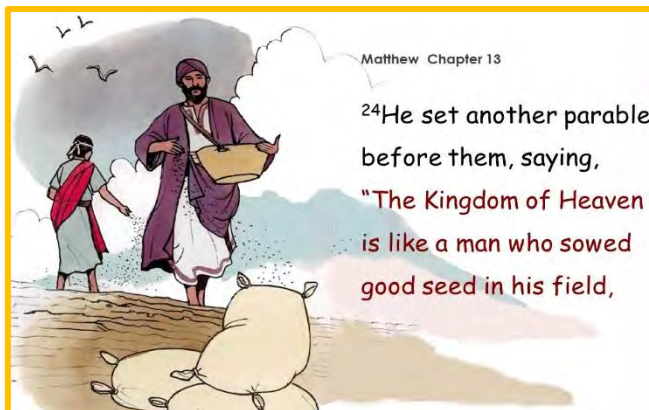

Homily Sixteenth Sunday OT A 2023

I am sure you probably have asked at some point: "Why does God allow evil to exist in the world?" Christ destroyed sin and death why does evil continue to exist? The parable about the weeds and the wheat gives us an answer.

STORY: A good family that lived around the corner from us in Hicksville in the 70s. They had four children. They were Christian and very active in their faith. The youngest son, when he was in his first year of H.S. got involved in a gang, a supremacist group called the skin heads. He was arrested and involved in many things he should not have been. His loving parents had to practice "tough love" in that they asked him to leave the home several times. However, through it all they knew that with all the bad in their son there also was good. They continued to always love him and always forgive him, hoping and believing that the good in their son would prevail. By the time he was 27 years old, married and now having a family of his own, holding three jobs, struggling to care for his own family, walking the straight and narrow, the parents realized that the good had prevailed in their son. That all those years of prayer, and all their tears, sleepless nights, pleading with him paid off. Their son was now a good human being through and through.

I would imagine that this is why God allows bad/evil to exist in the world, in the human heart: because he loves us infinitely and he patiently waits because he knows that good will ultimately prevail in the human heart and in the world. With that said we should never judge or criticize another human being. We must trust that God is somehow involved in that person's life moving them along the journey of conversion bring out the good in them.

--**Today's gospel reminds us that we should not judge others.** Instead, it invites people to look at themselves and repent, so they bear good fruit.

--**According to Pope Francis**, what is another reason that the man who sowed good seed in his field decides not to destroy the "weeds" right away?

"The servants' intention is to eliminate evil immediately, that is, evil people. But the master is wiser, he sees farther. Certainly, evil must be rejected,

but those who do evil are people with whom it is necessary to be patient. This does not mean that type of hypocritical tolerance that hides ambiguity; but rather, justice tempered by mercy. If Jesus came to seek sinners more than the righteous, to cure the sick first before the healthy, then our actions too as his disciples should be focused not on suppressing the wicked, but on saving them. Patience lies here."

--**Anne Osdieck**, a spiritual writer, expresses: Can you always tell the weeds from the flowers, or saints from sinners? If you are quick to judge, might you mistake a saint for a sinner? Is God patient with you regarding the "weeds" in your own garden? How patient are you with others? With yourself?

I.-- Today's readings tell us about a very **patient and compassionate God who is hopeful** that the so-called "weeds" among us will be converted and that we should not be in a hurry to eliminate them or hastily judge them.

A.-- The first reading shows us a merciful and patient God rather than the strict, angry and judging God presented in the book of Genesis.

B.-- The second reading reminds us that the Spirit of God goes on empowering us in our weakness and hence we should be patient with ourselves.

C.-- The Gospel presents a wise and patient **God who allows the good and the evil to coexist in the world, "Let the wheat and the weeds grow together till the harvest time."** So that the good will prevail in the end

--In other words, God awaits repentant sinners. He recognizes that there is evil in the world.

--In this parable Jesus calls us to be patient with those who are not living a good upright life.

--Parable exhorts us to practice patience and show mercy.

Each one of us is a combination of wheat and weeds. In each of us there are elements of the Kingdom of God and elements that are deeply opposed to it

-- God is so merciful that he allows evil to exist in order that what is good may grow. He allows evil to exist also because he can turn it into good. Through the power of change even the ugliest thorn can transform into a blossom of faith.

-- The good news is that growth and maturity of faith are probably the most effective forms of weed control.

-- Karl Rahner's piece of advice to enthusiastic weed-gatherers: "The number one cause of atheism is Christians themselves. Many Christians proclaim God with their mouths and deny Him with their lifestyles. Perhaps, the best defense of God would be to just keep our mouths shut and to live as He told us to. The gospel would then have such a power and attraction that we wouldn't have to worry about defending it."

--CONCLUSION: In the end, it's enough to know that we are "seeds" who have been planted by the "Son of Man," and that we are part of a healthy harvest that will someday be reaped by God.

--Our acts of charity, kindness, mercy, and selfless service can prompt the weeds to move along the journey of conversion.

