DEACON'S CORNER

Matthew 10:37

"He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me."

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." (See Saint Matthew 10:37-42) What is Jesus saying here? He is certainly not telling His disciples to go against the commandment to love neighbor as yourself. Neither is He telling them to break the fourth commandment: "Honor your father and your mother." To understand His words,

we must find in the context the reason for the words. Jesus is telling His disciples that they were going to be persecuted, that in some cases, unless they were willing to stop being His disciples, their parents, their siblings and even their children were going to throw them out of their homes and refuse to accept them as family members any longer. What were they supposed to do? Who were they to love more Jesus, or their family? Do not lose heart, because as Jesus goes on to say, "whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

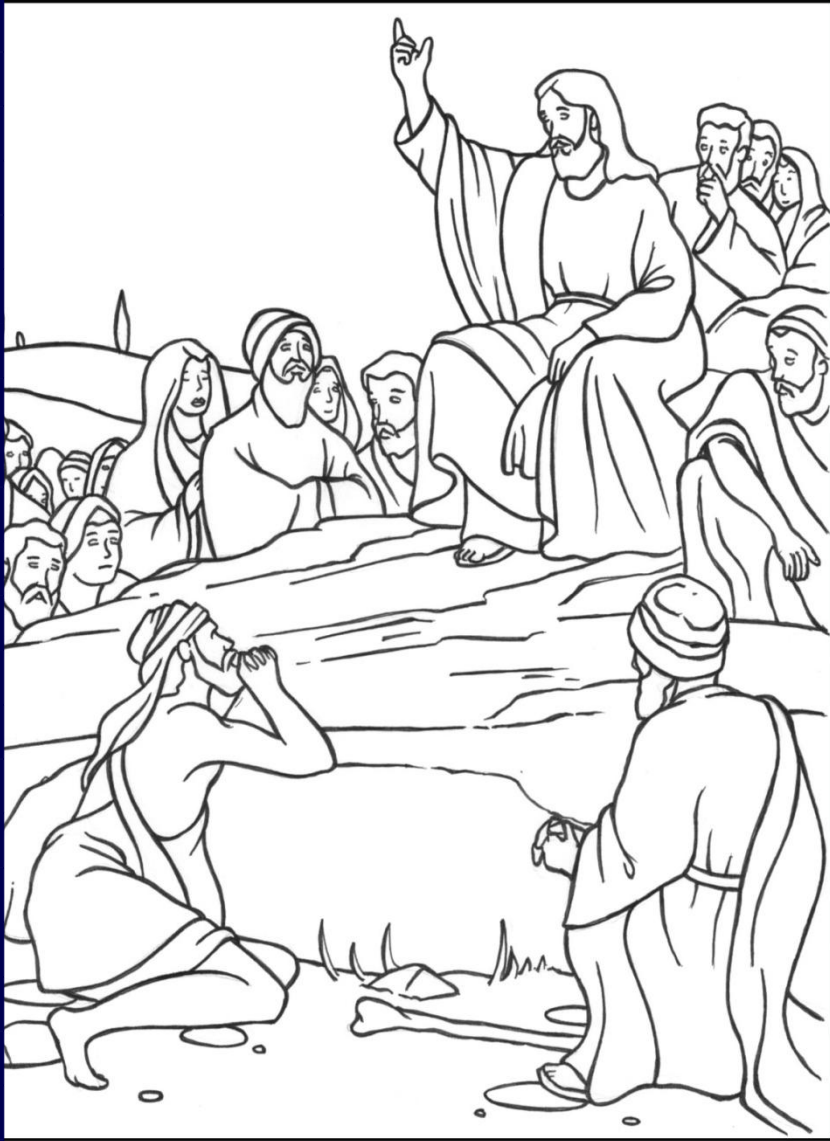

Homily: 13th Sunday OT A 2026

The way we treat others is the way we treat Jesus Christ himself.

Introduction: Hospitality is the principal theme this Sunday. The way we welcome and are hospitable to others is the way we welcome and treat Jesus Christ himself.

