Every act of kindness matters.

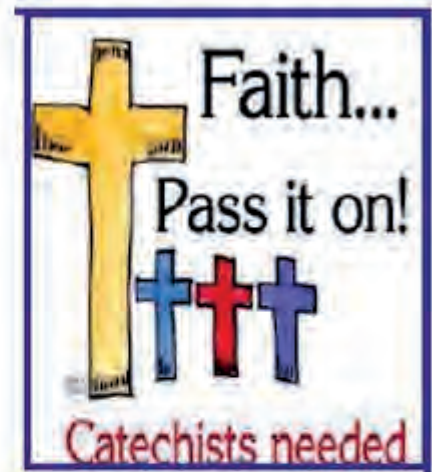
Every decision to stand up for someone matters.

DEACON'S CORNER



In today's Gospel (*Matthew 18: 21-35*) The king in the parable decides to settle accounts with his servants. We are told that one servant in particular owes the king an enormous sum of money. Despite the promise of the servant, it is unlikely that he would ever be able to repay the debt that he owes. The king is moved by the humility of the pleading servant and mercifully forgives the debt. Rather than displaying gratitude for this forgiveness, the servant confronts a fellow servant who owes him a small debt—a pittance when compared with the amount that was owed to the king. The unmerciful servant refuses the pleas of his fellow servant and sends the servant to prison.

A few other servants tell the merciful king about the actions of the unforgiving servant. The king punishes the servant because he refused to show the kind of mercy he had himself received from the king. Jesus concludes by

indicating that this is how it will be with God and those who refuse to forgive one another.

There is a temptation to quantify forgiveness as Peter tried to do, but Jesus' point is that forgiveness is not about quantity—the number of times we extend forgiveness to another. In the parable the king's forgiveness is like God's forgiveness, and it transforms us, helping us to be as forgiving as God. The lesson is clear: If we hoard God's mercy while showing no mercy to others, we risk forfeiting the effects of God's mercy in our lives.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

En el Evangelio de hoy (Mateo 18, 21-35), el rey de la parábola decide ajustar cuentas con sus siervos. Se nos dice que un siervo en particular le debe al rey una suma enorme de dinero. A pesar de las promesas del siervo, es poco probable que alguna vez pueda saldar la deuda que ha contraído. El rey, conmovido por la humildad del siervo que le suplica, le perdona misericordiosamente la deuda. En lugar de mostrar gratitud por este perdón, el siervo confronta a un compañero que le debe una cantidad pequeña, una suma insignificante comparada con lo que él debía al rey. El siervo implacable rechaza las súplicas de su compañero y lo hace encarcelar.

Otros siervos informan al rey misericordioso sobre la conducta de aquel siervo que no supo perdonar. El rey castiga al siervo porque este se negó a mostrar la misma misericordia que él mismo había recibido del rey. Jesús concluye señalando que así sucederá con Dios y con aquellos que se nieguen a perdonarse mutuamente.

Existe la tentación de cuantificar el perdón, tal como intentó hacer Pedro; sin embargo, el mensaje de Jesús es que el perdón no es cuestión de cantidad —es decir, del número de veces que perdonamos a otra persona—. En la parábola, el perdón del rey refleja el perdón de Dios: nos transforma y nos ayuda a ser tan misericordiosos como Él. La lección es clara: si acaparamos la misericordia de Dios sin mostrar misericordia hacia los demás, corremos el riesgo de perder los efectos de esa misericordia divina en nuestras vidas.

Homily: Twenty Fourth Sunday OT A 2017

I.-- Practice Makes Perfect: OLOP School Music Program / They put on a concert twice a year: Christmas and Spring / The kids are phenomenal: violin, oboe, saxophone, so many instruments and the voices of the singers. I asked a seventh-grade student how he became so good: he said: "I have to practice every day".

--Last week and this week WE ARE talking about FORGIVENESS: Forgiveness as a WAY OF LIFE... By way of analogy: JUST AS IN PLAYING AN INSTRUMENT...FORGIVENESS HAS TO BE PRACTICED EVERY DAY OR OUR LIVES.

****FORGIVENESS AS A WAY OF LIFE, HAS TO BE PRACTICED EVERY DAY****

A.-- THE DEGREE I CAN FORGIVE OTHERS = IS THE DEGREE I LEAVE MY SELF OPEN TO RECEIVE GOD'S FORGIVENESS OR WHEN I EXPERIENCE GOD'S FORGIVENESS / MERCY IN MY LIFE I NEED T RADIATE THE FORGIVENESS OUT TO OTHERS

(FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES AS WE FOR THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US...)

--We forgive others, not to let them off the hook; we forgive others to bring healing to our heart.

--forgiveness only matters when you don't keep count. It is not about winning or losing (I will forgive you only because you forgave me (I owe you)

--Sometimes THERE is NO perfect way to achieve forgiveness (it's not always cut and clean.) FORGIVENESS CAN BE A MESSY BUSINESS.(there are always lingering hurt feelings and resentments that have to be dealt with).

-- Sometimes forgiveness has to be a TWO SIDED EFFORT: AFTER BEING FORGIVEN: YOU HAVE TO WORK THROUGH THE HURT AND ANGUISH. THERE IS NO SUCH THING AS CHEAP MERCY... forgiveness comes at a price. (example: unfaithfulness spouse had to surrender their cell phone to prove their faithfulness,)

--When we withhold forgiveness, we remain the victim.

--When we experience God's forgiveness in our lives: we need radiate that forgiveness and mercy out to others.--He wants us to treat others the way he treats us.

