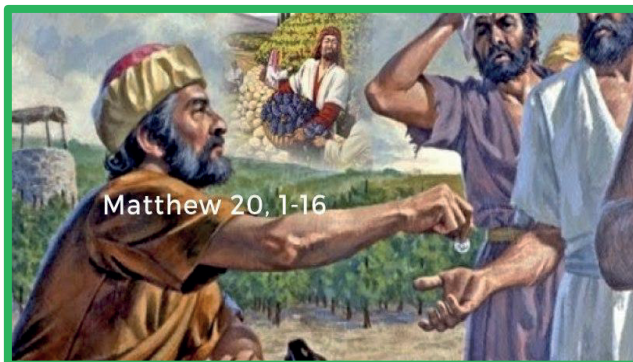

DEACON'S CORNER



In today's Gospel (Matt. 21:28-32) we find the two sons, each doing the opposite to what they declare; while Jesus tells us that tax collectors and prostitutes paid attention to John the Baptist and they changed too.

There is plenty of common ground between those bible figures and our own fickle behavior. One day we can be full of fervor and keen to profess our Christian faith, come what may. The next we can't pray. We ask where is the God of yesterday? Does he exist at all? Is all our time wasted? Those who reject belief, faith, Church, religion and moral responsibility continue life as contented, apparently, as everyone else. Many of them were our classmates with whom we received our First Holy Communion and Confirmation. They don't darken

the door of the Church anymore. They changed their minds! Of all the gifts given to us by God, the freedom of choice is perhaps the greatest. We're not pre-determined beings; our choices are sacred and are literally our making, our doing and undoing. When we respond positively to God's grace as also reflected in the best and noblest inspirations and aspirations of our environment, we're shaping ourselves more firmly in the image and likeness of God our Creator.

Part of the challenge of our day is to ignore the choices made by others and content ourselves with our own good choices which uplift and determine a better tomorrow for ourselves and society. Let us pray for those who have changed their minds or way of life and turned away from God. May they experience afresh the fervor of their early faith and experience anew God's gifts of peace and joy.

EL RINCÓN DEL DIÁCONO

En el Evangelio de hoy (Mt 21, 28-32) encontramos a los dos hijos, cada uno haciendo lo contrario de lo que declara; mientras que Jesús nos dice que los publicanos y las prostitutas escucharon a Juan el Bautista y también cambiaron.

Existen muchos puntos en común entre esas figuras bíblicas y nuestra propia conducta inconstante. Un día podemos estar llenos de fervor y deseosos de profesar nuestra fe cristiana, pase lo que pase. Al día siguiente, somos incapaces de rezar. Nos preguntamos: ¿dónde está el Dios de ayer? ¿Acaso existe? ¿Hemos perdido el tiempo? Quienes rechazan la creencia, la fe, la Iglesia, la religión y la responsabilidad moral continúan su vida tan satisfechos, aparentemente, como los demás. Muchos de ellos fueron compañeros de clase con quienes recibimos la Primera Comunión y la Confirmación. Ya no pisan la iglesia. ¡Cambiaron de parecer! De todos los dones que Dios nos ha concedido, la libertad de elección es quizá el mayor. No somos seres predeterminados; nuestras decisiones son sagradas y constituyen, literalmente, nuestra propia obra: lo que hacemos y deshacemos. Cuando respondemos positivamente a la gracia de Dios — reflejada también en las mejores y más nobles inspiraciones y aspiraciones de nuestro entorno —, nos vamos moldeando con mayor firmeza a imagen y semejanza de Dios, nuestro Creador.

Parte del desafío actual consiste en no dejarnos influir por las decisiones ajenas y en sentirnos satisfechos con nuestras propias buenas decisiones, aquellas que nos elevan y determinan un mañana mejor para nosotros y para la sociedad. Oremos por quienes han cambiado de parecer o de modo de vida y se han alejado de Dios. Que experimenten de nuevo el fervor de su fe inicial y vuelvan a gozar de los dones divinos de la paz y la alegría.

Homily: Twenty Sixth Sunday OT A

"Actions speak louder than words."

I. -- Our Actions Speak Louder than our Words... When I was Associate Pastor at St Hugh of Lincoln Parish (2004-6), I was in a conversation with a regular summer help priest known as George The Jesuit. George, a member of the California Province, would drive his BMW motorcycle from C.A to Levittown to his mom's house every summer. This conversation was about funeral homilies. I maintained that it was important in families to say the words "I love you" with meaning of course, frequently should there be an untimely death. You want your last words to someone to be meaningful. Fr George maintained that many families, like his own, weren't comfortable saying those words but they lived the meaning of the words in their actions, that they didn't have to say the words all the time. I maintained family members needed to hear the words frequently and live the words with their actions. We would never hang up the phone without saying "I love you". Anyway, we were on common ground and the message in today's Gospel that our actions say much more than our words.

In the final analysis our actions speak much more than our words... that OUR FAITH IS ONLY COMPLETELY EXPRESSED IN ACTIONS

We all have good intentions. But our intentions don't really matter. It's our actions that are grounded in and flow from our relationship with God that count.