Some of you have been to the Amish Country in Pennsylvania. Many of the homes / storefront have a sign that reads: "Welcome! There are no strangers here, only friends that haven't yet met."

In the first reading: we see, in Elisha's welcome by a childless woman and her husband who lived in Shunem. The woman recognized the holiness of Elisha. She showed him reverence and hospitality by inviting him to dine with her and her husband and by setting aside and furnishing an upper room of her house for the prophet to occupy whenever he should come to town. In grateful response, Elisha promised her, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son." The promise was fulfilled by God.

The second reading, taken from Paul's letter to the Romans, reminds the Roman Christians, and us, that by Baptism we have been baptized into Jesus' death, buried with him, and now look forward to resurrection with him (Rom 6:5) Thus, since those who care for the followers of Jesus are caring for Jesus himself.

Today's Gospel concludes Jesus' great "missionary discourse" in which he instructs his twelve disciples on the cost and the commitment required of being a disciple.

Gospel says: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me." These words may sound a bit extreme, since family comes first. 1) What Jesus means is that all loyalties must give place to loyalty to God. We must always put God first; but sometimes other family members may have different values.

All those who become followers of Jesus belong to a new family/ a Spiritual Family. It is a family where every single person, including relatives, friends and even strangers, are truly my brothers and sisters. We become part of a larger family who share and live the values of the K of G. In these verses and many others our Lord is establishing his church, our spiritual family. We have our biological family and our spiritual family. If they are the same people that is great. But many times they are not. Often times members of our biological family (parents, brothers, sisters) choose to not embrace and live the values of our Lord.

For example: in ancient times in a family of 6 people... Three accept the faith in Christ and live according to the Gospel and three remain pagan or Jewish. This could result in a huge division in values and cause division in the family. This what our Lord meant when he said, "Whoever love Father or Mother more than me is not worthy of me. The converts would have to put Jesus and the values of the Kingdom of God first in everything even beyond love for their father and mother.

By virtue of our faith, we as believers have more in common (and spend more time together eg. Mass, prayer, etc... and have the same values) than do many members of our own biological family. The worshipping community is our spiritual family, and we have many of the same values. If members of our biological family are members of our spiritual family, the church, that would be great. But oftentimes it is not the case. We love our parents and family members, but their values may not be the values of the Kingdom of God.

STORY: I was with some friends and accompanied them to dinner and a Broadway play many years ago. It was January and freezing cold in the city. As we were walking and turned the corner to enter the restaurant we literally had to step over a homeless person lying on the pavement to enter the restaurant. As we sat down and began to warm up in the ambiance of the restaurant and were handed the menus. Someone said, "Does anyone find it disturbing that we just had to step over a human being to enter this fine five star restaurant? We should do something. The responses that followed reflected the values of each person. Several said the person is probably a drinker and passed out on the sidewalk. Just let them be. Others said not to give the person money because they are probably just lazy and unemployed. Someone said sarcastically, "Lets invite them to sit down to dinner with us." Two people of the party of ten decided to go out to the person to at least see if they are ok. They went to a nearby deli and got them some food. The entire dinner conversation was very animated and heated and reflected and also rejected the values of our Lord and his kingdom. The family was very divided on the response that was taken.

This story is a powerful example of how even members of our own biological family don't embrace and live the values of our Lord. We must love our Lord first and put him first even beyond our mother and father if they don't share the values of our Lord.

This story reflects Hebrews 13:2 "Do not neglect to entertain (show hospitality, charity) to strangers; because in thus doing you have unknowingly entertained (showed hospitality, charity) to angels (emissaries of our Lord). In other words: to show charity to a stranger is to show charity to our Lord.

The main paradox of the Christian life is that we must lose life in order to find Life, and we must die to ourselves in order to rise again. ("Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."). We live in a world where "finding their lives" is the paramount ambition of the majority of people. But Jesus tells us very clearly that this should not be our main concern.

