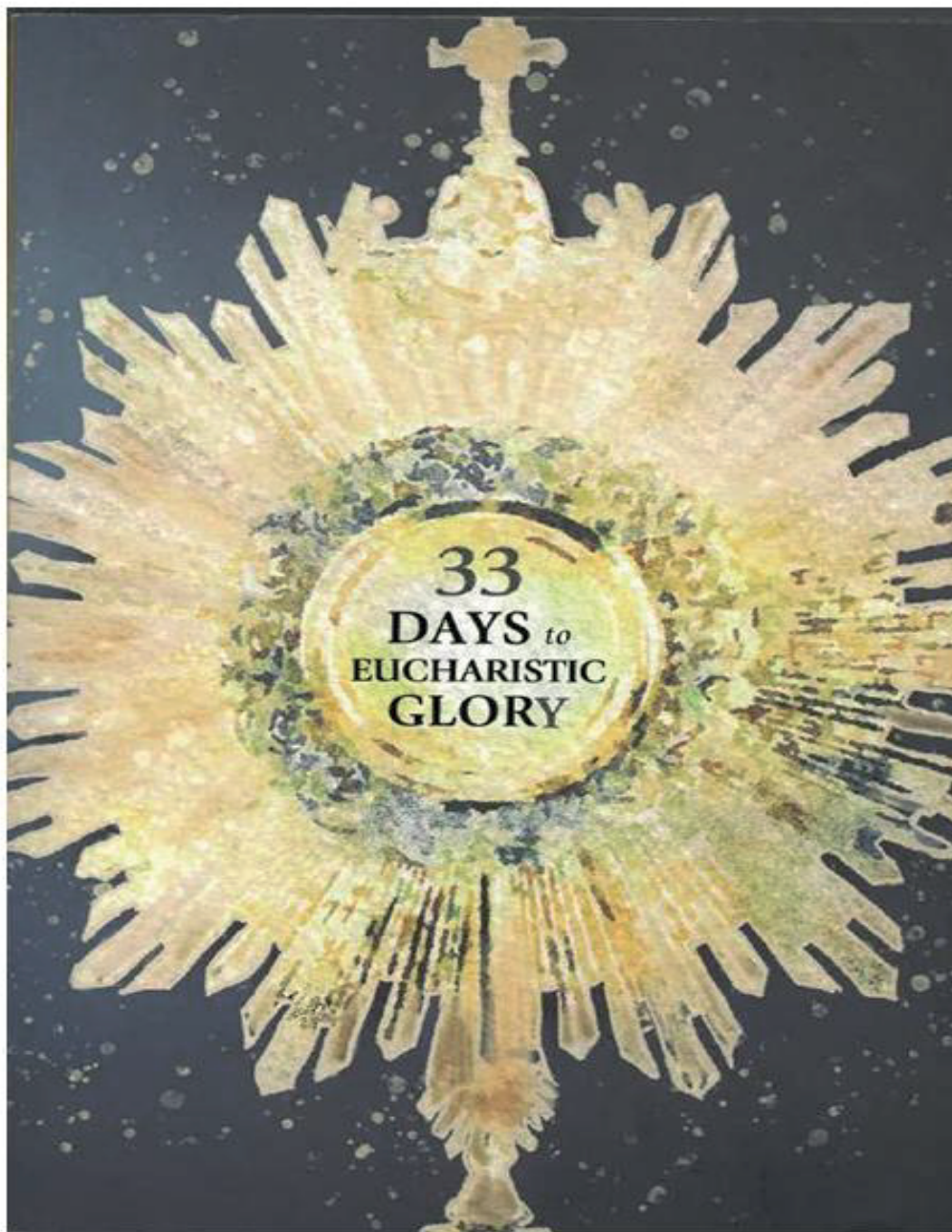
--JUST TO BE AWARE: THE BOOK OF GENESIS WAS WRITTEN: To explain why there is so much suffering and misery in the world... there had to be some kind of DISOBEDIENCE ON THE PART OF HUMANITY.

V.-- Conclusion: God tells us to be hopeful—that he is our Hope—that the only thing we have to fear is fear itself. --We may face suffering--we have to keep in mind the to be human is to suffer at times--not that God wills suffering—but it's just part of the human condition.

--You also may be called to suffer for spreading the Gospel—think of the grief you get when you tell your children and grandchildren to go to mass or receive the sacraments

--It is here our Lord tells us to remain hopeful—that he is near to us—that we are worth so much more than a sparrow--that the only thing we have to fear is fear itself.

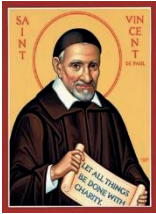

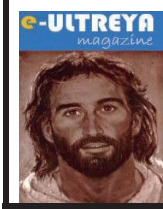
