DEACON'S CORNER



Today's gospel (Mat. 15:21-28) illustrates the universality of God's mercy. However, the fact that Jesus initially hesitated to listen to the woman perhaps could have been to test her faith. In other words, even though God is ready to show us mercy, he requires something from us: "faith as small as the mustard seed" (Mt 17: 20). An essential requirement for receiving this mercy is the amount of faith we demonstrate in Jesus Christ.

The woman demonstrated her faith in Christ. Of course, Christ showed her mercy by healing her daughter. Her persistence is also worth emulating. Despite all odds and what looked like Jesus' refusal to answer her, she did not

give up. So, like this Canaanite woman, each one needs God's mercy. We need to demonstrate our faith in Christ, and he will show us his mercy.

Today, Jesus is close to us. So, like this woman, we must cry to Him: "Son of David, take pity on me."

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

El Evangelio de hoy (Mt 15, 21-28) ilustra la universalidad de la misericordia de Dios. Sin embargo, el hecho de que Jesús dudara inicialmente en escuchar a la mujer tal vez haya servido para poner a prueba su fe. En otras palabras, aunque Dios está dispuesto a mostrarnos misericordia, nos pide algo: «una fe tan pequeña como un grano de mostaza» (Mt 17, 20). Un requisito esencial para recibir esta misericordia es la medida de fe que demostramos en Jesucristo.

La mujer demostró su fe en Cristo. Ciertamente, Cristo le mostró misericordia al sanar a su hija. Su perseverancia también es digna de imitar. A pesar de las dificultades y de lo que parecía una negativa de Jesús a responderle, ella no se rindió. Así pues, al igual que esta mujer cananea, cada uno de nosotros necesita la misericordia de Dios. Necesitamos demostrar nuestra fe en Cristo, y Él nos mostrará su misericordia.

Hoy, Jesús está cerca de nosotros. Por eso, como esta mujer, debemos clamar a Él: «¡Hijo de David, ten compasión de mí!».

Homily: Twentieth Sunday OT A 2017

Persistence: admittedly as with many things in life, we need to be **PERSISTENT AND KEEP AT IT**. Many things are never going to come easy. This is especially true in our Prayer life. If God gave us immediate everything we asked for: we would have no faith.

STORY: many years ago in Illinois, a young man with six months schooling to his credit ran for an office in the legislature. As might have been expected he was beaten. Next, he entered business but failed in that too and spent the next seventeen years paying the debts of his worthless partner. He fell in love with a charming lady and became engaged - and she died. He had a nervous breakdown. He ran for congress and was defeated. He then tried to obtain an appointment to the U.S. land office but didn't succeed. He became a candidate for the Vice-Presidency and lost. Two years later he was defeated in a race for the senate. He ran for President and finally was elected. **That man was Abraham Lincoln.**

--It took **Winston Churchill** three years to get through the **eighth grade**, because he **couldn't pass English!** Ironically, he was asked many years later, while WWII was raging, to give the commencement address at Oxford University. When it was his time to speak, Churchill ceremoniously stood up and walked to the podium. He ceremoniously took his trademark cigar out of his mouth and rested it on the podium; he poised himself as he looked out at the gathering of graduates, faculty, and family members: He took a long pause and said: His now famous speech consisted of only three words: **"Never give up!"**

--Today's gospel gives us the same message in a more powerful way: **NEVER GIVE UP IN PRAYER!**

I.-- Introduction: All three readings today speak of the universal nature of the "kingdom of God,"

--**AND IN OUR PRAYER LIFE WE NEED TO BE PERSISTANT IN PRAYER. THAT WE HAVE THE RIGHT TO SCREAM TO THE HEAVENS WHEN WE ARE PRAYING FOR SOMEONE.**

--Although God set the Hebrew people apart as His chosen race, **He included all nations in His plan for salvation** and blessed all families of the earth in Abraham (Gen. 12:1-3).

--God reveals the truth that in **His eyes there is no distinction among human beings on the basis of race, caste or color.**

--Today's psalm **rejects all types of religious exclusivity:** *"Let all the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you. For you judge the peoples with equity and guide the nations upon the earth, so that your saving power may be known among all the nations."*

--**Second reading**, Paul admits that although the Jews were the chosen people, they rejected Jesus as the Messiah and so Jesus directed His ministry to the Gentiles who received mercy through their faith in Jesus.

II--In the gospel story, Jesus demonstrates that salvation was meant for the Gentiles as well as for the Jews by healing the daughter of a Gentile woman as a reward for her strong faith. **Thus, He shows that God's mercy and love are available to all who call out to Him in faith.**

--The gospels describe only **two miraculous healings Jesus performed for Gentiles:** the healing of the daughter of the Canaanite woman and the healing of the centurion's servant (Mt. 8: 10-12).

--The encounter with the Canaanite woman was the **only occasion on which Jesus was ever outside of Jewish territory.** These miracles were performed in Tyre and Sidon, two coastal cities, twenty-five and fifty miles north of Galilee in present-day Lebanon.