When it says : to "lose one's life," this means that we live for others and not ourselves. EXAMPLE: Mom and Dad of a family live your life for your children. This takes place when we lose ourselves in caring for others, when we put the needs of others before our own. Saint Mother Theresa was fond of saying that when she cared for the poor and homeless she completely forgot about her own needs (hunger, rest, etc.)

Hospitality: was of paramount importance in the ancient world: To receive a stranger at your door was to receive Christ himself. Hospitality is legislated in the TORAH: if someone knocked on your door 1) owner of household: give them an embrace 2) wash their feet 3) pinch of aromatic oil on their head 4) offer them a meal **The basis of all hospitality is that we all belong to God's family, and that every person is our brother or sister.

In ancient times, hospitality was considered a sacred duty and in Scripture the patriarchs are cited as models of this virtue (Genesis 19:2; 24:17-33; 43:24). A visit of Yahweh to Abraham (Genesis 18:2-8); Abraham and Sarah's generous welcome of their guests was rewarded with the promise of a son. Hospitality was to be valued as a work of mercy as well as a means of witnessing to the Faith. The visitor who traveled through and requested assistance (Proverbs 27:8, Sirach 29:21-27) was to be regarded as a living reminder of Israel's former struggle as enslaved strangers in Egypt (Leviticus 19:33-34).

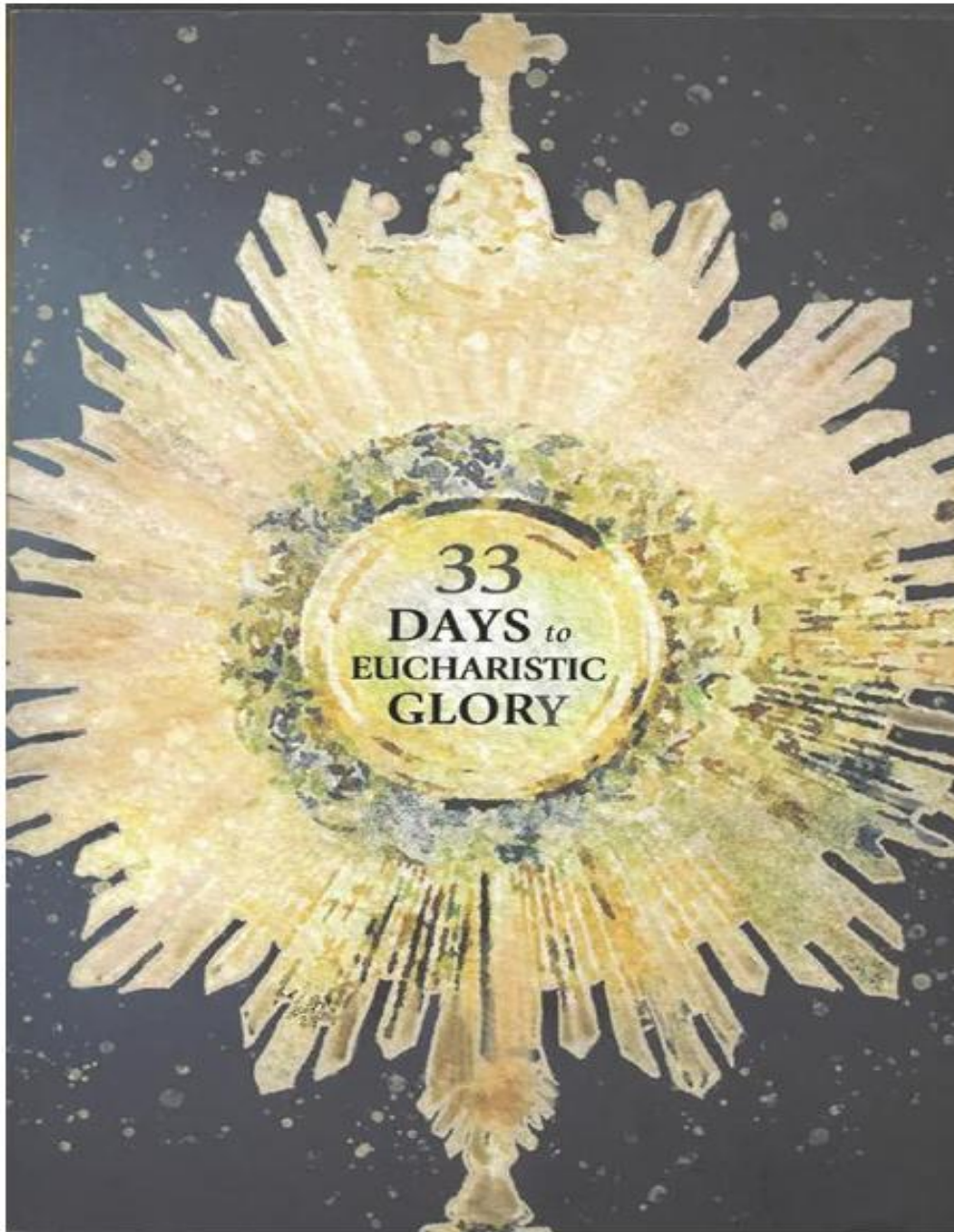
**Had you ever noticed the number of flat-out contradictions in scripture? For example,