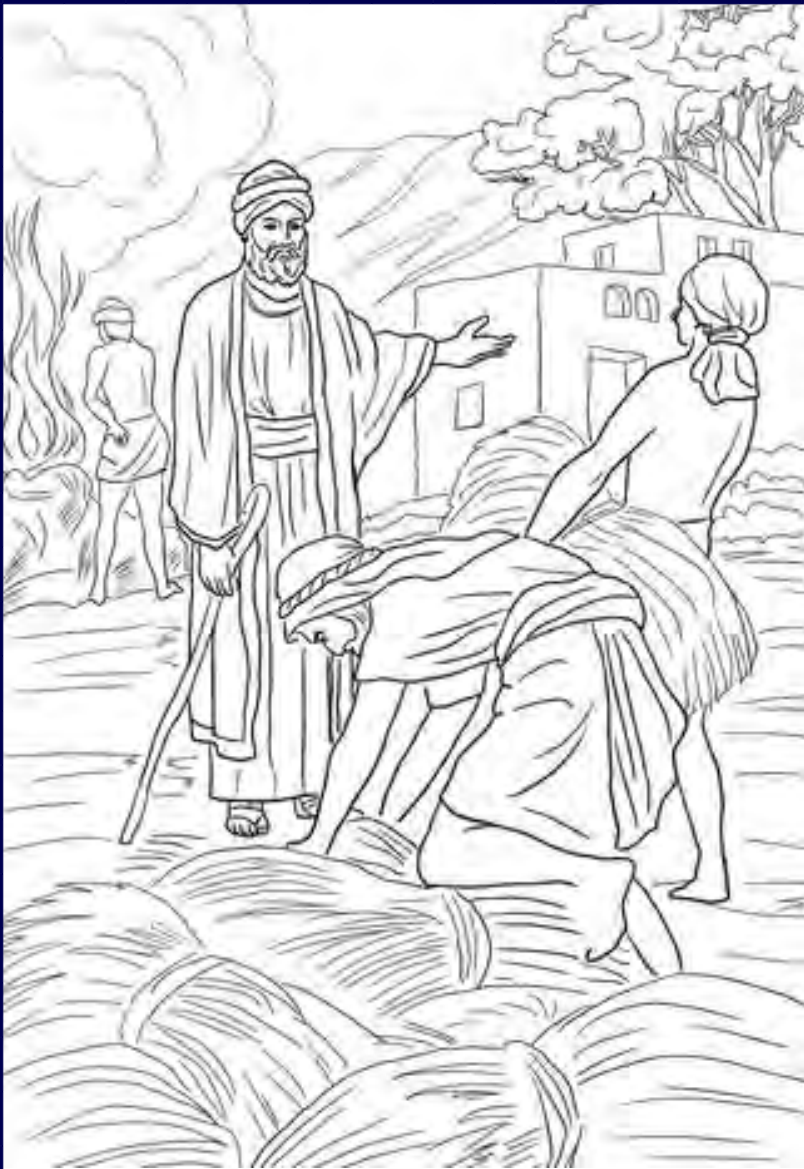

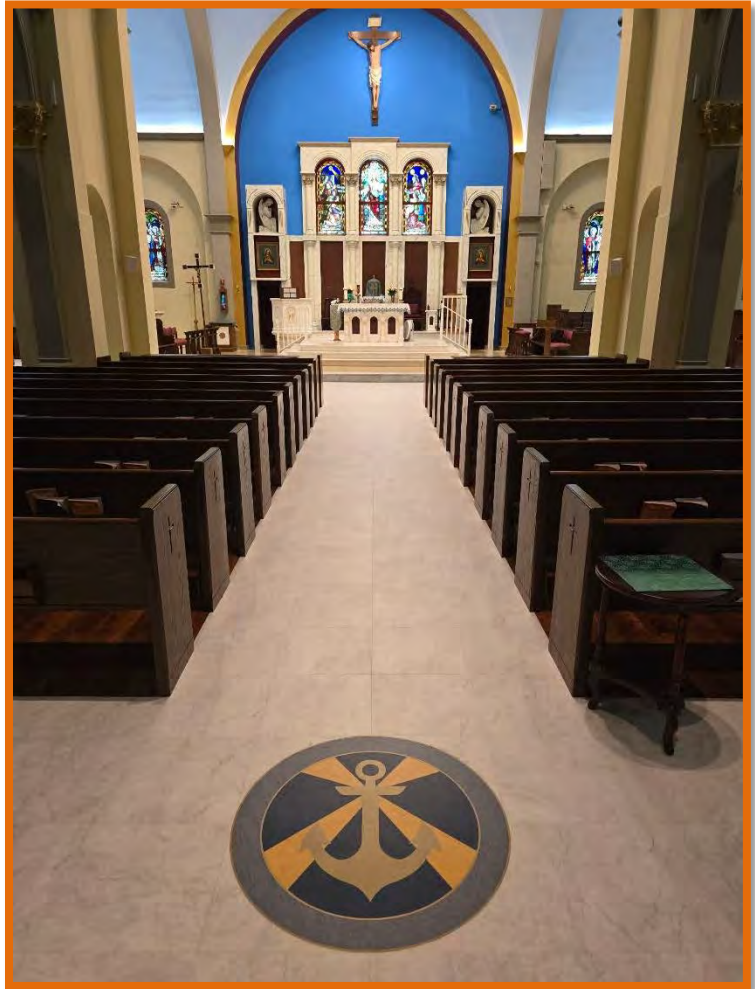