B.-- Sirach, in the first reading(written about 180BC), reminds his listeners that: It is unwise to nurse grudges and wise to forgive because our life span is very short and our eternal destiny is decided on how we forgive,

-- This teacher of wisdom tells us God treats us the way we treat each other (what goes around comes around / Karma)

C.-- Second Reading, Paul reminds us that we have to forgive others because we belong to Christ who taught us by his own example to forgive. Since we humans are related as

brothers and sisters of Jesus,

we are in the family of God, so hatred and bitterness should have no place in our hearts.

II.-- In today's gospel, through the parable of the two debtors, Jesus teaches us that there should be no limit to our forgiveness and no conditions attached to our reconciliation.

1) In the light of eternity and considering the shortness of our span of life, harboring old grudges is pointless.

2) We may never forget the hurt we have experienced, but we can choose to forgive and pray for our offenders. "Help so-and-so and me to mend our relationship." NO Cheap Mercy

--When we withhold forgiveness, we remain the victim.

STORY: Martin Luther King, Jr., In his sermon "Loving Your Enemies," TELLS When Abraham Lincoln was running for the presidency of the United States, there was a man who ran all around the country speaking ill of Lincoln. He said a lot of unkind things. "You don't want a tall, lanky, ignorant man like this as the president of the United States!"

--However, Abraham Lincoln was elected president of the United States. When the time came for him to choose the Secretary of War, he looked across the nation and decided to choose a man by the name of Mr. Stanton.

--When the president made this proposal before his advisors, they were surprised: "Mr. Lincoln," the senior adviser Do you know what Mr. Stanton has been saying about you? Did you read all of those derogatory statements that he made about you?"

--Abraham Lincoln stood before the advisors around him and said: "Oh yeah. I know about it; I read about it; I've heard him myself. But after looking over the country, I find that he is the best man for the job."

--Mr. Stanton did become the Secretary of War. Later, when Abraham Lincoln was assassinated, one of the greatest statements ever made about him was by this man Mr. Stanton. After describing the nobility of the president, his spirit of unconditional forgiveness and the integrity of his character in superlatives, Stanton paid Lincoln the highest compliment: , "Now Abraham Lincoln belongs to the ages."

If Abraham Lincoln had hated Stanton, and acted accordingly, Stanton might well have gone to his grave hating Lincoln and Lincoln might have gone to his grave hating Stanton. But through the power of Abraham Lincoln's forgiving love, God was able to redeem Stanton.

III.-- Seventy times seven: Peter asked Jesus how often he ought to forgive his brother and then answered his own question by suggesting that he should forgive seven times.

--It was the Rabbinic teaching that a man must forgive his brother 3X / three times. The Biblical proof for this was taken from the first and second chapters of Amos

--seven was a holy number to Jewish people, symbolizing perfection, fullness, abundance, rest, and completion.

--Peter expected to be warmly commended. But Jesus' answer was that the Christian must forgive seventy times seven. In other words, = ALWAYS.

(B) The lessons taught by the parable:

-- We must forgive in order to be forgiven.

--We represent the greater debtor in the parable. We commit sins every day and, hence, need God's forgiveness every day.

--10,000 talents would be 10 million dollars an exaggeration. All of Israel's taxes for 1 year= \$800K

--What Jesus means is that this man was hopelessly indebted. The accumulated sum of all our sins makes us greater debtors before God than the first debtor in the story.

--The moral of Jesus' story: WE TREAT OTHERS AS GOD TREATS US.

--Here is a divine call to throw away the ADDING MACHINE when it comes to forgiveness. We must choose the more honorable path and forgive one another "from the heart."

--As C.S. Lewis put it: "To be a Christian means to forgive the inexcusable because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you."

STORY: Pete Peterson was appointed U.S. ambassador to Vietnam in the late 1990s. Long before that, however, Peterson had served six years as a prisoner of war in the dreaded "Hanoi Hilton" prison camp. He endured unspeakable brutality, starvation, and torture at the hands of his captives. They robbed him of six years of his life he will never get back. Never. And when asked how he could return to this land as an ambassador, he replied, "I left my anger and regret at the gates of that prison when I

walked out in 1972. I just left it behind me and decided to move forward with my life." (Shoulda, Coulda, Woulda: Live in the Present, Find Your Future by Dr. Les Parrott, (Grand Rapids, MI: Zondervan, 2003).

--HOW MANY PEOPLE HAVE TO DO THE SAME: LEAVE ALL THE HURT AND ANGER AND RESENTMENT BEHIND AND JUST MOVE FORWARD WITH LIFE?????

CONCLUSION: FOREGIVENESS AS A WAY OF LIFE, LETS PRACTICE IT EVERY DAY BECAUSE: PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

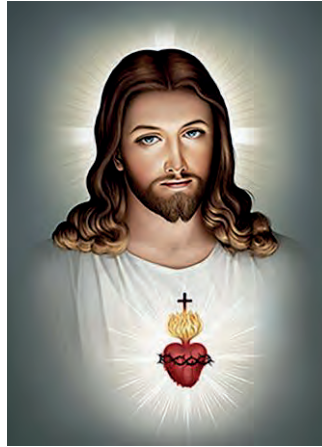

Peter asked Jesus, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, seventy-seven times. That is why the Kingdom of Heaven may be likened to a king who was settling accounts with his servants. When he began, a debtor was brought before him who owed a huge amount. ... The servant fell down and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' 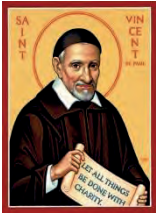

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