--**The woman belonged to the old Canaanite stock of the Syro-Phoenician race.** The Canaanites were the ancestral enemies of the Jews and were regarded as pagans and idolaters--ritually unclean.

--But this woman showed "a gallant and an audacious love which grew until it worshipped at the feet of the divine, an indomitable persistence springing from an unconquerable hope, a cheerfulness which would not be dismayed."

--Jesus first ignores both the persistent cry of the woman

--Jesus tells her, **"I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel."**

--But the woman is persistent, She *kneels* before him and *begs*, **"Lord, help me."**

--Jesus makes a seemingly harsh statement, **"It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."**

*The term "**dogs**" was a derogatory Jewish word for the **Gentiles**. Dogs were regarded by the Jews as **unclean**, because they would eat anything given to them, including pork. The woman noticed, however, that Jesus had used the word *kunariois*--the word for household pets - rather than the ordinary Greek word for dogs - *kuon*. She also observed that Jesus had used the word for dogs in a joking way - a sort of test of the woman's faith.

*So, she immediately matched wits with Jesus. Her argument runs like this: Pets are not outsiders but insiders. They not only belong to the family, but are part of the family. While they do not have a seat at the table, they enjoy intimacy at the family's feet. Hence the woman replied: "**Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table**" (v. 27), expressing her faith that Jesus could and would heal her daughter.

--Jesus was impressed by the **depth of her faith, her confidence and her wit** and hence responded, "**Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.**" NOTE: We notice that the woman was refused three times by Jesus before he granted her request and finally, the fourth time, her persistence was rewarded and her plea was answered.

Message: Persistence in Prayer: **We have the right to cry out to him day and night in Prayer of Petition.** Christ tells us: "Ask and you shall receive" We have to ask with FERVOR AND PERSEVERANCE which proves we have GREAT FAITH.

Note: We must realize and remember that we do not always get exactly what we ask for, but rather what **God knows we need**, what He wants for us and what is really best for us. What we need most are the peace and security that come from being in harmony with God's will for us.

NOTE: Today's Gospel reminds us that God's love and mercy **are extended to all who call on him in faith and trust**, no matter who they are. In other words, God's care extends beyond the boundaries of race and nation to the hearts of all who live, and God's house should become a house of prayer for all peoples.

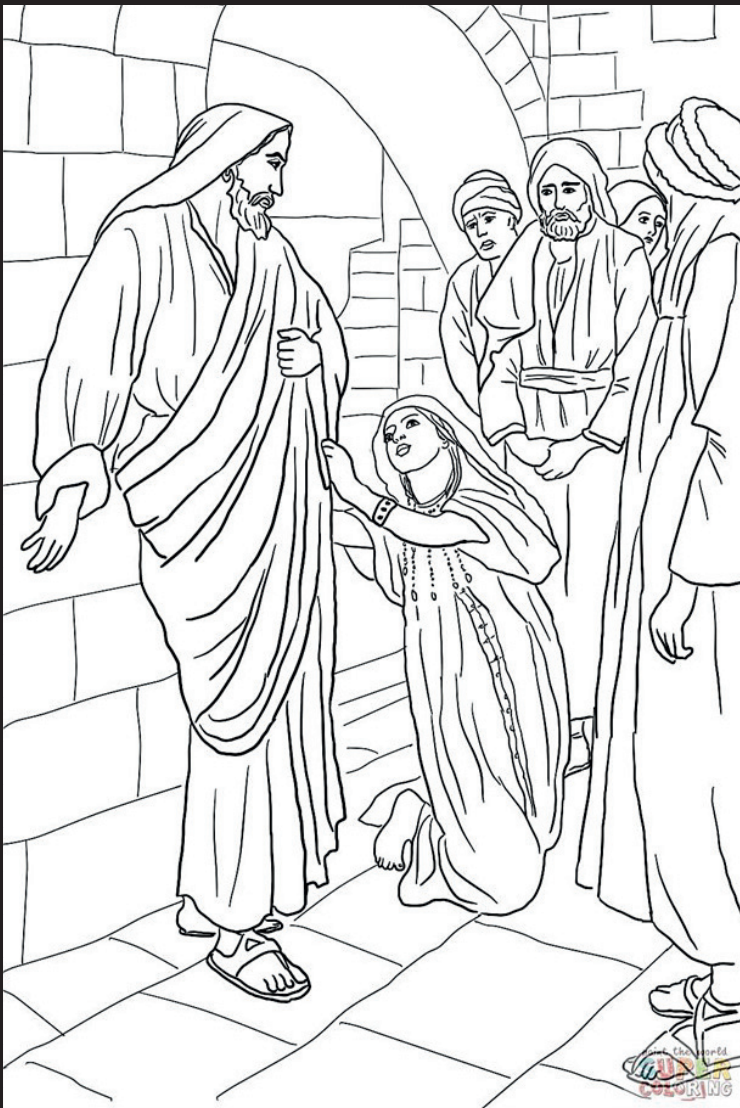


HOW GREAT IS YOUR FAITH?

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
- ♥ My brain waves can be detected as early as 43 days.
- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.

- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