A. --In the first reading, Ezekiel's message from the Lord God to Israel answers the objections of those who think it is **not fair that God should give such weight to one's final decision** because a person who, after a very long virtuous life, finally chooses sin will be punished and another, who finally chooses virtue after a life of loose morals, will be rewarded.

The second reading, BEAUTIFUL HYMN TO THE Philippians, also affirms Christ's obedience to God's will by *emptying himself, taking human form and humbling himself by accepting death on a cross that God the Father exalted Christ, bestowed on him the name above every other name*, and made him the recipient of universal adoration.

--In the parable in today's Gospel, a man who has two sons tells both to go out to work in the vineyard.

FIRST= SAYS NO>>>>>THEN DECIDES TO GO (rep. sinners, tax collectors, prostitutes.)

SECOND=SAYS YES>>>>>DOESN'T GO (religious leaders, elders)

FINAL DECISION IS MOST IMPORTANT

Context to today's Gospel passage is: Jesus is now in Jerusalem, his passion and death are immanent.

--The Sadducees and Pharisees are constantly trying to trip him up and so they are questioning his authority to do ministry: to preach and teach.

--Our Lord expresses that he will answer their question only if they answer his question first (*quid pro quo*).

--He asks them if they **thought John the Baptist's Baptism of water was of DIVINE OR EARTHLY ORIGIN**. They realize they can't say DIVINE because they never put their faith in John or submitted to his baptism//and they can't say EARTHLY because the people regarded him as a prophet.

--Our Lord **puts them further on the defensive** by posing to them today's parable in which their response condemns themselves.

In this parable: both sons OFFEND THEIR FATHER AND SHAME HIM. FIRST SON: response was a PUBLIC INSULT to his father by saying NO; but later he did what his father asked of him. SECOND SON: response was not a public insult, but he still shamed his father by lying to him and not doing what he said he would do.--this son only appeared to be faithful.

C. Neither Son represents the ideal; however, in deciding on the First Son the Religious Leaders condemn themselves.

--Tax Collectors and prostitutes were public sinners--they were deemed the worst of the worst--yet our Lord says they will enter heaven before the religious leaders.

--WHY? It was these individuals--the lowest of the low who accepted our Lord's invitation and believed in him--repented of their sins--changed their lives--and followed him (ex. Feast of St. Matt. on Wed.)--this repentance/acceptance/following>>>these actions/doing spoke louder than any words that could ever be uttered.

D.-- SECOND SON offends his father by lying to him: says YES, but no actions -- he politely says YES but never does what he says or what is asked of him.

--This son REPRESENTS especially those religious people----who may speak beautiful, pious, lofty>>>words--but these lofty words are never expressed in action>>ESPECIALLY THOSE WHO condemn others, are judgmental, and are unforgiving.

**sometimes religious people are so intent on proving they are correct that they fail to hear the voice of reason or discern the voice of God.

--**EXAMPLE:** someone who teaches a class on prayer but never prays himself

IV.--These two sons represent two approaches of how to relate to God.

1) Those who have NO WORDS: don't go to church, mass, don't pray... YET they: FORGIVE, SHOW MERCY, GENEROUS --they profess no faith YET their actions DISPLAY a tacit faith/presence that exists in them--we know them to be ANONYMOUS CHRISTIANS>>>>people who don't know Jesus Christ>>due to no fault of their own yet in the way they live their lives are perhaps more Christian than many Christians.

2) those who HAVE FAITH AND ARE RELIGIOUS: YET THEY ARE: UNFORGIVING, UNMERCIFUL, HAVE NO CHARITY.

** Doing the will of God IS NOT SO MUCH ABOUT: WHAT WORDS WE SAY, THE PROMISES WE MAKE....ALL THAT IS IMPORTANT....BUT WHAT REALLY MATTERS IS THAT WE DO THE WORK THAT GOD HAS ASKED OF US.

---ST IGNATIUS: "love shows itself more in actions than in words

STORY: A young woman from Australia was traveling around India. She was walking around Calcutta one day when she came across a small boy who looked like he was about 5 years old. He was beaten and left to die. She knew she couldn't leave him there. So, she brought him to Mother Teresa's Hospice in Calcutta. She asked if she could bring the child into the house. But she felt that she couldn't just leave him there and go away. So, she asked if she could stay and help look after him. And so, she did. She nursed the child day and night and he started to improve. She began to care for others as well in Hospice.

Mother Theresa was so impressed with the woman's care for others that she **ASKED HER IF SHE EVER COSIDERED RELIGIOUS LIFE.**

--The woman was very moved and flattered... she knew it was very unusual for Mother Theresa to ask people directly to join her congregation.

-- The woman said, "Well, you see, I'm actually not religious at all. Both my parents were atheists. I've never been to church; I've never been baptized. I'm not sure I'm really the sort of person that becomes a nun."

--"Oh," said Mother Teresa. "Don't worry about that. When the actions are right, as are yours, the words will follow."

Conclusion: The ideal are those who say YES (e.g. God)and DO WHAT THEY SAY.

