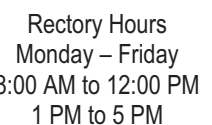

DEACON'S CORNER



In today's gospel (*Mat. 16: 21-27*), we see the irony of life. The same Peter who proclaimed that Christ was the Messiah last week is today rebuked as "Satan." Christ rebuked him for being an obstacle to his mission. This shows that though Peter professed that Christ is the Messiah (as God revealed it to him), he has not fully understood the nature of Christ's mission.

He still sees it only from the perspective of royalty and glory. Of course, he was eager to participate in these.

This also teaches us that we are all vulnerable to making mistakes and falling, no matter how spiritual we are. So, we must take the admonition of Paul seriously: "Let him who thinks he stands, take heed lest he falls" (*1Cor 10:12*).

Peter could not understand why Christ should be talking this way. However, God's call is not only about participating in his glory but also participating first in his suffering. This is what Christ did. That He offered himself as a living sacrifice means that he submitted everything without reluctance for our salvation. However, Peter has not realized the necessity of Christ's death: "it is better for one man to die for the people than to have the whole nation destroyed." (*Jn 11:50*).

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

En el evangelio de hoy (*Mt 16, 21-27*), vemos la ironía de la vida. El mismo Pedro que la semana pasada proclamó que Cristo era el Mesías, hoy es reprendido y llamado «Satanás». Cristo lo reprendió por ser un obstáculo para su misión. Esto demuestra que, aunque Pedro profesó que Cristo es el Mesías (tal como Dios se lo reveló), no ha comprendido plenamente la naturaleza de la misión de Cristo.

Él todavía la ve únicamente desde la perspectiva de la realeza y la gloria. Por supuesto, anhelaba participar de ellas. Esto también nos enseña que todos somos vulnerables a cometer errores y a caer, por muy espirituales que seamos. Por tanto, debemos tomar en serio la advertencia de Pablo: «El que crea estar firme, tenga cuidado de no caer» (*1 Cor 10, 12*).

Pedro no lograba entender por qué Cristo hablaba de esa manera. Sin embargo, el llamado de Dios no consiste solo en participar de su gloria, sino también en participar primero de su sufrimiento. Eso fue lo que hizo Cristo. El hecho de que se ofreciera a sí mismo como sacrificio vivo significa que lo entregó todo, sin reservas, para nuestra salvación. No obstante, Pedro no había comprendido la necesidad de la muerte de Cristo: «es mejor que un solo hombre muera por el pueblo a que toda la nación sea destruida» (*Jn 11, 50*).

Homily: Twenty Second Sunday OT A 2026

I.-- A nun was explaining the Stations of the Cross to her class. They got to the fourth Station where Jesus is on the road to Calvary meets his mother. The nun explained that even though they could not talk to each other, mother and son spoke just using their eyes. "What do you think they said to each other?" she asked her students. The class gave many different answers. One kid suggested that she said, "This is unfair." Another kid suggested that she said, "Why me?" Finally a sickly little girl raised her thin hand, got up and said: "Sister, I know what the Blessed Mother told Jesus. She said to him, 'Keep on going, Jesus!'" The nun asked the little girl: Why would a mother encourage her only son on the way to crucifixion to keep on going? The little girl responded that Mary as Mother understood the principle of "no cross, no crown."

IN LAST WEEK'S GOSPEL we saw the disciples riding high. They had, through Peter, acknowledged that Jesus, their teacher and friend, was no less than the long-awaited Messiah-King of Israel. "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." It must have been a really exciting moment for them. This, in turn, brought from Jesus a commission of the highest responsibility to Peter and his fellow disciples. Through Jesus, they were to be given the authority of God himself within their future communities. Peter himself is spoken of as a rock, firm and unshakeable, on which the ekklesia, the Church community, will be built.