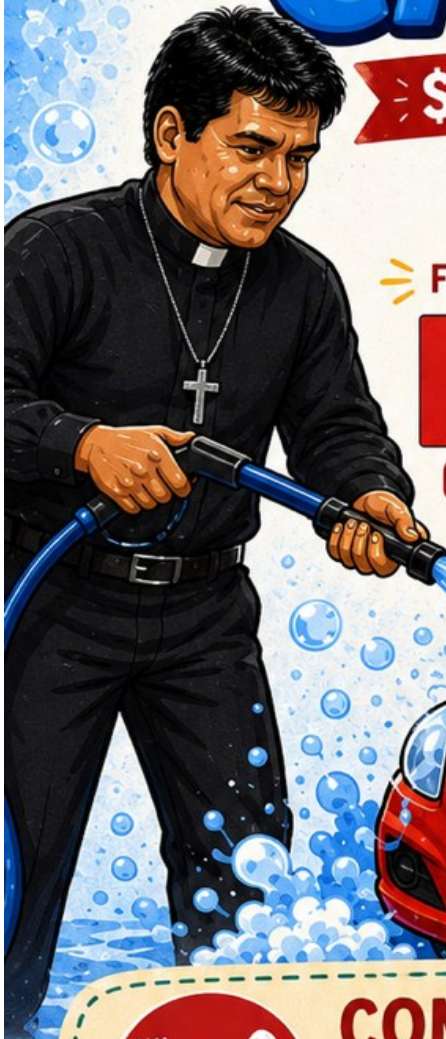

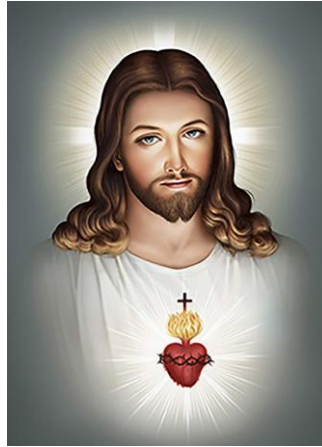

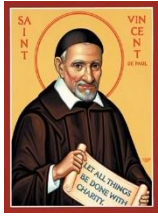

BABY'S LIFE BEFORE BIRTH

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
- ♥ My brain waves can be detected as early as 43 days.
- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.
- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
- ♥ By the 11th and 12th weeks I am moving my arms and legs, sucking my thumb and breathing amniotic fluid. All my systems are working.
- ♥ My movements by 16 weeks are quite active and I can be seen performing somersaults on ultrasound but am not yet felt by my mother.
- ♥ From the 3rd month on nothing new develops. I continue to grow in size and by 20 weeks I have hair on my head, weigh 1 pound and am 12 inches tall.