--God doesn't want correct answers, HE WANTS OUR ACTOINS. He wants our dutiful obedience, but more importantly he wants our enthusiastic service in building up his Father's Kingdom e.g. that is getting the job done.

--IDEAL--to profess FAITH in WORD and DEED.

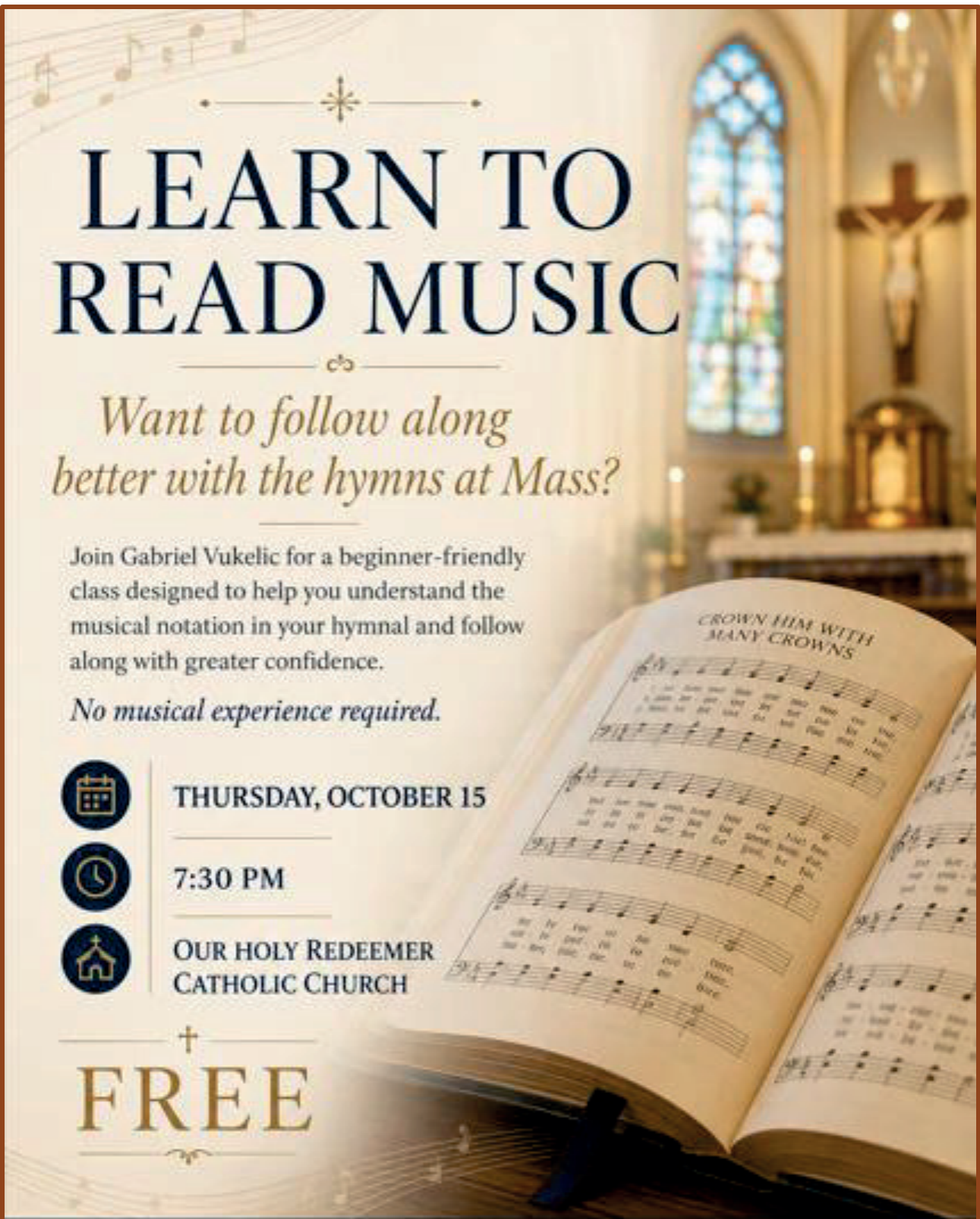

BABY'S LIFE BEFORE BIRTH

- ♥ My heart is beating at 18 to 25 days.
- ♥ The foundation for my nervous system is in place at 20 days.
- ♥ My skeleton is complete at 42 days and I have reflexes.
- ♥ My brain waves can be detected as early as 43 days.
- ♥ At 8 weeks my brain and all body systems are present and I look like a miniature doll.

- ♥ During weeks 9 and 10 I squint, swallow and can make a fist.
- ♥ By the 11th and 12th weeks I am moving my arms and legs, sucking my thumb and breathing amniotic fluid. All my systems are working.
- ♥ My movements by 16 weeks are quite active and I can be seen performing somersaults on ultrasound but am not yet felt by my mother.
- ♥ From the 3rd month on nothing new develops. I continue to grow in size and by 20 weeks I have hair on my head, weigh 1 pound and am 12 inches tall.