It is hard to imagine that this was not a moment of particular joy and satisfaction for the disciples. They now were thinking that Jesus, in line with Jewish expectations, would be a glorious and powerful king. And they, of course, as his followers and companions, would have a special share in the glory and privileges that went with it. (Later, would not two of them go

so far as to ask, rather cheekily and behind their brothers' backs, for special places in the Kingdom, to sit on the right and left of Jesus?)

A shock

However, the euphoria was not to last very long. Very soon after this, "Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day." This, undoubtedly, comes as a terrible shock. This was not at all part of the scenario for the coming of the Messiah! What is worse, the agents of Jesus' humiliation and death will not be some hostile outsiders (like the pagan and barbaric Romans) but the leaders and most distinguished people of their own community. The elders, chief priests and scribes were the people who formed the Sanhedrin, the ruling body of the Jews in Palestine.

Furthermore, it would happen in Jerusalem, the holy city, the site of the Temple where God dwelt among his people. It might be remembered, however, that Jerusalem was the city where prophets died. ("O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, killing the prophets and stoning those who are sent to you!" - Jesus' words to the Pharisees [Matthew 23:37].) The disciples must have felt very disturbed and confused indeed.

A protest

So, it is not surprising that at this point, Peter, still flush with his newly acquired status, takes Jesus to one side, speaking to him almost on equal terms. "Heaven preserve you, Lord! This must not happen to you." How can this happen to the Messiah-King of Israel? The angry reaction of Jesus must have come as somewhat unexpected, to say the least. Turning to face Peter, Jesus says: "Get behind me, Satan!" These are strong words

for someone who just now was being given leadership of the community Jesus would leave behind. It is not to be understood that Peter is literally a demon, but the disciple's words are understood as a real temptation to Jesus to turn away from the path he is to follow. Unwittingly and with the best of intentions, Peter is doing the devil's work - trying to steer Jesus away from the path laid out for him by his Father. How often have we been such a temptation or stumbling block to others? Perhaps more often than we care to think.

"You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but that of a human being." Peter is seen as an obstacle, a scandal (skandalon, skandalon), a stone in one's path which causes one to stumble. Ironically, the 'rock' which Jesus just now had said would be the foundation of his 'church' is now seen as an obstacle to Jesus' work and mission!

The mind of Christ

Jesus is angry for, though his disciples may have acknowledged that he is the Messiah, they clearly have no idea whatever what kind of Messiah-King Jesus is going to be. They are, as he says, thinking in purely human terms and have not yet got "the mind of Christ" (Philippians 2:5).

They shall have to change completely their ideas about what the Messiah is going to be like. He will not be a great political and military leader who will sweep away all of Israel's enemies. Even after the resurrection they were still thinking in those terms. "We had hoped that he was the one that would redeem Israel", said the two fellows on their way to Emmaus (Luke 24:21), not realizing the irony of their words. "When will you restore the kingdom of Israel?" the disciples asked Jesus as he prepared to leave them at the Ascension.

Yes, Jesus will be a King, but he will be a King of love, a King who will rule by serving. Because he loves and serves them, he will, if necessary, be prepared to die for them, for this is the greatest love that a person can show for his friends. This is not to say that Jesus wants to die on the cross but he is totally prepared to suffer and die, if the service of love demands it - and it will. Ultimately, the disciples will see that the death of Jesus was the source of his greatest glory and power. "When I am lifted up from the earth [on the cross and into glory], I will draw everyone to me" (John 12:32).

We all need to give consolation as well as to receive it.

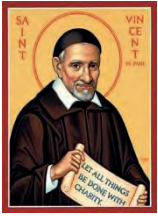

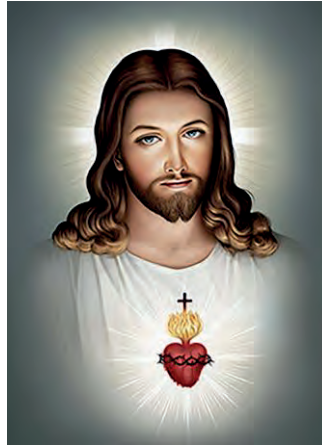
